PRESIDENTS REPORT

Well it is finally here, the end of my term as Club President.

Although at times I looked forward to the break at the end of the season (if you don't count preparations for trophy night, the AGM, sign-on, for next season and helping Deb Cooper prepare this magazine), I already miss the Saturdays at Downey Park and the friends to share it with.

This was my third season with Devils and although I coached an Under 12 side in the 94-95 season, I have never before been on the committee.

When I was asked to do this year as President I must admit I did approach it with some trepidation.

Financially we were not in a sound state at all ,and most of our equipment was older than the players using it.

To make matters worse, we lost the Premier and Premier Reserves Teams not that the majority of them were members of this club, but merely permitted players, from the other clubs and associations.

That aside, we were looking at resuming this season with only a core of six teams.

With these factors in mind, I had three definite goals. I wanted the club to strive for (1) new and better equipment (2) to have a solid financial base for next season (3) to build up the number of junior members, as that is where I believe the future of the club lies.

I was lucky in many ways, I had a hard working committee with the same goals.

Looking back, I think your committee achieved each and every one of these aims.

Firstly, we applied for and were granted \$5500.00 through the State Governments Community Gaming Benefit Fund. This went into all the new equipment the club now owns.

To try and improve our finances we looked at many schemes. The two that held the most promise was to re-introduce the team levy scheme, and to actively seek sponsors.

For the latter our thanks go to Marnie Munro and VACC Insurance.

VACC, as most members are now aware is our major sponsor, and through their continued sponsorship it will ensure the club has new and better equipment.

Although the re-introduction of the team levy was a bit of a burden, it is something that most other clubs have had for years. It has helped to put the club in a position where we can afford to give out more and better trophies at the end of the year, discard club raffles and to be able to advertise for players and coaches next season.

Lastily, the increase in club players.

This year in the juniors we were able to field a T-Ball team, Under 12, 2 x Under 14 and an Under 16 side.

The seniors increased to four teams, Division 2, 4, 5, 7. One of these was an entire team from the Redlands competition, most of whom will be back with us next season.

Basically we fielded nine teams this season, an increase on the last few years, and almost as many teams as Devils used to have in 90-91.

But all this came at a price and it involved a lost of time and effort by your committee.

I would like to especially thank the committee, Debbie Devine, Pauline Edgerton, Debra Cooper, Timna Kerr, Christine Kennedy, Anne Wrafter, Jenny Kingscott and Jenny Carter for their wonderful help and support this season. I would also like to give a special thanks to the Club Captain Chris Morris. These ladies have done a great job this year and deserve your thanks as well.

Also, I would like to thank the coaches, manageress, scorers, every parent or player who came to give a hand at canteen, office duty, umpiring or just watching a game.

Without you people giving up your time to do a bit, Clubs like this would not exist. Only by helping each other can we help ourselves.

The problem is, as I have found this season, as the club grows, so increases our need for more coaches, scorers, etc etc. To that end I applied for a grant to fund coaching levels for members or players of this club. This application was granted, and we are now in a position to pay for our people to obtain accredited coaching certificates.

Finally, I would like to thank the players and members of this great club, because you people are what it is all about.

It has been a great season, some minor hiccups early in the year, but we survived and grew and I think improved.

Heres hoping the next will be even better. See you in 97/98.


