

## Haileybury Team Managers Required

All the football teams from Years 7-12 require team managers to assist the coach so that he can focus on coaching and developing the team. The role of a team manager would be to:

- Promote parents to stand together to support the team appropriately.
- · To organise a goal umpire and boundary umpire for each match. A roster system works best.
- · To fill up the drink bottles and bring out to each break.
- · To organise a Fruit roster.
- To keep score and goal kickers and to pass this information to the coach and student allocated to write the weekly report.
- · To attend to any minor injuries.
- To assist the coach in managing major injuries and to help get the injured player the required attention.
- · To manage the equipment supplied to the team.
- · To take some photos throughout the season and pass onto the coach.

The bloods started the third quarter right where we left off kicking multiple early goals to find ourselves in a comfortable lead. Russell Ebert, father of Brett Ebert and legend of the Port Adelaide Magpies and Power Football club, provided the boys with an insight into what it takes to become a professional football player. He emphasised the fact that to become a member of the Port Adelaide Football Club, it takes more than talent - it takes character, attitude and GRIT which play a massive role in the choice of Port recruiters. The boys were lucky enough to train on Alberton Oval under the guidance of Phillip Walsh, midfield coach of Port, who directed the boys and gave them tips on how to win the most vital ball, centre clearances. With the help of former Haileyburian and now Port Adelaide player, Karl Amon, the boys were able to hit the showers that the likes of Chad Wingard, Ollie Wines and Justin Westoff regularly use.

This marked the end of the Adelaide tour for 2014, and it was off to the airport for the boys and time to return to Melbourne to continue training hard in preparation for round 1 against St.Kevins.
