Consideration should be given for past contributions, but with particular emphasis on 2013. Their achievements as a volunteer must be of a standard of excellence to have set themselves apart from their peers so as to warrant them becoming the recipient of this Award. No task is too much trouble and they are always willing to help out in a friendly and helpful manner.
