VFL award winners recognised



Congratulations to Alex Woodward a most deserved winner of the 2014 J.J. Liston Trophy.

It's well deserved on many fronts as the Hawthorn listed player displayed consistently good form across virtually every game he played for Box Hill Hawks.

The most telling aspect about Woodward's Liston win is that it is a victory and reward for the persistence, resolve and determination he's displayed in the most trying circumstances.

Woodward, a former TAC Cup Sandringham Dragons' premiership co-captain and club best and fairest, missed his first two seasons on Hawthorn's list after undergoing not one, but two knee reconstructions.

The just turned 21-year-old put all that heartache and disappointment behind him as he showcased the talent that saw Hawthorn draft him at the 2011 AFL National Draft.

Woodward's victory in the Liston Medal highlighted an enjoyable and rewarding evening where the individual stars of the Peter Jackson VFL were honoured.

It is a fabulous way the Peter Jackson VFL community can gather to celebrate another memorable season and salute those who have left their signature on the competition.

Port Melbourne's Daniel Connors and Box Hill Hawks' Sam Grimley were presented their 'Jim 'Frosty' Miller medallions by the legendary Dandenong full forward whose moniker is carried on the goal kicking award.

Box Hill Hawks Peter McEvoy, a brother of Hawthorn ruck man Ben, tied with Josh Muling from Port Melbourne in the A. Todd Medal for the best and fairest player in the AFL Victoria Development League.

Frankston's Nicholas Newman was awarded the Fothergill Round Medal, named after Des Fothergill and Barry Round, the only players to have won a Brownlow Medal and Liston Trophy, as the player aged under 23-years with

the scope to take his game to the next level.

Williamstown coach Andy Collins, in his first year back in the Peter Jackson VFL for seven years, was named coach of the VFL Team of the Year.

As usual there were several familiar faces in the VFL Team of the Year, but two who deserve special recognition are Williamstown captain Ben Jolley and Port Melbourne's Sam Pleming.

For Jolley and Pleming it is the fifth successive season they have featured in the VFL Team of the Year.

The Alec Gillon medal was awarded to Lorna Bromley from the North Ballarat Football Club. Lorna has served in a voluntary capacity as a member of the Ladies Committee for the past 61 years, the past 30 years as president.

The Best Conducted VFL Club, judged on the votes on the field umpires who rate clubs on three criteria - players behaviour, on field officials behaviour and off field officials behaviour - went to North Ballarat.

Peter Jackson VFL Life Membership was bestowed upon dual Liston Trophy winner Steve Clifton and Ben Jolley, who played his 175th VFL game during the season.

Dennis Galimberti, a long serving servant of the Sandringham Football Club whose links to Victorian football, including 10 years as Footscray CEO, stretch back to 1981, was also awarded VFL Life Membership.

John Nicol, who joined the Werribee Football Club board in 1996 and has held the position of president for the past nine years, was another recipient of a VFL Life Membership.

Woodward claims J.J. Liston

Alex Woodward could be excused for thinking the football gods were never going to smile on him.

After a decorated career as a teenager, which saw him co-captain Sandringham Dragons to win the 2011 TAC Cup premiership, collect the Dragons' best and fairest and then be selected by Hawthorn in the 2011 AFL National Draft, everything appeared rosy for Woodward.

But, things went awry, really awry for Woodward in his first season with Hawthorn.

Woodward underwent a knee reconstruction after rupturing his anterior cruciate ligament during a NAB Cup match. It erased the entire season.

The 2013 season had not even begun when fate dealt Woodward the cruelest of blows, a second knee reconstruction after he re-injured his ACL.

After two games with Box Hill Hawks this season, Woodward was again cast in the unwanted role as a spectator with a shoulder injury. It cost him a couple of games.

While it hasn't been the easiest of journeys for Woodward, he wasn't anchored by what happened in the past.

Woodward put all that wretched luck behind him to showcase his talent in a manner that saw him make his AFL debut and secure the J.J. Liston Trophy.

The 21-year-old made it back to back wins in the Liston for a Hawthorn player when he won the VFL's highest individual award.

Mitch Hallahan dead-heated with North Ballarat's Steve Clifton and Geelong's Jordan Schroder in last year's Liston.

Woodward becomes the fifth Box Hill player to win a Liston. Don Brown was the first in 1960, followed the next year by Doug Beasy. There was a 41-year break until Sam Mitchell won the 2002 Liston Trophy in a phenomenal season where he polled 10 three votes and a single vote



from the 11 games he played in the VFL that season.

It took until the final home and away round for Woodward to hit the front in the Liston count after sharing the lead with North Ballarat's AFL listed player Liam Anthony.

Woodward polled the maximum votes in Box Hill Hawks' crushing win against Northern Blues even though Sam Grimley kicked a haul of seven goals.

The three votes elevated Woodward to 20 votes while Anthony was left on 17 votes after failing to secure a vote in North Ballarat's thumping loss against Port Melbourne.

It was the fourth maximum vote game Woodward polled,

the same amount as Anthony and third-placegetter, Footscray's Tom Campbell, who finished with 15 votes.

Woodward polled his first votes in Round 4, two votes against Coburg. He added another two votes against Richmond in Round 7 and a further two against Williamstown in Round 10.

By that stage, Williamstown's Scott Clouston led the count with 11 votes, one vote ahead of Anthony who polled 10 votes after the first seven rounds.

It wasn't until Round 13 that Woodward made his charge when he collected his first three vote game - against Essendon.

Clouston had surrendered the lead to Campbell who had shot to one vote advantage, but Woodward assumed the lead with another best-on-ground game, this time against Footscray.

Campbell wrestled the lead from Woodward with a three-vote game against Essendon in Round 15.

It would be the last game Campbell would play with Footscray as he earned a call-up to the Western Bulldogs.

Anthony made his move with a three-vote game against Coburg in Round 17, but Woodward was to counter that by gaining votes in the final three rounds.

Woodward secured one vote in Round 18, and then added back-to-back best-on-ground games against Bendigo and North Blues to rush past Anthony to win the Liston.

He collected votes in nine of the 13 games he played, the most individual votes awarded to any player.

Anthony, Campbell and Port Melbourne's Tony Pinwill, who dead-heated for fourth with Clouston, all polled in seven games.



Footscray polled the most votes of any club - 87 - with 20 of its players gaining at least one vote, beating ladder leader Port Melbourne with 83 votes, one more than Box Hill Hawks.

As is usually the case the Liston count threw up some anomalies.

Port Melbourne captain John Baird was not among the 18 Borough players who polled at least one vote.

Baird's teammate Daniel Connors, who tied with Grimley for the Jim 'Frosty' Miller, received just two votes. Grimley received five votes.

Hallahan, one of last year's Liston Trophy winners, collected just three votes while Schroder polled eight votes.

Ben Ross, another previous Liston Trophy winner, polled two votes and dual Liston Trophy winner Shane Valenti received six.

Ben Cavarra, winner of last year's Morrish Medal for fairest and best in the TAC Cup, headed Frankston's vote count with seven votes, while teammate Nicholas Newman, winner of the Fothergill Round medal, polled five votes.

But, the story of the 2014 JJ Liston Trophy was about Alex Woodward and the football gods finally smiling on him.

A. Todd Medal goes down to the wire

Peter McEvoy added to the collection of competition trophies at Box Hill Hawks this season when he dead-heated with Port Melbourne's Josh Muling for the A. Todd Medal, best and fairest in the VFL Development League.

McEvoy's success followed teammate Alex Woodward's win in the J.J. Liston Trophy and Sam Grimley's in the Jim 'Frosty Miller Medal.

McEvoy also won the goal kicking competition in the Development League by a whopping 23 goals.

There was no such margin for McEvoy in the A. Todd Medal as he was locked with Muling on 13 votes at the end of a thrilling count.

Both McEvoy and Muling polled in six matches, with the Box Hill Hawks forward surging home to tie the Todd Medal.

Muling, in his fifth season with Port Melbourne, appeared to have the A. Todd Medal in his keeping when he collected his third 'three votes' in Round 17 to shoot to 12 votes.

It gave him a five vote lead over McEvoy and Muling added to his tally with a one vote game in Round 18.

But, that round coincided with McEvoy gaining the maximum votes following his eight goal haul against Frankston.

With Port Melbourne having a bye in the final home and away round, Muling was left to ponder if his 13 votes, three more than McEvoy, would be enough.

It wasn't.

McEvoy, thanks to a seven goal bag against Northern Blues, collected three votes to move to 13 votes.

McEvoy, younger brother of Hawthorn ruck man Ben, made a stunning impact with Box Hill Hawks.

He played every match and kicked at least one goal in every match

except an early season fixture against Sandringham.

For Muling it was a fitting reward for a loyal club man who has played 68 Development League games for Port Melbourne, along with his 17 senior games.

Muling made three senior appearances this season and played 13 Development League games.

He's missed very few games since he graduated from the Oakleigh Chargers in 2009.

McEvoy's success gave Box Hill Hawks its third A. Todd Medal, Ryan Cassidy (2003) and Joel Cross (2009) the other Box Hill winners.

For Port Melbourne it was their first A. Todd Medalist since current Collingwood player Sam Dwyer won in 2007.

Former Box Hill Hawks player Dalton Graham, in his first season at Sandringham, finished equal third with Williamstown's Josh Bench.

Graham and Bench polled 11 votes, two less than McEvoy and Muling.



Port Melbourne v Sandringham



For much of the season the discussion centred around Port Melbourne's bid for a 17th premiership such was the Borough's dominance.

The conversation seemed warranted as Port Melbourne went through the home and away season losing just the two games, finishing two games clear in top spot.

Adding to the talk was that Port Melbourne would play its first finals game at the North Port Oval where they'd lost just a handful of games in the past five years.

All that dialogue was rendered redundant after reigning premiers Box Hill Hawks exposed chinks in the Port Melbourne armoury in last week's Qualifying Final.

Now, Port Melbourne finds itself in a Semi Final clash against Sandringham after what can only be described as an inglorious performance against the VFL Hawks.

It was hard to reconcile the Port Melbourne during home and away season to the one that repeatedly butchered the ball, made poor decisions and were badly beaten in the engine room, which had been its strength.

Admittedly, forwards Daniel Connors, Will Johnson and Julian Rowe were largely ineffective, but the supply source was spasmodic at best.

Port Melbourne now must regroup against a Sandringham team that carries momentum from a strong end to the season.

When it appeared the Zebras season would fade away they rallied to win four of the past five games, including its Elimination Final against Collingwood.

Yes, the Magpies were threadbare on AFL listed/rookie players (there was just six) but Sandringham had the services of just one more St Kilda listed/rookie players.

The Zebras would be buoyed that they were able to travel to Victoria Park and overcome the magpie army.

Now, they must regroup again as they tackle Port

Melbourne, which defeated them by 29-points in Round 13 at the Trevor Barker Oval.

While Port Melbourne will run out with the relative same line-up - tribunal decisions pending on Marcus Marigliani and Toby Pinwill - it will be a vastly different Sandringham team.

In their last encounter the Zebras included 13 St Kilda players against Port Melbourne. Not too many, if any, of that group that included Sam Fisher, Tom Curren, Beau Maister, Brodie Murdoch, Blake Acres, Nathan Wright and Arryn Siposs will play in the Semi Final.

Sandringham will rely heavily on captain Adam Cockie and Kenny Ong as well as Saints Trent Dennis-Lane and Sam Dunnel.

They will also hope that Port Melbourne are still shell-shocked from its uncharacteristic performance against Box Hill Hawks.

But, Port Melbourne, who won't be troubled by Sandringham's height in attack as they were against Box Hill Hawks, won't want its season to have the exclamation point of a straight set exit.



Williamstown v Werribee



It's fair to say there's always a fair degree of niggle whenever Williamstown plays Werribee.

The two traditional western suburb clubs don't particularly like each other for a raft of reasons, particularly with recruiting or as each club may say poaching of players, dating back over the decades.

Now they square off in a Semi Final, which will consign one of them to its season end.

Williamstown will be rueing lost opportunities last week against Footscray at a wind-swept Victorian University Whitten Oval.

Werribee are likely to have some important North Melbourne listed player inclusions for the match against Williamstown, but they will need to as this promises to be a take-no-prisoners affair.

Williamstown posted a nine-point victory in its only encounter against Werribee this season, although with nine



more scoring shots the Seagulls should have won by more. It was Williamstown's 11th straight win against Werribee, a run that the Tigers will be hoping to end this weekend.

Each club has its prime movers, players that provide the spark that ignites teammates.

Seagulls' captain Ben Jolley, ex-Werribee player Scott Clouston and former Northern Blues trio Adam Marcon, Kane Lambert and Nick Meese are pivotal to Williamstown's chances.

Werribee will be hoping that Moore will play and that ruck man Daniel Currie, Jamie MacMillan and Mason Wood, who were all elevated to North Melbourne's team when they decided to rest several players, will come back into the team.

Wood was absent in the Round 9 clash and would be a welcome inclusion up forward for the Tigers.

North Melbourne's Scott McMahon, outstanding against North Ballarat as he played a loose man role, another player Werribee will look to help keep the dream alive.

Werribee will need everything to fall in its favour as Williamstown may just have an edge in the midfield.

VFL to play International Rules

AFL Victoria has announced the initial Peter Jackson VFL squad that will host Ireland in a practice match leading up to the AFL International Rules game in November.

2014 VFL State coach, three-time Springvale premiership player and 2013 Box Hill Hawks premiership coach Damian Carroll will be in charge of the team.

The squad features 12 players that represented the VFL against SANFL earlier in the year, along with some of the competition's most talented up and coming players including Frankston's Ben Cavarra, Shannon Taylor and Fothergill Round Medalist Nic Newman, Coburg's Adam Saad and Williamstown's Adam Marcon, Kane Lambert and Jake Owen.

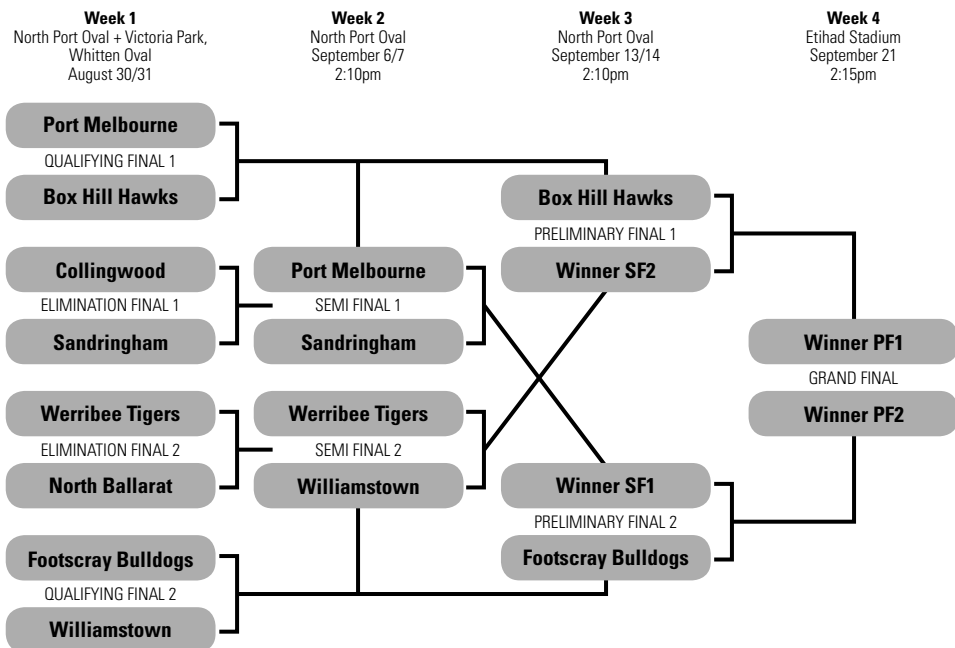

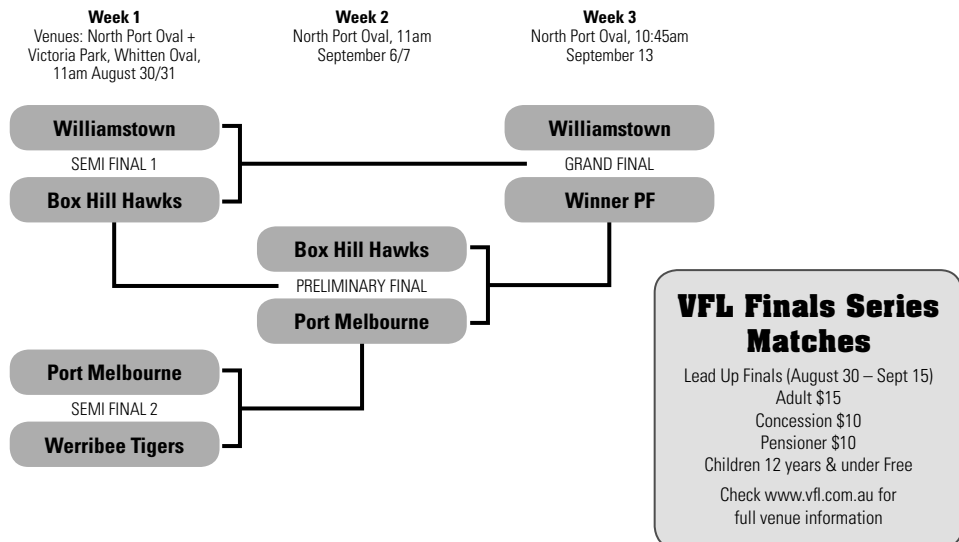

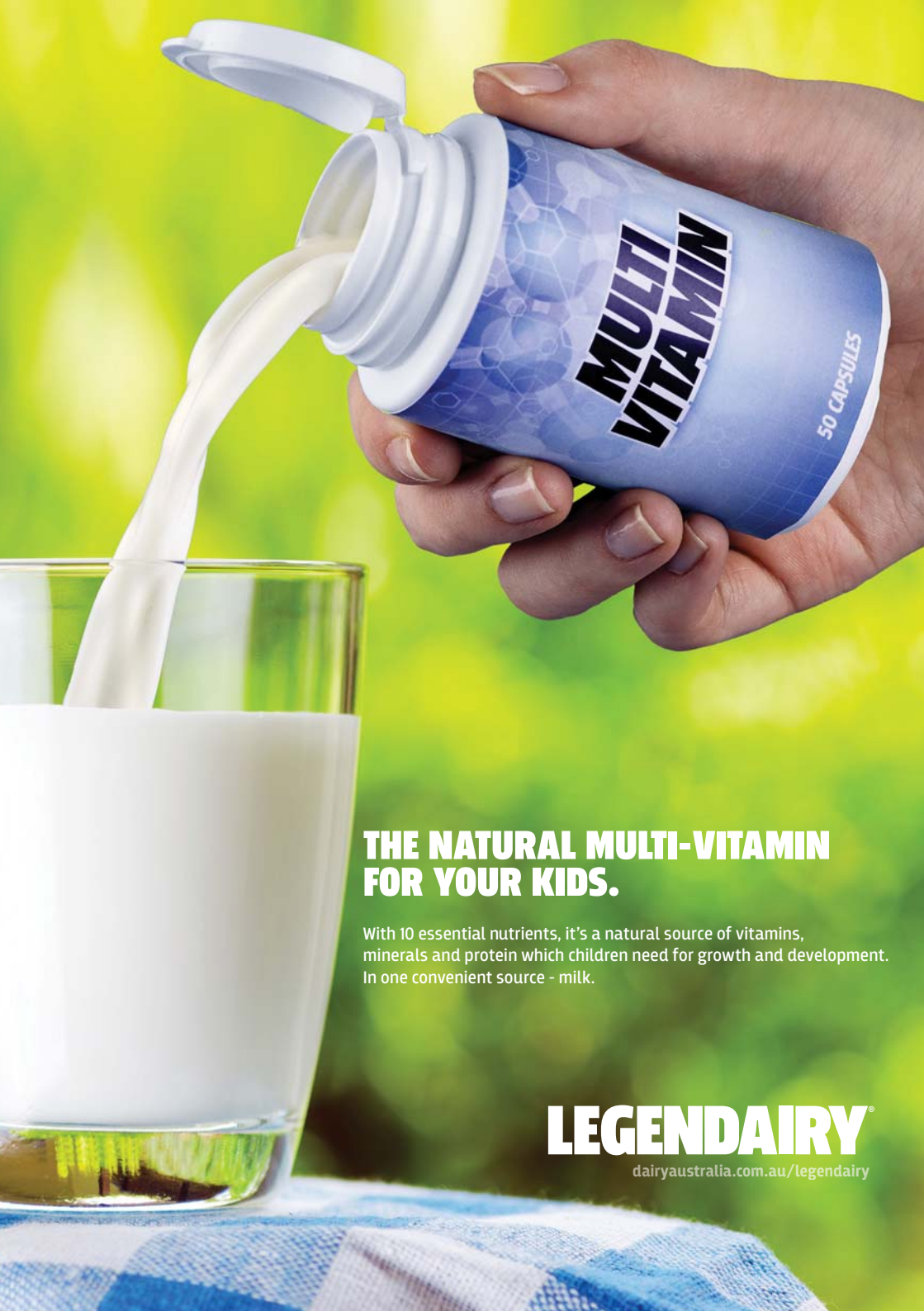
