Administration Quarterly Report 2015. (First Quarter)

Despite still in the mood of the festive season, the National Olympic Committee of Solomon Islands office resumes its duties on the 5th of January 2015.

The office activities started off with a lively pace, different from the previous year, this was because the office has now employed another staff, the Secretary General.

2015 was however going to be a very challenging and tiring year for the Olympic Committee of Solomon Islands before it arrives, both in the Sporting arena and Administrational as the NOC is preparing its athletes for the Pacific Games in PNG in July and for the Commonwealth Youth Games in Samoa as well as the office prepares to roll its programs under Solidarity.

Some of the major activities which the office did in the first quarter was trying to get the National Federations to pay in their affiliation fees or get affiliated to the National Olympic Committee as well as the National Sports council on time and to pay their Pacific Games Levy.

The Federations were somehow very slow to come forward to pay in their registration fee and the Pacific Games Levy as they (NFs) don't have the financial means and have to raise funds.

Another major activity which the office did was, to get the athletes right information to be accredited for the Pacific Games. This is done daily.

The course in the Solomon Islands was attended by 10 national squad players, who were able to work on their skills and develop their confidence. The course was also attended by national team head coaches, who have gained further knowledge on how best to prepare their teams for the Pacific Games in.

Solomon Îslands Volleyball Federation Mr Morris Hakapauhenua said the organisation was hoping to: "Provide career pathways for coaches, referees and executive administrators, to deliver quality volleyball through grassroots courses, national courses and regional and international training.
