## **REPORTS – Board Members**

### 2015 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Andrew McTaggart

This year saw LWA start to put in place the new Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) endorsed strategic and operational plans to achieve our vision to grow the sport of lacrosse in WA. This has provided the Board with a clear focus on what is required and has brought a number of successes which will be covered in each of the Director's reports.

Increasing the funding for lacrosse in WA continues to be a challenge despite great support from the DSR and from the Department of Health through their Healthway program. Financial support has not grown for a number of years despite our best efforts and thus we face increasing challenges to provide a level of governance and support for lacrosse that is commensurate with expectations of more established sports. Next year we will be faced with a number of choices regarding the best use of our assets and how to fund the ever increasing demands on development, junior high performance and board governance.

I believe that Lacrosse WA continues to lead the Australian lacrosse community in driving the focus towards growing the game and shifting the balance away from high performance. This is not to say that high performance will diminish, but that our efforts will increasingly be directed towards tackling how we grow the game whilst maintaining our high performance demands. It is not going to be easy; recruiting new people into the sport must compete with other more popular sports and with the ever increasing trend towards individualized pursuits. We must be prepared to be innovative and try new approaches to growing this great sport at State and Club levels. We can do this if we work together, share our experiences, and celebrate the successes.

Thank you once again for the privilege of leading this sport, and I give you my personal commitment to:

- 1. Grow membership across all clubs,
- 2. Listen to the needs of clubs and to serve them as best as possible

3. Build on the great pride within the clubs and its members to promote the game to a wider audience.

### 2015 DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION'S REPORT Anna Forrest

It has been a busy year for this Directorship. The Administration area of LWA is the vital cog in running lacrosse in WA.

LWA is funded by 2 sources of income, club fees and a generous grant of approximately \$85,000 from the Department of Sport and Recreation. The Club fees go straight to ALA to pay for insurance for our registered lacrosse players and the remainder pays for the cost of our Australian and junior and senior representative teams and the officials who run and umpire the high performance tournaments and championships each year.

The grant from DSR is exceeded by the expense of the cost of running the administration of lacrosse in WA. LWA runs a tight ship, any increased demand for funding for more administration or growth programs can't be met by the DSR grant.

LWA receives money from Healthway for the *Smarter than Smoking Modcrosse in Schools* program. All that money is spent on running the program and paying the Development Officers who deliver it. For LWA this program is a bonus we must keep. We get to expose thousands of children to lacrosse and the dangers of smoking message.

At Board meetings our Strategic Plan, Operational Plan and Budget are constantly reviewed.

DSR demands that the use of the tax payer's money to run lacrosse is accountable. LWA must adhere to quarterly AKRS. In order to acquit correctly the grant money we receive, the Department expects LWA to operate at an appropriate level of governance. This year has seen the Board do a lot of work on achieving a high level of governance, equal to that required of many corporations. This is the behind the scenes effort that member clubs and players don't see. If we are to maintain our grant, and to see more funding to work on growth in player numbers, we need to continue these reforms. The Board has this year signed off on a modern strategic plan; a review of our workforce needs, including volunteers; an operational plan and has had a consultant review the LWA constitution. Work on all these initiatives will continue in 2016.

The LWA Board is focused on growing the sport of lacrosse in WA. It is vital for the future of our game.

I would like to thank our Executive Assistant, Roxanne Leavy, and Administrative Assistant, Jamie-Lee Bartle for all their hard work in making the office run our sport at a highly professional level.

Lacrosse WA's prime goal is recruitment.

Similarly for officiating.

Therefore a most excellent initiative has been the recruitment, supporting and training of young officials in recent times. We owe a great deal of thanks to Grant Moir and Stephanie McRae who were the prime movers behind this scheme and the clubs who actively supported this move. Officials from both men's and women's lacrosse provide advice and support and we now have a large group of young, experienced officials who are ready to move up through the junior grades and hopefully eventually into the seniors.

The aim is always to build a group of well-trained officials to manage the games at all levels.

To do this we need to provide a safe environment where officials are treated with respect and dignity.

Until recently the women's game provided this environment and heckling was seen as totally unacceptable. This is slowly being eroded. The concern in both forms of the game is that people believe that officials deliberately favour one team. Until we accept that officials are not perfect, but are trying to carry out their duties to the best of their abilities lacrosse will continue to stagnate or die.

If you believe that the officials could be better then what are you doing to help?

Over the summer the plan is to review the progress of officiating in WA. Earlier in the year we had a very successful coming together of men and women's officials to plan for the ALA Conference. Hopefully this group with support from other key stakeholders, will help us devise further strategies to grow our great game.

2015 was a busy year for the High Performance portfolio and a huge thank you goes to all of the organisers, officials, coaches, managers and players involved.

2015 saw the development and adoption of the LWA High Performance Strategy. The Strategy was developed with the aim of providing a clear, supported High Performance Pathway for WA lacrosse players, coaches, managers and officials.

The strategy will have benefits across all aspects of the game for individuals, clubs, the state and the country, thus helping to increase the skills and participation across the board.

The key programs that are included in the Lacrosse WA High Performance Strategy are:

- U15's Athlete Development Squad
- U18's High Performance Squad
- Seniors High Performance Squad
- Coaching Apprenticeship Program
- Manager Mentoring and Education Program
- Officiating High Performance Program
- LWA Uniform Policy and Sponsorship

The aim of 2015 was to draft the Strategy and run pilot programs with the LWA U15 Girls Development Squad, the Coaching Apprenticeship Program and through the JLC, the Officiating Program. These pilot programs will then be evaluated and further programs initiated in other age groups and into boys and men's programs. A big thank you to Alana McKinlay, Gerard Wills and Elizabeth Hinkes for their dedication to the development of girls junior high performance lacrosse and to all those who assisted in sharing their vast lacrosse knowledge with our young, inspiring, future West Australian champions.

In April our U18 State Teams travelled to Adelaide to compete in the Australian Championships. The 2015 U18 ALA National Championships were hosted by Lacrosse South Australia at Barratt Reserve, West Beach SA. The WA boys team finished 2nd and the WA girls team finished 3rd. Ted Herbert, Will Day, Brayden Panting and Matthew Wood being named in the ALA All Star Team and Sharn Muffet and Emily Wills named in the Girls' ALA All Star Team.

The 2015 ALA Senior National Championship was held in Perth, Western Australia with a successful Championship being run by Subiaco Lacrosse Club. Congratulations to the WA Men's

Team being crowned Champions for 2015 with the WA Girls Team finishing 4th. Jamie Murphy, Jessie Bowland-Curtis, Tom Graham, Lewis Blackie and Daniel Kennedy were named in the Men's All Star Team along with Coach, Gavin Leavy and Referee, Peter Mulcahy. WA women named in the All Stars Team were Bec Banyard and Official, Kellie McBean.

The U15 Tournament was hosted by Footscray Lacrosse Club in Melbourne in September/October. WA was represented by the Stars and Flames girl's teams and the Southern Braves and Northern Thunder boy's teams. The Stars finished 4<sup>th</sup>, Flames 6<sup>th</sup> and Thunder 4<sup>th</sup> and Braves 5<sup>th</sup>. It was a great tournament with over 100 West Aussies all travelling to Melbourne on the same flight!

2015 was also a big year on the International level with the FIL U19 Women's World Championship held from 23 July to 1 August in Edinburgh, Scotland. Players from Western Australia were team Captain, Ashtyn Hiron (18) Phoenix, Karri Somerville (16) Subiaco, Goal Keeper Sharn Muffett (17) Wanneroo and Wembley Lacrosse Club's Rhiannon Panting (15). Also Assistant Coaches Rebecca Banyard and Caitlyn Ryan and Umpires Kellie McBean and Suzanne Kirkby. Australia finished fourth in the Championship. Phoenix's Ashtyn Hiron was given the huge honour of making the 2015 U19 Women's World Team. Congratulations girls and Ashtyn – WA is very proud of you!

The U23 International ASPAC Championship was held in Thailand in July. Western Australia was well represented in both the Men's and Women's teams. Overall the men finished 3<sup>rd</sup> and the women finished 2<sup>nd</sup> bringing home the silver medal. It is vital that Australia continues to play a key role in the rapid development of lacrosse in the Asia Pacific Region. Well done to all involved in this event.

We also had a WA representative in the 2015 Australian Indoor men's Team. Lucas Wood from Wembley was part of the team that competed in Syracuse, USA and finished 8<sup>th</sup> on the ladder.

Our next step is to establish a High Performance Committee so we can continue to implement the strategy and provide clear and supported high performance pathways for all of our administrators, coaches, managers, players and officials. Continuing to develop our high performance program is an integral part of growing our sport at the domestic and high performance levels.

Thank you to Murray Gates and the LWA office staff for continually supporting the LWA High Performance area.

### 2015 DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

Grant Moir

For the vital area of development and junior lacrosse, 2015 has been both challenging and rewarding. In some areas we have grown, in other areas we have not. There has also been some great work being done behind the scenes by a number of people, we hope that in a couple of years we will see the positive results from this work.

Lacrosse WA (LWA), with the assistance of Healthway, coordinates the 'Smarter than Smoking' School Modcrosse Program, which includes modcrosse sessions in schools, with community groups, at lightning carnivals and any other special events which includes high priority groups. This year the Smarter than Smoking Modcrosse Program was centrally coordinated with the assistance of Anna Forrest liaising with schools and development officers, and Peta Hiron liaising with Healthway, collating database from the clinics and development officer payments.

LWA monitors and adheres to Healthway's requirements which include no co-sponsorship with fast food companies, smoke free lacrosse environments for its members', safe alcohol and Sunsmart practices, healthy canteens, provision of a safe and inclusive environment for members.

In 2015, Smarter than Smoking Development Officers from various clubs, attended primary and secondary schools and delivered up to 3 modcrosse sessions per class.

Lacrosse WA would like to thank Healthway for their ongoing support. I would also like to thank Anna Forrest for her efforts in fulfilling this coordinator's role in 2015. Many, many hours of volunteer work went into keeping this centralized coordination of the STS Modcrosse Program moving along throughout this year. Peta Hiron has also done a great job in ensuring that Anna was fully supported in this role, while ensuring that our Development Officers were totally resourced and ready to bring Modcrosse to the schools.

While the Smarter than Smoking Modcrosse Program has been a major source of recruitment for the 6 clubs, it has been decided that for the sport to grow, there is a need for other programs with a greater focus on recruitment. There have been a number of meetings held throughout the year by a working group with the sole focus of growth and development. These meetings have resulted in a proposed development program that was endorsed and financially backed by the LWA Board. It is envisaged that this pilot program will be rolled out in the near future.

The Junior Officiating Program was one of the great highlights of the 2015 season. After a promising start in 2014, the program grew in leaps and bounds this year. The successful Induction Day (April 11th @ Rosalie Park) was attended by 30 juniors and was very well operated by a group of senior umpires and referees. By the conclusion of the 2015 season, there were 35 participants in the program, with ~60% of these participants reaching Phase 2 of the program. The U11's competition was almost totally officiated by junior referees in 2015, with the sight of 8-10 referees running around each Saturday morning quite commonplace. Many thanks must go to Nicole McKenna for her efforts in coordinating the junior umpires in the D Grade competition.

In the 2015 season, the Junior Lacrosse Council trialled a number of junior rule variations, namely the Mercy Rule in Junior Men's, as well as the use of the white lacrosse ball and optional arm guards in 13's. A full review of this trial was conducted by the Council at the conclusion of the season, with both 13's rule variations being endorsed as ongoing elements of the LWA Junior Rule Variations. While the Mercy Rule was well received in most grades, there is further review regarding this rule to be conducted in the off-season.

The 2015 LWA Gala Day once again brought together juniors from our three entry level competitions (Modcrosse, D Grade & U11's Lacrosse) into the one venue for a morning of round-robin competition. This year saw a huge increase in participants, particularly from the Wembley and Wanneroo Modcrosse competitions. Another great event coordinated by the JLC.

Lacrosse WA continued to support the D Grade Presentations, U11's Wind-Up and LWA Junior Lacrosse Wind-Up in 2015, with all three culminating events proving to be great successes. The Junior Wind-Up was a great night; particular thanks to the host club Wembley Lacrosse Club, Amanda Plummer & Russell Panting (organisers), our MC Glenn Morley, guest speaker Sharn Muffett and the Junior Lacrosse Council for bringing it all together.

I would once again like to acknowledge our 2015 Junior Lacrosse Council representatives: Amanda Plummer, Russell Panting (Wembley), Bev Leavy (EF), Aaron Williams (Phoenix), Angie Somerville (Subiaco), Lachlan Walker, Dennis Holman (Wanneroo), Des Doherty (Bayswater) and Bruce Banyard (ALRAWA). It has been a privilege to chair this Council and to work with all of its hardworking members.

In conclusion, I would like to thank those who have done their bit and more for the cause of junior lacrosse in WA. There are some amazing people out there who spend many hours making sure that we get teams on the park each week.

If we are to grow this sport to a point that we will be wondering "where are we going to fit ALL of these junior teams?" instead of worrying about how we will be looking in 5 years, we need to make some fundamental changes to how we do things. We also need to make growth, development and junior playing numbers our number one priority in every club.

The 2015 Lacrosse WA season was launched with an opening function at Subiaco Football Club where significant local lacrosse achievements were recognised such as the WA Stars taking out the 2014 Under 15 National Championship and Bayswater Lacrosse Club winning the Australian Club Championships back to back. Attendance numbers were low at this function, however Lacrosse WA will continue to find ways to reward and recognise local success.

Lacrosse WA continues to grow in the social media space with on a focus on Facebook marketing and currently has more than 1180 followers ("Likes").

The LWA Facebook page has become a key tool in communicating with our lacrosse community and promoting both local and international opportunities for players, coaches, staff and volunteers.



Don Rudderham presented the Hodgetts Shield that had been unearthed in recent years, a trophy that was originally to be presented to a team winning 3 premierships in B Grade, the first club being Maylands in the early 1920's. It is indeed a very handsome trophy featuring ornate engraving of lacrosse players in action. The trophy was promptly donated to LWA for safe keeping. Anyone who has further information of this trophy are urged to contact the LWA.

The Annual Dinner was held at RAAF Bullcreek on the 19th of August. The theme was the 25th Anniversary of the 1990 World Series held in Perth. The Whiteman Youth sponsorship award was made to Ashtyn Hiron from the Phoenix Lacrosse Club for the Australian Under 19 team.

#### The Project:

Professional editing of a book History of Western Australian Lacrosse Association (founding year 1896 to 2010) including every lacrosse club/team that has existed or exists in Western Australia.

A small team of Kuljak members led by Ian Toy have undertaken the task of researching and gathering material that will enable a book, both paper and digital, to be produced.

The research includes WALA records, newspaper articles, photograph collections of club members and press photos, official WALA photos. The book is now some 400 pages, 200 plus photos, 80,000 to 90,000 words. The work so far has been at no cost the Association. Sub editing is underway (again at no cost to the Association) and the next stage is to engage a professional editor to ensure a quality product, that makes the Western Australian community proud, is produced.

#### **Benefits and Value**

By producing a book, now, the history will not be lost. It will be a source of knowledge for those who come and provide pleasure to anyone seeking to know what has happened.

It has been said "The further back you look the further you see into the future." Recorded history gives you an opportunity to look back. The application was approved.

#### Photograph of the Year Competition

In 2012 the Foundation accepted a proposal to sponsor an annual photographic competition to promote and develop the art of sports photography within the lacrosse community of Western Australia with an annual prize of \$500. The primary aim of the competition was to boost the range of photos available for promotional and educational purposes for Lacrosse WA and clubs.

Promotion of the competition to clubs and members was by way of a poster, which was distributed annually to all clubs and also the LWA office, for display. Details of the competition were also placed on the Lacrosse WA website.

The 2014 fixtures reveal that the Association, from six clubs over 10 grades (excludes club Modcrosse and Under 11 competition), fielded a total of 64 teams. With some exceptions, individual photographers specialized in one form of the game over another. The majority of photographs received covered the men's

competition. Photos received were all presented to attendees to the Association's annual presentation evening, via PowerPoint, prior to the announcement of the winner. Photos have also been incorporated within the LWA's annual reports. Endeavours to have the competition's winning photographs published in the Western Australian newspaper were unsuccessful.
