Many Cultures, One Game

Now a standalone VFL club, Coburg Lions boasts a strong contingent of former TAC Cup players on its list.

After ending its alignment with AFL club Richmond, Coburg has gone about rebuilding its list with a mixture of experience and talented youth, with 25 players coming through TAC Cup clubs such as Calder Cannons, Northern Knights, Oakleigh Chargers and Western Jets.

If you take a look around Coburg's Piranha Park on any given training night at it could easily double as a meeting of the United Nations.

The Lions also boasts a diverse playing group with 23 percent of the list from multicultural backgrounds.

There are players of Lebanese, Turkish, Italian, Irish, Serbian, Seychellian, New Zealand, Sudanese, South African, English, Dutch, and Torres Strait Islander heritage.

Coburg General Manager Craig Lees said the club is proud of its multicultural list and its ability to attract, welcome and embrace players from such differing cultures and religions.

"We've got plenty of boys who have at least one parent born overseas," Lees said,

Lees said there is nothing but total respect and understanding among the list of all cultures and the differing demands they bring, especially as the players of Muslim faith observe the month of Ramadan which began on June 29.

Ramadan is a period of prayer/devotion, fasting, charity and self-accountability.

Lees said the multiculturalism provides an interesting dynamic, but it was a pretty seamless operation where everyone was playing the common goal of playing football and helping the Coburg Football Club forge its status

on and off the field.

One Coburg player isn't limiting that helping hand and promotion of multiculturalism to just his own club.

Former Oakleigh Chargers player Gatluak 'Pau' Johnson came to Australia from Sudan as a youngster with his family. The 201cm ruckman has taken on a role as one of the inaugural VFL Multicultural Ambassadors.

As a part of the program that's facilitated by former AFL player David Rodan, Johnson works with participants from all cultures in areas such as community engagement and participation.

As an Ambassador, Johnson helps raise the awareness of the various programs AFL Victoria run in the community, in particular the TAC Cup and VFL competitions.

One of the great things about our game is its inclusive nature. The common theme from the players at Coburg is despite their varying backgrounds, football brings them together and they are one big family at the club.

It's a theme that's mirrored at football clubs of all levels across the country.

Laguntas Squad celebrates second win

Members of the 2014 Laguntas Squad continue to impress after another highly productive camp at the Korin Gamadji Institute (KGI) located at Punt Road Oval.

The indigenous squad of highly talented boys (aged 15-18) met for the second time this year as part of a specially designed program to fast-track their development on the field, boost their leadership qualities, and strengthen ties with their cultural identity.

The camp also gave the boys another chance to impress on the field where they were pitted against an U18 Multicultural Squad from the Western Region.

The team, known as the Majak Daw Squad, includes a number of very gifted young footballers from multicultural backgrounds, but they proved no match for a slick Laguntas outfit.

After capturing the squad's first ever victory against Vic Country U16s last month, Laguntas produced another impressive display to storm to a commanding 86-point triumph.

With three-time Brisbane Lions premiership hero Chris Johnson at the helm, Laguntas piled on the pressure early with Antony Young prominent up forward and Kain Proctor damaging out of the middle.

The ball movement was electrifying and by the quarter time siren, the lead was a decisive seven goals.

While the Majak Daw Squad kept fighting and had their own moments of brilliance, Laguntas remained in control throughout.

Koolyn Briggs, named captain for the day, provided outstanding leadership and was instrumental at centre half back, repeatedly making his presence felt at the contest.

Jai Rout was dominant on the wing with two goals and several eye-catching runs, while Kyle Thomas booted a match-high four goals and showed his aerial ability with an enormous contested mark.

Others to shine were Bohdi Walker, with his penetrating kick creating numerous attacking opportunities, and Dylan Bentley, who slotted three goals but set up several more for his teammates.

AFL Victoria Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Clark said he was extremely impressed with the development in the squad, especially off the field.

"On Friday night we had Laguntas/KGI mentors Dustin Martin (Richmond FC) and Neville Jetta (Melbourne FC)



speak to the group about the trademarks the squad wants to be known for," Clark said.

"To see the boys speaking up and showing some leadership off the field in identifying what they want to get out of the program is really rewarding."

The group also listened to indigenous culture expert Jamie Thomas speak about aspects of aboriginal heritage.

"For some of these boys they might be the only aboriginal player in their team so we want them to learn more about their heritage and be proud of their identity," Clark said.

"These boys are an important stage of their lives and surround them with positive indigenous role models hopefully helps them strive to towards making their own mark, whether that be with football or in another pursuit."

The camp gives the boys a chance to be exposed to a high performance environment, utilising the facilities at the Richmond Football Club and undertaking recovering sessions and reviewing their game footage.

"Ultimately this is a football program and we want to develop these guys on the field so that they have the best possible chance of succeeding in the TAC Cup system, which is the mainstream talent pathway, or at the very least return to their communities and local football teams as leaders and role models," Clark said.

Under 16 Championships

South Australia has continued its winning run in national championships, taking out the 2014 NAB AFL Under 16 title on the Gold Coast recently with a clean sweep of the three round competition.

ROUND 3

Following on from two wins in the U18 Championships, Vic Country made it 3-0 against Vic Metro in 2014 at Championship level, fighting back from a 19 point deficit at quarter time.

Ben Ainsworth (Gippsland Power) and Shannon Beks (North Ballarat Rebels) were the key to Country's win, kicking four goals each.
