

1971:

There were only 13 members that first year, they were:-

They won the trophy for the dress parade, which meant that they won their first trophy for Devils before they ever played one match. That first year they made the Grand Final but were defeated by Rebels by only one run.

1972:

The following year there were three Devils teams, A1, A3 and J1C. J1C were runners up in Grand Final to Jindalee Jags.

This year saw Devils take out the A3 Premiership to the tune of 13 - 0 to Saints culminating a very successful year, the team being undefeated.

1973:



Ross Culpitt's 100 A Grade game against Rebels was on 8/11/75. Ross was a great asset to our club and played top softball at all times.


1976:



DEBBY BROWN — Very capable short stop and strong batter. Obviously a thinking player in the field who always knew where the ball should go.


DONNA ANDREWS - Great batter who was never short of a hit at the right time.


