Refereeing the Defense

“REREREE THE DEFENSE”

On a one on one play, drive to the hoop

- Referees must focus on the defense
- Focusing on the defense allows for better judgment
- What has the Defense done ***wrong?***



Refereeing the Defense

- Defense has the same rights as the offence.
- Not every contact is a foul and
- Not every contact which is penalised is a defensive foul.



Refereeing the Defense

Defensive Rights

- Defend
- A place on the floor
- The space directly above



Refereeing the Defense

Defensive Rights

- Maintain an established position
- Maintain a path
- When in the air, a place to land if space is not already occupied



Refereeing the Defense

Defensive Obligations

- Play defense within the rules
- Not interfere with the RIGHTS of the offence

3 F's Principle

- Feet
- First
- Facing



REFEREEING LEAD

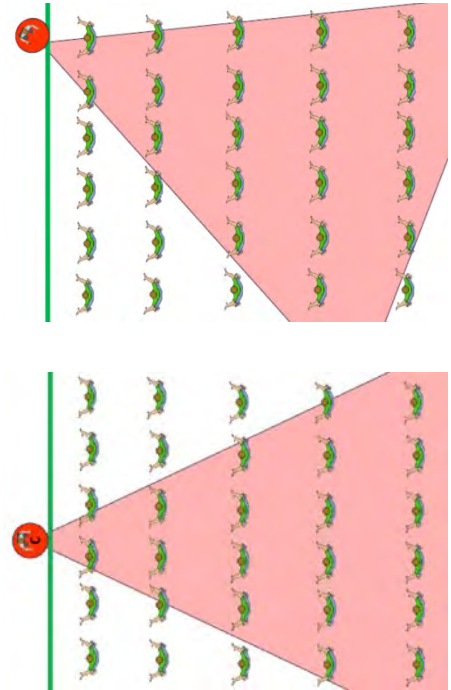
Refereeing Lead

- Move off the baseline
- Step back 1.5 - 2M from the end line



Refereeing Lead

- Get a wider view to see more
- Under the hoop can narrow your view
- See the **Gap** and adjust



Refereeing Lead

- A wider angle means better vision and, in turn, better decisions.
- To achieve this, you must always be on the move.
- Penetrate to the basket when the ball is dribbled from rectangle 4 to 5 to 6.
- See the 'start' and 'end' of the drive.



Refereeing Lead

- Pay attention to the **post play**
- Amount of physical contact you will tolerate.
- Responsibility for any rough play & should penalise it.

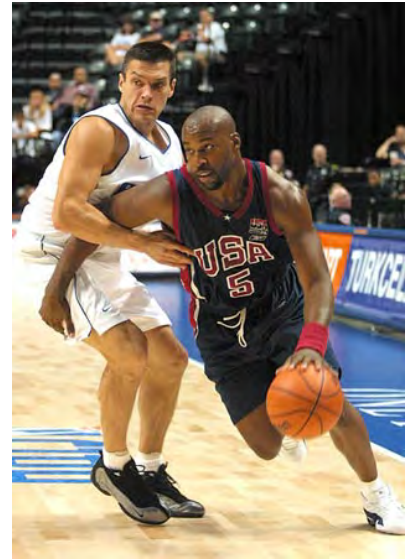


MAKING THE RIGHT CALL

Tips and techniques for better refereeing.

Making the Right Call

- Let the game come to you
- get in to the flow of the game from the start
- each game is different
- feel the difference
- concentrate on the reactions of players



Making the Right Call

- take note if the tempo of the game changes and adjust
- establish a pattern early in the game, if the game requires tight calling, do so from the start
- if the game changes, Referee must change accordingly



Making the Right Call

- Referee the spirit of the rules.
- Intervene, do not interfere
- Do not create problems for yourself
- Work as a team
- Keep constant visual contact
