Matt Dunn Report

Kangaroos v South Warrnambool

After a solid pre-season, turned in a solid performance against South Warrnambool; and the senior team were keen to 'stuck' into our opposition in front of a huge crowd here at the oval under lights. We welcomed new recruits, Nathan Curtis, Kamus Gordon and Paul Cox



into the side along with Jack Sutherland and Mitchell Johnson, for their first senior games. The Game was fast paced with some exciting passages of play. Although the match was relatively even, South made more of their scoring opportunities, while wayward kicking for goal proved costly for us. Our backline worked really hard setting up many forward thrusts, which resulted in Josh Meulendyks being able to get forward for two goals. Ryan Sigley and Jarrod O'Brien also performed well. Sean Barnes, coming off an impressive pre-season, got 'plenty of the footy' through the midfield, while Paul Cox was dangerous around goal. In the week that followed, we worked on identifying areas where we needed to improve as we prepared to take on North Warrnambool. All players were keen to put in a strong showing and get our first win on the board.

Kangaroos v North Warrnambool

We travelled to Bushfield to take on the powerful North Warrnambool Eagles, making three changes, bringing in Jack Murray, James Whyte and selecting Michael McMeel for his first senior game for the club. North were coming off a big win over Warrnambool, so we understood the new challenge that lay ahead. We got off to a great start in the first quarter, with Hamish Waldron and co. setting the standard, working hard to get the ball forward; and Josh Pepper presenting well across halfforward. The efforts across the board, had us meeting our key indicators, resulting in a thirteen point lead at the first siren. The next term was unfortunately a different story as North's bigger bodies enabled them to get on top, in contested footy and at the stoppages. Norths delivery to their 'tall's' in the forward line, made life difficult for our defence, as they piled on nine goals, showing everyone how classy a side they are. The third quarter was an even thirty minute contest, but we were 'running out of steam' Losing vice-captain Brady Hicks (ankle) and Jarrod O'Brien hampered (but playing on in discomfort) by an indiscrete 'corky', early in the game our rotations mid-field rotations were restricted saw us go into the final term eight goals down. This quarter was similar to the second with the Eagles taking control through their height and strength, however to our boys credit; we continued to fight the game out, despite North coming away with a fourteen goal win. Our better players were Sean Barnes, Josh Meulendyks, Josh Pepper, Hamish Waldron, Sam Quinn and Sam Tooley. Last week we once again had the honour of playing on Anzac Day against Portland who had already shown good form early, intent on putting together four solid quarters to bring about our first points of the season.

Kangaroos v Portland

On Monday we travelled to Portland, for the now traditional Anzac Day fixture between our two clubs.

It wasn't a great start to the day as the Under 18.5s struggled to take their opportunities in windy conditions, resulting in a big loss for our boys. Our fortunes turned in the reserves, with the help of a number of 'unders' who stepped up to contribute, we were able to fashion a good win. The senior side welcomed back Kane Uebergang, for his first senior game of the season; and Luke Uebergang returned after some dental work. Unfortunately Brady Hicks was unable to get over a niggling ankle injury, while Jack Murray was squeezed out of the line-up. The game started with Paul Cox, taking a spectacular grab in front of the Portland Social rooms, Paul had 'plenty of the ball' early and was creating excitement in our forward line. We controlled the play in the first five minutes, but failed to capitalise on the scoreboard. Portland then took over for the remainder of the quarter, scoring four goals five to take a 26 point lead at the first break. In the second term we managed to kick two goals three, but the Tigers were running harder, getting to the footy first and using it better to post five goals, to further increase their hold on the game by 44 points at the main break. There was plenty of soul searching during the interval, with particular emphasis on our midfield, which to their credit set the scene for a much improved second half. Kane Uebergang moved in for the centre clearances, making his presence felt around the stoppages, crashing packs, tackling hard; and setting a fine example to his team mates. Hamish Waldron and Jarrod O'Brien, also worked hard through the midfield to put us back in the game. The improved work rates had a positive affect right across the ground, being first to the ball and striving to provide protection and options. At the final break we had gained some momentum, but still trailed by thirty seven points. The last quarter was an exciting 30 minutes of football; Kane Uebergang continued to impose himself on the game, kicking three goals vital majors, while Josh Pepper marked strongly to finish with five goals. The most impressive 'stat' for this term was our 24 tackles 11 of which were in our forward 50. Along with the improved showing by our forwards, the backline held strong, providing plenty of run and attack, meaning we were able to pile on six goals four, to a just one point by the Tigers. It was an interesting finish to the game after Portland kicked a goal seconds after the siren, which would have given them the win by 4 points. The officiating umpire (and a number players and spectators) didn't hear the siren and the goal was deemed to be in play, before an umpiring conference saw the decision overturned giving us victory by two points. Kane Uebergang superb in his 'comeback' game, with midfield 'grunt' classy ball use and great kicking for goal, was awarded best on ground. Overall we had many contributors in the second half, which were rewarded with the presenting of the Ted Kenna VC Cup to Hamilton Kangaroos.

After Monday, we have a number of areas to work on a as we continue to learn and develop our game. A key focus will be to put together four quarters of competitive football, hopefully starting against Terang Mortlake, once again under the Melville Oval lights.

Kangaroos v South Warrnambool

In what was going to a test, our new A Graders didn't disappoint. After a few early nerves we soon adjusted and settled into what became a great, fast paced game to watch. The South attackers combined well; and their goalies shot beautifully, not missing at all in the first



quarter. The score line read 9-0 before we sank our first goal, our girls realised that they needed to work really hard to get back in the game after such a slow start. Half way through the last quarter we dropped three goals behind, but to their credit our girls kept fighting back and eventually tied the game up at the last whistle. For a team that has not had a great deal of time playing together, this group of girls really proved to them-selves that they are capable of so much. Our Players Auction is a fun way for members, sponsors, supporters and community groups to have a closer involvement with the Kangaroos playing list 2016.

You can participate as an individual, or form a syndicate where one member will be the official bidder. Bidders must be registered on the day of the event through Rhianne Lewis.
