My heartfelt appreciation to you all for your support this past year and in many cases, for many years, and I truly hope we will see many of you continuing to contribute to netball.

A number of new initiatives were introduced this year with the new structure of the premier competition implemented and the introduction of four 10 minutes quarters to those premier grades. The feedback has wholeheartedly been in support of this quarterly transition and it is planned for expansion to the rest of the competition for 2007. I thank you all for your patience and support during this first year and envisage that 2007 will be a smoother year with us having more knowledge about the impact of such a change. The learning from these initiatives has been invaluable and we will be looking to tidy up areas that may have caused frustration during 2006. As they say "Knowledge is Power" and our aim is ultimately more power to the Clubs.

It has been a challenging year for all involved but I believe challenges are really just unidentified opportunities. My thanks to the Board for their support during the year and the staff of the Centre for their hard work and effort.

Next year is a new year (please, let me state the obvious) and an opportunity to further solidify the advances and learnings made. It is also a World Cup year so Go the Ferns!

# **NETBALL OPERATIONS**

The 2006 season has been a great opportunity to progress netball in the Wellington Centre. The new structure to the competition was implemented and for the most part received positively by all those who were involved. The introduction of the quarters format for Premier and Premier Reserve grades brings the Centre in line with modern netball practices and assists our players and coaches who are going on to the elite level to learn the skills required to excel in this format.

We had an increase in playing numbers this year with 87 club teams and 176 College teams involved in the competition. It is good to see this continuing level of interest and enthusiasm for netball. There was also an increase in the number of teams playing in the Twilight competition with 30 teams in the Oct/ Nov competition and 26 in the Feb/ March one.

The number of umpires in the Centre has increased from 41 to 58 this season. This is a group of enthusiastic people who put additional hours into their umpire training. The umpire section later in the report shows the success achieved this season. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the umpires for their commitment to the Centre and I hope that all players and coaches show their appreciation to our umpires throughout the season.

I would like to thank the 12 College students who formed the Junior Umpires squad. These girls umpired throughout the season and received training and guidance from Holly Far, Kerryn Greaves, and a number of other umpires.

This year we introduced the Fair Play promoters to the Centre. Ray Hogan and Tom Terei supported the player-umpires throughout the season and actively encouraged spectators and players to be positive in their interactions. The number of complaints has been greatly reduced this season and further improvements should be made next season with the retention of these positions. Both Ray and Tom are keen to return so look out for them around the courts next season.

The coaching programmes run this year have been well supported. Frances Solia put together an attractive programme for all level of coaches and was able to complete a large number of practical assessments. The success of the coaches programmes are shown later in this report. The continued improvement of our players is dependent on the quality and consistency of the coaching that is provided. The number of coaches who are improving their knowledge and skills will reflect in our players performance in years to come.

During the year we had some staff changes. Marian Daals took on the role of Umpire Training Co-ordinator in March. Alison Lavin left the Centre in April and





Kylie Summers who had been coaching the junior programmes also has taken over Alison's role. In August we said goodbye to Jo Millett who had been with the Centre for five years as Administration Officer. This position is now filled by Kerry Sipthorpe who brings her years of experience as a player of netball in the Australian scene to our Centre.

The junior participation and development in Wellington City remains strong. The 3 Junior Netball satellites all have well run competitions that provide training and support for players, coaches and umpires. A feature of the relationship between the Centre and the Satellites this year was illustrated with the new Skills and Drills Course for coaches of junior players. This course, which was run in all 3 satellite areas and then at the Wellington Centre, attracted 118 coaches. The majority of these coaches completed their Introductory qualification and some have even gone on to do the Level 1 qualification already. This year 273 teams played in the junior competitions.

Financially it has not been a good year. Although we have secured a greater number of grants, increased sponsorship and more than doubled the income from the cafeteria our income targets were not met. Two fund raising functions that we ran during the year did not receive the hoped for support and we were not successful with two grant applications. This has meant that the expenses we were committed to to implement the new representative programme and court and venue rental obligations were not covered by our income. We also had some debt from previous years to pay back which increased the problem. New budgets have been put in place for the upcoming season to remedy this situation and I look forward to reporting a much more favourable outcome in the next annual report.

Many thanks to all those who have voluntarily provided support to the Centre throughout the year. The coaches who have worked with developing players, the Control Room staff on a Saturday, the umpire trainers, assessors and coaches, the Centre Board members, the administrators and organisers of the junior satellites and all the people who have freely given of their time to make netball a rewarding and enjoyable sport.

Shirley's input into netball in Wellington was greatly appreciated and her passion for the game will be missed by all.



## FACILITY DEVELOPMENT

The pavilion has only required routine maintenance this year. However the kitchen facilities are in dire need of upgrading and a grant application to enable this work to be carried out was put to NZCT at the beginning of the season. We have been very fortunate in that this application has been successful so the work will be carried out in early 2007. This will allow us to improve the facilities that we provide to our members, increase hygiene and attract more people upstairs on a Saturday. It is hoped that by doing this some of the flow out of the venue on a Saturday will become more staggered so that the traffic congestion is relieved to some extent.

#### Multi-Sports Indoor Stadium

After many meetings, years of lobbying and pushing the netball point of view the Wellington City Council has passed the building of a \$40million Community Indoors Sports Venue. The site for this is currently being finalised and it is likely to be completed in 2010. Well done to all of you who have worked over the years to get this facility and to those who put in submission to the draft Annual Plan this year.



Netball Wellington Region has been building on its role in the Region over the last year. It again ran the Super League between top clubs from all of the Centres within the region. This tournament took place in the build up to the Winter season finishing at the end of April. PIC form Wellington Centre won the competition taking the final against Naenae Collegians.

The Region ran two successful events during the year, a breakfast at the TSB Arena and a pre-match dinner in October prior to the first Silver Ferns vs Australian test.

This season the Region has introduced and fostered the new Umpire coaching and assessment structure. A number of umpires from the Wellington Centre have been integral parts of the Regional Umpire panels.

The change to all linear seeded grades throughout the Premier, Premier Reserve, Senior and College grades resulted in many more close games throughout the season. #### PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

#### After School Programme

Total attendees 39 in the July Programme. This again is very popular with the year 5 and 6's and we will ensure this programme is implemented again next year.

#### **Holiday Programme**

These were held at the Hataitai Courts once again with good attendance.<br/>April ProgrammeYears 3 & 44391Years 5 & 65857Years 7 & 81628Development players were used as coaches for the larger groups.

#### **Coaching in Schools**

This year seventeen schools were attended with six others contacted. The coaches from these schools were very proactive in supporting and learning the basic skills taught in these sessions. We only had one coach on board with the schools this year, however the schools were very well attended.

#### **Junior Academy**

Two modules were completed this year with 43 participants for the first module in Term 1, and 48 participants for the second module in Term 2. A great big Thank you to Alison Lavin, Sue Beckford, and Raewyn Penman for coaching these sessions.

The two Block courses had 33 participants in total, 21 for the first Block Module and 12 for the second Block Module. Francis Solia and Cushla Litchwark were again very much appreciated for coaching these Block Modules.

In Term 4 a questionnaire was sent to all of the participants of this years Academy. We are looking to receive more information from the parents and children about how they felt the Academy was run and especially the times and venue. We are trying to ensure we are supporting all the players and providing the best services for them as we possibly can. The response from this questionnaire has been outstanding and we are positive we will be making some great advancements to our Academy programme for 2007







The FunFerns programme was run in the Northern Suburbs and Motukairangi Satelittes this year. Churton Park school played host for 6 sessions for the Northern Suburbs. A wonderful number of 120 children took part in this programme. A big thank you Neil Hargraves, Sue Beckford and Raewyn Penman for coaching these sessions. The Chinese Sport and Cultural Centre in Newtown was the venue for the 6 sessions for Motu Kairangi Fun Ferns. Again an awesome 93 children registered. Thank you to the coaches Raewyn Penman, Sue Beckford, Cushla Litchwark and Francis Solia.

Raewyn spent time with parents on the last session of each programme with the intention to train parents with the Fun Ferns programme to take back to the 5 – 7year olds in schools. This training was provided to increase the skill level of this age group. From these trainings 19 parents attended and we now have Paparangi, Johnsonville, Cashmere and Holy Cross School running Fun Fern sessions in their schools.

Another thank you to Southern Trust for the funding to purchase 10 Fun Fern Kits. We are now able to loan these to our schools to ensure they are supported with the programme.

#### **Health and PE Units**

This year we went into 1 school to introduce the new Health and PE Units provided by Netball New Zealand. In Term 4 we sent an introductory letter to all the primary and intermediate schools in Wellington with the offer of a free session to explain and help promote these units. We have had 3 responses from these letters and 1 school is now planning to use the Units in Term1 and 2.

#### Skills and Drills Course.

This was new development for 2006. There were three sessions aimed at junior coaches to provide easy and applicable skills and drills for their junior teams. 1 session was run in each of the 3 satellites run by Neil Hargreaves and Denise Henderson. The next 2 sessions were held at Hataitai and presented by Ivy Topping and Jill McIntosh. The sessions were well supported with 118 coaches attending. From this course some of these participants went on to achieve Level 1 coaching certificates.

Year 8, held 3 sessions in November with 24 players registering. Covering basics i.e. passing, catching, fitness and an introductory session on what the Junior Academy Programme run. Last session also had a BBQ.

#### College

The talent identification and development programme continued with the same format as 2005. In 2006 72 players were talent spotted not including the U17 and U15 representative squad players. Of the 72, 52 responded to take part in the programme.

Two off season training sessions were organized for these players during the month of October 2005, final session was cancelled due to bad weather. An off season training program was also provided to each player.

A fun day in December 2006 is also arranged for the players to come play some games and have a BBQ. A pre season programme is also being provided to these players for their build up to the February 2007 six week training programme.

#### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Reporting Entity**

Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated) (the Centre) is an Incorporated Society reporting under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and its Constitution.

#### Measurement Base

The general accounting policies recommended by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand and used by the Centre for the measurement and reporting of income and expenses and financial position is the historical cost basis.

#### **Differential Reporting**

The Centre qualifies under the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand's Framework for Differential Reporting as it is not publicly accountable, and is not large. The Centre has applied all Differential Reporting exemptions available to it.

#### Specific Accounting Policies

- (a) These financial statements include income and expenditure for the Centre only.
- (b) Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation has been calculated on either a straight line or a diminishing value basis. This is to write off fixed assets over their estimated economic life as follows:

Building	1-10% SL	and	10-20% DV
Equipment	9-33% DV	and	9.6-20% SL
Office Equipment	36% DV	and	-36% SL
Uniforms	48%SL		

- (c) Accounts Receivable are stated at their expected realisable value after allowance for bad debts.
- (d) The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.
- (e) No taxation is provided for in the financial statements as the Centre is exempt from income tax under section CW39 of the Income Tax Act 2004.
- (f) Grant income is matched against expenditure incurred for that grant during the financial year. Where not all of a grant is spent by the end of the financial year, these unexpended funds are carried forward on the balance sheet into the subsequent financial year and matched to expenditure incurred during that year.
- (g) Finance leases, which effectively transfer to the Centre substantially all of the risks and benefits incidental to ownership of the lease item, are capitalised. The leased assets and corresponding liabilities are disclosed and the leased assets are depreciated over the period the Centre is expected to benefit from their use. Operating lease payments, where the lessors effectively retain substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the lease items, are included in the determination of the operating surplus in equal instalments over the lease term.

#### Changes to Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in previous years.

#### Auditors' Responsibilities
