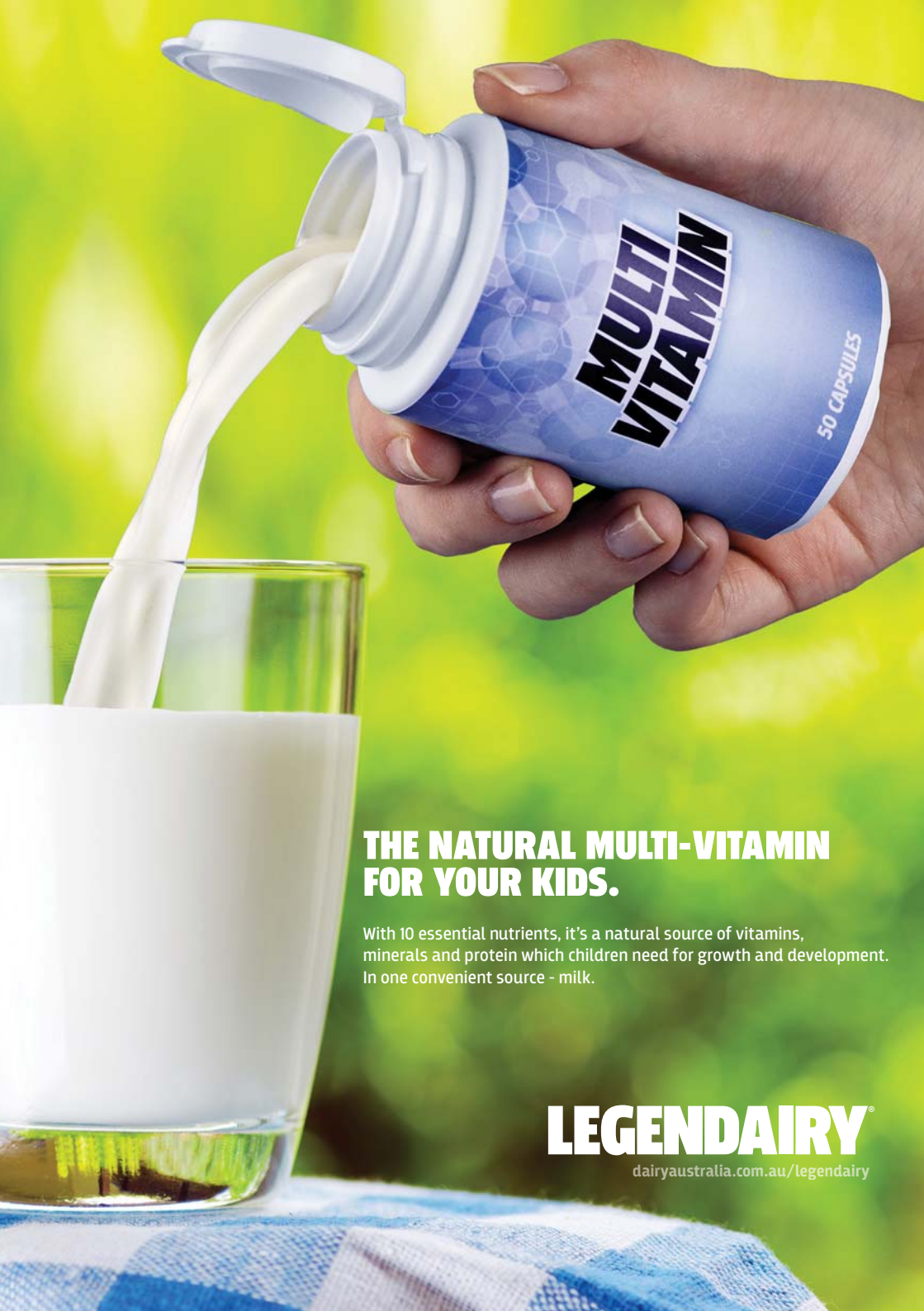

ANZAC Day

ANZAC Day is a special day on the Australian calendar.

It is a day when we remember and pay tribute to all those women and men who served their country so selflessly and bravely in various conflicts over the years.

And, it is a day we salute those fallen heroes who sacrificed their life so we can enjoy the lifestyle we currently do.

Just last June, the Victorian football community was saddened to hear of the loss of one of its 'graduates' when Corporal Cameron Stewart Baird was killed while on active duty in Afghanistan.

The loss of Corporal Baird resonates particularly strongly within the TAC Cup competition as he played for the Calder Cannons, under legendary coach Robert Hyde, where he counted Paul Chapman, Jude Bolton and Ryan O'Keeffe amongst others as his teammates.

Corporal Baird was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross (the 100th recipient of the award) earlier this year.

According to the Defence Force's official citation, Cameron Baird died how he lived - at the front, giving his all with no hesitation or indecision.

Six years earlier Corporal Baird was awarded a medal for gallantry. From all that you read and hear about him, Corporal Baird was the sort of person who was always prepared and willing to put the welfare of others before his own.

At the time that the award was announced, Ian Kyte, the current Talent Manager of Corporal Baird's former club, the Calder Cannons, said that "it really brought home to our kids last year that footy is just a game and we're lucky to live in this country."

This season the Calder Cannons will name their "most courageous player" award after Corporal Baird, a small gesture but a fitting tribute which "will keep him in the minds of everybody at the club," Kyte said.



In Round five TAC Cup action, Calder Cannons will host North Ballarat Rebels on ANZAC Day, playing for the ANZAC Day Cup.

As part of this week's round of Peter Jackson VFL matches, Frankston and Bendigo will host Richmond and Footscray respectively on ANZAC Day where the pregame activities will suitably commemorate the spirit of ANZAC Day.

The AFL match between Collingwood and Essendon has become intrinsically linked to ANZAC Day as a suitable tribute and opportunity for reflection about those who have and currently serve our country so proudly. These two sides also play each other in the VFL this weekend in the ABC TV game.

ANZAC Day services and those football matches that incorporate tributes provide us all with an opportunity to salute our courageous service people, past and present.

Also on ANZAC Day, AFL Victoria launches the Victorian Women's Football League season with three matches at Shepley Oval, Dandenong. The headline match is the VWFL All Stars, a team selected from 14 teams over five divisions, and the Defence Force All Stars, a team of players who are current service women within the Army, Navy or Air Force.

This game is preceded by an U18 girls match between Vic Country and Vic Metro as well as a women's game between two sides made up of female players striving to be drafted at this year's Women's Draft to play for either the Western Bulldogs or Melbourne in the upcoming AFL match in June.

Providing support for parents

Donald McDonald certainly knows football.

Playing 155 games for North Melbourne taught him plenty about the game.

When one career ended, a new one started. Donald went on to become a successful coach in the VFL, and then worked in football operations for North Melbourne, further enhancing his football knowledge.

As a father, Donald also knows about supporting a young son through challenging talent pathways and the TAC Cup. Donald's son Luke was part of the Oakleigh Chargers program. His talent evident in his TAC Cup games for the Chargers, Luke was selected for Vic Metro in the under 18 championships.

Since then Luke has gone on to be drafted by North Melbourne (father-son) in the 2013 draft and after debuting in round one this year, has played in every game for the Kangaroos so far this season.

So when it came to talking to parents about supporting their son's football career at the recent TAC Cup parent information session, Donald was able to provide parents with a wealth of firsthand experience.

Donald stepped aside from his role as North Melbourne football chief to work in the commercial department to enable Luke to forge his own way and make his own name at the club.

So it was no surprise that one of the key messages he stressed to parents was that "you don't need to coach your son, you need to support them."

With the TAC Cup coaching ranks brimming full of experienced and well qualified coaches, Donald implored parents to let these coaches do their job.

Rather than focusing on being the coach, Donald advised parents that playing the support role would be a far greater help to their sons football development.

He encouraged parents to get educated about the program set in place by the club, and then look to help their son when they need to do things away from the club.

This could be something like helping them adhere to special dietary requirements around trainings and games, completing training diaries or individual rehab or fitness sessions.

Completing year 12 at school is a challenging time in itself, combining that with TAC Cup commitments means that it can be a very stressful period.

Donald encouraged parents to help de-stress their sons and remind them about the importance of having a balance in their life, so it's not just all about football.

Despite the stress, late teenage years are often looked back on by many as being a great time in their lives. With it all going so quick, Donald reminded parents to balance the seriousness with a bit of fun.

"Let them enjoy it and make sure they have a good time."

School Principal Graham Spencer also spoke to parents on behalf of the TAC about how they can support their sons as they transition from L-plate drivers to P-plates.

While L-plate drivers are the safest group of drivers on the road, the accident rate for P-platers soars once the parent is removed from the car and they are driving on their own. The death rate of 15 – 24 year males is disproportionately high. Providing a positive parental influence and teaching young drivers to make good decisions is crucial to reduce this rate.

State Academy trial matches

While the Easter long weekend saw a break in the TAC Cup schedule, it was a big weekend for the AFL Victoria under 18 state academy squads.

Both the Victoria Metro and Country academies were in action with players vying for selection for this year's NAB AFL Under 18 Championships teams.

Visy Park hosted the Easter feast of talent, with Vic Country playing trial matches against the Northern Territory and NSW/ACT under 18 teams on Good Friday, and Vic Metro playing an intra-club match on Easter Sunday.

In the first match, Northern Territory got off to a great start. But as the Vic Country team made up of Bendigo Pioneers, Murray Bushrangers and North Ballarat Rebels players got used to their new team mates and worked together they began to dominate.

The constant rain and slippery conditions didn't slow down Vic Country's goal scoring as they pushed on to record a comprehensive victory.

Final score: Vic Country 21.7.133 defeated Northern Territory 4.5.28

The rain cleared and the sun shone through for the second match, with NSW/ACT setting the tempo early and showing plenty of class.

Again it took some time for the Vic Country team, made up of Geelong Falcons, Gippsland Power and Dandenong Stingray players, to get going.

After the halftime break, a much better team effort from Vic Country saw them chip away at the seven goal deficit and set up a thrilling last quarter.

A strong and determined NSW/ACT team held on, winning by two points.

Final score: NSW/ACT 9.10.64 defeated Vic Country 9.8.62

For the interstate teams, who will be playing additional games in the TAC Cup this year, it was a great test being able to pit themselves against some of the best players in the competition.

For Vic Country coach Mark Ellis it was an opportunity to see how his players fared under pressure from quality opposition and how they fitted in to a new team dynamic.

"We had about 48 to 50 boys coming in that have all been in good form in their TAC Cup games, the good part about today is seeing how they go playing at the next level.

"You watch them play in their TAC Cup games and it's exciting to watch them play. Here we get to see what they can do at a different level and how they gel together quickly as a team," Ellis said.

Usual team mates found themselves in the strange position of matching up against each other in the Vic Metro intra-club match. But as the players crossed the white line, friendships were quickly put aside and a tough contest ensued.

Metro coach David Flood challenged his players, running them through a number of different positions and seeing how they reacted under pressure.

It was a solid hit out, with plenty of skill on display. In a fast flowing game, there was only a few goals difference between the two teams all day.

Final Score: Vic Metro Navy 10.10.70 defeated Vic Metro Teal 7.12.54

While the players were all vying for individual selection, the emphasis for both Country and Metro coaches was on team work and seeing who was prepared to put the team first.

The coaches now face the unenviable task of making selection decisions as they look to finalise their teams for the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships that commence in May.

This weekend is a highlight in the TAC Cup fixture for a number of clubs, with a game on ANZAC Day and a match played under lights.

Calder Cannons will host the North Ballarat Rebels on ANZAC Day at the newly named RAMS Arena with RAMS Home Loans becoming naming right sponsors for Highgate Recreation Reserve.

The two teams will be playing for the inaugural Calder Cannons v North Ballarat Rebels ANZAC Day Cup, with both clubs looking forward to starting a tradition of playing against each other on this very special day on the Australian calendar.

The Cannons will host a special post match function in the

Highgate function room, with all families and supporters from both teams welcomed to attend.

On Saturday night the Murray Bushrangers will take on the Eastern Ranges in the first TAC Cup game played under lights at the Norm Minns oval in Wangaratta.

The Bushrangers, who have been in great form so far this season, will have a big home crowd behind them as they go up against the reigning premiers in a great display of TAC Cup football.

RISING STAR

Grouch another Rising Star nominee

Former North Ballarat Rebel Matt Grouch received the perfect birthday present, named the Round Five NAB AFL Rising Star nominee after playing only his third game for Adelaide Football Club.

The midfielder, who turned 19 on Monday, was one of the team's best in the 65-point win over the GWS Giants last Sunday.

Matt's match tally of 28 possessions could have been more had he not been subbed out of the game at three-quarter time.

Adelaide Crows coach Brenton Sanderson said Matt has made an immediate impact.

"Matt has a real hunger to learn more about the game and his role in the team," Sanderson said.

"He is also a fierce competitor, who makes great decisions under immense pressure."

North Ballarat Rebels Talent Manager Phil Partington said it was a great reward for Matt so early in his AFL career.

"It is outstanding news for Matt; we as a program always thought Matt would make an impact when he would play AFL football.

"His first few games have been exceptional, and it is great to see him receive a Rising Star nomination so early in the season."

His coach at the Rebels in 2013, David Loader said despite those outside the Rebels' program questioning Matt's running ability, the positives far outweighed this minor area of his game.

"Our push to all the recruiting staff and people watching the game was that you don't have to be the best runner in the world when the ball is in your hands at every stoppage.

"He had a phenomenal ability to read the football, and be where the ball was at all times," Loader said.

"His year with us last year was nothing short of outstanding, despite only playing seven or eight games due to injury, he only missed the Morrish Medal by four votes.

"His ability to win the contested football in close was always going to hold him in great stead when he went to the next level."

Matt was the Crows' first selection, (selection 23 overall) in the 2013 NAB AFL Draft. He played two games for Vic Country in the 2013 NAB AFL Under 18 Championship before breaking his hand, but he finished the TAC Cup season in great form averaging 37 disposals (16 contested), seven clearances and five tackles for North Ballarat Rebels.

Matt was originally recruited from Beaufort is also a graduate of the AFL National Academies. Matt's brother and Crows teammate Brad was a rising star nominee in Round 14 last year.

The previous round former Oakleigh Chargers player Luke McDonald was named the Round Four NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.



Bouncing around with mates

Talented young umpires will have the chance to learn from the very best this year through the 2014 Mates Program.

It's a moment even the elite find nerve racking.

Picture it: Standing in the middle of the footy field, a huge crowd in attendance, and all eyes on you and the bounce of the football.

For young umpires and even those like veteran AFL umpire Ray Chamberlain, the centre bounce – especially at the start of a big match – can be the stuff of nightmares.

"I remember the first bounce I had in the 2010 grand final," Chamberlain said.

"108,000 people at the G and it felt like I had a hand grenade in my hands.

"Even now after almost 200 games it's the one thing that you still think about," Chamberlain said.

"Some days you feel like you couldn't miss one if you tried but other times you have no idea where it's going."

Chamberlain said with hard work, he was able to bridge the gap between his best and his worst.

"I had some good people help me work on it and it probably took almost four years of hard work to get to the stage where over 24 rounds of the season I was confident I would come out ahead of the curve."

Through the Mates Program, Chamberlain and six of his AFL colleagues will have the chance to pass on these important lessons to young umpires from Melbourne's premier competitions.

The two-time AFL Grand final umpire will be paired with three young whistle blowers from the Southern Football League in a mentoring initiative designed to fast-track their development.

"With umpiring it's not about doing anything particularly sexy, it's about consistently and predictably positioning yourself in the right spots to see the information.

"Once you see that information it's about being able to make the right decisions.

"Umpiring community football is just as simple. The rules aren't different, the dimensions of the ground aren't different and our role isn't different, so it's just about coping with the environment."

Chamberlain said being part of the Mates Program was his way of repaying the support he received as a young umpire.

"I grew up in Sydney and I had guys like Peter Carey and David Howlett, who are former AFL Umpires and legends in our sphere, who would stay over in Sydney to watch me umpire a state league game and provide me with feedback.

"Without them and others who have supported me through I wouldn't have had the opportunity to umpire AFL footy.

"I feel it's important to give something back and help people who are keen and want to get better. We want them to know that they're one of us and we want to them to have fun and do well at it."
