# International Cup

**Over the past week we have seen the preliminary rounds of the 2014 AFL International Cup, an event being staged in and around Melbourne that has drawn together 25 teams from 18 countries playing 62 matches with more than 1000 people involved.**



Held every three years, the AFL International Cup continues to develop and expand with new teams in both the men's and women's sections.

It was a marvelous experience to see all 18 competing country's flags on display as players, coaches, staff and volunteers were welcomed by senior Wurundjeri elder Aunty Joy Murphy-Wandin and Premier Dr Denis Napthine at the official opening in Federation Square last weekend.

Just as spectacular was the sight of all the teams following their respective flag through Birrarung Marr to the MCG where there was a parade of nations before the Melbourne/Hawthorn match.

It illustrated in more ways than one just how popular our great game has become with so many different country's now playing the game. It's also a great advertisement for our code.

There's little doubt that Australian Rules appeals to a large, diverse consumer base not just around our country, but also overseas.

The opportunity to link up with a unique blend of traditional and no-traditional fans is something that can only further foster the game.

What should not be lost in the conversation is that 47 per cent of Australians come from a multicultural background.

It is an initiative which enables all International Cup teams to experience what a community football club has to offer, build networks and engage with the local community.

Next Saturday both the Grand Finals of the women and men's section will be played. The Women's Grand Final will be played at Punt Road while the Men's will be played as a curtain raiser to the Geelong/Hawthorn night match at the MCG.

# 2014-15 AFL Academy squads announced

## Following on from a review of the talent pathways and changes to the NAB AFL U18 Championships, the NAB AFL Academy program has been revamped.

The original AIS-AFL Academy program started in 1997, offering thirty 12-month scholarships to young footballers to enhance not just their football, but their education and personal development as well.

Planning for the program restructure commenced in 2013 after the Australian Institute of Sport flagged the end of their association with the Academy to allow for a greater focus on Olympic sports.

The program will continue to have two squads, Level One - for players eligible for the following year's draft (2016), selected from the NAB AFL U16 Championships - and Level Two - for players eligible for that year's draft (2015).

The selected players for both 2014-15 squads will come together for the first time in late September and then early December for camps in Melbourne.

As a part of the new schedule, the level two squad will play a showcase game during AFL Grand Final week against a 'Rising Star' team made up of players eligible for the draft from across Australia.

Whereas in the past the level two squad travelled to an AIS training base in Europe around the start of the TAC Cup season, the squad will now travel to the United States in January for a twelve day high performance camp.

This allows the players to experience an international camp, but still be available to play for their TAC Cup clubs from the start of the season.

In a move that's been embraced by the AFL clubs, level two players will also spend more time experiencing an elite level environment with one week at an AFL club in late November and another week at a different club in early January.

Level two players will then come together for a ten day camp in Melbourne during April that will include matches against VFL teams.

The timing of the level one squad's trip to New Zealand has also been changed from January to April to coincide with the AFL match in Wellington on ANZAC Day.

# State NAB AFL Draft Combine attendees announced

**Thirty eight TAC Cup players have been invited to the state NAB AFL Draft Combine in October this year.**


This takes the total number of TAC Cup players invited to the various combines to 86, following on from the 48 invitees to the national NAB AFL Draft Combine, which was announced last week.

The state Draft Combine testing will take place on Saturday October 4 in Melbourne, measuring a combination of athleticism and football skills as well as assessing each player's personality and character – all essential elements clubs need to consider in the drafting process.

Each AFL club provided a list of 25 players who they wanted to attend the state-based combine, with players that had two or more nominations receiving an invitation.

# Young Guns on display

**Providing opportunities to showcase the ability of aspiring Victorian players via the talented player pathway is a key responsibility of AFL Victoria.**

Throughout the season there are many calendar events - the NAB AFL U18 Championship program, the VFL State representative match as well as the Foxtel Cup - where players from the TAC Cup and Peter Jackson VFL gain an additional opportunity to enhance their football prospects.

Finals time, both in the TAC Cup and VFL, also affords players further opportunities to test themselves against the best of their peers under finals pressure.

Performances during finals can definitely enhance a player's prospects of attracting the attention of AFL recruiting staff.

But not every team in the competition is exposed to finals football. As a result, AFL Victoria is mindful of providing additional chances for players whose clubs will not feature in their finals series.

This is why next month's AFL Victoria Young Guns game, a curtain raiser before the second VFL Preliminary Final, is being planned.

From its early beginnings, the Young Guns match has grown in stature and become an anticipated event on the football calendar with AFL clubs closely scrutinising the match.

The Young Guns game will comprise of VFL players, top age TAC Cup players as well as invited representatives from other community football competitions from around the state.

Players will be selected from clubs which are no longer competing in either the TAC Cup, VFL or community football finals and meet the criteria for selection.

VFL players must be 23 years or younger and have attracted

attention of AFL clubs throughout the season while TAC Cup players must be either 19-year-olds and/or top aged players who didn't play in the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

It offers another chance for a raft of young, emerging, talented players to exhibit their skills and hopefully enhance their careers.

Player nominations have now closed and the selection panel comprising of Darren Flanigan, Anton Grbac, Leon Harris and John Hook as well as community football representatives have the tough job of determining the final line ups. Last year over 160 players nominated to play in the game.

# Energy Safe Round

**Energy Safe Victoria (ESV) is reminding country football fans to look up and live and stay safe around electricity at the upcoming Energy Safe round on August 23rd and 24th 2014.**

As part of the round, ESV will be handing out "Look up and Live" re-usable coffee cups at country football matches, in the hopes that those working near electricity will keep the cups handy and remember this vital message.

Leongatha Football Netball Club will be hosting a special "Look up and Live" round event, with giveaways and activities at their game against Traralgon on the 23rd August.

The Look up and Live campaign raises awareness about the dangers of power lines and the precautions that must be taken when working in their vicinity. By educating workers to steer clear of the three metre "no go zone" ESV is hoping to reduce the amount of injuries and literally save lives.

ESV would like to remind everyone to not take risks with power lines, think of your loved ones and your family. Follow the below safety precautions and Look up and Live. Identify all electrical hazards and power lines before starting work, specifically at dawn or dusk when there is low visibility.

Remember that electricity can jump gaps. If in any doubt contact the local electricity distribution company

- Ensure an ESV registered spotter is on hand when working anywhere near overhead power lines
- Monitor weather conditions as power lines can sag in extreme heat and sway in strong winds
- Relocate bulk delivery storage sites to a safe area away from power lines
- Only tip material near power lines as a last resort when there is no other location and never raise the tray of tipper trucks when underneath power lines
- Suppliers of bulk materials must ascertain, when taking orders, the delivery point on the farm for the load, the proximity of power lines and the safety precautions in place when working near power lines
- Drivers should refuse to deliver loads if their safety is compromised in any way
- Display LOOK UP AND LIVE stickers on any machinery or equipment which is to be raised overhead

Remember – everyone involved in the delivery of material has a duty of care to ensure the safety of themselves and others



# Gardiner and Stringer the latest Rising Stars

**Another two former TAC Cup players have received NAB AFL Rising Star nominations.**

The recent nominations for former Geelong Falcon, Darcy Gardiner (Round 19) and Bendigo Pioneer, Jake Stringer (Round 20) brings the total of former TAC Cup players nominated to 15.

Darcy Gardiner was regarded as one of the best defenders in the TAC Cup last year. Named centre half back in the TAC Cup Team of the Year, Gardiner was taken at pick 22 by the Brisbane Lions in the 2013 NAB AFL Draft.

Geelong Falcons Talent Manager Michael Turner said the early opportunities for Darcy in the Brisbane line up have helped his development in the AFL this season.

"He has done well in his first year at Brisbane.

"With their list and the young team they have got, he has probably been given an early opportunity which has been good for his development," Turner said.

"He was obviously one of our key players last year, really aggressive at the football, a fairly quiet kid, but he is a real competitor which he has shown in the AFL games this year.

"He has had some big jobs to do in the backline when Brisbane has been under pressure, but he is a very competitive defender, and as time goes on he will develop into an elite AFL player."

Darcy made his AFL debut in Round Five and has played 14 games, becoming a consistent part of the Lions defensive line-up and recently extended his contact which will see him remain at the Lions until at least the end of the 2016 season.

Jake Stringer was unlucky not to be nominated already, his consistency and form in recent weeks making him a stand out for the Western Bulldogs.

Drafted by the Bulldogs with pick five in the 2012 NAB AFL Draft, Stringer's Round 20 performance against St Kilda also saw two of his four goals nominated for the Hungry Jack's Goal of the Year.

Renowned as a fierce competitor during his time in the TAC Cup, Stringer suffered a severe leg injury that some thought would end his career there and then.

His coach at Bendigo Pioneers, Dave Newett, witnessed firsthand Stringer's determination and resilience to make it back to the elite level.

"My first year as coach was his top age year at Bendigo. I arrived in November and saw him limping around the oval at pre-Christmas training. He could barely run and had an

awkward gate, that's when a lot of people were thinking he was never going to get back," Newett said.

"When he came back and kicked nine goals against the Knights in his first game, it showed his class, competitiveness and his ability to win the one on ones.

"At the end of the year he played some VFL and showed against men that he was quite capable."

Newett knew Stringer's had plenty of potential and praised the Bulldogs by taking what some perceived a risk in drafting him.

"We could see what he was going to produce if he got his body and leg right, so credit to the Bulldogs for being able to show the faith to take him.

"His game sense and ability to know what the situation is around him has been highlighted by some of the goals he has kicked this year."

# Gambling's Not a Game

**AFL Victoria is proud to partner with the Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation to promote their responsible gambling sporting club program, Gambling's Not a Game.**

Matthew Torcasio is the program Ambassador. The following is a short interview with Matt, to discuss the program and his involvement.

## **How did you become involved in the sporting club program?**

In mid 2013 I participated in the Foundation's 100 Day Challenge, which involved filming video diaries for 100 days whilst I tried to give up gambling. I had been gambling since I was 16 years old and at the time I started the Challenge I was gambling 6 or 7 days a week and at a real low. My girlfriend sat me down and made me realise that I wasn't going anywhere if I continued to gamble the way I did.

So I decided to join the challenge and I am happy today that I am over a year free of gambling. Since completing the challenge I have become an Ambassador for the Foundation, telling my story about my difficulties with gambling as part of the foundation's education programs.

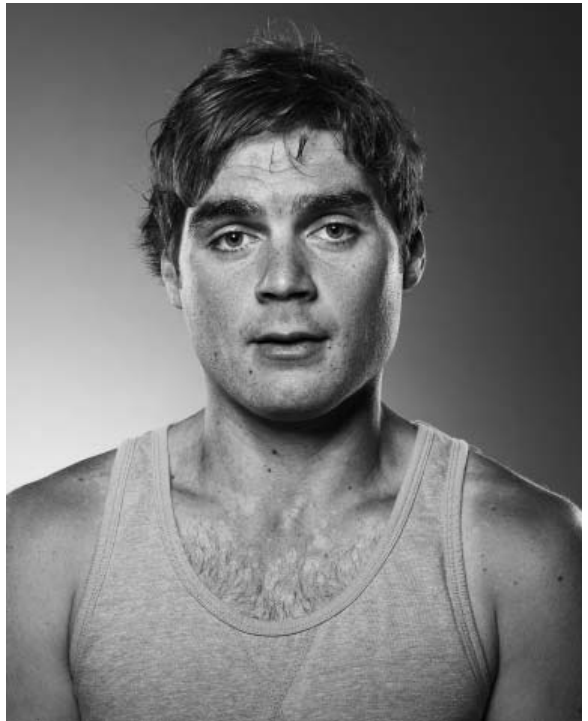
## **Can you tell us a little bit about the role your sporting club played when you were experiencing difficulties with gambling?**

It wasn't so much a role the club played but the opportunities that arose when the club hosted its functions at the RSL which made it easy for me to go off and play the pokies. Also on Sundays our recovery would be down at the beach which was nice and close to our club, and straight after we would all go to the RSL for a late breakfast and once again I would take the opportunity to play the pokies.

This was of course my choice, not the clubs, as they didn't know how bad of a gambler I was because I hid it quite well. I think if we had not have been at the RSL, and just another café, the temptation would not have existed.

## **Why do you think this is an important program?**

I am a really big fan of this program because it creates awareness for clubs, as people at the club don't often realise that when players have a little bet at the functions how quick this habit can turn into a problem.



I only wish this program was around when I was younger as it would have put my gambling into perspective. I am not saying it would have stopped me altogether, but it would have held me back from gambling as much.

## **What are the benefits of this program for clubs?**

The program creates awareness for all involved and also gives people the facts about gambling and makes people fully aware of the chance they have to win.

As part of the program, clubs have access to free education sessions on the risks of gambling, as well as ongoing support and advice on responsible gambling practices at their club.

# St Pat's claims Herald Sun Shield title

**Ballarat's St Patrick's College has over powered Box Hill Secondary College to secure a record breaking fifth consecutive Herald Sun Shield title.**

A dominant first term saw St Pat's sprint to a five goal lead and while they never quite broke the shackles, their class in the end proved too much for a gallant Box Hill SC.

The 12.12 (84) to 5.5 (35) victory at the MCG last Friday night was built largely on St Pat's drive off half back that so often came from the dashing Tom Templeton (Nth Ballarat Rebels).

The silky-skilled left-footer played with poise that enabled his team to sit more than five goals clear for the majority of the night.

Joel Cowan (Nth Ballarat Rebels) was also instrumental with his long kicking, while twin towers Jesse Palmer (Nth Ballarat Rebels) and Brenton Payne (Western Jets) caused plenty of headaches up forward.

The class of captain Liam Duggan (Western Jets), who pulled down mark of the day in the final term, and Dan Butler (Nth Ballarat Rebels) was also important for the winners.

Palmer and Butler joined fellow Rebels team mates Jacob Wheelahan and Jacob Hopper with two goals apiece, with the latter's finishing a feature.

Box Hill Secondary College, aiming to be just the second State school to prevail in the prestigious competition, was far from disgraced and after quarter time showed their willingness to compete.

Key forward Rob Maibaum kick started his side with two goals in a minute early in the second term, after a goalless opening stanza.

With Jayden Collins (Eastern Ranges) battling hard in the ruck, and Kyle Margaritas and Jarrod West winning plenty of the ball, Box Hill SC took it right to their more fancied opponents.

Speedy half forward Tieren Barbera was another making an impact and by at half time the margin was back to 32 points.

Despite keeping the pressure up in the second half, an effort typified by the work of Captain Liam Kinsella



(Oakleigh Chargers), Box Hill SC's turnovers prevented the underdogs from ever mounting a serious challenge.

The large contingent of St Patrick's students who made the trip from Ballarat made plenty of noise at the final siren as the players in the middle celebrated a 49-point victory and a remarkable fifth consecutive Herald Sun Shield title.

The streak puts St Pat's clear of Assumption College, who won four straight titles from 1987-90 and according to Duggan was a very special achievement.

"To win the School's fifth straight title is really special and to do it with your best mates is just a dream come true," he said.

"It's hard to put into words but we knew the whole School was behind us and we were really keen to do them all proud."

# New squads a boost for talent pathway

**Football's next crop of multicultural and indigenous stars is in good hands thanks to AFL Victoria's new specially designed academies.**

The David Zaharakis Squad, based at the Northern Knights, and the Jimmy Toumpas Squad (Dandenong Stingrays) were launched last month, giving boys from Melbourne's north and south east exposure to the main stream talent pathway.

The programs are based on a similar initiative at the Western Jets, known as the Majak Daw Squad, which is in its second year and has proved a valuable tool in helping talented boys with a multicultural or indigenous background transition into the TAC Cup system.

The primary objective of the three squads is to identify players who potentially have a future at the AFL or VFL level and through specialised training – under the guidance of expert coaches and positive role models – help them develop on and off the field.

The training sessions focus on skill development, fitness, strength and nutrition, and importantly also involves education and leadership components.

Zaharakis and Toumpas just don't hold naming rights to the squads, but they also attend most training nights and provide hands on coaching.

"Jimmy and David are both AFL Australia Post Multicultural Ambassadors and are really passionate about helping boys like themselves (both have parents born overseas) make the most of their football opportunity," AFL Victoria Engagement Manager Xavier Moloney said.

For Zaharakis, who is a former captain of the Northern Knights, it also allows him to give back to the pathway which helped him become the footballer he is today.

Former Western Bulldogs duo Lindsay Gilbee and Paul Hudson act as specialist coaches for the Zaharakis Squad, while Hawthorn livewire Paul Puopolo and Box Hill Hawks star David Mirra are filling a similar role with the Toumpas Squad.

Moloney said the success of the Majak Daw Squad had generated enormous benefits which helped inspire these two new academies.

"From last year's first intake of the Majak Daw Squad, we had a number of boys who are now playing or training with the Western Jets, which is a terrific result."

"The programs centres on leadership development and life skills that have players feeling empowered, and having a

good sense of self-worth and value which ties in well to making good decision for themselves, their careers and in general life.

"Team building, improved self-belief, decision making and communication are core curriculum topics covered and our aim is to also help educate parents and families on the AFL talent pathways and TAC Cup program.

The squads are made up of boys from many different backgrounds with some participants drafted in after high performance testing at schools in both regions to identify athletes with the right attributes to adapt to Australian football.

Both programs will enjoy an extensive week training regimes and play exhibition games to provide another opportunity to impress TAC Cup talent managers and possibly earn selection on their respective TAC Cup lists in 2016.
