International Transfer Certificate Application for Minors

NB: All documents should be submitted as pdf scans. Photographs of documents are <u>not</u> acceptable to FIFA.

Dispensations:

Dispensation from providing all of the above documentation will be granted in the following circumstances, and in the following manner, only.

<u>Where the parents are Australian or New Zealand citizens</u>: the requirements relating to work permits *only* are waived.

<u>Where the applicant player and their family are refugees:</u> FFA accepts that aspects of this documentation will be impossible to provide. On this basis, in lieu of the documents listed under "Proof of Identity and Nationality" and "Work Permit", we will accept a copy of the family's *Document for Travel to Australia*, which is provided by the Department of Immigration and includes proof of a Subclass 200 Visa. In respect of the other categories of documentation, Clubs are advised to work with the Player's family and the relevant Member Federation in the first instance to compile as complete an application as possible.

Instructions for Clubs:

Clubs will have received this checklist from the relevant Member Federation where they seek to register:

- A child aged between 12 and 18, who is a foreign national, who is seeking to register with an Australian club, and this registration will be their first registration anywhere in the world; *or*
- A child aged between 12 and 18, who is Australian or a foreign national, who is seeking to register with an Australian club and their previous registration was with an overseas club.

Any Clubs who have received this checklist from their Member Federation and compiled a *complete* application for a Minor International Transfer Certificate should <u>send this documentation</u> to their Member Federation as soon as possible.

Please note: if the minor is in Australia temporarily as a <u>foreign exchange student</u>, please speak with your Member Federation as a different FIFA process will apply.
