Season 2011-2012



Season 2011/12 started for me back in June last year when I started preparing pre-season training sessions, organising a Development Camp, organising and preparing a Glenelg Rebels Masters Team for the upcoming Masters Games and madly recruiting players. Whilst it has been a long season for me, it has been one that I will remember and cherish in years to come. Pre-season, a lot of hard work was going on behind the scenes by myself and senior players in securing new recruits to the club. One of the states upcoming pitchers, Stephanie Trzcinski came to the club from West Torrens together with Hayley Cross and Kayla Borovnik. TVR's unfortunate demise turned out to be a blessing when we picked up Kate Sczcypiorski and an added bonus with a US Catcher, Katie Bartlett. I was also fortunate in getting a young Canadian Pitcher, Holly Denny. Vanessa Stokes made the move to the club also and as an added bonus, she bought her niece Nicollete (Sissy) Dunn from Alice Springs. It was at this stage that I knew with the current Glenelg players, together with these new recruits, I had the team that was capable of doing great things, but I didn't want to get ahead of mvself.

I first had to prepare the Glenelg Rebels Masters Team for the Australian Masters Games in Adelaide in October. Little did I know back then that the team winning Gold was just the start of things to come in season 2011/12. The first 6 games of the season were a bit of a mixed bag as Lindy and I were trying to work out the feel of the team and the players themselves were trying to get to know how each other plays, but the results were already positive having surpassed what we had achieved in recent seasons. There was a buzz around West Beach that Glenelg Rebels A Grade were no longer the easy beats and that we had a team that was a force to be reckoned with!

Katie and Holly were slowly adapting to not only the

Australian language and colloquialisms, but to the game itself. Whilst Katie and Holly were totally opposite in their personalities, with Katie being loud and out there and Holly being quiet and very shy, both the girls started to blend in with the players and the team was starting to gel. By the end of the first half of the season, we had 7 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses, 50 runs for but only 16 against. Defensively we had proved that we were the best team but we just needed to score more runs. We were sitting 2nd on the ladder with 16 points together with Seacombe on the same points but a better runs for and against. Sturt were currently on top with 21 points.

After the break we didn't start how I would have liked going down to Seacombe in a hard fought game 3-2. The girls came out in the next game twice as strong against Walkerville winning 11-1 and this saw a pattern emerging. We only lost 2 more games for the remainder of the minor round but after each loss, the girls rallied and would come out in their next game and smash the opposition. On our Club Day we played against Sturt and although we lost 9-4, the team showed tremendous strength and spirit, never giving up believing they could still win.

Glenelg finished 2nd on the ladder after the minor rounds and were facing Sturt in the Semi Final. The players had an impressive 120 runs for and only 46 against, the best in the competition. In the minor rounds we had 1 win, 1 draw and 3 losses to Sturt and we knew it wasn't going to be an easy match, but they were beatable.

Both Sturt and Glenelg were missing key players in the side due to Australian commitments in Canberra but we knew we had more depth. The girls were pumped and confident that it was our time to take Sturt and secure our spot in the Grand Final. We jumped Sturt early putting the runs on the board and had them chasing us. Holly was a rock in the middle striking out a number of their dangerous batters and she was backed up in the field by some great defence. The girls were buzzing and it showed in their batting. Even when Sturt threatened with runners on, the girls held firm and didn't let the pressure get to them. The end result.... a victorious win 5-2! 25 years on and Glenelg Rebels A Grade were playing in a Grand Final. Now we had to show everyone that we deserved to be Premiers!

Grand Final day had finally arrived and it was an exciting day for the club with 3 teams playing for Premierships. We already had 1 Premiership after our Men's team won their Grand Final a few weeks earlier. Congratulations to James and the team. Our U/13's started the day off with a great win over Onkaparinga scoring a massive 18 runs to 6. Congratulations to James, Chris and the girls. Our B Grade was playing on diamond 2 against Sturt and was a great prelude to the A Grade Final. The B Grade defeated Sturt convincingly 7-0 and was a great start for me having played in this Premiership side. Congratulations to Nat, Darren and the rest of my team.

Now my focus was on the A Grade. West Torrens had gallantly come from 4th position to have convincing wins over Seacombe 6-0 in the Semi Final and then defeating the favoured Sturt 4-1 in the Preliminary final. It wasn't going to be an easy game as they were on a high but we did have the upper hand throughout the season with 4

wins and 1 loss and we knew they were beatable. But finals are a different ball game altogether, which they had already shown.

The girls were pumped and didn't appear to be showing any nerves. I wish I could say the same for myself. Vanessa Stokes started in the middle for us and did a great job and was, once again, backed up in the field by the team with a strong defence. As the innings rolled by, both teams were getting hits and threatening with runners on, but just couldn't score that elusive run. Marni Nichols was ruling the outfield for West Torrens taking some great catches, all over the place, even in front of her own players. The Glenelg players showed no signs of nerves or pressure standing firm to make sure no runs were scored by West Torrens.

I think it was the top of the 6th innings and West Torrens had runners on 2nd and 3^{rd,} 2 out and Mel McGie up to bat. Mel is always a dangerous batter and I knew if anyone could hit Vanessa under pressure, she could. She hit a deep fly ball to Centre Field and Georgia turned, ran, and took a great catch. This seemed to lift the team to another level and they came back with some strong hitting. We still couldn't get that run though to shut out the game but they still believed they could do it. At the conclusion of 7 innings we were tied 0-0 so it was time to go to a tie breaker. The girls held strong and managed to stop West Torrens from scoring but then West Torrens did the same to us, so we were locked again at 0-0 and the tie-breaker continued. At the top of the 9th innings West Torrens scored a run and was now leading 1-0. It was our turn and we were at the top of our batting line up. Young speedy Georgia Bevan was our runner at 2nd and it was time to bring in Bree McGee to put down the bunt to advance her. Although Bree didn't get the bunt down, she did her job as she caused an error by their catcher and Georgia took the opportunity to steal to 3rd to be in a scoring position. None out and up to bat is Sissy Dunn. She cracked it to the outfield for a stand up double scoring Georgia and the game was tied again at 1-1 with Steph Trzcinski up to bat and our fastest runner was now on 2nd. An outside pitch was thrown down by their pitcher and Steph went with it cracking it to right field. Sissy took off heading for me at 3rd and I yelled "GO HARD!" pointing to home, waving my arms madly and that she did. The throw from right field came to home plate and all I saw was Vanessa velling at Sissy and the girls all coming out of the ball pen. I don't really remember much after that except looking at Steph to tell her to hold up at 2nd and then the umpire to see if he had called time and game, and then he did! A huge sigh of relief! After 25 long years of waiting for that elusive Premiership, we had done it! We were now the A Grade Premiers and it was time to celebrate after a long season and boy did the girls party!

It had been a great day for the Glenelg Rebels Softball Club with all 3 teams playing in Grand Finals and coming out Premiers! But still we weren't finished. Heidi and I went up to collect the Shield and we came back to the where the team and supporters were standing overcome with the excitement. They then announced the

A Grade Player of the Grand Final, Nicolette Dunn (Sissy) and the look on her face was priceless. It couldn't have been a more fitting end to what was a great day and at times still doesn't seem real.

These players are a team of champions who showed great strength, courage and belief throughout the season and who I am very proud to have coached. I know that all of the players and members of this club are also very proud of them.

A Grade Awards:

Most Valuable Player & Batting trophy - Katie Bartlett

I remember when I first met her and recalling her bubbly personality which was always there during games and at training sessions. Her enthusiasm, encouragement, effort and experience were of great value not only to her own team mates, but other players in the club.

Most Valuable Player & Pitching trophy - Vanessa Stokes

She would often make everyone laugh but was deadly serious when she stood on the pitchers plate as she knew she had a job to do. She didn't like to let the team or herself down. She played in the STARZ team and was named in the A Grade Team of the year. She was selected in the Australian Team to play against New Zealand in January and then against Japan in March. She was recently named in the Australian Team to play in Canada in July at the ISF Open Women's World Championships. She is known as the 'Black Doll'

Inspirational Award - Georgia Bevan

In the beginning she was quiet but had this air of confidence about her when she took to the field. She had no fear and would dive for anything near her whether she was in the field or trying to sneak that extra base on any error the opposition made. She was always talking and it was as if she was permanently drinking Red Bulls and bouncing everywhere but was always encouraging and positive no matter what the situation. She would always be the first to put up her hand to try any position or volunteer to umpire or help out somewhere if a coach was needed to help players, in particular the juniors, no matter how frustrating sometimes it got for her. When young players were sitting on the bench she would always encourage and talk to them to help calm their nerves because she remembers what it was like when she first got to sit on the bench in A Grade.

Coaches Award - Hayley Cross

She has shyness about her and may not say too much come game day but she could always say something funny at the right moment. She always gave 110% and was full of energy and enthusiasm at training sessions, although easily side tracked. At the start of the season she lacked confidence with her batting so I got her to play B Grade as well to get more exposure with at bats and it certainly paid off. She finished the season with a batting average of .280, 50 at bats and 14 hits with 11 RBI's. In the field at the start whilst Lindy and I were trying to find the best fit for the players, we had her at short stop, outfield and even 3rd base, which she was dreading but she gave it all and never gave up trying to get it right no matter where we put her. On Grand Final day I remember speaking to her and letting her know that she was going to be our leadoff batter and the look on her face was one of OMG! Lindy and I knew she could do it so it was just a matter of convincing her she could. She has an unorthodox throw that you wouldn't think would get from the outfield to home plate the way it does, but it does. The improvement in her game this season has been great to see from when she first came to the club. She was a member of the B Grade Premiership side and finished 3rd in SASA B Grade Best & Fairest.

Lesley Claxton – A Grade Coach



It was my great pleasure to transition from playing A Grade into my semi-retirement role as Player/Head Coach of the B Grade this season especially when it is sweetened by a B Grade Premiership. My aim of the season was to make the top four but to also blood many of the junior players in a controlled environment where they could enjoy the challenge of B Grade as well as ensuring our more mature players performed at their potential. Heading into the Christmas break we had a very up and down season so were just hanging on to fourth position. Obviously the Christmas break did us the world of good as we only lost 2 out of our 10 remaining games. We just missed out on the double chance but it wasn't needed as we were able to knock West Torrens over 4-2 in a tight Elimination Game.
