This season was going to be an exciting one with the return of old players and new ones coming into the team. We were defending our Premiership but it wasn't going to be easy. To ensure that the girls had the best coaching available to do this, I increased our coaching. Lindy Rattigan returned as my Assistant Coach and into the team came Kay Bevan and James Harris. Between all of us there was plenty of years of experience at both club, national and international as coaches and players. Mel Barnes and Tamyka Penglase returned to the squad from injury and were eager to get back into it. The team was awaiting the arrival of 2 new International players from Holland, Ylaine and Suzanne and the return of Katie Bartlett. We had 2 new players this year in Stephanie Stewart and Sophie Hoyle who made the move to Adelaide to become permanent members of the club.

Pre-season started in August with a squad of 15 involving batting, ground work and a camp at Middleton. Everyone was working hard but unfortunately the team had a set back with Mel Barnes re-injuring her shoulder that would end up being a season breaker.

The start of the season had finally arrived and although we were still awaiting the arrival of our International players, everyone was ready. Like last year's draw, we were playing Port Adelaide and Walkerville a number of times. The team was unsettled for the first half due to 6 of our players being involved in the Starz squad and myself coaching. We had mixed results with a number of draws and only a handful of wins, but the girls kept hard at it improving in small areas each week.

At the break, we had 5 wins, 8 losses and 4 draws positioned 3rd on the ladder with West Torrens and Seacombe above us. Our runs for were 35 and against 50. We were still in the hunt of finishing 2nd spot at the end of the minor round and knew we had some work to do before we came back for the 2nd round.

The 2nd round saw a change in the team, coming together with the bat and looking strong for the run home to the finals. We had 8 games until finals and the team showed great determination and strength to finish in 2nd spot with 7 wins and 1 draw. Our runs for were 38 and only 11 against thanks to some great defence and pitching strength.

Our semi-final saw us up against Seacombe who we had beaten twice, one being a Wednesday night game that saw a battle of the pitchers. It went to 11 innings with the batting strength coming together at the right time. We knew it wasn't going to be easy. The great display of batting went astray unfortunately and we lost 6-0. Whilst we were disappointed, the girls stuck to the task at hand, knowing we had another chance.

The Preliminary Final had arrived and the girls were pumped. Sturt batted first and it was 3 up, 3 down and now it was our turn. Tamyka Penglase was the leadoff batter cracking one to left field for a double but

unfortunately we couldn't score. There was some brilliant fielding from both teams, although I would say some of Sturt's were 'lucky' which proved to be enough to lift them in the next innings, scoring 2 runs. Stephanie Stewart had 3 great at bats with a triple, double and single. Ylaine also batted well with 2 from 3 turns at bat. The team was batting but not enough to string it together to score those elusive runs going down 2-1 and ending our hopes of defending our Premiership. Most coaches rely on stats, but this time..... We had 10 safe hits to their 2, and Vanessa pitched 13 K's to our 3. Everyone was shattered but it has only made the girls, and coaching staff, more determined for next season knowing they can do it and a 2nd Premiership is still within reach.

This weekend set us up for a good season to come, with 7 wins, 1 draw and 2 losses. Unfortunately Elly Beal scraped up the side of her leg quite badly sliding into base on diamond 1, leaving her out of the next 2 weeks of minor rounds....

Moving in to the minor rounds, we had a team of 9, Cara, Amy, Bek J, Elly, Sasha, Steph, Bec S, Megan and Sara. Along the way, we were assisted by Mia, Alana, Jess and Tasma from the U15's in the weeks where we had injuries or players away on state commitments. Our first game against Sturt left us reeling a bit, with a 7-2 loss, but we fought back in the following weeks to maintain a top 4 position. With good wins against Port, a win and loss against West Torrens, and wins against all other teams except Sturt, we managed to finish the season in second position! Sturt, after the minor rounds had not lost a game!

Our first final against Sturt was one of the minds, and from the first pitch, Georgia and I knew the girls were probably not in the best head space... Sturt batted in 17 runs to our 5, but luckily we had the second chance to move in to the next round against Port, who had just beaten West Torrens. After a kick to the guts the week before, we really worked on hitting at training and it certainly paid off against Port in the Prelim Final, coming out winners 6-0. Sasha pitched the game of her life with 6 strike outs and 2 hits for the game. Our girls were incredibly aggressive on the bases, and put the pressure on when needed to force the errors. Elly and Steph both getting on base all 3 times they batted!! And the field was almost perfect with only 1 error for the game!!

Now the big game!! We were always going in the underdogs, with such a big loss to Sturt previously, and Sturt having not lost a game all year. But, that wasn't going to put our girls off! They all went in to this game so cool, calm and collected. They were determined right from the first pitch that they were going to knock Sturt of their 'falcons' perch! And that they did! Elly Beal started off our batting innings with a line drive up the middle to centre field, backed up with Bek Jury putting down a perfect bunt, to advance Elly to second. This already started to rattle the Sturt girls, with Sasha getting walked. It was all on from there with 3 runners scoring in the first innings. Sturt couldn't back it up with the bats, with only 1 hit for the innings. We couldn't manage any runs in the second innings, but managed to hold Sturt to nothing going into the third at 3-0. The third innings brought in 3 more runs, bringing the score to 6-0. Morale was high and the girls kept their cool, looking confident. Still with time to spare, we brought Steph in to finish the game, striking out 8 out the next 12 batters for Sturt. Amy

was solid at first base catching some rockets from third and short. (4 innings of play). With hits to Steph, Elly, Sasha, Megan, Sara and Cara, Glenelg couldn't quite get those last few runs on the board, but that didn't matter, and the game was over 6-0.

I am sure I speak on behalf of Georgia and everyone involved with our team, in saying that I am so proud of all the girls, not only for winning the Grand Final, but also for how hard they have worked this year, not just on the diamond, but at training and the carnivals as well. There are always going to be frustrating moments for coaches, parents and players, but as a team, we worked together to build a solid group of players who got the best out of each other and themselves, to win that ultimate game.

All coaches have to sit down at the end of the season and give awards... And I am sure all coaches wish, as I do, that there were 9 trophies to be able to give out. All of our players this year stick in my mind for one thing or another. Just a run down on each player for you... Amy started the season a scared first base having to catch rockets from Steph at shortstop, but finished the season catching every single thing that got thrown at her. Amy has also worked hard on her batting, getting a few really nice line drives up the middle. Bek Jury was a great little utility starting some games at third, second and outfield. But has really knuckled down and has owned second base this side of Christmas. Bek has also cemented her place as number 2 hitter, with those bunts going down nearly every time! Megs has played almost every infield position this year, but has come so far behind the plate. She calls the pitches so well, and that rocket arm – no one would want to steal! Her batting has been awesome, with 2 home runs and 2 triples to her name. Bec Steer – centrefield could not be a safer place! Diving for almost anything she can get close to, you know if there is a ball in the outfield, Bec will be under it! Cara has almost played all over the diamond – third, first, left field and pitcher just to name a few. Solid with the bat, and picking a lot of walks as well, she is one to look out for, especially with an on base average somewhere in the .600's. Sasha has pitched almost every game, as well as playing shortstop and first. Working hard outside saw her improve her drop ball and change up. Sasha will definitely be stepping up to seniors in good form. When she doesn't drop her shoulder (LOL) – Sasha has hit 1 home run and also batted in 9 RBI's for the season. Sara started out the season at third, but after a knock to the face early on, stood tall to claim rightfield and did extremely well, having never played there before. With a few doubles, and a triple to her name, Sara will go into next year with a strong presence in the batting box. Steph has put her name to shortstop this year as well as a few innings at first, catcher and pitcher. Batting in 11 RBI's and scoring 16 runs herself, Steph has shown her aggressive nature on the bases and the ability to score runs under pressure.

This year I tried to settle the players in positions a little earlier in the season so they could really focus on learning the game in a familiar role. Once again we had most of the players on the pitching mat at some point during the season and they all gave a great effort when it was their chance, but the three girls who pitched the majority of the season were Alana, Jess and Tasma. 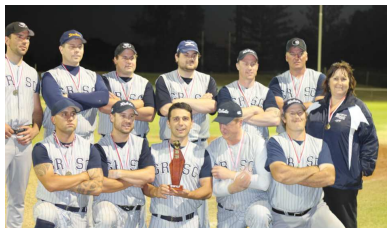
