

Season start

The year kicks off this weekend with Metro Round, with the season consisting of 18 rounds in AFL Victoria's TAC Cup competition.

Regional areas of Warrnambool, Hamilton, Lavington, Camperdown and Mildura are all fixtured to host TAC Cup games in 2014, with the 12 TAC Cup regions to face increased matches against New South Wales (seven), Queensland (six), Tasmania (four) and Northern Territory (three).

The interstate sides will not only participate in the lead up to the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships as per previous years, but for the first time will feature in games post the Championships due to there no longer being division one versus division two matches.

Highlights of the 2014 fixture include five Peter Jackson VFL curtain raiser games, one AFL curtain raiser with the Calder Cannons to face NSW on the SCG on June 14, a metro triple header next Sunday at Highgate Rec. Reserve and a country triple header at Bendigo's Queen Elizabeth Oval in round four.

In a bonus for Victorian football fans, they will also get two opportunities to see the best of AFL Victoria's Country and Metro Academies go head to head, with Visy Park the battle ground on both May 18 and June 8.

AFL Victoria State League & Talent Manager John Hook said the success of the TAC Cup competition in helping develop future AFL players and changes to the 2014 NAB AFL Under 18 Championship structure, has led to other states increasing their participation during the year.

"The overall draft numbers last year again proves how well the structure of Victorian football works in developing players, with the TAC Cup regions and community clubs playing a vital role."

In the various NAB AFL Drafts, 38 players from the TAC Cup were provided a spot on an AFL list, with 26 selected in the November Draft, and another 12 given an AFL Rookie position.

"The TAC Cup again provided the most draftees from across Australia, and it is pleasing to see the majority of them formed part of AFL Victoria's Country and Metro Academies," Hook said.

"Those TAC Cup players not drafted should not be disheartened, but should look at other pathway opportunities available to once again put their name in front of AFL clubs."

The Laguntas program, which saw three indigenous players involved in the inaugural program drafted in 2013, will again play games during three of the five allocated Development Weekend's in the fixture.

The programs final game of the year will be played during the AFL Multicultural Round on the weekend of July 19, and will be against the Majak Daw Western Jets Squad.

A number of VFL venues will host increased TAC Cup games in 2014, with Avalon Airport Oval, Trevor Barker Beach Oval, Box Hill City Oval, Burbank Oval and North Port Oval all scheduled for matches this year.

Neeld moves to Ranges

Mark Neeld has been appointed AFL Victoria's new eastern region Talent Manager.

The former Melbourne coach takes over the role, which includes managing the Eastern Ranges team in the TAC Cup competition, from Anthony Parkin, who has been appointed to the position of Victoria/Tasmania Recruiting Manager with the Port Adelaide Football Club

Neeld was selected from a strong field of applicants, with his vast experience in football and background in the education system a key to his selection.

"Mark possesses the skill set needed for the role of Talent Manager" AFL Victoria State League and Talent Manager John Hook said of the appointment.

"He has a strong background in football, from community right through to AFL level, and we believe this will help him in this new role as he draws on his experiences with players, parents and key football stakeholders at all levels.

"Using his knowledge of the latest trends from the AFL will only benefit the Eastern Ranges as he helps oversee the identification and development of talented players in the region."

Neeld played 74 AFL games for Geelong and Richmond before coaching at community level with Ocean Grove in the Bellarine Football League and St Joseph's in the Geelong Football League. In 2005 he moved to the Western Jets in the TAC Cup, before joining Collingwood in 2008 as an assistant coach. He left the Magpies at the end of the 2011 season after landing the Melbourne senior coaching job.

"It is a really good opportunity," Neeld said regarding his new appointment.

"The multifaceted nature of the role appealed to me, with it involving football operations, talent identification, player

welfare and development amongst a number of other areas.

"It is a terrific program and competition, providing a number of players with an opportunity to be part of a high performance environment and to develop before possibly being drafted into the AFL system or to go on to VFL or other levels of football."

He is no stranger to the TAC Cup competition, having previously coached for three years at the Western Jets, overseeing seeing the likes of Bachar Houli and Callan Ward as they progressed through to the AFL.

"I really enjoyed my previous time within the TAC Cup at the Western Jets.

"It is another one of the attractions of coming back to the TAC Cup competition that you get to work with the up and coming stars."

Eastern Ranges claim TAC Cup premiership

The Eastern Ranges marched to their first TAC Cup premiership since 2002 after dispatching the Dandenong Stingrays, writes David O'Neill.

An almost complete performance by the Ranges finished in a commanding 112-point victory, capping an amazing transformation after struggling to win a game in 2012.

A dominant first half set up a 49-point lead at the main break before the Ranges celebrated their triumph with a 10-goal-to-two final term.

The Stingrays, usually so precise by foot, made error after error to prove no match for a hard-running Eastern side.



While Daniel Capiron (20 disposals) and Billy Hartung (22 and two goals) tried their best to stop the Ranges' charge, they were ultimately overwhelmed by a side hell-bent on premiership glory.

Morrish medallist and Ranges skipper Ben Cavarra added a TAC Cup Grand Final best-on-ground honour to his list of accolades after running riot with 30 disposals.

His ability to find the ball in close and use it on the outside was one of the features of the Ranges' win, but he certainly wasn't alone.

Cavarra was well supported by the work of hard-nut Jordan Walker (26) and the versatile trio of Connor O'Sullivan (22), Christian Petracca (21 and two goals) and Daniel McStay (18 and seven marks).

Returning stars Tom Boyd (four goals) and Mitch Honeychurch (three), along with Matt Traynor (three), Daniel Welsh (three) and Michael Apeness (two) kept the scoreboard ticking over.

After much speculation about his fitness, Boyd took his place in the starting 22 and proved the difference in the opening term.

He bagged three before quarter time as the Ranges took control of the contest.

A 16-point lead at the first break was well deserved after showing none of the nerves that were seemingly strangling their opponents.

Despite spending plenty of time in possession, the Stingrays' poor kicking saw countless forward forays squandered.

The men in yellow and black had little to hang their hats on with small forward Clay McCartney providing their only goal of the first half.

After kicking into the man on the mark, McCartney regathered tight on the boundary and threaded one from the behind post.

But apart from some fine defensive efforts from Capiron, it was the Ranges who impressed most.

Concerned by Boyd's extra height, the Stingrays' under-



sized defence twice gave away free kicks to the 199cm giant, allowing him to return from an ankle injury in style.

Things only got worse for the Stingrays in the second term as the Ranges put the foot down.

Two 50m penalties and a clever snap saw Welsh finish the quarter with three goals of his own and his team with a 49-point advantage.

If the Stingrays were hoping for a form reversal in the second half they were soon on the back foot when Honeychurch and Petracca bagged the first two goals of the third term.

Finally after 11 unanswered majors, the Stingrays hit back with two in a row, both to the tireless Hartung.

But any plans of a fight back were soon scrapped when Jacob Crowe steadied on his left to goal and regain the ascendancy for the Ranges.

Despite Boyd shanking a set shot after the three quarter time siren, his side remained in control, 64-points ahead.

The flood gates quickly opened in the final term as the Ranges put a full stop on a

stellar season with some of their best football of the year.

Boyd, after being well held for the middle two quarters, found his rhythm again, while Traynor made the most of his chances at the big man's feet.

The 112-point margin may not have told the full of story of the difference between the two sides but it did prove the victory emphatic.

The Ranges now have two TAC Cup premierships to their name, while the trophy cabinet at the Stingrays remains bare.

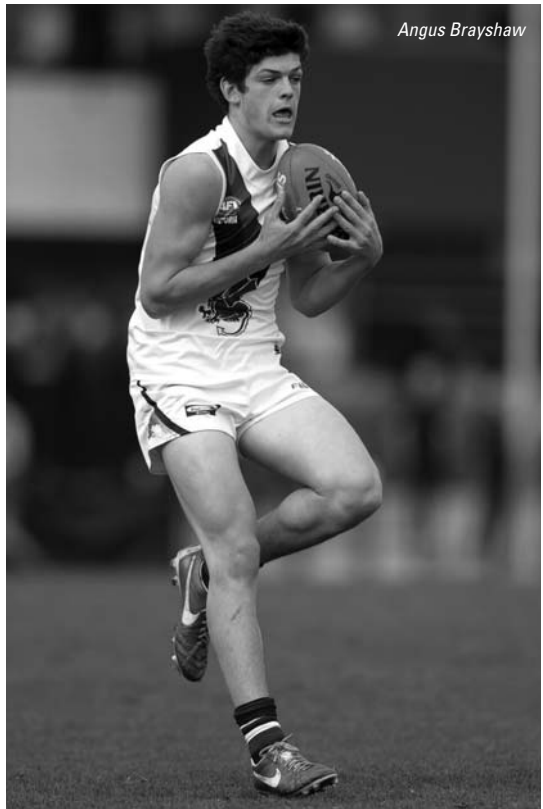
What can we expect from Sandringham in 2014?:

A final squad of 22 and three emergencies will be named following the camp, which will also include a raft of education, cultural strengthening and bonding sessions.

AFL Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Clark said this year's squad was difficult to finalise because of the high number of talented youngsters trying out.

"Everyone who participated in the tryouts and the camp is to be commended for their commitment," Clark Said.

"Ultimately this program is designed to help develop young Indigenous footballers on and off the field and maximise their chance of gaining a place in the mainstream talent pathway."

"We want to see as many of these boys as possible on the lists of TAC Cup regions in three years and this squad contains a number of boys who can, with hard work and dedication, achieve that."

Clark said some players who missed selection in the final

squad would get an opportunity to play in a combined Multicultural and Indigenous team at the V/Line Cup in April.

"Even the greats of our game will have had times in their development where they missed selection in a representative team or had a similar setback," he said.

"As footballers, we grow and mature at different stages, so we will endeavour to stay engaged with all of those boys who participated in the regional trials and High Performance Camp."

"The Kickstart initiative is just one component of AFL Victoria's Indigenous Programs and there will be more opportunities in the coming years for these boys to showcase their talent."

The final squad includes three players from Tasmania, along with players from Metropolitan Melbourne and as far away as Lakes Entrance, Shepparton and Warrnambool.

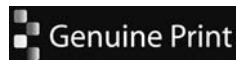

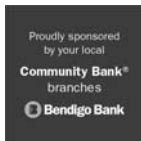
