ROUND 7 REVIEW

UTS vs North Shore

The season to date certainly hasn't gone to plan for UTS. The Bats, with their enormous pool of players and strong recruiting network, had high hopes that 2014 would be the year in which they would make it to the Premier Division finals for the first time. But the first six rounds had seen them left without a win, having copped some heavy defeats. Their only premiership points had come from a draw against Sydney Uni. So when the Bats took the field against North Shore, another



defeat would have been horrendous for their finals prospects. There was no time for any more losses. The Bombers were another side with high expectations that the reality hadn't lived up to. But, although decimated by injuries, the Bombers had at least recorded some wins; and were playing to move into the top five.

It was a gloriously sunny day at Waverley Oval, blue skies over the ground and extending down the hill to the ocean below. The ground was looking a treat, and there were plenty of spectators on hand as the Bats and the Bombers faced off.

With some early goals, the Bombers took the lead; but looked far from impressive. Goals were hard to come by, but the Bombers would remain ahead through the first half. Three goals to two in the first quarter, and North Shore led by seven points at the first change. But through the second term, every time the Bombers threatened to kick away, they found themselves unable to shake off the Bats; and the home side would come up with the answering goal. And with a late surge in the shadows of half time, the North Shore lead was cut to just two points at the long break.

This is UTS's fourth season in Premier Division. In each of the previous seasons, North Shore have made the finals and UTS haven't; but the Bats have given the Bombers grief, with the Bats having recorded a few wins and made the Bombers distinctly uncomfortable on other occasions. And there would be plenty of discomfort for the Bombers in the premiership quarter.

It took seven minutes for a goal to be scored, but a strong mark by Michael May just inside the 50 broke the deadlock and gave the Bats the lead for the first time in the game. And a couple of minutes later, May was again in the thick of the action, pouncing on a grubber kick forward and shooting over his shoulder. A running Adam Baker was cooking up a handy lead for the Bats as he slammed another goal through; and when Scott Tregoning capitalised on a free kick, the Bats were well on top.

They weren't finished yet, as Liam Flanagan launched a booming torp from outside the 50 to land another. Confidence, which had deserted the home side for so long, was back; as the Bats were finding winners all around the ground. Even with the Bombers getting a late goal back in time on, with Shaun Atkins finding himself at the end of an impressive run from Dale Fitzgerald, the Bats were 20 points ahead at the last change and victory was all but assured.

The last quarter was largely a countdown to the Bats being able to finally sing their victory song and wasn't a term that produced any great highlights. But by now, UTS had regained the winning feeling and went on with the job in the last quarter with a run of four goals to two. Finally the siren sounded, and finally the Bats had cause to celebrate.

The final margin was 27 points, a comfortable enough result for the Bats' breakthrough win. Brendan Brown, Harry Whiting and Tom Zilm had been their best. For the disappointing Bombers, Jack Campbell, James McKenzie and Daniel Schacher had toiled tirelessly; but it was a below-par performance from the Bombers and one which places their chances of making the finals into question.

St George vs Sydney University

St George hosted Sydney Uni at Olds Park on Saturday afternoon, two of the teams that have got themselves into the top five early in the season and look a strong chance to stay there. And it would be the Dragons who would give themselves a boost against a possible finals opponent when they capitalised on a strong start to record a 14-point victory.

ROUND 7 REVIEW

With the home ground advantage, and keen to make a statement early, the Dragons burst out of the blocks with a flying start that would prove to be the difference between the two sides. The early goals would be crucial, a run of four goals to two in the opening term, with St George leading by eleven points at quarter time. And the Dragons would continue to attack the goals in the second term, but their accuracy would desert them. There were three goals apiece in the second term, and as the teams returned to the rooms at half time, the Dragons held a 14-point advantage.

The Dragons had been easily the better side through the first half, but the Students were still within striking distance. And during the third term, they threw the challenge out to the Dragons; with a string of goals to close the margin. But the Dragons had the answers, and would come up with goals to repel the Student challenge. After a quarter of four goals apiece, the three quarter time siren sounded; the margin finishing where it started at 14 points.

The last term was mainly going through the motions, as Sydney Uni never looked a chance to steal the game. Each side would score just one goal in the final term. The final quarter, like the third, saw each side record the same scores; the half time and three quarter time margin remaining intact at the finish. 

THOSE WERE THE DAYS

In the first decade of the last century, a number of VFL (now AFL) clubs regularly visited Sydney, sometimes for a holiday and at others, to play, normally against NSW or a combined Sydney side.

In nearly all of these visits the clubs made no claim on the gate takings to offset their travel and accommodation costs and what money was raised was left with the league in Sydney.

This gesture was particularly welcomed by league officials and in 1909 with Collingwood, Geelong and premiers, South Melbourne all visiting at the same time, allowed the NSW Football League to declare a very rare profit on their operational activities.

Such was the magnanimity of these gestures that it led one Sydney official to comment that these VFL clubs "must have money to burn."

It was pleasing to read a comment written in the Sydney Morning Herald in 1906 regarding the St Kilda visit in August 1906, which read:

"The last day of the visiting team in Sydney was fully occupied in a very pleasant manner yesterday. The morning was devoted to a harbour trip, which was thoroughly enjoyed, the weather being genial and the attendance good.

After lunch the visitors, escorted by several members of the League, paid a visit to Messrs. Beale and Co. Pianoforte Factory at 47 Trafalgar St Annandale where the manager showed them through the various departments, and explained the process of manufacture from the time of arrival of the raw material, till the finished article was produced.

Afterwards, a vocal and instrumental concert was provided, and a repast served, which was thoroughly enjoyed. Several toasts were enthusiastically honoured.

An adjournment was then made to Messrs Tooth and Co 's brewery (Broadway, Sydney) where the visitors were shown round by Messrs. Finn and Whiting after which an adjournment was made to the dining hall, handsomely decorated in honour of the visitors, where refreshments were partaken of. The toast "Success to the firm of Messrs. Tooth and Co" proposed by Messrs. Rason (vice-president) and Dixon (manager), of St. Kilda, was heartily received.

After inspecting the new railway station (Central Railway Station was opened only days before on 4 August, 1906) a visit was made to the head station of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade (located in Castlereagh Street, Sydney) where, through the courtesy of Mr Stoneham, an interesting and instruction hour was spent.

The team left last night by the southern mail for Wagga, where the last match of the tour will be played to-day. A large gathering of local "Australian" players and supporter attended to give them a hearty send off.

The days of groups of people seeing off friends and family at the Sydney Rail Terminal, Mascot Airport or one of the many wharfs in the city have long gone.

MAGPIES LOOKING FOR EDGE

With competition in Sydney AFL going from strength to strength as each season passes, clubs are recognising the need to up-the-ante in their approach to the game. The Moorebank Magpies are one such club who are reworking their tactics in order to gain an advantage.

Soon to be introducing a new Strength and Conditioning Coach – Warby is set to leave the club due to outside commitments – the Magpies are hoping that this will add another level of fitness to their game.

"Looking at results, our medium term aim is to see the Seniors and Reserves playing competitive football in Division One and Three. We are also focused on continuing to strengthen our relationship with our major sponsor, Mounties,"

Coles says that despite current results, there are many standout stars amongst their playing group including Tom Rice, Taylor Currant, Chris Harry and Ryan Forrestor.

"Chris in particular has been a surprise packet as after not playing regularly since 2010, he has returned more committed and better than ever."

In an effort to conjure a sense of pride in the history of the club, Moorebank will also be looking to engage with former players. Holding their annual 'Past Players Day' in Round 17, the club will devote the day's play to the foundation clubs on which the Magpies were built.

"Each of our senior teams will be wearing a different retro jumper. Third Grade will wear Bankstown's green and gold, Reserves will don Southern Districts' and Liverpool's blue and white, whilst our Seniors will wear the original South West Sydney black and white colours."

Reflecting a demand of the local area, the Moorebank Magpies have this year introduced their first Women's team – currently playing the in Women's Division Two competition.

With many female players in their community already enjoying a love of playing the game, however having to travel to other areas in order to fulfill their desires to do so, the Magpies now provide an opportunity to the women of South West Sydney to play Australian Rules.

"I feel that we have addressed a long overdue need in the region."

Rising stars of the Women's side according to Coles include Cassie Rice, Tara Warner and Rheanna Vehlow.

As with the other debutant Women's teams in the Division Two competition such as Manly-Warringah and Gosford, the Moorebank side is still finding their feet at the lower end of the ladder, however have had a taste of victory in winning their first game of the season.






