With assistance from the Sunshine Coast Sports Federation and Basketball Queensland, your steering committee has developed a concept for the governance structure as described in the proposed SCBA Structure and Recommendations document:

- in keeping with the **vision** of “***basketball being everyone’s game to enjoy on the Sunshine Coast***”, and
- accepting the **mission** to “***provide leadership and co-ordination that enable everyone to participate, develop and enjoy the sport of Basketball on the Sunshine Coast***”.

We, the members of the steering committee recommend endorsement, by clubs, of the attached suggested structure, to benefit Sunshine Coast Basketball Clubs, players, families, and the sport of Basketball as follows:

- Provide stronger competitions for players
- Development of co-ordinated programs for player development, coach development, referee recruitment and training
- Access to central resources
- Eliminate duplication of functions and roles that currently exist in clubs (eg: administration, competition co-ordination etc)
- Offer improved pathways for players – from club to interclub to representative to QBL
- Presenting as a strong unified “voice” for Sunshine Coast Basketball to:

- ✓ Access local, state and federal government grant funding
- ✓ Attract sponsorship
- ✓ Develop more facilities
- ✓ Produce stronger representative teams
- ✓ Promote basketball on the Sunshine Coast as the sport to be loved and enjoyed by everyone from the junior to the senior, from the serious player to the social player, and including the spectator.
