Financial Report 2012

I have pleasure as Club Treasurer presenting this financial report to all members.

Members were advised last year at the AGM that the club had introduced an accounting software program to record all the clubs financial trading and this system has continued during the season 2012.

Given the current difficult economic climate I am also pleased to report an increase in revenue of 15% from last year's trading whilst we have been able to reduce our overall expenditure at the same time. This has resulted with the close of 2012 financial trading showing a profit of \$30,401.00. In reflection this year's trading results are outstanding given that we have increased revenue by \$245,000 since financial year ending 2009.

During season 2012 our club has been able to retire \$36,151.00 of past debts, placing us in a better financial position moving forward.

Following discussion with LBW chartered accountants, I wish to draw your attention to this year's financial trading statement that now reflects the actual position for all departments.

I urge all members to remain involved in the ongoing need for support that will continue to provide Newtown & Chilwell Football Netball Club the financial stability required as a competitive member of the Geelong Football League.


Our Responsibility

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Newtown & Chilwell Football & Netball Club Inc ("the Association"), which comprises the committee's report, the statement of financial position as at 30th September 2012, the statement of comprehensive income for the year then ended 30th September 2012, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the statement by members of the committee.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of the Association is responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and has determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Victoria) and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The committee's responsibility also includes such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view, in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. Qualification

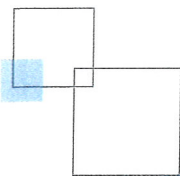

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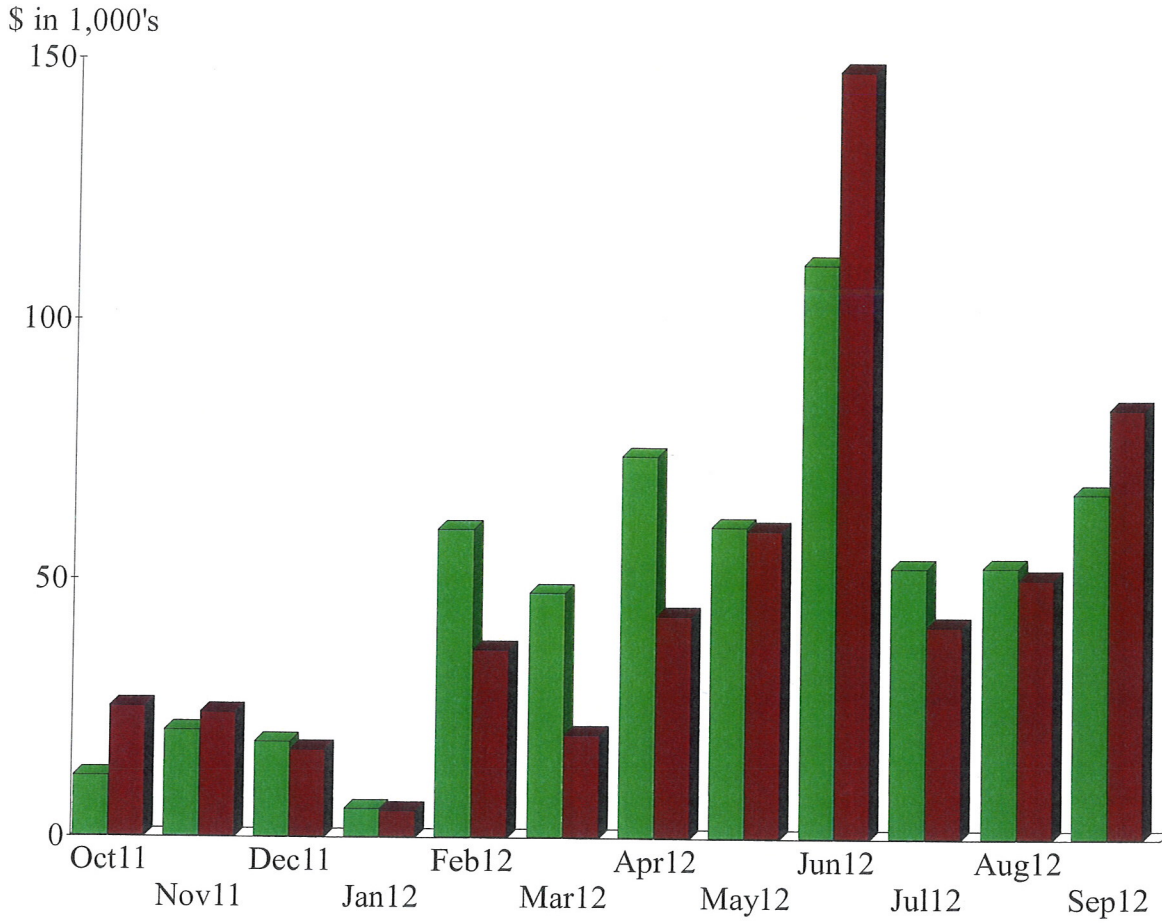
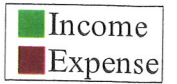
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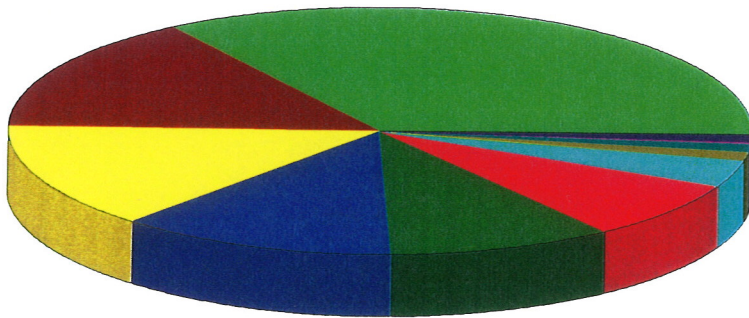


Income and Expense by Month

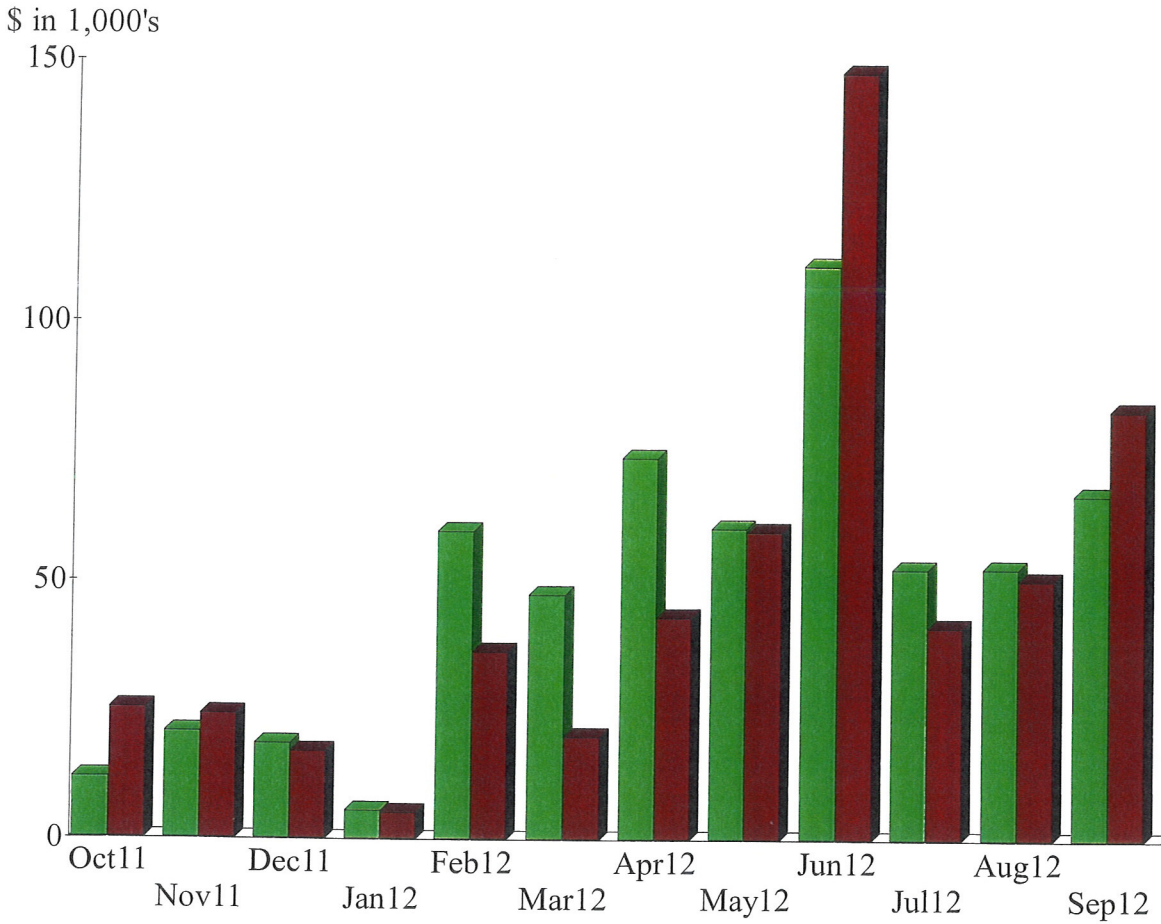

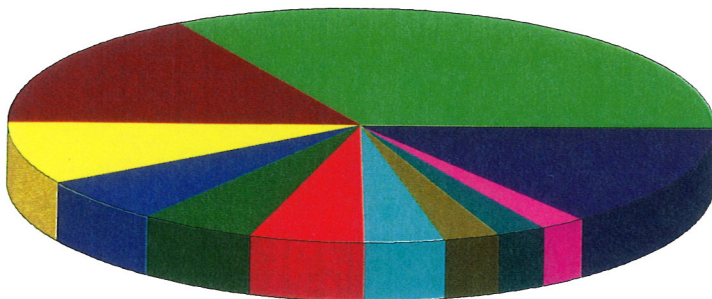
Income and Expense by Month

Football Report 2012

Seniors:

Season 2012 saw the seniors continue to develop and show continued improvement across the season. We managed to play 41 players in the seniors, which is a fantastic effort as it provided our list with the opportunity of gaining invaluable experience in playing high quality GFL football.

We went on to win 14 out of our 18 games with an 11 game win streak and once again play finals football for the second consecutive year. Unfortunately we were unable to play our best football at this time and we lost both of our finals. This feeling will be great motivation for the playing group when training resumes in November.

As season 2013 approaches we will be faced with new challenges that I am sure this group of players will meet head on and continue to develop to feel the ultimate success.

Reserves:

2013 was another successful year for our Reserves side. Entering the season as defending premiers, the boys were always going to attract plenty of attention from the opposing sides. This year we decided to abandon the previous year's rotation policy and play the most committed and best 23 each week. After a narrow Rd 1 loss, the boys gained momentum to reach the interleague bye at 4-2. A terrific effort as during this period the senior section of the club had up to 16 injuries at one stage. This gave our players opportunities to measure themselves under duress, and it paid off. We managed to win every game for the remainder of the home and away season. A terrific New-Towner effort displaying a united and ruthless approach week in week out.

For the second consecutive year the boys claimed the minor premiership in outstanding fashion. Unfortunately that run came to an end in the second semi final against St Josephs. Our reserves side again had their backs to the wall as the Seniors were knocked out of the First Semi – final, reducing the playing list by 7. However the playing group rallied and in a display showing true grit and determination, prevailed against St Mary's in a preliminary final.

The 2013 Grand Final team had 12 absentees from last year's premiership side, and to achieve the success they did with a younger, less experienced outfit was a credit to the players. Unfortunately we were beaten by a better side on the day in St Josephs, however all 23 men fought hard until the final siren. I am incredibly proud of the 23 representatives we had that day, as I am of the whole Senior playing list. We have a terrific playing group at this club, a group that is destined for further success

I would also like to thank all volunteers and members for the season, without you all we could not do what we love doing each week. A special mention to Mark Johnston and Terry Stanley for their unwavering support. Finally to Jacob, Simon, Bernie and Jono Holt, thank you for your continued support and advice throughout the year

Colts:

2012 was a first for all clubs with the introduction of the Colts completion. Teams were graded on their performances over the first 4 weeks of the season and placed into divisions with the new cut off age to be 18½. The aim for our group was to play division 1 to provide the boys with the best possible opportunity to play with and against the strongest teams and players across the Geelong region for their age group. After performing admirably over the first 4 weeks we achieved our initial goal of playing in the top competition which meant there would be no easy games played throughout the season providing a fantastic challenge for our boys.

Our season provided many ups and downs for our lads highlighting what was required from our boys in order to perform to an optimum level every week in order to achieve results in an extremely close competition. The group was successful in 7 of the 18 games and was able to win a couple of games against some very strong opposition. The boys were competitive on the scoreboard for all but 2 weeks throughout the season which is a credit to the boy's, however it also highlights that we are still a little off the mark when competing against clubs that have historically been very strong in junior football.

2013 will provide new challenges for the playing group and it will be interesting to see how the boys progress after being exposed to a high standard of football throughout 2012.

Netball Report 2012

I am pleased to present a netball report for 2012 on behalf of all our netball committee, players, coaches and parents.

SEASON 2012

Season 2012 Newtown & Chilwell fielded 11 junior teams (5 Friday night) (6 Saturday morning), an All Ability team and 5 senior teams making a total of 17 netball teams representing our club every Friday and Saturday.

For the first season in the GFL 19U competition moved from the junior competition to the senior competition, making 5 senior teams competing for our club.

Our club continues to attract, embrace and welcome many new players to the club.

Season 2012 started in 2011 with a great attendance for pre-season. January numbers grew and by the time of the trials in February there were 23 new players trialling with a total of more than 60 players participating in trial selections.

Over the three senior trial sessions 16 new players were selected to be apart of the squad.

One of the most notable things I observed was the acceptance on court and socially of all the new players within the club and the enthusiasm of new members to be the best they could be. A great example of team focus/club focus.

Mid season head coach Lachlan Carlyle reshuffled four of the five senior teams, this saw players moving up and down divisions. Fitness and skills training intensified. The result being C & D grade looking at finals at the end of the season.

C grade played the first elimination final unfortunately with a loss which stopped them going through to the next round of finals. While D grade narrowly missed finals as a result of marginal losses in round 17 and 18.

On the junior front our juniors are going from strength to strength. This season our first team of Saturday juniors progressed to finals since 2007. Next season we want to better that.

The premiers of the netball division of Newtown & Chilwell Football Netball Club were the 'All Abilities' team who took out the grand final defeating Ocean Grove 8 goals to Newtown & Chilwell 11. It was a great victory by the team and celebrated sweetly! A special thankyou to Emma Bright and Elise Hultgren for coaching and team managing; a mammoth effort in developing this team. The result of good relationships formed and consistent support. Well done the AA team!

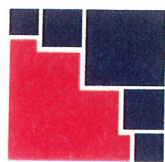
