COACH'S COMMENTS

I would like to welcome all our Reds supporters and the Fencibles United team to Murdoch Park.

We come in to today's game in good spirits. Having six games left of the season, with four of those being at home, we are confident of improving on our results from the first round of the season and adding to the seven points we have accumulated. Another positive is that three of our remaining games are against the other teams that sit in the bottom four of the division, with all three being at home. We have to look to take maximum points from these fixtures, but more importantly, we need to ensure that we play the way we want to – using the ball and developing a possession-based style. Our main objective for this season was to consolidate our position as a Premier Division club, and I think it's safe to say that we have done that and we can now continue to enjoy the challenge that this league brings.

Last week was a difficult game and we were disappointed with the result, losing 7-0 away to Forrest Hill Milford. When we view it objectively, though, there are positives to be taken: Nine of their starting eleven are in the New Zealand Under20s squad and are training together six times a week – essentially, they are semi-professional players at the moment. We managed to com-

pete for large spells of the game, with it being 1-0 at half-time, and only 3-0 with fifteen minutes to go. The last ten minutes or so when our legs had gone is when they started to tear through us, but we can take pride in the fact that we forced them to step-up their game, and that three of their goals had to come from set-plays. I am sure they will win the league and so there is no disgrace in our performance. Little steps will take us far, and being competitive for large parts of the game against the top team is something to take heart from.

Fencibles United are probably our closest rivals this season, geographically, and so it's the nearest thing we have to a derby fixture this year. The fact that many of the players have represented both teams also adds to the tension and today will be a battle as all players hope to get the win. Angela has managed to strengthen her squad with the addition of some quality players and they will have been frustrated to have had their game postponed last Friday as they seemed to be gathering some momentum following the 10-1 loss to Claudelands. I am sure they will be wanting to avenge their loss to us earlier in the season, too, and we know today will be a tough game from start to finish.

We just need to focus on what we do well for our remaining games. We are trying to implement a

high-energy pressing game, and want to keep the ball once we win it back. That requires all of our players to give everything they have defensively and to ensure that we support each other when we are trying to regain possession. We also need to show bravery and courage on the ball, and be continually willing to offer as an option, as keeping the ball is what will help us to improve. As a coach, I will be looking to see if we can play football on the ground and use the full width of the pitch to develop positive, structured football as we try to push on.

Good luck to the girls and I hope everyone enjoys the game.

PLAYER PROFILE

RIVA FUIMAONO

KEEPING GUARD

She's got one of the toughest jobs in the team and faces an often unenviable task, but Papatoetoe's Premier Women's Goalkeeper is relishing the challenge. The 17-year-old says she's found focus - and family - since joining Papatoetoe. Midway through a tough and testing season, Rivalina Fuimaono spoke to Monique Fischer about the highs, the horrors and what it takes to keep on 'keeping.

It's the role chucked around amongst junior levels; the undisputed dreaded position, with all the pressure and none of the glory. Guarding the goal is a combination of physics and geometry - and sometimes sheer luck. "There's a moment as a

'keeper just before you make a save, before I know I'm going to catch the ball, or before I know if I'm going to dive - the moment when you make that decision. That rush is why I love it."

The Samoan teenager didn't always feel like this. Ironically she started playing striker as a youngster, but ended up filling in for 'keeper duties as an 11-year-old. "I found myself in goal for the harder matches and stuck with it as I really liked it. I like to challenge myself and I like the feeling of being depended on - It's a good feeling. When I make a save, I feel even better."

It's her second season with Papatoetoe, switching to the club to enhance her game. "They provided me with goalkeeper training, they've welcomed me in, and the girls have been great from the get-go - approachable, easy to talk to. They've become family."

Despite spending most of the match confined to the perimeters of a small box, Riva's presence on the pitch is unrestricted - whether it's lifting intensity or barking orders to her backline, one thing is clear, she leads from the back. At 164cm guarding the near two and a half metre-high goal is

no mean feat. But being light on her feet with a solid physique surely helps, and anyone who has seen her in action can attest to her abilities. "I like that I get to fly around the goal," and that is the best way to describe what she does.

And no-one can doubt her commitment, "Every day is football for me. It's the single biggest impact on the rest of my life. Every day there's training and every weekend there's a game." If the Year 13 student isn't tied down with club commitments or goalkeeping practice, she's Captaining Mount Albert Grammar's First XI. "It's different as I have to take charge. The girls - some of them are quite young - and they look up to me. I have to step up for them because If I play well, they'll perform, and if I muck about, they will too. It's a different challenge but I love it."

Though her attitude is on target, it's the losses that roam the hallways of her mind. Recalling all too well the feeling of helplessness after suffering a hefty loss against Forrest Hill earlier this season, when the team went down 9-1. She hesitates - and then launches, "I felt like crap. Felt like I couldn't do anything at a time I should be saving the team. I mean I'm the last man and they were depending on me, but I couldn't do anything to help. If I came up, they chipped



me and if I stayed back, they went through."

And then there's the side of football that takes just as much training – not the physical or tactical or even mental part – another; the one that's easily overlooked but arguably the most important challenge for a goalkeeper – managing emotion. "Once I've conceded I focus on staying motivated. Clear-headed. Factual. Anything to make sure I don't get emotional. I can't get emotional. It's so important to keep a clear head. To learn and let go."

Her sentences jump over each other, as if she's already moving onto the next thing. You wonder quietly if that mentality helps her with her game because that's the thing about 'keeping; you can watch tape after tape, you can agonise over every decision, you can mathematise every movement, but at the end of the day, it's instinctive. "You have to go with your gut. You have a split second to make a decision and you have to stick with it. Sometimes it pays off, sometimes... well yeah, it doesn't."

The worst part? "Big losses. The amount of goals that go through. What gets me the most is how the goal went in; if it was a good strike – okay, I can let it go, but if it was saveable - that gets me down. My Dad and I will sit down after the game, talk about what I did well, what I did badly, and what I could do better."

In fact the whole family fits into the footballing fraternity. Her two younger brothers often play training partners to their older sister. And then there's her Mum, "She was a great player in her day and if football had been big for women back then, Mum would have represented Samoa. But she's the reason I got into football. In a lot of ways this is



our dream." And she's dreaming big.

The teenager hopes to one day play in the German Women's Bundesliga and in the meantime is eyeing up scholarship opportunities at Universities in America and Lincoln in Christchurch.

It's all being realised with Papatoetoe, the club breaking into the Women's Premier Division last year. "There's really good spirit at 'Toe. It's been a huge improvement to have made it up to Prem's. We've done really well with that but I think we can do way better this year. We're going to go from strength to strength."

For the player who feels every blow, rues every shot, and scrutinises each performance, you might expect a more serious disposition. However, if there is any pressure stooped on the 17-year-old's shoulders, you wouldn't see it past her smile. There's no doubting that with goalkeepers tending to enjoy long footballing careers, Riva has a bright, long stretch ahead of her, that reaches much further than the perimeters of a penalty area.





OPPOSITION PROFILE

FENCIBLES UNITED

HISTORY OF THE CLUB

Fencibles United AFC is one of the largest football clubs in New Zealand. It was established in 1995 following the amalgamation of two stalwart East Auckland clubs, Howick AFC and Pakuranga Town AFC.

The name Fencibles recognizes the link between the club and the locality in which we are based. The Fencibles were among the first European settlers in the area, the name deriving from the Royal New Zealand Fencibles Corps. The Fencibles were the military defenders of the first settlers in the Auckland Region. The club playing strip of red, blue with white trim and the Fencibles Coat of Arms reflects their regular uniforms on blue trousers and a red tunic with white trim.

The club has a current playing membership of 1600 from junior

(under 8) through to the senior ranks, male and female. Our eldest playing member is in his 60's. Parents or guardians of junior and youth players are classed as associate members and their inclusion swells the clubs full membership to over 3000.

COURTNEY ROWSE

Courtney is a versatile player with great potential who is settling in well to life in the NRFL Women's Premier Division.

Courtney's talent was recognised early as she was involved in the Auckland Football Federation representative teams during 2008, 2009 and 2010. She had her first taste of senior women's football in 2011 when she played in the AFF/NFF Women's Conference for Buckland's Beach. This was followed by a second season



in that league with Eastern Suburbs in 2012.

Courtney then signed for Papatōetoe AFC at the start of the 2013 season and made six appearances in the NRFL Women's Premier Division for The Reds before transferring across to Fencibles United.

In the same year, Courtney was awarded the St Kentigern's First XI Most Valuable Player. As well as football, Courtney has also tasted success playing futsal. She was chosen as part of the Auckland squad that won the 2013 U16 Australian Futsal Championship, and was recently selected for the Auckland Football Federation U19 Girls Futsal team to compete in the National Tournament in Wellington.

Courtney has settled well at Riverhills and has found the net twice already this season. Good luck for the future Courtney.





MATCH REPORT

FORREST HILL MILFORD 7 - 0 PAPATOETOE

6/7/2014

Papatoetoe suffer big loss away to table-toppers Forrest Hill Milford.

The Reds were hoping to put in a better performance than when the two teams met at Murdoch Park back in May. However, the game did not start well as the home side found the back of the net within thirty seconds. A shell-shocked Papatoetoe found themselves chasing shadows for the following ten minutes with Forrest Hill coming close to scoring again on a couple of occasions, but failing to make the most of their chances. The visitors then settled and started to build some attacks of their own. The pressing of McErlean, Fischer and Hareb in midfield allowed The Reds to force play in the Forrest Hill half, and Stevens and Spyve had some half-chances as a result. The rest of the half continued at a fast pace and thanks to Fuimaono playing as a 'Sweeper-Keeper', Papatoetoe managed to keep the score at 1-0 going in to half-time.

The message for the second-half was to play the same as the first – which was taken literally as Forrest Hill scored within twenty seconds of the restart. They intercepted the

Papatoetoe kick-off, and following a one-two down their left-flank, played the ball across the box for a tap-in at the back-post. Again, Papatoetoe responded well and started to stretch the opposition by playing more direct, with Fischer again running beyond the strikers. Unfortunately, as the game wore on, the home side's superior strength started to tell as Papatoetoe's attacks fizzled out and Forrest Hill looked more and more dangerous. The Reds held strong beyond the hour mark, but soon after another slick move allowed Forrest

Hill to break the visitors' defensive line resulting in the striker going down in the penalty area under a clumsy challenge. The spot-kick was dispatched to make it 3-0. Almost ten minutes later, another tired challenge afforded the home team a free-kick on the edge of the area, which was scored to make it 4-0. In the remaining fifteen minutes, the floodgates opened as the home team drove on to rack up another three goals, with the seventh

being the last kick of the game.

It finished 7-0 and was a difficult result to swallow, but some positives can be taken from the fact that nine of the Forrest Hill players are currently in the New Zealand Under 20s squad preparing to play Brazil soon, and therefore, it was a fantastic learning experience that will assist the development of our players.

MVP was awarded to Monique Fischer for her relentless running, tackling and supporting the strikers for the full ninety minutes.

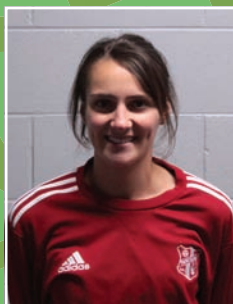

Diego Maradona – for me, he's the best player ever. I was only seven when I watched the 1986 World Cup which Argentina won, and he was phenomenal.

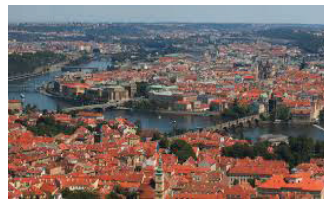
He is still criticised in England for the 'Hand of God' goal, but his second goal in that game is probably

A handful of cancelled trainings made the two played games since the last update, against the top two teams on the ladder, even more daunting. The first of these games was three weeks ago, and against Pukekohe, a team we had drawn with in the previous round. Pukekohe though, appeared to be a different team from the first round, demolishing Papatoetoe AFC 7-3. All three of Papatoetoe's goals on this occasion came from Lusia Ioane, who is becoming more and more invaluable to us.

The total of five goals from Ioane solidified her as Player of the Day for the second time this season, and helped us with the reasonably respectable 7-5 loss to Waiheke.

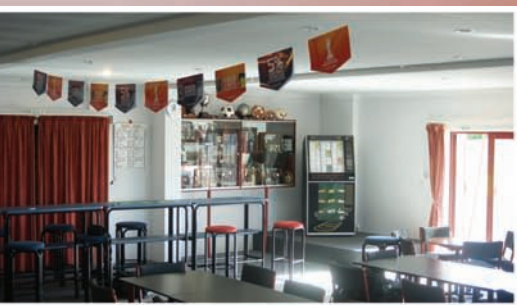
