Undoubtably our top recruit was Ron Tanabel who showed excellent form in pre-season training and carried this form for most of the year being section runner-up.

New players to sign with the club were Leon Price, John Philp, Danny Collard Joe Bronszewski, who all showed good early form. The Club appointed Laurie De Goldie as Reserves Coach who was always willing to help the senior side. A new captain was selected and Yanek Olsen a previous vice-captain for two years obtained the club captaincy with Ron Tanabel his deputy.

The season commenced with all the players of both teams very confident about chances for 1972. Once again as in the past two years our form was very good recording some very good wins while also playing some excellent football.

Although deeply embedded in the top four we had our slump and were beaten by teams who previously we had easily accounted for.

An example of this was the time we played St. Mary's at home with at least three players in for their first game with previous poor form we played excellent football against the top side and ran out comfortable winners by eight goals. The next week we went to Barwon who were not playing well and were easily beaten by the then bottom side.

After discussions amongst ourselves we overcame these difficulties to once again appear in the finals at Kardinia Park.

Our opponents were Thomson who appeared to have the

wood of our team. This was a very interesting game with our skill and pace a decisive factor early and Thomson strength bringing them into the game with little time to go and they eventually won by three points.

In my opinion the committee and supporters saw our team in a wonderful game with every player giving his very best for the club in the true "Eagle" spirit.

Congratulations to Laurie and all Reserve players for an excellent effort in being section runners ups.

Personally the final series this year was of a good standard and was highlighted by a Grand Final which was won by St. Mary's.

With the young players connected with our club playing well, I am hoping that all '72 players will make themselves available and accept the challenge for '73, it goes without saying it must be Chilwell's year in '73.

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### THE HURST TEAM


