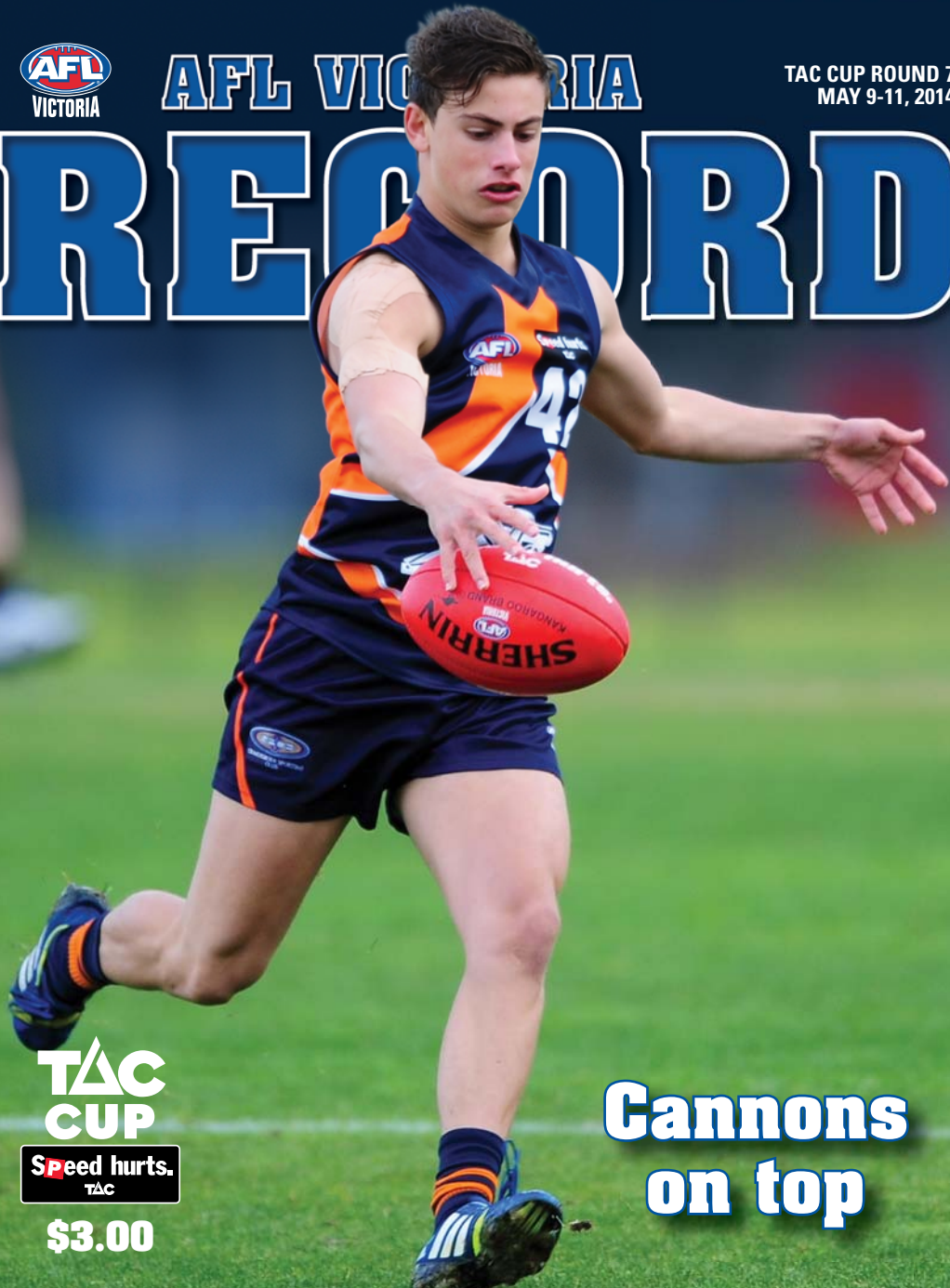

The People's Game

When Gillon McLachlan was recently appointed as the new CEO of the AFL, he spoke passionately about the importance, value and fabric of the game.

McLachlan noted significantly how the game is intrinsically linked to people, to communities, to towns and cities.

And, that's certainly true of the VFL with its reach, appeal, affordability and connection with the footy fan. Basically, it's tailored so everyone can enjoy our great game.

AFL Victoria, along with the VFL clubs, strive to ensure that the VFL competition is accessible and caters for everyone who wants to watch high-quality State League level football from close range, and to see the players that will be the future stars of the AFL competition develop and improve.

It's that promotion and accessibility to the players and coaches at the quarter and three-time huddle, kick to kick on the ground at the breaks, the grass roots "elbows on the fence" feel that adds just another dimension to the Peter Jackson VFL.

You can also do this within the TAC Cup competition. There is no charge for entry and you can gain a sneak preview of players that will be stars of the future and the prodigious talent that exists in Victorian underage football.

Many clubs in the Peter Jackson VFL have worked extremely hard in recent years to implement various community engagement programs, not only because this is the right thing to do, but it provides them the opportunity to play a broader leadership role in their communities.

A welcoming, inclusive, safe, family friendly, affordable and entertaining environment is something every club should strive for. Undoubtedly, on field success will follow.

Last weekend there was a further example of how AFL Victoria is working to improve the game for participants and those directly involved in leagues, clubs and communities, with the joint announcement

that Moorabbin Oval will be redeveloped into a community football hub.

Football in Melbourne's southeast will benefit significantly from the funding allocated in the 2014/15 Victorian State Budget, which will result in a new headquarters for football that services about 15,000 players, their families as well the volunteers that support these clubs.

It will also be the cornerstone of the region's talent and participation pathways by catering for football development programs including NAB AFL Auskick, school football, women's football and AFL 9s through to coaching and volunteer education.

AFL Victoria has been chairing a working party with the key stakeholders, including the local community leagues, the AFL, St Kilda Football Club and the Kingston Council, to collaboratively plan for the revitalisation of the Moorabbin Community Reserve.

As part of the multi-million dollar redevelopment of Moorabbin, the Sandringham Dragons, the Southern Football League and the South Melbourne Junior League will be all based at Moorabbin.

Included in the redevelopment will be an extensive refurbishment of the facilities to bring them up to best possible standards, which will allow St Kilda to use the venue as its home base when it fields a stand-alone team in the Peter Jackson VFL in 2016.

Also, light towers, which have stood inoperable for years, will be reconnected paving the way for possible night football at Moorabbin.

No second year blues for Baker

In his first year as head coach of the Western Jets, Torin Baker wanted his team to be competitive.

His holistic approach to the role, developing the person as well as the footballer, struck a chord with his playing group and competitive they were.

The Jets made the finals series in 2013 off the back of a solid season, surprising a few observers with some of their wins along the way.

With a year's worth of TAC Cup experience under his belt, Baker's desire to build on last season and improve shines through.

"I think as a coach in the TAC Cup you are learning every game and you continue to learn all the way through," Baker said.

With a playing career that included time at Werribee in the VFL, St Joseph's in the Geelong Football League (winning the league best and fairest in 2007), a playing coach role at Camperdown in the Hampden Football League and a premiership with Spotswood in 2011, Baker certainly has a vast degree of football experience.

But his role at the Jets has also given him a whole new experience and skill set.

"It's just been a great experience in terms of managing a whole group of people. That is probably one of the biggest

challenges of the role, managing 50 players and about 20 to 30 staff.

"Managing that amount of people takes an enormous amount of time. I think I am getting better with it with more experience and I really value the position that I have."

He admits that it hasn't been an easy start to the season this year for the Jets.

"We didn't really have our full squad to choose from early (due to injuries) so it was a slow start for us.

"We had some really tough opposition to play early on. Playing Sandringham, Calder and Oakleigh all in the first three rounds certainly tested our boys."

Consecutive 40 and 46-point losses in the first two rounds will test any coach's resolve. But from those losses came plenty of learnings. Ever the optimist, Baker continued to instil his core values across the team through his positive messaging and feedback.

It was in the seven point loss to Oakleigh Chargers that Baker began to see a marked improvement across his playing group.

"We were really pleased with the effort the players were

giving. Even though we didn't win the Oakleigh match it was a real turning point for our season.

"We have been able to get a better mix of players through some injuries recovering and I have been really pleased since the Oakleigh game," Baker said.

The Jets have gone on to defeat Northern Territory by a whopping 122-points, Dandenong by 3-points in a thriller and Gippsland by 36-points in a dominant display to have them sitting 5th on the TAC Cup ladder.

What has pleased Baker the most is the across the board contributions from



his players, with everyone playing their role in a true team effort.

"When certain players haven't played well, other players have stood up and played really well.

"One player that has been really consistent over the time is Connor Menadue, his season whether we have been going well or are up against it has been outstanding."

An athletic half back flanker, Menadue has been named in the Jets best players numerous times already this season and is one of the eight Jets players in the initial Vic Metro squad for the NAB AFL U18 National Championships.

Baker also points out Corey Ellis as another player that's had a great start to the year, but who the Jets now lose due to his school football commitments.

While the Jets players that have gone on to be drafted into the AFL have been well publicised, what is not as well-known is that there is currently 17 former Jets players on the list for VFL affiliate Williamstown.

Baker acknowledges that the strong alliance developed by both clubs has given a number of Jets players an alternative pathway and opportunity to experience senior elite level football.

"Our players that don't get drafted see it as a real stepping stone."

But it's not just the players that benefit from the association, with Baker finding a mentor of his own at Williamstown.

"I have been able to work closely with Andy Collins (Williamstown coach) to see what he does and that's been a real benefit."

A keen student of the game, Baker has been a strong advocate for the new rules being phased into the TAC Cup competition this year.

Whilst it's not a penalised rule for 2014, the coaches are implementing structures with two players staying inside forward 50 and another two players forward of centre to enable a more free flowing form of football that showcases the players talents.

"I think the congestion in today's footy is not great and I think when you go back a level from AFL to VFL and TAC more congestion makes for poor quality games.

"I have enjoyed the rule and I hope that it gets introduced into other competitions as well. I can really see the benefits of it, every game we play its good open attractive footy to watch and it's good to coach as well."

It's easy to see that Baker is enjoying his coaching role at the Jets and that his squad enjoys playing for him, the results are speaking for themselves.

Friday Night Lights

Being able to step on to the playing surface at Simmonds Stadium in Geelong is an inspiring experience in itself.

Home to the Geelong Football Club, it's a ground often referred to as one of the best playing surfaces in the AFL.

So many champion AFL footballers have graced its hallowed turf, so many classic matches and displays of brilliance have prevailed at the ground.

This Friday night Geelong Falcons and Calder Cannons players will partake in an experience of a lifetime, playing the first TAC Cup match at Simmonds Stadium under lights.

A joint effort by AFL Victoria, Simmonds Stadium

Management, Geelong Football Club, City of Greater Geelong and the TAC Cup clubs has enabled the match to be scheduled.

Both clubs have been eagerly anticipating the round 6 clash. With Calder sitting on top of the TAC Cup ladder and the Falcons just one game behind in 4th position, it's a clash that many spectators are also eagerly anticipating.

Both clubs have started the season in outstanding form, and it promises to be a great display of TAC Cup football on the big stage.

Gippsland coach pulls the boots back on for a good cause

Completing the arduous hikes up and down Mt Hotham with his players during preseason has paid off for Gippsland Power coach Leigh Brown.

Brown was part of the victorious Collingwood team that defeated arch rivals Carlton in the Legends Match at Visy Park last weekend. The clash helped raise funds for the Peter McCullum Cancer Foundation and the EJ Whitten Foundation for Prostate Cancer Awareness.

It was Brown's fitness levels that really stood out as he continually presented in the forward line. His ability to take those big strong grabs was still evident and impressive in the wet and slippery conditions.

Deep into the final term Brown's second goal of the game,

a booming torp from outside 50 on the boundary line sealed the 20-point win for Collingwood in a tight contest. Brown was awarded the Eddie McGuire medal for his best on ground performance for the pies.

He will be hoping his forwards can emulate his performance this Sunday when Gippsland Power take on Queensland in Morwell. With Power getting off to an uncharacteristic slow start in 2014, they will be looking to turn their season around against a very competitive Queensland outfit that are fine tuning for the NAB AFL U18 National Championships.

Home ground advantage

The tools and Bailey Ladders have been in use at a number of TAC Cup clubs of late as their facilities are rejuvenated.

The biggest project is taking place at Shepley Oval, the home of Dandenong Stingrays, with the redevelopment of the Shepley Oval pavilion. Work is well underway on the new change rooms which will see more space for visiting teams, along with vastly improved facilities for the Stingrays football operations and administration.

Stingrays Talent Manager Mark Wheeler has thanked his fellow Talent Managers and TAC Cup clubs for their support of the redevelopment.

"We would like to express our appreciation to the TAC Cup teams that have played matches at Shepley Oval so far for the understanding being shown during the construction period," Wheeler said.

It's a home coming for the Sandringham Dragons this weekend as they play their first game in over a year at their home ground.

A major redevelopment of the playing surface at the Trevor Barker Beach Oval has kept them off the ground, but now that it is completed the Dragons are looking forward to taking on the Oakleigh Chargers in Sandringham at their spiritual home.

And Gippsland Power have recently completed an extension of their Centre of Excellence building, with the already impressive facility adding a new gym area, hot and cold spa pools and offices for the clubs administration.

Tom Langdon nominated for Rising Star

Former Sandringham Dragons player Tom Langdon is the Round Seven NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

Langdon, selected by Collingwood at pick 65 in the 2013 NAB AFL Draft, was best on ground in the Magpies' 34-point win against Carlton last Friday night.

Fielded in his now familiar role across half back, Langdon demonstrated poise and composure belying his years, routinely foiling the Blues with his innate ability to regularly intercept.

Collecting 23 disposals, including 10 contested possessions, and eight marks, Langdon once again demonstrated his penchant for the big stage, which began with his AFL debut in Round One.

Langdon played junior football with the Glen Iris Gladiators before joining the Sandringham Dragons. He represented Vic Metro in the 2012 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships.

After being overlooked in the 2012 Draft, Langdon returned to the Dragons as a 19 year old and played three senior VFL games with the Sandringham Zebras as the 23rd man. He attended the 2013 NAB AFL Draft Combine where he tested well.

The former Dragon featured in all three pre-season games for Collingwood in February, with the ease of his transition to the elite level helping mount an irrepressible case for selection in the opening match of the season.

Langdon's subsequent performances have proven sufficient reward for Collingwood's show of faith, ranking eighth overall in the competition for intercept marks, and twelfth for rebound 50s.

Collingwood coach Nathan Buckley said he is impressed with Tom's resilience.

"Tom was originally



passed over in the 2012 draft giving him resilience, a drive and a desire to embrace his opportunity and take it with both hands. Having played only seven games, he still has a long way to go in his football journey, but what we have seen so far has been very encouraging," he said.

Sandringham Dragons Talent Manger Ryan O'Connor knew the potential was always there with Langdon and is very pleased to see him achieving at the highest level.

"It is a win for the system and the 19 year old rule in the TAC Cup, but it is also a credit to Tom and his family, that he stayed on course and believed in himself and worked through to where he is now.

"It is a credit to him what he has been able to do in the AFL system. We always thought there would be some upside to him with some extra training, and I think he has embraced the full time AFL regime, playing an exciting brand of football and it is great to see one of our kids out there like that."

AFL Victoria Umpire Rookie Squad underway

An Umpire Rookie Squad has been developed by AFL Victoria to help bridge the gap between community and State League umpiring.

The inaugural AFL Victoria Umpire Rookie Squad commenced this month.

The squad is made up of 16 young field umpires from metropolitan and country groups including Ballarat, Bendigo & Gippsland.

These umpires were recommended by their community coach with the outlook of them being 1-2 years away from state league umpiring, and completing their first sessions with the AFL Victoria Senior & Development Squads last month.

"The purpose of this squad is to bridge the gap between community and State League umpiring by providing the umpires with a good understanding of the fitness and the professionalism required at this level," AFL Victoria State League Head Umpiring Coach Cameron Nash said.

"At the end of the season, these umpires will be better prepared if they trial for the VFL.

"It will also develop their umpiring so they hopefully improve throughout the season with their local groups as well."

The rookie squad will train every second Tuesday night at Victoria Park with the aim of better preparing them for the step up to State League football.

Former AFL and three time VFL Grand Final umpire Brett Ritchie is coaching the squad, and will be assisted once per month by 2012 All Australian and AFL Grand Final umpire Matt Stevic.

Matt took his first session this week with the rookie squad, and highlighted the importance of health & fitness with the group and what they should be doing now to assist them in taking the next step.

Matt will run various sessions throughout the season with the aim of providing these young umpires with the necessary information and advice to assist their development.

The umpires will also be observed regularly in their local matches by Brett, Bill Torney (Talent Assessor) and former VFL umpire Shane Mason.

Auskick boost for kids with Autism

It may not have made the headlines in the weekend papers, but one very important NAB AFL Auskick Centre opened its doors last Saturday.

The Irabina Auskick Centre held its first session at Irabaina's offices in Baywater, with more than 50 young boys and girls with Autism given a chance to learn the skills of Australian football.

Irabina is a not-for-profit organisation that specialises in early intervention programs and services for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

FIDA Football Administration Manager Logan Whitaker, who, along with AFL Victoria Football Development Manager Aaron Baily, helped establish the clinic said they were excited by how many people turned up for the first ever session.

"It's never been offered before so to have more than 50 girls and boys in attendance was fantastic.

"To see so many kids, all of whom have autism, having fun playing football with their brothers, sisters, mums and dads, shows how important it is to offer these sorts of programs."

Whitaker said the aim of the Auskick Centre was to improve gross motor skills and help increase confidence levels.

"It really has so many benefits and flow-on effects," he said. "The kids are obviously being physically active but it's also a great way for parents to engage with them."

In a further boost, Deakin and Victoria Universities will undertake a study to see if the regular clinics do indeed help improve the motor skills of the girls and boys involved.

Whitaker said the new AFL Victoria Access All Abilities NAB AFL Auskick Strategy (funded in partnership with Sport and Recreation Victoria), would provide a model for Auskick



that supports and develops inclusive Australian football opportunities for boys and girls with disabilities, in an enjoyable and supportive environment.

He said the All Abilities Strategy would hopefully lead to more centres like this being set up in the not too distant future.

AFL Victoria backs funding announcement for Moorabbin Redevelopment

AFL Victoria welcomes the announcement from the Victorian State Government of an \$8 million contribution to the redevelopment of the Moorabbin Community Reserve.

Football in Melbourne's southeast will benefit significantly from the funding allocated in the 2014/15 State Budget that will result in a new headquarters for football bodies that service 15,000 players and their families, as well the volunteers that support these clubs.

AFL Victoria General Manager Grant Williams said the redevelopment of Moorabbin Community Reserve would see the facility transformed from an oval with limited use to an administration and community hub for the next generation of footballers.

"This project will significantly increase the capacity of the South Metro Junior Football League, the Southern Football League, the Sandringham Dragons boys and youth girls talent programs, and AFL Victoria's Region Development Manager Gary Brown to effectively administer and support

football in the region," Mr Williams said.

"It will also be the cornerstone of the region's talent and participation pathways by catering for football development programs including NAB AFL Auskick, school football, women's football and AFL 9s through to coaching and volunteer education."

Williams said the redevelopment would also provide a base for the planned standalone St Kilda VFL team from 2016.

"We thank the State Government for their support, in particular Treasurer Michael O'Brien, Minister for Sport and Recreation Damian Drum and Member for Bentleigh Elizabeth Miller who were present to make the announcement. We look forward to continuing to work with the State Government, Kingston Council, the South Metro Junior Football League, the Southern Football League and St Kilda in bringing this project to life and revitalising Moorabbin Community Reserve."

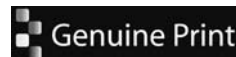
