FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT

Having now moved into a new role within AFL NSW/ACT, it is with mixed emotions that I reflect on not just the 2015 season, but also the previous few years in my role as AFL Sydney Football Operations Manager. It was a passion for the league itself that led me to a career change and a job at AFL NSW/ACT and was always one I felt extremely privileged to be in. While certainly a very challenging role, it is one that I very much enjoyed and look fondly back on.

Things don't stand still for very long at all in footy and the 2015 AFL Sydney season was no different with a typically busy year starting as soon as the 2014 season concluded. As always there were highs and lows along the way but overall the league enjoyed another season of growth and increased professionalism.

2015 was the first year where the immediate support team remained steady which was certainly a huge advantage in all aspects and was reflected in the way the competition was administered. Scott Burkinshaw as Football Operations Coordinator was once again a pillar of support in the operations of the competition and deserves significant recognition for his unwavering assistance. There were plenty of noteworthy events across the 2015 season and once again AFL Sydney was fortunate enough to share in a feature milestone of one of its members when Frank Kalayzich umpired his 500th AFL Sydney First Grade match in the Round 10 Premier Division blockbuster between Manly-Warringah and East Coast. This day would prove one of the real highlights of the 2015 season with the two competing clubs, the wider AFL Sydney community and a few high profile umpiring stars coming together at Weldon Oval for a brilliant celebration of an amazing achievement. In what would be Frank's final season of umpiring, his wonderful contribution to umpiring and AFL Sydney was recognised at the year end Phelan Medal night with a feature video package on the day finished off with Frank being made a Life Member of AFL Sydney.

The league once again saw 10 divisions of football as per 2014 with a total of 91 teams completing the season. This included 59 senior men's teams, 16 senior women's teams and 16 Under 19's teams.

The season itself got off to a bumpy start with the withdrawal of Campbelltown from the Premier Division competition just days before the first round which put the best laid plans into disarray. The withdrawal meant that the Premier Division Competition would only be contested by nine teams across eighteen rounds with a bye each weekend for one team. While not ideal, the clubs should be thanked for their understanding in this difficult situation and despite a few anomalies in the fixture which couldn't be helped due to the timing, the change didn't have a significant impact on the division.

Similarly, the Women's Division One competition was also affected by a late team withdrawal when the previously dominant Balmain Dockers side advised the league in the lead up to the season that they did not have the numbers to field a side. This change saw the competition reduced to seven teams and like the Premier Division competition, one bye each weekend. Outside of these late team withdrawals, the most anticipated change in 2015 was the return of the East Coast Eagles First Grade side into Premier Division after their withdrawal from the NEAFL competition at the conclusion of the 2014 season. The return of this side created a huge amount of interest in the lead up to the season and now that the season has concluded, there is no question that their return was a real positive for the league.

Across the divisions, we saw the most even competitions since divisionalisation came into effect which is evidenced best by the number of wins by the lesser performed teams in most of the divisions. While the nature of Sydney football means that there will always be anomalies that do not necessarily support this, the settling of teams into the correct divisions is close to being correct and should be evident in 2016. Of course the flip side to divisionalisation is the significant added stretch on clubs and resources, in particular for larger clubs, and this is something that certainly needs continual review of.

To support this, of the ten premierships on offer in 2015, we once again saw a very good spread of clubs winning them with nine separate clubs crowned premiers and only Sydney University claiming two (Men's Divisions One and Three). We also saw Wollondilly (Men's Division Four) and Gosford (Women's Division Two) claim their first silverware within AFL

Sydney which shows the spread of clubs we now have in the league. Interestingly, only two of the ten minor premiers managed to win the premiership which also shows the evenness of the competitions.

The 2015 finals series were once again a season highlight and arguably the best and certainly the tightest for many years. Outside of the Division Five match won comfortably by UTS, the biggest winning margin of the other nine Grand Finals was Pennant Hills Premier Division victory by 35 points, a game in which they trailed at three quarter time!

This years Premier Division competition had plenty of interest in it well before the first bounce of the ball with the return of East Coast's first grade side to the league. With some well-planned fixturing, the Eagles kick started their season at home against Manly-Warringah, the new boys on the block who were coming off back-to-back flags in their first two years of the competition. With great weather and a big crowd, the season kicked off in style and the game certainly didn't disappoint. Running riot, the Eagles looked home early in the last quarter as they led by 40 points however a typical Manly-Warringah fight back followed where they claimed victory with a kick after the siren. The season was underway.

The opening round loss for East Coast would be their last however until the final game of the year as they dominated the competition. Pennant Hills finally broke the curse Manly-Warringah held over them in Round 2 with one of three victories over the year against the Giants and those two sides along with St George were the only real genuine threats to the Eagles during the year. UTS under new coach Nic Fosdike were the big improvers in Premier Division and showed signs that their maiden Premier Division finals appearance may not be too far away. With a huge turnover of players, Western Suburbs struggled for consistency and were the big fallers while UNSW/ES finished the year with the wooden spoon after managing just the single win for the year.

After falling short against Manly-Warringah in the 2013 and 2014 Grand Finals, it was a very popular and deserved Premier Division premiership for the Pennant Hills Demons in what was a high quality, thrilling Grand Final at Henson Park (due to the unavailability of Blacktown International Sportspark).

The Men's Division One competition was once again an even affair with Balmain the benchmark during the home and away season. It was however Sydney University, the clubs third grade side who were in their first year in the Division One competition who amazingly came from 5th position on the ladder to claim a heart stopping 1 point victory over Pennant Hills in the Grand Final. After a dominant couple of recent seasons by Sydney University, the Women's Division One competition was a much more even affair in 2015 as highlighted by the finals series. Newtown were the main beneficiary of Balmain's withdrawal from the competition with a number of key in's which ultimately proved the difference for the Breakaways as they defeated Sydney University in a tight Grand Final.

The Under 19's competitions this year couldn't have had two different seasons. The Division One competition proved to be a high quality and extremely even division which highlights the talent coming from the city. Pennant Hills were dominant early but in the end the quality within North Shore showed through as they defeated UNSW/ES in a very close Grand Final. The Division Two competition however was a completely different story as teams struggled for numbers which meant a number of team withdrawals prior and during the season and a competition littered with forfeits. In saying that, the two sides that contested the Division Two Grand Final, put on an extremely entertaining and high quality match (the highest quality Division Two football have seen in recent years) where eventually Western Suburbs claimed back to back flags.

The Under 19 Division Two sides do face a difficult challenge year on year to attract the more participant style player with generally the talented players naturally attracted to Division One which is flourishing. The issues particularly in Division Two were a regular topic of discussion at the AFL Sydney Strategy Group meetings and clubs were also consulted on their thoughts of the right ages for this competition. Being only the first genuine year of Under 19's, it was unanimously agreed by clubs and the Strategy Group that another year of Under 19's football was required to determine the success or otherwise of the Under 19 age.

And so at the conclusion of the 2015 season, the full list of premiers were: Pennant Hills (Premier Division), Sydney University (Men's Division One), Blacktown (Men's Division Two), Sydney University (Division Three), Wollondilly (Division Four), UTS (Division Five), Newtown (Women's Division One), Gosford (Women's Division Two), North Shore (Under 19's Division One) and Western Suburbs (Under 19 Division Two).

As one of the benchmark clubs across all area in the league, it was fitting that Pennant Hills added the Club Championship award to their list of achievements this year. The Club Championship award is given for on field results of the clubs three highest grades, in their case Premier Division, Division One and Under 19's Division One who all finished in the top 3 after the home and away season in each competition. Camden enjoyed their best season in all aspects and finished runner-up with the winner of the previous three years award Manly-Warringah finished third.

Once again Representative football had an important role within AFL Sydney in 2015 in the form of senior men's and women's sides. The Development / Under 23's representative team did not continue in 2015 for a number of reasons including budget pressures. Once again the buy in from the players was brilliant and I sincerely thank the clubs and players involved for their support. Their support once again ensured a great program and confirmation it is an important piece for AFL Sydney.

The 2015 Representative program started on the opening weekend of the AFL Sydney season which was obviously much earlier than ever before when the womens side played AFL Canberra in Game 1 of the two game series. This was mainly due to the fixture of the AFL Women's match being earlier than normal and provided an opportunity for the players to be viewed in order to be drafted by either the Melbourne Demons or the Western Bulldogs. After a dour first half, the AFL Sydney side exploded into action in the 3rd and 4th quarters to play some very attractive football and run out dominant 8.5-53 to 2.6-18 winners.

Once again the Queens Birthday Long weekend saw the main weekend of representative football when the AFL Sydney senior men's and women's teams took on AFL Canberra on the Saturday at Blacktown International Sportspark. Missing more than a dozen of their first string side who were in Melbourne to play in the State game against Victoria, the women's side were outplayed by AFL Canberra in the second game of the series to go down by 38 points. The men however recorded their first back to back rep footy victory in many years when they scraped home by 12 points in a thrilling contest and retain the Carter – Jesaulenko Shield.

2015 saw significant changes to the AFL Sydney – NEAFL relationship which must be seen as a huge positive for the league. This included changes to the eligibility criteria (required to be former players, students etc) for Sydney University Premier Division players. Players who did not meet this criteria but were selected on the Sydney University NEAFL list, were put into a mini draft where AFL Sydney Premier Division clubs (excluding Sydney University) bid on players and would be required to play with the team they were selected by if they were not selected in the NEAFL team (or Swans or Giants NEAFL sides). This led to quite a number of these players playing a significant number of AFL Sydney games.

This year we also ran a Blue Sock themed round in support of the important work which Beyond Blue do which all men's clubs took part in. All senior men's sides wore specially designed blue socks for one round with proceeds of the socks, and additional fundraising, going directly to Beyond Blue. Close to \$30,000 was contributed to the cause which was a very impressive effort and particular praise should be given to Wollondilly who contributed over \$20,000 of this! The Club of the Year program was again in place in 2015 to reward those clubs who achieve administration excellence. Pennant Hills set the benchmark for all clubs in this program to go with their on field success. In total this year \$19,020 was returned to the clubs under this program.

The contentious Pathway Policy was abolished at the start of the 2015 season meaning junior players were able to go to any senior club of their choice without restrictions putting the onus back on clubs to develop relationships with their natural feeder clubs.

Umpires were again supplied by the NSWAF Umpires Association under the existing CBA Agreement, and we thank them for their support. 2015 saw the appointment of more umpires to AFL Sydney matches than ever before which is a real positive for all involved. In particular

thanks should go to AFL Sydney Head Coach Ashley Thomas and NSW/ACT Community Umpiring Manager Graham Glassford for their work and support throughout the season. A new Prescribed Penalty System (PPS) was introduced in 2015 to line up with the AFL's new matrix. Again players who were reported were given the option of taking a set penalty rather than appearing before the tribunal. The reporting umpire completed a report template which was then assessed and converted into points and subsequently the penalty that the player would be offered under the PPS. The main change from previous years was that players offered a prescribed penalty received a one match discount if they plead guilty.

The independent tribunal panel were kept very busy in 2015 with at least one hearing almost every week so thanks must go to the panel, led by Chairman Brian Langton, who volunteer their time week in week out.

The Phelan Medal Presentation Dinner was once again a huge night for the league with over 650 people attending the gala event at Doltone House, Pyrmont. It was a great way to end the season for all those involved and congratulations to all award winners. In particular, Connor Pettersson from Manly-Warringah who claimed his first Phelan Medal after polling well in recent years.

The Women's Division One medal was named for the first time in 2015 in honour of the first women's AFL Commissioner Sam Mostyn who has been a regular at the awards night for many years and played a significant role in female football in the region. Macquarie Universities Amanda Farrugia was a popular winner of the medal.

Fittingly, Barb Dickin and Frank Kalayzich were awarded Life Membership for their exceptional service to the code in Sydney while the late Albert Ellis was inducted into the Hall of Fame. The AFL Sydney website was once again the main source of information for the AFL Sydney competition. This was again updated on a daily basis providing plenty of interesting information for the AFL Sydney community. These articles, linked in with our social media platforms, proved as popular as ever with huge viewer numbers and discussion among the community.

The AFL Sydney Football Record was once again published for all home and away rounds and finals weeks. A monumental weekly task completed by Scott Burkinshaw, we would also like to acknowledge the clubs for their contributions along with the NSW AFL History Committee for their input.

Once again we were fortunate enough to have the AFL Sydney Match of the Week streamed live through the AFL Sydney YouTube channel. This service was again provided by Craig Abercrombie and Digital Sports and continued to be cutting edge with the introduction of some great features. A big thank you goes to Craig for the quality productions of the Match of the Week, the Phelan Medal and the finals series.

As can be clearly seen, 2015 was once again another extremely busy AFL Sydney season and I would like to acknowledge in particular the work of Scott Burkinshaw who for the past two years has made my job so much easier. I would like to also acknowledge the dedicated staff of AFL NSW/ACT and volunteers who's hard work and dedication to contribute to another successful year, namely Darren Simpson, Luke Turner, Taleah Neowhouse, Bob Robinson, Sam Canavan, Graham Glassford and the Umpiring Group, Club Presidents and their committees along with the AFL NSW/ACT Management Team and AFL Sydney Tribunal.

Before I move on however, I would like to thank all clubs for their support and assistance over the past three years in this challenging role. While the nature of any footy ops position means that it is not always smooth sailing, my endeavour has always been to make decisions for the betterment of the league and our great game. AFL Sydney was the department where I wanted to work when I joined AFL NSW/ACT so I feel incredibly fortunate to have spent close to 4 seasons in and around this great league. I have met countless amazing people, all passionate about the game and am very fortunate to have made many great friends along the way.

I now move into the role of AFL NSW/ACT Facilities Manager and look forward to continuing to work closely with AFL Sydney clubs, albeit in a different capacity.

Annual Report – Sydney AFL Umpiring Group




The 2015 season can be adjudged a successful year for the umpires. While having modest growth the engagement of the umpires at training and also at games was the best it has ever been.

With the additional engagement of the umpires the Umpiring group committed to ensuring Field umpires were appointed to six grades of football each week (from after the fourth week of the season). This meant that Women's Division One and the Under 19 Division Two had Field umpires appointed to all games.

In 2015 a six week trial was conducted in the Women's Division One utilizing only one Field Umpire that was from our Umpire Talent Pathway. With the importance of women's football growing, 70% of all the games played had Field/Boundary/Goal umpires appointed. Two games towards the end of the season were identified for NEAFL Umpires to be appointed to.

Junior Umpires from the Greater Sydney Juniors again provide great assistance by filling many of the Boundary and Goal umpire appointments. This is a terrific vehicle to provide a link between juniors and seniors and is an integral part of a young umpire's pathway.



Round Ten of Premier Division saw Frank Kalayzich umpire his 500th Premier Division game with two legends of umpiring, Ray 'Razor' Chamberlin and AFL games record holder Hayden Kennedy. The support of the football community was sensational in particular Manly Warringah Giants and the East Coast Eagles Football Clubs. The game drew national media attention and provided a great promotion of umpiring.

111 Club Appointed Field Umpires registered online this season which is the best result since the inception of formal registration. In lower grades there will always be a heavy reliance on Club Appointed Umpires to fill the void. The challenge is ensuring that each of the umpires is correctly skilled to ensure a safe and fair environment for all players. With only 11% of the umpires involved currently accredited, clubs, the umpires involved, the league and the umpiring group need to ensure that the appropriate education is undertaken.

REPRESENTATIVE FOOTBALL

The 2015 Men's AFL Sydney Representative program was different from previous years with the Under 23s Representative program being removed. The AFL Sydney Senior Mens Representative went ahead once again playing AFL Canberra at Blacktown International Sports Park on the June Long Weekend. The AFL Sydney Women's side played a two match series against AFL Canberra similar to 2014. The first game was played at Gungahlin Oval on April 11 while the second match was played at Blacktown International Sports Park on the June Long Weeekend.

At the start of the 2014 season the coaching and support staff positions for both the Senior and Under 23s teams were advertised to the AFL Sydney community. Following receipt of applications Roger Moten was reappointed as the Senior coach after a successfull program in 2014. Co-coaches were announced the women's team with Stuart Newman and Simon Berry taking control of the side after all coach interviews were conducted.

Roger Moten was ably assisted by Jon Hayres, Terry Mudge and Tony Overall. Matthew Graham acted as the Senior Team Manager with Liam Davis actook statistics during the game. The full coaching panel for both squads along with Matthew Graham and Scott Burkinshaw were involved in the selection process. Stuart Newman and Simon Berry was assisted by Abraham Caroca and Tracey Kick.

A representative of the selection panel attended many of the Premier Division games as well as numerous women's matches in the lead up to selection and players were advised of their selection by phone and also a follow up email. From the original squad there were a number of players who withdrew during the representative program for varying reasons.

The senior squad trained a total of five times with training at Henson Park with one session being held at Lakeside Oval at Moore Park. The women squad trained on Sundays with a squad of about 60 training in the the first few weeks before the squad was trimmed to around 35. During the program there were sessions run being conducted at Blacktown International Sportspark and Lakeside Oval. Each training session was attended by at least one of James Sutherland from Balmain Physiotherpaists staff to ensure that all injuries and ailments were well managed which was very much appreciated by the players. The

All players and officials were required to wear their team shirt, black dress pants and black shoes to their game. This requirement was completed without exception and presented a positive image once again for AFL Sydney.

The women's side departed for game 1 Saturday morning to compete the next day and stayed at the Tradies that Saturday night. The side returned back to Sydney by coach on the Sunday afternoon.

All players from both teams were also provided with a large selection of food and drink for lunch at the ground prior to their match.

Follwoing both matches at Blacktown, there was a small presentation where finger food was provided and best on ground medals were handed out.

A big thanks must go to the coaching and support staff, in particular coaches Roger Moten, Simon Berry and Stuart Newman as well James Sutherland and his team for assisting in making the representative program for 2015 a huge success.

Seniors Match Report

AFL Sydney have claimed the Carter- Jesaulenko Trophy for the third consecutive year after they defeated AFL Canberra by 12 points at Blacktown International Sports Park today.

It was a tough and tight opening quarter with both sides looking to gain the upper hand. As the sides went to the first break, it was AFL Sydney taking a one point lead into the huddle.

As the second quarter started, it was Sydney who took control with last years best on ground medal winner Brayden Fowler starting to take over the game helping Sydney stretch out their lead to 28 points after a seven goal to two second quarter.

The third quarter was tight once again with both sides going goal for goal. Four goals to three third quarter by the boys from down south closed the margin to 16 points at the final change.

2015 PHELAN MEDALLIST

Manly-Warringah captain Connor Petterson has claimed AFL Sydney's most prestigious honour by claiming the 2015 Phelan Medal. Petterson accepted the medal in front of more than 600 people at a gala event at Darling Harbour's Doltone House last night.

Petterson had a stand out year for the Giants and has gone one better than 2014 when he finished runner up behind Pennant Hill's Alex Goodall.

Petterson took over the captaincy this season for the Giants and thrived on the added responsibility by finishing on an impressive 24 votes, nine ahead of pre count favourite in East Coast Eagles Trent Stubbs with the Eagles Andrew Browning a further two votes behind. Petterson becomes the second Manly Warringah player to claim the Phelan Medal in only the club's third season in the top division following good mate Tyrone Armitage's victory in 2013 (Manly's inaugural season in Premier Division).

Following the disappointment of a runners up finish in the award last year, Petterson started the 2015 season in scintillating fashion polling an astonishing 16 votes in the opening six rounds including being best on ground in five of those games. He led by 8 votes after six rounds and from then on was always in a strong position to claim the award. Further votes in Rounds 8 and 11 pushed his total to 20 votes before a rib injury kept him from playing from Rounds 13 to 16. On his return, Petterson continued on where he has left off to poll in the final two games to finish on 24 votes and claim a deserved victory.

Trent Stubbs, the 2015 Stan Milton Trophy holder for the Premier Division competition's leading goal kicker, finished on 15 votes while his team mate and ruckmen Browning, who missed three games at the end of the season, finished on 13 votes. Rounding out the top 5 were former Phelan Medallist Matt Carey from Pennant Hills in fourth position on 13 votes while Western Suburbs midfielder Taran Etto rounding out the top five after an outstanding year with 11 votes.

HALL OF FAME

In 2003, AFL Sydney established a Players' Hall of Fame. Nominees are judged by the selection committee to have made an outstanding contribution to the AFL Sydney competition.

The Hall of Fame is principally for players with the following criterion used in the selection of inductees:

- Level of service and overall contribution to the game
- The number of playing years is a consideration but not the sole determining factor in assessing a person's eligibility
- A player may only be eligible to be inducted as a Hall of Fame member once they have been retired from playing for a minimum period of three years
- Only those who have played in a senior competition in Sydney are eligible.

In 2015, one new member was inducted in to the AFL Sydney Players' Hall of Fame:

Albert Herbert Ellis

He began playing with Newtown FC in 1912 in a career spanning 14 years. A versatile player, Ellis spent his time on the field playing predominantly centre half forward and centre half back, going on to play over 200 games for Newtown.

Ellis' football career was put on hold in 1915 when he was enlisted to fight in WW1, during which time he was wounded in the leg and wrist via gunshot but recovered and went on to be commissioned as an officer in 1918, before returning home in 1919.

Ellis resumed playing football in 1920. Over his career he represented New South Wales on 23 occasions spanning over 12 years. This included games against Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, and the VFL, along with games against the Melbourne, Carlton and Port Adelaide FCs. He was also captain of New South Wales on four occasions (two of which were during the 1924 Australian National Football Council Carnival) and vice captain on two occasions. Of the 23 representative games Ellis played, he featured in the best players on 15 occasions.

At club level, Ellis played in 5 consecutive grand finals for Newtown in 1920 to 1925, but unfortunately was never part of the winning side.

Frank Kalayzich

Frank began umpiring in 1978 in the North Shore Junior Football competition and has umpired every year since, bar 2001.

In 1983 he umpired his first senior match, presiding over his first top-level Sydney fixture three years later.

In a career flush with highlights, Kalayzich has umpired 10 first grade Grand Finals, including last year's Premier Division decider at 52 years of age.

Despite his stocky frame, Frankie K is an elite runner, beginning his career in the days where only two field umpires were permitted, where he estimates he'd clock "close to 25 kilometres" over four quarters.

Yesterday he umpired his 511th AFL Sydney First Grade match, a number which will unlikely ever be beaten.

An almost permanent fixture in Sydney umpiring circles, Kalayzich also officiated in 50 VFL reserves games, a couple of years in rural Queensland and five years of junior umpiring.

Frank retires at the conclusion of this season and his hoping for a 512th and last appointment in this Sundays Grand Final.

Well known by the AFL Sydney community and loved by all, Barbara Dickin began her time in AFL Sydney with Western Suburbs over 30 years ago when her son began playing Australian Rules Football.

The worthy 2015 AFL Sydney Volunteer of the Year, Barbara has volunteered her time for many years as a timekeeper for AFL Sydney finals as well as representative matches every year.

Her son long since retired, Barbara has remained a constant at the Western Suburbs Football Club since and each season and each week, she gives her time freely and selflessly to time keep for the club at ALL home and away matches.

If a club only had two teams their total points have a 10% weighting added to them.





CLUB OF THE YEAR PROGRAM

The Club of the Year incentive scheme was continued in 2015 to give clubs the opportunity to receive financial rewards for achieving excellence for off field administrative tasks. These tasks included provision of financial information, attendance at meetings and match day duties.

Points were allotted for each task, each worth \$0.50 to the club.

Each week points were calculated and clubs issued with a statement.

At the end of the season, clubs were paid the amount which they earned. If a club finished with a negative amount they would be required to pay this amount.

Of the 29 clubs in 2015, 26 clubs were eligible to receive a payment with North Shore and Pennant Hills receiving the maximum rebate.

The incentive scheme is an excellent initiative that saw \$19,020 returned to the clubs in 2015.

DIGITAL SPORTS COVERAGE

Our broadcast partner, Digital Sports provided live streaming of one weekly Premier Division Match, including all Grand Finals on www.digitalsports.com.au. This platform is integral to showcasing the talent on display in the local competition to a wide audience. A huge thank you must be extended to Craig Abercrombie and his team at Digital Sports for their continued support.

Digital Sports should be commended on the quality of the production and presentation and it is hoped that this exposure will continue in years to come.

THE FOOTBALL RECORD

Prior to the season clubs were asked if they would like the hardcopy of the Record continued and the overwhelming response was yes so the production of a weekly Football Record continued in 2015.

More content was added in the record with clubs allowed to submit notes each week, fixtures for the week and the next week, premier division goals and best was added to the record and the AFL page was introduced once again.

At the beginning of the season clubs were asked if they wanted to receive Football Records during the year. It was pleasing that all clubs opted to receive copies.

Clubs were levied \$1 per record, but were able to sell these on matchday should they wish however most opted to make them free of charge.

The publication was compiled and edited by the Football Operations Department, in particular Scott Burkinshaw. The softcopy was then sent to MMB Printing who would print and return to the Moore Park office by Thursday morning each week. From there they would be Express Posted to each club who had their first grade playing at home that weekend.

The season's records have again be bound and kept as part of the leagues historical records.

Regular articles included Those Were the Days, which was received from the historical society, From years Gone By, Team of the Week and the Rising Star nominees.. A review of the previous round was also added to the the record which was written by Michael Shillito.

Whilst there is a reasonable effort in publishing the Football Record the end result is a tremendous vehicle for the league and clubs to push their cause and a wonderful effort for those concerned in its publication.

It is still being decided what will happen with the football record in 2016.

In comparison to 2014, charges in 2015 were exactly the same at 99. In 2015, 77% of all charges were 'offered a Prescribed Penalty of which 87% were accepted. This percentage compares to 2014 where 79% of charges were offered a Prescribed Penalty with 93% accepting. In 2015, 70% of those cases which appeared before the tribunal resulted in a guilty verdict as opposed to 62% in 2014.


