## Indigenous Round

This weekend we celebrate AFL Indigenous Round across all levels of football.
The round's theme in the AFL: 'Everything's Possible' will highlight the contribution of indigenous footballers, past and present, and will celebrate the diversity that exists within our indigenous game.
Several country leagues will celebrate Indigenous Round in their own unique way, helping to create awareness of issues facing indigenous Australians and highlighting the role football can play in encouraging understanding and acceptance between diverse groups.
The round, which falls in National Reconciliation Week, aims to celebrate and promote the inclusion of indigenous cultures and offers fans as well as players a vehicle for building stronger ties with indigenous communities.
This year, Indigenous Round is also promoting the RECOGNISE Campaign.
RECOGNISE is the people's movement to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in our Constitution. Tens of thousands of Australians from all walks of life have already declared their support to recognise the first Australians in our founding document.
The 'Dreamtime at the G' clash between Essendon and Richmond has become one of the highlights on the football calendar and is again one of many events held this weekend as part of the AFL's Indigenous Round.
As a curtain raiser to the game, The Footy Means Business Program will take centre stage, giving indigenous players at state league level a chance to continue to develop as footballers and young men.
Among the two teams, one named after David Rodan - now an AFL Victoria employee, the other after Aaron Davey, are three country Victorian exports. Alex Saunders (Bairnsdale) Kayan Bundle (Drouin) and Andrew Murray (Wonthaggi) will all be aiming to use this opportunity to help launch their own AFL careers.
The Long Walk will once again precede the Richmond v Essendon match at the MCG on Saturday night. This is year marks ten 10 years since Essendon great Michael Long and others walked to Canberra to highlight issues affecting indigenous Australians.

AFL Victoria's Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Clark said Indigenous Round deserved to be celebrated not just at the MCG but throughout the state at every football venue.
"At all levels of football, and particularly in country Victorian competitions, indigenous players, umpire, coaches and supporters play a vital role in our game and this round helps celebrate that contribution," Clark said.
"While football has played, and continues to play, a huge role in creating understanding between nonindigenous and indigenous Australians, incidents of racial vilification are still prevalent at both the elite and community level. In the past football has been a vehicle for social change and this is something we should all be proud of."
"It is important as a football community we take a no tolerance approach to stamping our racism and continue to be a leader in this field. We must also continue to provide support to our champions; both local, and those at the national level, for they are the ones that are at the forefront of leading this social change."
Clark said the recent debate in the media about what constitutes a racist slur and what a person should, or should not be, offended by had clouded a simple message.
"People, regardless of the heritage, or religion and sexual preference for that matter, should not be made to feel vilified or isolated by the behaviour of others." "We all have a role to play in this and hope the 2014 Indigenous Round reminds people of this responsibility."

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## BULLS CHASE FIRST WIN

KARINGAL'S rugged start to the season could be about to take a sudden turn for the better.
The winless Bulls believe they can crack their duck egg by beating fellow battler Chelsea at Beardsworth Ave today.
In what could one of its few chances for a win this season, Karingal has set itself for this game.
"Absolutely. It's a game we expect to be very, very competitive for a very long time," Karingal coach Steve Coats said.
"I think Chelsea will be thinking the same way and I think the team that does the right things at the right time will get the points."
After six rounds, Karingal is rooted to the bottom of the ladder with a meek percentage of 26.95 .
The departure of a raft of players in the off-season, coupled with injuries to key players, left the Bulls undermanned in the opening weeks of the season. They were crushed by 178 points by Frankston YCW in round three and a week later lost to Edi-Asp by 148 points.
But Coats is adamant the Bulls are on the up.
Last round, Karingal showed a glimpse of its 2013 form, pushing Mt Eliza. The Bulls trailed by only 19 points 10 minutes into the last quarter.
"Last week was a much better effort, we were in the game longer," Coats said.
"We had a lot of kids - first year senior players - and they played well. We got a few back on the park which helped us."
Coats said despite the lack of wins, the spirit among the players can't be questioned.
"It's a good feeling down there. The scoreboard
doesn't show it but everyone who is there at that footy club is positive and knows that short term pain is going to be long term gain," he said.
LANGWARRIN'S emergence as a contender has been one of the stories of the season. A 5-1 win-loss record has the Kangaroos sitting pretty in second spot.
However, Langy's hard work is only beginning. The next four weeks of footy - when they face Edi-Asp, Mornington, Frankston YCW and Mt Eliza - will present test after test and reveal a lot about this young and promising Kangaroos outfit.
Today, Langwarrin hosts reigning premiers EDI-ASP. Rewind a year and Edi-Asp were probably very similar to the current Langy side; hungry, talented but yet to prove themselves. Well, the Eagles did go on and prove themselves, hoisting the flag in brilliant fashion.
After winning its first four games, Edi-Asp has dropped its past two and really do need a steadying win today. Former Dolphin Matt Clarke will return to the field today after two years out and, even if he's a bit rusty, he is sure to still have an influence in the middle.

## Stingrays Run Over Tasmania.

The Dandenong Southern Stingrays got back on the winners board with a very strong 26 point victory over the travelling Tasmania in the Round 8 TAC Cup match at Shepley Oval Dandenong last Saturday.
The Stingrays added debuting players Zak Rouse, Gach Nyuon and top age players Taylor Joyce and Caleb Gray for their first game for 2014. They also welcomed back 19 year old Troy Jacobson who successfully returned from two years of injuries.
The Stingrays had trained well during the week and started like a shot out of a cannon, dominating most of the play in the first half of the first term. Tackling was a highlight and relentless pressure resulted in numerous inside 50's for the young Rays. Taylor Joyce took control early in the air, kicking one of his 5 goals in the first term. Tasmania steadied a little and converted well to kick 3 straight goals with their limited opportunities and the Stingrays led 4-3-27 to 3-1-19 at quarter time.
The first ten minutes of the second term was very messy skill wise and the term was a bit closer as both midfields rolled back to support their defenses and scoring opportunities dried up a little. An opportunist goal to Keegan Downie and an interception mark from an errant rebound kick gave Taylor Joyce another goal, but they were the only goals for the Rays as Tasmania took their turn on dominating the play. All the hard work from the Stingrays midfield group went to waste as time after time panic kicking forward allowed Tasmania to easily defend and rebound, which resulted in 6 goals for the quarter- most came from Stingrays turnovers. During the long term break, Stingrays Coach Craig Black was full of praise to his players for continuing to play their individual role, but challenged them to work harder defensively and to use the ball better in contested and uncontested situations- especially entering the forward line as 2 goals 2 points from 12 inside 50's for the term was poor conversion. At the end of the second, the Stingrays trailed on the scoreboard by 16 points, with Tasmania scoring every time they went inside 50 so a huge challenge was set for the defenders to close down their individual player at the long break.
The third saw the first goal come within a minute to Stingrays player Joyce, followed with another a minute later to the dynamic Bailey Dale. Midfielders Alex Harnett, Jake Lovett and Dan Moloney were brave throwing their bodies at every contest, which became effective as the pressure and intensity lifted for both teams. Another goal to Mitch White a few minutes after some good defensive pressure looked like the Rays might blow the game apart but Tasmania locked down and made scoring a little harder. Great work from Bailey Dale and Jack Lonie resulted in two opportunistic goals to Tomkins and Dale. Tasmania made the Stingrays pay from poor defensive acts that resulted in two of their own goals before the Stingrays once again hit the scoreboard through Joyce and Jacobson. The end of the third saw the Rays kicking 7 goals to 2 and holding a 16 point lead, but would be defending against a 2-3 goal breeze in the last.

The final term was more hard running and hard work as the Stingrays continued to outplay and out-muscle their opposition. The Stingrays added another 4 goals to Tasmania's 2 with eight different players on the goal kickers' list indicated a very even team effort and should instill a lot of confidence in the Stingrays squad. The non-negotiables of hard work, hard running, good defense and multiple avenues to goal were all front and centre in the very good 26 point win to the Stingrays and only allowing 4 goals defensively after half time which was led by best on ground Bailey Dale who racked up 21 possession, most from winning his own ball from contested contests (16) then rebounding inside 50 kicking 3 goals and supported strongly from the ever reliable Jack Lonie, Jayden Tomkins and return to form Taylor Joyce and hardnosed midfielder Alex Harnett.
Next Sunday, June 1st in the TAC Cup Round 9 game sees the Dandenong Stingrays play the
Northern Knights at Shepley Oval, Dandenong. The game starts at Midday and entry is free.

## Strategic Planning - why it is critical.

"The best way to anticipate the future is to invent it" - Rosabeth May Kanter

All sporting clubs and associations want to increase membership, raise funds, attract and retain volunteers, develop coaches and officials and maintain good financial and governance management practices.
Strategic planning is a process of mapping out how a club or association can successfully achieve these goals. It also provides the opportunity for all interested parties in the club to discuss, agree and describe what is best for their club and what steps they will take to progress its future development.
A strategic plan has five main components: Vision, Mission, Core Values, Goals and Objectives.
Vision: It represents the ultimate aim. The members need a vision of what their club should be like at some point in the future. However, visions must also be realistic. A vision should therefore be challenging but ultimately achievable and reflect the particular nature of the organisation.
Mission: The mission of a club sets out simply what it will do to achieve its vision. Everything the club does, or wants to do, should be tested against its agreed mission and anything that does not fit the mission should not be progressed.
Core Values: The "things we believe in" are our core values. Many people believe in honesty, for example, while others are happy to do dishonest things in order to make money. Typical examples of club core values include equality of opportunity; social inclusion; fair play; quality training; excellence in standards and that football should be valued for its own sake rather for some other reason.
Goals: Are a key foundation for the strategic plan. They are long term aspirations, which will lead to the achievement of the vision and are compatible with the mission. Goals are difficult to quantify so it can be difficult to say if they have been fully achieved; alternatively, it is always possible to do better against them.

Objectives: Are things the club will set out to achieve which, if successful, will contribute to the achievement of goals. There may be several objectives related to one goal. For example, a goal of promoting more participation might lead to a series of objectives such as:

- To run a club development program
- To develop stronger links between junior and senior club
Strategic plans should not be confused with business plans. A strategic plan provides focus, assists with communicating club ideals both internally and externally and prioritises the functions of the club to ensure strength and vitality.
