## MID-STRENGTH APPROACH AT CHFL GRAND FINAL

Huge crowds are expected to gather at Eureka Stadium in Ballarat this weekend for the Central Highlands Football League Grand Final.

As they will at venues across country Victoria, supporters will pile into grounds to witness the battle for the Premiership Cup, with some enjoying alcoholic beverages as they cheer on the men in the middle.

While traditionally alcohol consumption has been part and parcel of these occasions, a recent research project commissioned by AFL Victoria and conducted by La Trobe University's Centre for Sport and Social Impact shows cultures can, and are, changing.

A violent incident at the 2009 Central Highlands league Grand Final in which police were injured and the SWOT team was forced to attend, was the catalyst for the league implementing an Alcohol Management Plan.

A key part of the plan was serving only mid-strength beer, a move that research shows has improved the overall culture at one of the Ballarat region's most popular sporting events.

The nine point alcohol management plan included the following:

Sale of mid-strength alcohol only

• Zero tolerance of underage drinking and misbehaviour

• Visual presence with increased security and police, and bag checks at the gate

 Posters detailing offences and penalties relating to alcohol

• Regulation of car parks, with a club allocation to be given to the elderly and families with pre-school children only

• Large 'dry areas' implemented in trouble spots

The research included surveys with football spectators at the 2013 CHFL Grand Final and interviews with key stakeholders within the CHFL and Central Highlands Netball League.

While some stakeholders and clubs in the league thought the 2009 incident was an isolated one, the overwhelming consensus was that the results had been positive and the plan worthwhile.

There was almost complete agreement that the action taken had benefited the league and transformed the culture of Grand Final day.

There has been no major incidents since the introduction of the mid-strength alcohol policy and coupled with other strategies such as dry areas and increased secu-

rity checks, most believe the event is now more family friendly than ever.

These changes have also coincided with an increase in attendance while having minimal impact on bar sales.

More than 50 per cent of people interviewed on Grand Final day thought the mid-strength trial was a good idea, with one third of the drinking crowd reporting that they now drink less at the event.

AFL Victoria Cultural Strategy Manager John Strachan said taking a responsible approach to drinking was important for all leagues.

"The focus of clubs and leagues needs to be on creating healthy, safe and welcoming environments for participants, whether they be players, coaches, umpires, volunteers or supporters," he said.

"This research project identifies the outcomes that can be achieved by developing a comprehensive plan for alcohol management."

"It's not about eliminating alcohol altogether but rather taking steps to ensure it is consumed responsibly and that it doesn't detract from the many positive social benefits that stem from community football."

# Drawn Finals

## NO FINALS WILL BE REPLAYED IN CASE OF A DRAW IN ANY FINALS GAMES EXTRA TIME WILL BE PLAYED

In the event of scores being level at the elapsed time, the timekeepers are instructed to sound the siren. The field umpires shall then.

- a) Direct the goal umpires to consult with each other as to the correct score. Teams are required to stay on the ground until goal umpires confirm scores correct.
- b) On receiving confirmation that the scores are level instruct both captains that the match shall recommence with the teams kicking to the same end as in the final quarter and that two five minute periods (with time on) shall be played with teams exchanging ends after the first five minute period immediately after the siren sounds.
- c) Consult both captains as to their readiness to recommence the match.
- d) Hold the ball aloft to indicate to the timekeepers that the match is about to recommence.
- e) The timekeeper shall then sound the siren and the match will recommence.
- f) In the event of scores being level after the two five minute periods, a further two five minute periods (with time on) shall be played with clubs exchanging ends after the first five minute period.

This process shall continue until there is a result.

Coaches are not permitted to address players at any stage after the three-quarter time interval





# What just happened?

Last weekend Beaconsfield had a dream that they would down Casey Cardinia League super side Narre Warren and move into the 2014 Grand Final with a week's break. On paper it was far-fetched and akin to wishing for world peace. That hope was expected to remain until the final siren of the second semi-final when the Eagles players would wake up and find themselves in a preliminary final. Well unbelievable as it may seem – the dream is alive after the Eagles caused the upset of the year.

Even the scoreboard attendants were thinking that Narre Warren would win at the end of the game but a quick check saw the Eagles with the week's break courtesy of the barest margin.

Berwick bowed out of the finals race on Sunday courtesy of a comprehensive dismantling at the hands of Cranbourne. The Wickers have had an interesting season that has ranged from brilliant to confusing to downright disappointing. The big plus for Rhys Nisbet's side is that they now present as a team off field and, more often than not, play like one on it. This augers well for next year but unfortunately for the lads from the Edwin Flack Reserve, they will be watching on with envy over the next two weeks.

# **Preliminary Final**

Narre Warren will go into this weekend's game as strong favourites against bitter rivals Cranbourne but that will be cold comfort for Magpie fans after last week's shock finals loss to Beaconsfield. Despite finishing the game full of running the Magpies went down and the fact that



they have been head and shoulders above the rest for the season meant nothing in the end. Beaconsfield's Holm Park Road Reserve creates a neutral venue that will favour neither side so fans can expect a close and, more importantly desperate affair.

Eagles supporters had plenty to cheer about on the weekend and the Magpie brains trust would have been taking notes. High on the list of plusses was the superb performance of star midfielder Curtis Barker, who often looks unfashionable but always has a major influence on every contest he is part of. He is one of those players who maintains his feet and composure as others fall away and that is gold in modern football. Barker had assistance around the packs from tough team mate Leigh Holt together with Matt Weller and the Wickers simply capitulated in the clinches.

Narre Warren's reaction to the shock second semi-final loss will decide how this week's match is contested. While the Magpies edge in class is undeniable, there is an elephant in the room and that is injuries. Josh Tonna is absent and interleague centre half-back Kain Baskaya looked proppy after the weekend's game and a huge hole will be made if he does not come up for the cutthroat final. As suggested last week the Magpies do have great depth so there will be no panic. The positives from last weekend included the top-notch performances of Jake Richardson, Ryan Morrison and under 19 prodigy Hayden Stagg.

Given good conditions it is anticipated that this week's game will be highlighted by attack because both sides will be out to prove that the other can be dismantled by forward pressure.

The Magpies have goal scoring options led by century spearhead Kerem Baskaya, Aaron McIver, Chris Collins,

Nick Scanlon and his brother Stewart. The battle between Baskaya and Cranbourne blanket Brandon Osborne will be worth watching particularly if the game is close. Inform star Nick Scanlon will likely spend time in the midfield and could run in to Eagles half-back playmaker Nick Barker when he is forward, so he will need to include a defensive string to his bow this week.

The Eagles attack boasts the strength of Marc Holt and secondary marking forward Michael Theodoridis, together with the finesse of elusive star Ryan Jones. Those names would put fear into any defensive unit and how the Magpies line up to take on the task of stopping them will be interesting to watch. The job will fall to reliable youngster Ben King along with Lee Boyle, Ben Wragg and Kain Baskaya if he plays. They may need a serious chop-out from the side's midfielders if the pressure is applied.

Cranbourne coach Scott Sutherland was the first to devise a successful plan to down the Magpies after 44 straight wins and, while it may not be a big thing, it will be in the back of the mind of his Magpie counterpart Chris Toner. Toner will not allow any complacency to creep in to this group of players, that is for sure.

Cranbourne oozes class with strong marking big men Michael Boland, Stuart Morrish and Troy Tharle, supported by experienced team mates Mat Rus, Mat Fletcher and Luke Bee-Hugo as the side's prime movers.

However the Magpies have just as many, if not more players in that boat. Names like Michael Collins, Steve Watson, Col McNamara, Dylan Quirk, Justin Marriott and Jackson Parker are among many Fox Road household stars that football fans expect to see listed as gamebreakers.

These two foes would not have expected to see each other before the grand final after Cranbourne's qualifying final loss a fortnight ago so there will be a fair degree of nervous energy about this game. The head-to-head score for 2014 stands at one-all, with the margins being six points to the Eagles and 10 points to the Magpies. Their last meeting gives a small pointer to this weekend's result with Narre warren having 10 more shots at goal in round 18. The feeling is that last Sunday's loss was an aberration on the way to the grand final and that the Magpies will take their place in the big dance and meet Beaconsfield for the ultimate prize.

# **Football Preview**

## Reserves

As predicted Narre Warren catapulted into the grand final but only after a real battle last weekend, leaving Berwick and Pakenham to argue the point about who challenges them for the silverware. This weekend's game could be the highlight of the reserves finals series.

Pakenham outran Čranbourne last weekend with coach Darren Sidebottom giving players like Sean Winsall, Chris Cardona, Jake Kowarzik and veteran Chad Shooter license to take the game on. #### Geelong Falcons stung by Stingrays....

The Dandenong Southern Stingrays continue to prove the experts wrong with a frantic 53 point win against the Geelong Falcons in the TAC Cup Semifinal, which was played on Sunday at Visy Park Carlton in slightly windy but perfect Spring like conditions. The Flacons had the wood over the Stingrays in season 2014 with strong wins, the most recent a 10 goal win two weeks ago in the final home and away game. But a 20 goal turnaround from the last outing two weeks ago has plenty scratching their heads. Even dominating early and matching the Stingrays on inside 50 entries it wasn't to be the Falcons day with their season coming to a crashing end, with most experts having them easily through to next week to take on the Calder Cannons. In perfect conditions the Stingrays kicked against the swirling breeze but defended gallantry denying the Falcons any goals, which would be the theme for the remainder of the day. The start of the game was a low scoring affair, with the ball bouncing between the arcs until Aaron Wilson kicked truly for the first goal of the match from a coast to coast movement at the thirteen minute mark. The Falcons were dominating the play and we went forward often enough, but they didn't use the ball anywhere near good enough for TAC Cup level allowing the Stingrays defenders to pick off the high ball and continue to rebound it forward who in turn were wasting their opportunities. Jack Lonie added the Stingrays second goal moments before the siren sounded giving the Stingray a 10 point led at the first break. The second term was similar to the first with the game played at a fast pace with all goals being setting up from rebound entries. The first goal going to the Falcons after a poor inside 50 entry, but two quick replies went to the Stingrays before a 50 metre penalty allowed the Falcons to kick their second bringing the margin back to 2 straight kicks. It was shaping up for another cracking game. The Stingrays playing group seemed to lift and movement inside the Stingrays 50 became more measured and direct with goals coming through Lachlan Williams and Mitch Cox to go to the long break with a handy 24 point led. At half time Dandenong Stingrays Coach Craig Black asked his players to continue to take the game on, but directed them to lower their eyes more and look lateral for the spare and to honor the runners.

The Stingrays had led at every break, finally putting the game beyond doubt in the premiership quarter, powering

away to establish a match-winning 40-point lead which they continued to increase that in the final term. There was intense pressure around the uncontested ball and courage called upon time and time again, with the Stingrays playing group growing in confidence after numerous individual acts. It was led by Dandenong' Co Captain, the ever dangerous pocket dynamite Jack Lonie who did the damage kicking three of his five goals. The Falcons tried three different opponents on him in an attempt to nullify his influence but Lonie was back to his MVP Vic Country best slicing the opposition and stamping his mark on the big stage. Jack was supported superbly by Tom Lamb who was dangerous wherever the coaches moved him to, kicking two beautiful goals. There were 7 other individual goal kickers, 5 being midfielders making it hard for any team to close down the scoring. The Stingrays backline was solid all day with Kyle Gray and Mitch White raising their hands as key utilities, along with a match winning performance by Dan Moloney on the ever dangerous Alan Christensen limiting him to less than 10 possession and no goals which hasn't been done many times this year. Remarkably, the Falcons finished with 9 more inside 50 entries than the Dandenong Stingrays but they were unable to take their opportunities and that ended up being the difference in the finish. The win now sees the Stingrays one win away from a back-toback Grand Final appearances, which would be a huge effort after finishing outside the top 4. This week's game for the Stingrays is a repeat of last year's Preliminary Final match against the Calder Cannons, which will be played at Visy Park, Carlton on Saturday 13th September at 11.30am. Entry is free. After the game Stingrays Coach Black said, "Couldn't be happier for the players at this stage...a few weeks ago they got a reality check, we the coaching group gave them the advice needed and for two weeks in a row they have followed our instructions to a tee." Black went onto say, "Today as the game went on I think we got better...we were lucky in the first half the Falcons didn't put us away on the scoreboard as they had more of the footy and more inside 50's...we did defended well though and take they missed probably two of their best players this year." "The boys will be sick of hearing it from me but I say to them if the effort is there the result will come....22 players gave us effort today so we now get to play in another round of finals where anything can happen, as long as we turn up to play." 
















# **Netball Preview**




# Narre Warren Magpies




