Vicki is assisted each week by a Referee's Supervisor whose job it is to move around the courts monitoring and supervising the work of our young referees and providing education and in rare cases intervention, when needed.

For your assurance, all of the people working for CHBA have submitted themselves to a "Working with Children" check and are approved persons.






Rules, Rulz and more rules!

All of our Primary School Competitions are played using modified rules which recognise that children are not adults and therefore do not have the same physical abilities or maturity to be able to play according to the official rules. Our modified rules also recognise that even in year 6, our players are still learning the game.

Within our competition we have three different sets of playing rules, which likewise recognise the very different abilities of year 2 or 3 players compared to the "oldies" in year 6.

We seek your support for our Codes of Behaviour and that you take some time to teach your children the appropriate way to participate in our sport.


Need some help? Coaching Clinics?
