



Coaching Director

The St Paul's McKinnon Junior Football Club is looking to appoint a "Coaching Director" for the 2015 season.

Our coaches are the key influencers in developing and maintaining our positive club culture. They also have a significant impact on the lives of individuals within our club, especially the players.

The St Paul's McKinnon Junior Football Club believes there is a growing need to assist accredited coaches and support their development in a variety of aspects of the multi-faceted role they play in our club environment. We want the coaching coordinator to support and oversee the growth and development of individual coaches and enhance their overall effectiveness at our club.

Coaching Director Role Description

Objectives

- To coordinate, monitor and enhance the quality of coaching of all St Paul's McKinnon Junior Football Club teams at training and on match days

Responsibilities

- Lead the recruitment, appointment and development of all coaches at the Club
- Ensure and maintain coaches accreditation – and encourage progression through the AFL Levels
- Build through consultation a game plan / style of play for all teams that is age appropriate
- Provide guidance and oversee the use of core training drills and skills that support the club's game plan and style
- Provide training night assistance in introducing the core training skills and drills
- Manage and acquire new football equipment as required
- Communicate regularly with all coaches, providing regular feedback on their performance and impact at training and on match days

Reporting Relationships

- Reports to the Club Executive Committee



Role Expectations

It will be expected that the Coaching Director will contribute 10 hours per week to the junior football club each week for 20 weeks, however these hours can be negotiated.

The Coaching Director should support coaches so that players will receive the best practice approach to training, skill development and match day environment.

Key Deliverables 2015

- Build, promote and enforce a skills development curriculum for use at all age groups by the coaches.
- Monitor and assess skills development progression for each age group (on-going)
- Develop a club game plan / style that can be tailored to different age levels – share game style and plan with all coaches
- Publish and promote a set of core training drills at each age level that supports the adoption of the club game style
- Prepare and convene 2-3 education / development sessions for all coaches / assistant coaches
- Manage the 2016 Coaching Appointment Process – including all interviews with an appropriate assembled recruitment panel and submit coach recommendations to Club Executive Committee for sign-off.

To Apply
