TREASURER'S REPORT

As treasurer of the Strathfieldsaye Football & Netball Club, I wish to report to members that the club has recorded an operating profit of \$8,583 for the financial year ending 30 September 2013, down from \$13,653 for the 2012 financial year. Whilst the result is down on the previous year, the club has been able to fund its operations from its existing cash reserves and has incurred several large expenses that are not of a recurring nature. It is more important than ever that the committee and the members of the club work hard over the next 12 months to help increase vital revenue streams so we can continue to remain strong and vibrant both on and off the field in a competitive environment.

Operating activities by the club in 2013 consisted of only the scheduled 18 home and matches for the BFNL season, of which 9 were played at home. The fixturing that the club faced for the 2013 season made it extremely difficult in the management of cash flow with limited dates to run successful functions. Let's hope the fixture for 2014 will alleviate this issue.

With this in mind, and as shown in the enclosed financial report, the club was able to generate total revenue of \$387,279 for the financial year, up from the 2012 level of \$326,735. Members will note in the financials, that this increase in revenue was driven by increased sponsorship, bar sales, function income and donations from the Strath Storm supporters group.

Total club expenditure for the season amounted to \$378,696, represented an increase by approximately \$65,614, when compared to the previous year. This overall increase is attributed to increases in the majority of expense categories of the club. Of particular note are the following major expenses items, contribution for the electronic scoreboard \$9,090, increased signage costs \$8,000, purchase of two sets of new playing jumpers \$8,700, additional function expenses \$5,000, increase in league affiliation fees \$8,900 (this includes the final payment for the 2012 season paid in this financial year), increase in players insurance \$1,700 and the addition of a physiotherapist. Overall match day payments to players and coaches were an additional \$2,000 on the 2012 season.

Once again the Strathfieldsaye Football & Netball Club Inc. is grateful in the financial support that it has received during the year from the Strathfieldsaye & District Community Enterprise that assisted with the installation of the electronic scoreboard. The Strathfieldsaye Football & Netball Club appreciates the continued support provided by the Strathfieldsaye & Districts Community Enterprise committee.

The club was able to increase sponsorship revenue for the 2012/13 financial year. This feat was tirelessly coordinated through the hard work of Steve Hetherton and Richard Falconer who were able to attract numerous new sponsors to the club. The club conducted another successful "sponsors day" during our home match against Sandhurst which was well attended by our sponsors. To our sponsors I personally would like to thank the willingness of your organisation to financially support our club, without your continued support the club would not be in the position of strength it currently is in.

As anticipated, the club saw a slight downturn in our membership base in 2013. At season's end, the Strathfieldsaye Football & Netball Club had in excess of 355 members—making the Club still one of the strongest Not for Profit sporting organisations in Central Victoria.

In the 2nd year of the Player Sponsor membership, saw players be active in gaining this membership which resulted in 32 framed players' photos being displayed in the club rooms together with their sponsors' names.

To our members, I thank you for your continued financial contribution to the club in season 2013. The committee will again look at ways of improving our membership packages to provide best value for our members for season 2014, in which I encourage all of you to remain members and to enjoy the benefits on offer in season 2014.

As at the time of writing this report the club has no outstanding liabilities and has over \$10,000 in the bank, to enable a sound starting point for the 2014 season.

In closing this treasurer's report, I wish to thank my fellow executives and committee members for their assistance during my first year as Treasurer and understanding and acceptance of changes that have been implemented.

In particular I would like to thank Kaye and all her assistants for all their hard work in the Canteen through not only match days but all the Thursday night meals and functions held during the year, Leanne and then Dearne in the management of the Bar and to Carmel for all her efforts in the membership and merchandise area. Without the quality of volunteers that we have involved around our club I have no doubt it would not be in the position that it is in.

A strength of our club has been the establishment of the supporters group through the efforts of Mark & Mick and their committee. Through their hard work and those that have joined this group as members it has enabled the club to provide valuable facilities and equipment that has eased the financial strain on the club. With this support it has enabled the club to be able to provide facilities for the players to assist them in achieving success. Thanks for all your efforts I know it is greatly appreciated by all the players.

It has been a challenging and demanding year with the scheduling of our fixtures and the changes to the committee. The experience gained in the past 12 months will serve me well in further strengthening the clubs finances for a period of sustained success and look forward to working with and alongside you for the 2014 season.

It is my pleasure to pen this report as Football Operations Manager for the Strathfieldsaye Football Netball Club. 2013 is the first year of my "official" involvement with the club and what a year to jump on board.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 September 2013

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The committee has determined that the not-for-profit Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of merchandise

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Grant revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the statement of profit or loss when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

Strathfieldsaye Football Netball Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of profit or loss.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised when credited to the nominated bank account.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies continued

Memberships

Revenue from the provision of membership subscriptions is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

(e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Cost of inventory is determined using the standard costs basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Critical accounting estimates and judgments

The committee members have not made any significant accounting estimates or judgements which are likely to affect the future results of the Association.

Expenses were verified to the extent that invoices and receipts were supplied.
