Victorian talent pathways on display



It might have been lost amongst a truly extraordinary weekend of AFL games, but the substitutes in the Carlton v Hawthorn match hold a special place in Victoria's talented player pathway.

Nick Graham, the 2012 Morrish Medal winner, and Ben Ross, the 2012 JJ Liston Trophy winner, were the respective substitutes for Carlton and Hawthorn.

Both players are graduates from AFL Victoria's TAC Cup program at Gippsland Power. Since then their football journeys have taken many twists and turns.

Ross was originally drafted by North Melbourne, but was delisted at the end of the 2011 season. He went on to play two stellar seasons with Werribee in the Peter Jackson VFL before being rookie listed by Hawthorn. A long term injury to a team mate cleared the way for Ross to be elevated onto the senior list and make his debut for the Hawks

Drafted by Carlton at pick 54 in the 2012 National Draft, injury hampered most of Graham's first year with the Blues. Graham has built up his form playing with Northern Blues, the VFL affiliate of Carlton, to the point where he earned his first AFL game of the 2014 season.

Already, this season we've witnessed so many TAC Cup graduates and VFL players progress to playing their first AFL game.

Significantly, Dylan Buckley (Northern Knights), Josh Kelly (Sandringham Dragons), Jarman Impey (Murray Bushrangers), Matt Crouch (North Ballarat Rebels), Lewis Taylor (Geelong Falcons), Zach Merrett (Sandringham Dragons), Joe Daniher (Calder Cannons) and Marcus Bontempelli (Northern Knights) - have earned Rising Star nominations.

So, too, Luke McDonald, who played all last season with VFL club Werribee and Tom Langdon who effectively split last season with Sandringham Dragons and Sandringham Zebras.

Apart from McDonald, we've seen Sam Lloyd, who represented the VFL last season when playing with Frankston, play for Richmond at the AFL level, Zac O'Brien, who played with Essendon as a top-up player, debut for Brisbane as well as another Essendon VFL player Patrick Ambrose debut for Essendon AFL.

It's an undoubted highlight of the first half of the season to see all these gifted players mature, progress and realise an ambition they've often held since their days of NAB AFL Auskick.

What it illustrates is that there is a clearly defined pathway offered for all Victorians through the TAC Cup and/or the VFL. This pathway provides players with the best possible chance to showcase their talent and impress AFL recruiting staff while playing in a top quality competition.

With that as a back drop it's worth recording the outstanding success last week of both Vic Country and Vic Metro teams as the NAB AFL U18 Championships continue.

Both Victorian teams travelled interstate, but were far from overwhelmed as Vic Country defeated Western Australia by 10-goals and Vic Metro emerged triumphant from an engrossing contest against South Australia.

With the final two rounds of the Championships to play out over the next 10 days at Simonds and Etihad Stadiums, football fans can gain a sneak preview of tomorrow's stars of the game and appreciate a flourishing nursery of Victorian talent.

Country wins interstate

Vic Country has won its first interstate game of the 2014 NAB AFL U18 Championships with a convincing 64-point win over WA in their Round 4 clash last weekend.

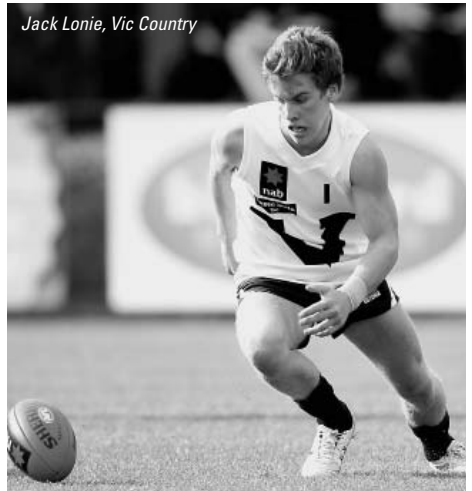
Country got off to a flying start and could have been further ahead with more accurate kicking after slotting through 4 goals 6 behinds to WA's 1 point in the first term.

Dandenong Stingrays player Jack Lonie made his presence felt in the second quarter, kicking two goals while Jordan Cunico (Gippsland Power) racked up the possessions with 10 disposals for the term (18 for the half).

Cunico was dominating, but left the field early in the third term with a broken nose and took no further part in the game.

Country's team work and defensive pressure shone in the third term, keeping WA goalless while finding multiple avenues to goal up the other end.

Nick Dixon (Geelong Falcons) lifted his output in the second half and along with North Ballarat Rebels pair Daniel Butler and Darcy Tucker, and Billy Evans (Bendigo Pioneers) had a real influence on the match.

While Dixon finished with a game high 28 disposals and 6 marks, it was Lonie that was best on ground. Along with 4 goals the small forward had 24 disposals and 3 marks.

Tucker (23), Evans (21), Murray Bushranger Daniel Howe (21) and Geelong Falcon Darcy Parish (21) all had big numbers, but it was the even contribution from every player on the ground that allowed Country to dominate from start to finish and secure the win.

Vic Country will now take on SA at Simonds Stadium in Round 5 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships, in what may just be the championship decider on the 27th June.

Their final game of the championship will be against WA on the 2nd of July at Etihad Stadium.

Metro inflicts SA's first defeat

Vic Metro has ensured the 2014 NAB AFL U18 Championships will go down to the wire, inflicting SA's first defeat with a 14-point win last weekend.

After a 44-point defeat in Round 3 against Vic Country, Metro saw the return of some key players - namely Peter Wright (Calder Cannons) - to help them to their second victory of the Championships.

Wright dominated the ruck with 29 hitouts, 16 disposals, 10 marks and finished with three goals to be among the best for Metro.

He was joined in the best by Ed Langdon (Sandringham Dragons) with four goals and 13 disposals, Dillon Vlojo-Rainbow (Western Jets), Ed Vickers Willis (Sandringham Dragons), Corey Ellis (Western Jets), Jason Castagna (Northern Knights), Christian Petracca (Eastern Ranges) and Angus Brayshaw (Sandringham Dragons).

Bontempelli the latest Rising Star

Former Northern Knights player Marcus Bontempelli is the Round 13 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

After a stellar season with the Northern Knights and representing Vic Metro at the 2013 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships, Marcus was the Western Bulldogs' first selection (4th overall) at the 2013 NAB AFL Draft.

Marcus, played a key role in the Bulldogs' eight-point win over Collingwood at Etihad Stadium last Sunday. His 22 possessions, five marks and four tackles were complemented by his composure under pressure.

Playing in his sixth AFL game for the Western Bulldogs, Marcus kicked his first AFL goal in the third quarter at a crucial time of the match.

Standing at 192cm, Marcus plays as a tall midfielder, but his agility and endurance enables him to play in any position. His endurance was evident at the 2013 NAB AFL Draft Combine where he ran a 14.7 in the beep test.

Northern Knights Talent Manager Peter Kennedy said Marcus was a late developer in the system, with his finish to the 2013 season the key to his rise up the draft order.



"His last game for Vic Metro was his stand out match. Then he blossomed as a player when he returned to the Knights, moving from the wing to the midfield and took his football to another level.

"He is a terrific young man and worked hard at his footy at TAC Cup level, displaying a great commitment, work ethic and attitude, and he is now getting the reward for effort."

Marcus is the Northern Knights second rising star nominee this year, joining Dylan Buckley (Northern Knights / Carlton) on the prestigious list.

Laguntas Squad posts first ever win

Winning might not have been the main objective of the weekend but for members of the Laguntas Program it certainly provided a memorable ending to the first camp of 2014.

The Laguntas Program is designed to fill a void in the talent pathway for indigenous footballers (aged 16-18) and help them reach their potential in a tailored development program.

Supported by the AFL, the Korin Gomandji Institute (KGI) and AFL SportsReady, the 2014 Laguntas Program kicked off over the

June Long weekend with more than 30 boys from around Victoria attending a high performance camp under the guidance of three-time Brisbane Lions premiership hero Chris Johnson and AFL Victoria indigenous program staff.

With the majority of members only meeting each other for the first time on the Friday, and having recorded three losses during the program's inaugural year in 2013, defeating the U16 Vic Country side appeared a distant possibility.

But after a tight first half, Laguntas – led by Newborough's Anthony Young – galloped away to claim its first ever victory.

Mickitja Rotumah-Onus, Kayle Kirby (who kicked three goals), Bohdi Walker, Kyle Thomas and Blake Rout were others to impress in the highly entertaining hit-out.

Only seven of the 25 boys who played are currently in TAC Cup programs, but it's hoped through the Laguntas program this can number can dramatically increase before the 2015 season begins.

AFL Victoria Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Clark said while it was nice to win, the really pleasing aspect of the match was the standard at which the boys played.

"We've got a very young list this year with 10 U16 boys and to come out and play the way they did against a highly talented team in Vic Country was terrific."

"For guys like Anthony Young, it was a chance to show that they can match it with boys in the same age group and that they belong on a TAC Cup list."

"Kayle Kirby and Jai Rout were both cut from the U16 Vic Country Squad, so for them to play well showed great character."



"Ultimately this program is about providing a stepping stone into the mainstream talent pathway and through practice matches like this the guys are able to show how much talent and work ethic they have."

Clark said the practice match was just one component of a huge weekend, designed to develop the Laguntas members on and off the field.

The group visited historic indigenous sights and monuments to learn more about their cultural heritage, listened to Laguntas mentors Dustin Martin (Richmond) and Neville Jetta (Melbourne) talk about their journeys to the elite level and were exposed to leadership training through experts at the YMCM.

"It's not just a football development program and this is really pressed home to the boys. Hopefully through these initiatives and exposure to respected mentors these boys can grow into role models themselves who are young leaders back in their local communities."

The Laguntas squad will meet twice more this year (July 18-20 and August 8-10) for intensive weekend camps that include everything from education sessions and cultural activities to practice games against other teams in AFL Victoria's talent pathway.

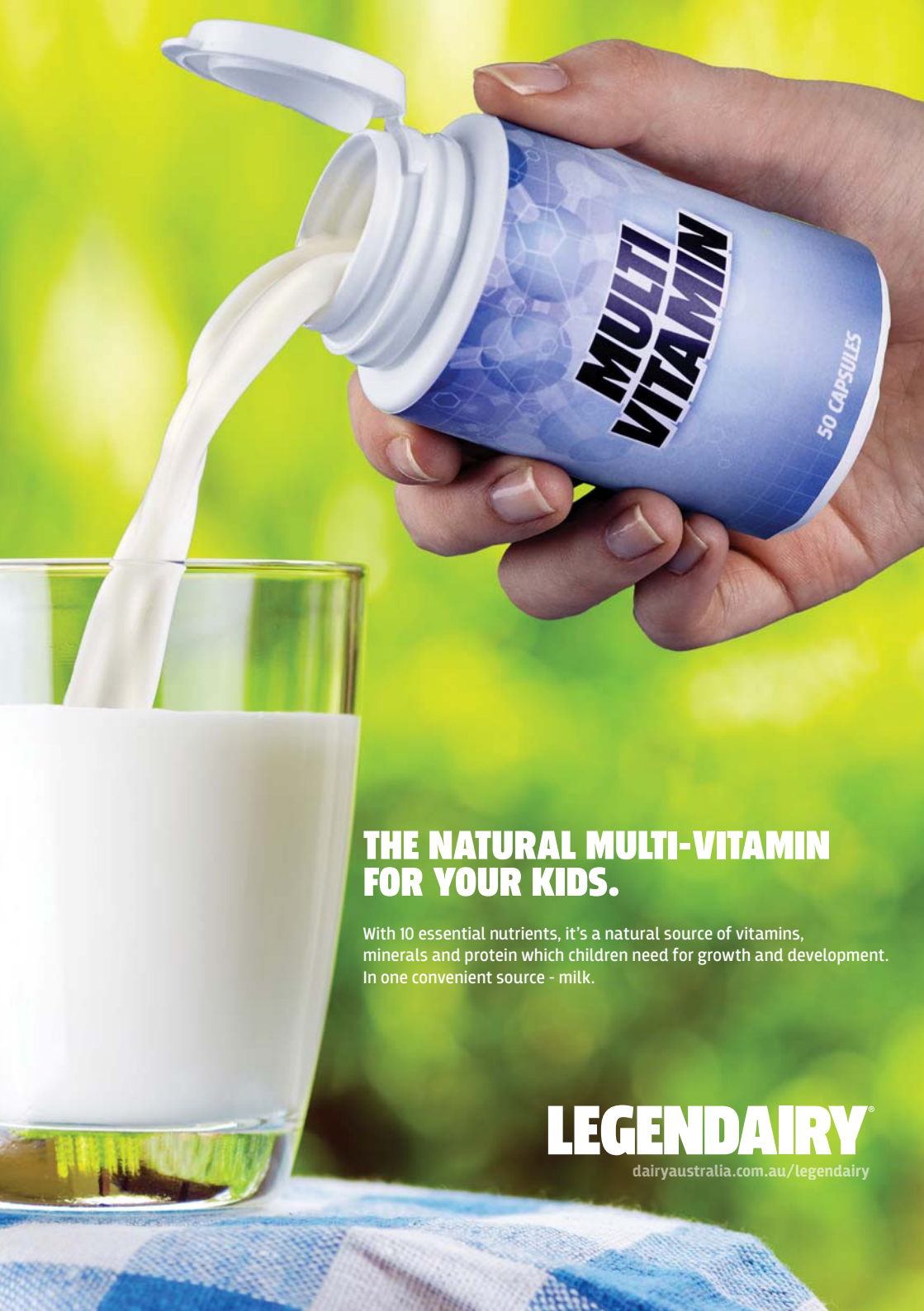

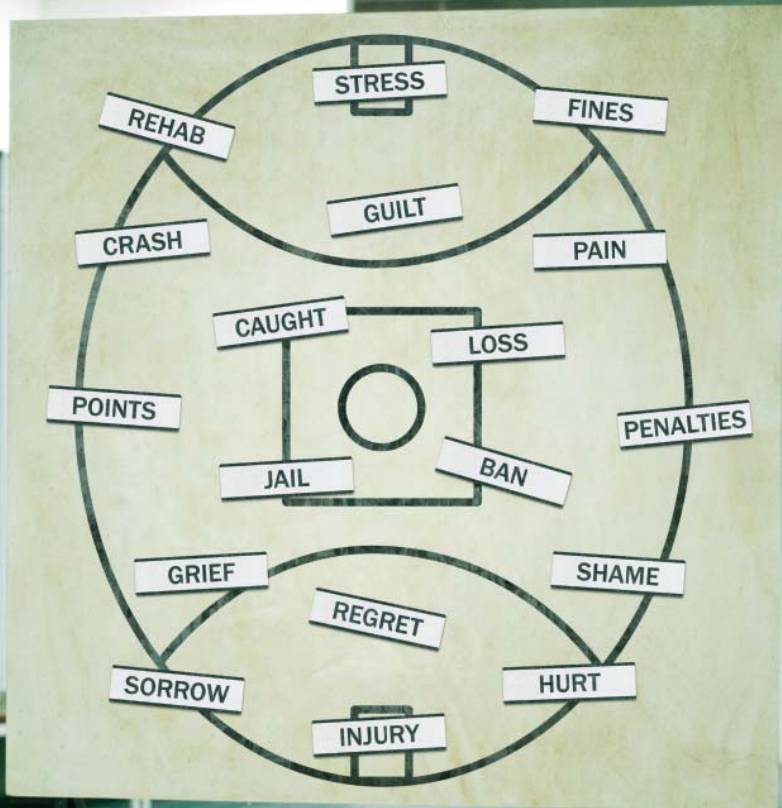
