

Club History

1971:

Devils Softball Club was founded in 1971 by Sandra Gadde's and Elaine Robinson. The first ever matched played by Devils was 2nd October, 1971 against Vikings and won by Devils 21 - 1. There were only 13 members that first year, they were:-

Jill Bolen; Alison Dawson (Holdway); Sandra Gaddes; Judy Lindholm; Roslyn Gaylard (Morrison); Rae Hyslopp; Julie Browne; Merle Martin; Narelle Sharpe; Elaine Robinson; Marilyn Phillips; Rosslyn Culpitt (Wilson); Fay Hammond (Walter).

There was no Captain, Elaine coached and they all shared the work. A very happy team. They won the trophy for the dress parade, which meant that they won their first trophy for Devils before they ever played one match. That first year they made the Grand Final, but were defeated by Rebels by only one run.

1972:

The following year there were four Devils teams, A1, A3, B2 and J1C. J1C were runners-up in the Grand Final to Jindalee Jags.

This year saw Devils take out the A3 Premiership to the tune of 13-0 to Saints culminating a very successful year, the team being undefeated. Members of that team were -

At the end of this Season, Sandra Gaddes and Rosslyn Culpitt (Wilson) had completed 32 and Elaine Robinson and Jill Bolen 17 'A' Grade Club Games.


1973:

In 1973 we fielded 5 teams A1, A2, A3, B2 and J3. This was a tremendous increase, after only 2 years Devils had 5 teams, three of them in the highest possible grades.

Also in 1973 the very first night Softball started at Hawthorne Park, this was later to be transferred to Perry Park. How well we remember those first nights. The squad for that year was:-

Considering the age of some of these players today, just work out how young they and their Coach Don Culpitt were in that first night series. This is the first year that complete records could be registered, as we have no score books for the A2 and B2 that year we cannot include these in our records.

In day ball, highest batting average went to Leanne McCulloch .514 and Fielding Average to Maree Bitossi .981. Sandra Gaddes and Rosslyn Culpitt completed 51 'A' Grade Club Games.

1974:

Devils played at Hawthorne Park again in 1974 and in the day fixtures we fielded 7 teams A1, A2, A3, B1, J1A, J1C and J3. 47 Seniors and 36 Juniors. So in 3 years the numbers rose from 9 players to 83 players. We must have a lot going for our club to attract players at a rate of this degree.

In this year the J1A team took out the Premiership coached by Jill Bolen.

The highest batting average this year was Tracey Moores .382 with highest fielding to Leigh Lester .985. Sandra Gaddes and Rosslyn Culpitt completed 76 'A' Grade Club Games with Joyce and Leigh Lester on 44.

1975:

In 1975, Management decided to take a team to the Kumbia Carnival. This proved to be very successful, as it gave our team excellent pre-season match practice and we took out the Senior Trophy.

1975 was also a very first for T-Ball which saw Devils team take the Premiership. We fielded 7 teams again this year. Al, A Reserve, Bl, Cl, Under 16A, Under 14A and T-Ball.

Ros Culpitt's 100 'A' Grade game against Rebels was on 8/11/75. Ros was a great asset to our Club and played top softball at all times.

Kim Lewis (A1) had the highest fielding average .977 and Heather Symington (B1) the highest batting average .548.

At the end of the season, Rosslyn Culpitt had completed 111 'A' Grade Games, Joyce and Leigh Lester 78, Lyn Miles 60, Diane Lowry (Clark) 53 and Kerry Pollock 51.

1976:

We returned to Kumbia in 1976 to defend our title and very proudly brought the trophy home with us for another year.

The year of 1976 was the first year we were sponsored by Kedron Aust. Rules Football Club. We wore the new colours of red and blue very proudly for our new name for the night competition was to be 'REDLEGS'; we certainly had a wonderful night series. Firstly, we won the 4BK Cup then went on to become the premiers of that competition. There were many individual trophies won by Sandra Gaddes, Leigh and Joyce Lester.

In the same year, we celebrated the 100 'A' Grade Games with a Dinner for Sandra Gaddes and both Leigh and Joyce Lester. They were all presented with an engraved tray.

In the pre-season Kumbia Carnival we once again won the A Grade Senior, A2, and B Grade trophy and returned feeling very tired and triumphant. At the end of the season, Sandra Gaddes had completed 109 'A' Grade games, Rosslyn Culpitt 145, Joyce Lester 111, Leigh Lester 107, Diane Lowry 86, Lyn Miles 79, Kerry Pollock 72, Alison Dawson 50. Joyce Lester (A1) had the leading fielding average of 1.000 and Leonie Bertwhistle (A2) the batting average of .600.

1977:

This year saw the appointment of Audrey McLaughlin as A Grade Coach. We played at Perry Park again this year. Diane Lowry played her 100th game on 15/10/77 against Redsox. She was the A Grade pitcher and had played for Queensland many times along with Wendy, Sandra, Joyce, Leigh, Rosslyn, Alison, Debbie and many others. We fielded 5 Senior teams and 5 Junior teams. T-Ball won the Premiership this year again under Joyce Lester and the Ul2A team won the Premiership with Coach, Leanne McCulloch.

Alison Dawson had the highest fielding average that year .990 and Alana Casey the highest batting average .500. On the completion of this season, Joyce Lester had completed 145 'A' Grade games, Diane Lowry 119, Kerry Pollock 82, Alison Dawson 71, Wendy Fallis 70, Leigh Lester 110 and Jacki D'Alton 61.

1978:

Wendy's 100th game came up at Toowoomba playing against Toowoomba on 28/1/79. This also was a great year for we had so many reps from Devils, not only in the State Championships but the Australian Championships, Juniors, Under 19 and Senior teams. We were now fielding 5 senior teams and 6 junior teams. There is a tremendous lot of organising and work for management when the ranks fill to this proportion, 63 Seniors and 71 Juniors.

As at the end of February 1979, Joyce Lester had played 163 'A' Grade Club games, Diane Lowry 145, Sandra Gaddes 133 and Wendy Fallis 108.

Out of over 11 teams this season, we had 8 make the Semi-Finals, 7 the Preliminary Finals and 5 in the Grand Finals (T-Ball, U14A, U14B, A2, A1). T-Ball and U14A were Grand Final Winners.

Southside Nightball Promotional Softball tournament started at Langlands Park with our team called RED DEVILS and we were most successful winning the Grand Final. We once again fielded a Redlegs team at Perry Park and were runners-up to Redsox 5-1 on 23/11/78. This year 3 players from Al fielded 1.000 - Pauline Harvey, Joyce Lester and Wendy Fallis. Best batting average was .585 Sandra Gaddes (Al). Chris Campbell (B2) also achieved 1.000 fielding average.

1979:

A record number of teams fielded again, 4 Juniors and 7 Seniors. Six teams, U12B, U14A, U16A, U16B, B2 and A1 made the Semi-finals, with B2 and U16B finishing Minor Premiers. U12B were Grade final Runners-up and A Grade and U16A were Grand Final Premiers. There were 46 Junior and 84 Senior players.

A Club Carnival was held at Kedron with country and city teams competing. Over \$500 was raised. Representative players both Junior and Senior competed in Brisbane and State teams. Caroline Grice was Captain of Brisbane Ul9. and was successful in playing for the state as Captain in Hobart. Junior players played at Mt. Isa.

Redlegs were successful, being Grand Finalists winning the Mark Gilley Trophy and were tops at the end of round 1, winning the Sunny Queen Egg Trophy. This is their second success, the last in 1976. Our Al and Redlegs team saw a new coach and an old face, Don Culpitt, back into our club.

The Club competed at two carnivals, Kumbia and Toowoomba. Patti Walker was our only 100 'A' Grade Game player against Rebels 17/11/79.

Life Membership honours to Teggie Tegner and a "Sandy Gaddes - This is Your Life" night was held with Sandra presented with her Life Membership Badge.

Sylvia Van Der Valk completed 103 games (other than Al Grade) for the Club. 100 "A" Club games at completion of the year were Joyce Lester 199, Diane Lowry 180, Sandra Gaddes 170, Patti Walker 115, Wendy Fallis 135, Leigh Lester 122.

Joyce Lester, Wendy Fallis (Al) and Liane Mills (Red Devils) all had 1.000 fielding averages for the season with Batting Average of .567 to Deborah Mills (B2) and Helen Rose .706 (Red Devils).

1980:

The appointment of our Al Coach, Don Culpitt, as Coaching Director for 2 years was instrumental in our Club winning the Brisbane Club Championship Trophy for the first time ever. Our Al and undefeated A3 teams were Minor Premiers with the A2 in third position.

Once again a record number of teams were registered - 14, with one U16 team disbanding during the season leaving us with 4 Junior and 9 Senior teams. Ten teams - T-Ball, U12A, U14A, U16C, U16A, Cl, Bl, A3, A2, Al reaching the Semi-finals. There were 56 Junior and 105 Senior players.

Our REDLEGS Nightball team once again sponsored by Kedron Football Club was not quite as successful this year, reaching third spot and losing to 4th team, Jaguars in the Semi-finals. Nightball for the first time was played on the International Diamond at Downey Park changing from Perry Park. Our Southside team, RED DEVILS, after losing the first game of the season, then went through undefeated to win the Premiership a top effort to coach, Windy Gale, and captain, Kerry Pollock.

A Junior Club Training Camp was conducted at Linville 5-7th September for the third time. Club attended Kumbia (A, U16), Redlands (U16, U14) and Brisbane (A, U16, U14) Carnivals. A most successful Devils Carnival was held at Kedron on 23rd November. Teams from as far afield as Gladstone participated. No invitation from Toowoomba received.

Our Club has now a reciprocal club, we call our Sister Club - Devils Gladstone.

A first for our Club was the 200 'A' Grade Club game obtained by Joyce Lester on 17th October, 1980 against Redsox and then followed shortly by Diane Lowry on 12th December against Redsox once again. Debbie McColm reached the rank of our 100 Grade Club players on 26th September, 1980 against Panthers. Sandra Gaddes had 196 games as at the end of the season.

The Club successfully, and with a lot of pride, was the Liasion Club for the San Diego Trendsetters at the Mini World Series in Brisbane 2-9th March, 1980. Against Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Phoenix U.S.A. and Japan, our San Diego team won the Series in an exciting Final game against Japan. Pitcher, Pam Stone, visited our Club in January on leave from Waverley Club in Victoria.

Patron, Bill Tegner, was presented with an appropriate Life Membership joining Flaine, Peppy and Teggie.

Representative players, both Junior and Senior, competed in Brisbane, State and Australian teams. Joyce Lester after representing Australia in San Salvador last year had a China tournament. Sharon Cunnington competed in the Australian Primary Championships in Darwin. Karen Moore and Patrice Webb represented Queensland in the Australian Under 16 Championships. Maryanne Walsh, Joyce and Leigh Lester and Pauline Harvey represented Queensland Seniors in Melbourne.

1981:

Don Culpitt was in his second year as Coaching Director for the Club and once again the Club took off the Club Championship in the Brisbane Day softball competition. Our A2 and A3 teams being runner-up in the competition.

The Club has 7 of the 9 senior teams in the finals this year and 5 in the Grand Finals, but alas no team made it this year. Our Juniors were well represented on Final Day and our Under 14A team and T-Ballers became Premiers for the season.

Our Nightball team could only manage third spot this season - maybe if the finals could have been delayed one week until the return of our Australian players, it could have been guite a different story.

Our Junior Training Camp was conducted once again at Linville and was as popular as ever. We also sent 3 teams to the Kumbia Carnival and Devils took off the Club Championship, the A Grade and Under 16 finals. Congratulations to all who participated.

We were once again fortunate to have many representatives from our Club, who were selected to represent both their City and State and two members who represented their Country.

1982:

We certainly had a mixed season, the middle falling out of our Senior ranks with the loss of our Coaching Director to another Club and also quite a few transfers to other Clubs.

This season we fielded 13 teams with 6 making the finals. We participated in the Kumbia and Redcliffe Carnivals and this season had the honour of retaining the Kumbia Trophy.

We had three players reach their 100 A Grade Games - Pauline Harvey-Short, Kerry Pollock and Sue Gamble.

A very sad moment for the Club this year has been the loss of our Patron, Bill Tegner. To Teggie and family our very deepest sympathy, he is missed by all Devils. Our Club Camp was very successful this season under the leadership of top Australian Coach, Ray Allsopp. We also held a very successful Carnival day.

We had representative players in both Brisbane and Queensland teams and this is a reflection on the standard of players with our Club at the moment. Our Nightball teams had an up and down season, with the Under 17 team taking off the Premiership, with an undefeated record.

1983:

Another mixed season for the Club, fielding 13 dayball teams and 3 nightball teams. We took off 3 Premierships - Under 16A, Under 14B and Under 17 Nightball.

Geoff Hunter was appointed our Coaching Co-Ordinator and the Club imported Canadian Pitcher, Elaine Davies, for the season. One of our players, Sandra Gaddes, played her 200th A Grade game on 26/11/83 against Redsox.

We sent teams to the Rebels, Kumbia and Toowoomba Carnivals with our teams doing very well in all.

Devils were once again well represented in many of the representative teams. We held our Club Camp once again at Caloundra but didn't manage to have a Carnival this season.

1984:

Will have to go down as the Year of the Juniors with Premiership wins in Under 16B, 14A, 14B, 12A and Runners-Up in T-Ball. Our only senior team to take out a Premiership was the Reserve Grade Nightball.

We attended Kumbia and Rebels Carnivals and came away with the Under 14 Trophy from Rebels. Our own Club Carnival was staged in late September with 32 teams competing. We also entered a team in the Mixed Competition held in the off-season at Redlands and they reached the Preliminary Finals.

We had representative players in the Under Age Brisbane and State teams and this is indicative of the strong contingent of juniors we have within our Club at the moment. Geoff Hunter remained as Coaching Director but, unfortunately, we could not hold a Club Camp due to a double booking of the venue.

This year saw the introduction of the new uniform into the Club in Nightball with a promise to the Seniors in the Dayball Competition to don theirs for 1985/86.

1985:

The Club again fielded 12 Dayball and 2 Nightball Teams with Premierships going to the Regional Nightball Team (again) and the A2, Ul4A and Ul2A Teams; Ul6A and T-Ball being Runners-Up.

With Bob Payne's organisation we entered a team in the South Brisbane Winterball Competition and took out the Premiership there in August. The Club Carnival was again held in late September with 34 teams competing.

Debbie McColm played her 200th game in October, 1984, and her 250th game in March, 1985 - both against Saints.

We had strong representation in both Brisbane and State Teams. Geoff Hunter completed his last year as A Grade Coach and Coaching Director. The Club has appointed Gary Ogg to take on this task in 1986 - 1987.

We look forward to competing in the National Club Championships here in Brisbane during Easter, 1986.

1986:

The Club entered a team in the National Club Championships in Brisbane at Easter and, despite a first game loss to Glen Waverley, performed consistently well over the next 3 days.

Bob Payne, with the help of Chris Welsh, again fielded a slightly stronger team in the South Brisbane Winterball Competition and came away winners for the second successive year.

With Craig Sinclair the driving force, it was the inaugural year for Devils in the Men's Competition at Bannister Park, where our A Grade Team were Runners-Up and two-thirds of that team were announced in Brisbane A and B Representative Teams, two of whom made Queensland level.

The Club Carnival had a date change to Saturday, 27th September, this year and was not as successful as would have been liked with only 20 teams competing.

Our Club was finally asked to field a team for the Medibank Series and finished a creditable fourth.

Our Brisbane and State Representatives this year almost doubled with the 'new look' A Grade. Their Coach, Gary Ogg, was appointed State Under 19 Coach and returned from Perth Runners-Up. State Seniors and Under 16's were victors in Darwin and Sydney, with Carrie MacCarthy taking our 'Pitcher of the Series' in Under 16's.

We fielded 13 Day and 2 Night Teams with Premierships going to U16A, U14B and T-Ball; U16B and U14A being Runners-Up.

Thanks to Grant Russell for all the effort in the dual role of pitcher and coach. Grant's knowledge of the game is invaluable.






Highlight of the week-end was undoubtedly the Aerobic and Rap Dancing Display performed at the Crown Hotel and continued in the cars on the journey homewards.

A good time was had by all and the week-end declared a success by those who attended.


It does seem a shame that all the Carnivals are pre-season, clash with Rep. Trials and can't be attended, as a week-end away together does much for Club and Team morale.



If this all was not sufficiently time consuming for her, she has had to combine those with Year 11 and 12 studies.



Last season when young Alexander was on the way, she still coached a team and was a driving force within the Social Committee.


This season she has played, coached and, in the absence of a formal Social Committee, organised a number of functions for the Club.




