Looking On From Over The Fence . . .

One of the things we need to collectively work on as a League, is ensuring that we adhere to guidelines in relation to attire for our on-field support personnel. The requirement for our water carriers to wear white shorts (or pants) and green western water tops, has not been followed by all clubs during the opening couple of rounds.

In addition, we must also ensure our runners are wearing black coloured shorts at all times.

The other area of concern relates specifically to water carriers standing on the ground, watching the game.

Here is what rule 17.2 of the AFL-Vic Country Handbook states in relation to these positions.

All official runners, trainers and water carriers are to be dressed in a uniform determined by the league.

The sole duty of a runner shall be to confer with the player or players of his/her club and to immediately leave the playing arena.

The sole duty of a water carrier shall be to convey water to players and to immediately leave the playing arena.

We did experience an incident in another league, whereby a water carrier was standing inside the boundary line watching play. The boundary umpire was tracking play and collided with the water carrier. Thankfully neither person was seriously injured in this instance, but it should not have occurred in the first place. Let's make the playing arena safe from unforeseen incidents, by ensuring our on-field support staff are fully aware of the rules and regulations.

Good luck to all teams ahead of Round 3.

ROUND 3 2015 REWIND

Round three of the RDFNL had a number of blockbusters that would shake the competition. Diggers Rest and Rupertswood went head to head, and Romsey and Broadford battled it out.

DIGGERS REST v RUPERTSWOOD

Reigning grand finalists Diggers Rest went into this game with confidence. Rupertswood, frustrated from its early 2014 finals exit, were determined to gain revenge on the Burras who sent them crashing out of the finals race.

The Sharks dominated play in the first term with the wind but their inaccuracy in front of goal proved costly. They led by 12 points but could only convert five times from 11 attempts. The Burras kicked four straight goals and took a solid nine-point lead at halftlime after restricting Rupertswood to nothing.

Cam McCabe (three goals) picked up the tempo in the third term as the Burras outplayed the Sharks to lead by 26-points. With seven goals to two in the second half, the home team won with confidence, 14.7 (91) to 7.12 (54). Brett Chambers was the star for the Sharks who were led by Riley and Jordan with two goals each.

Tuckey, Campbell and Clarke all joined McCabe as leading multiple goal kickers for the Burras.

BROADFORD v ROMSEY

A finals like atmosphere surrounded Harley Hammond Reserve as the Roos unleashed former AFL stars Brodie Holland and Russell Robertson onto the reigning premiers, Romsey.

The Redbacks were somewhat a shadow of their former self and came off a tough loss at the hands of Rupertswood in round two but the talent was so strong that they would reassure to the rest of the competition that they would take some beating in 2015.

Romsey held a 20-point lead at quarter time in a high scoring encounter. That lead was trimmed back to eight points at half-time, 60 to 52.

Broadford through John Baker (four goals) and Robertson (four goals) surged to the front with five goals to three in the third term.

Romsey needed something special in the final term and former AFL talent Mitch Farmer (seven goals) did just that. He pushed forward as the Redbacks kicked seven in the final term to lead his team to victory. 19.11 (125) to 16.5 (101).

Matt Burkett was a stand-out for the Redbacks before he was taken off the ground with a collarbone injury that would sideline him for a big part of the season. Corey Viani was a star for Broadford.

WALLAN v MACEDON

Both teams went into the game undefeated. The Pies were set to face a challenger for the flag and were hungry for success.

Unfortunately for the home team, the visitors were just as hungry. Macedon kicked 5.10 to nothing in the first term with the wind to lead by 40 points. Usually in these conditions, the team kicking with the breeze would storm back into contention the following quarter. Macedon denied that opportunity, kicking 4.5 to 2.3 and take a 54-point halftime lead.

Shaun Harrison and James Wright (two goals) were unstoppable as Macedon unleashed seven goals to one in the third term to lead by 92-points. Wallan won the final

term, but the damage was done, Macedon ending Wallan's unbeaten run to move to second place, 17.22 (124) to 6.9 (45).

Macedon had 12 individual goal kickers. Jess Cosaitis was the best for the Pies and was one of three players to kick two goals.

LANCEFIELD v ROCKBANK

This game proved to be one of the more interesting ones of the round. Lancefield were on the hunt for their second win after beating Kilmore in round two while the Rams were looking for their first victory.

A pulsating first term had the Tigers lead by 10-points, 31 to 21. The screws tightened over the next two terms as Lancefield led at three quarter time, 8.10 (58) to 8.7 (55). The Rams pushed hard during those middle terms but could not take the lead.

After missing a chance to take the lead, Rockbank watched on in the final term as the Tigers ran away to victory with seven final term goals to three to win 15.11 (101) to 11.9 (75).

What made this game more interesting was the forwards. Jon Kent was at one end for Lancefield. He kicked six goals and was equally matched at the other end as Lachy Calder kicked six goals for Rockbank. The two forwards went head-to-head in an entertaining outing for fans.

Tevita Fonua was sensational for the Tigers and Scott Swindell impressed with four goals. Leigh Sobotnicki and Tim Senserrick impressed for the Rams.

MELTON CENTRALS v RIDDELL

Both teams wrnt into the game, 1-1. The Centrals showed plenty of heart against the Cats on Anzac Day and the Bombers were full of run.

The run was evident in the opening term as the contest was effectively over before it started. Riddell kicked 7.0 (42) to nothing in the opening term.

Centrals fought back in the in the second term to reduce the margin to four goals. They continued to fight hard and not be overwhelmed by the Bombers.

They kicked nine goals to eight after quarter time which was a positive sign. Riddell won by 43 points, 15.13 (103) to 9.6 (60).

Seven players shared nine goals for the Centrals with Shane Frederickson a stand-out. Shaun Neeson and James Nolan kicked four goals each for the Bombers while Paul Sahlberg was a clear stand-out

WOODEND/HESKET v SUNBURY KANGAROOS

Both teams would be at opposite ends of the ladder after the result of this clash. The Hawks played their second home game at Romsey Park and started strongly in the first term, trailing the Roos by 22-points.

That was as close as they got as Ryan Hatty and Mitch Streiff kicked six goals each and Phil Kaufmann kicked five goals. The trio adding 17 goals between them in an impressive effort.

The Roos had a day out for stats fans. They kicked four goals in the first and third terms, and seven goals in the second and final terms for a combined total of 22.13 (145). They won by 110-points against a young Hawks, 5.5 (35). Hamish Govan, Nathan Stephens and Ben Morrison impressed for the Hawks.

MESSAGE FROM WORKSAFE AFL VICTORIA COUNTRY

COUNTRY FOOTBALL NETBALL PROGRAM EXTENDED

AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria welcomes the Victorian Government's latest announcement to commit \$8 million to extend the Country Football Netball Program (CFNP) for a further four years.

In addition, a further \$1 million contribution has been committed by program partners, AFL, AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria.

AFL Victoria chief executive Steven Reaper and Netball Victoria acting chief executive Katie Reaper believe that the CFNP has been an unmitigated success, lauded from clubs, leagues, local government and both football and netball.

"The Country Football Netball Program has been pivotal in providing grassroots clubs and associations with a vehicle to improve their facilities so that increased participation levels in both netball and football, on and off the court, can be maximised," Mrs Reaper said.

"The evaluation of the program was extremely positive and recommended the CFNP continue, as did Peter Jackson's 2011 Country Football Review, so we welcome the decision by the Victorian Government to do just that," Mr Reaper said.

Mr Reaper also cited the landmark research project by La Trobe University which found that for every dollar invested in community football, a return of \$4.40 in social value is delivered in terms of improved physical and mental health, increased social connectedness, wellbeing, personal development and employment outcomes.

In its 10-year history, the CFNP has provided more than \$22 million in grant funding to assist with over 425 projects. This has resulted in a combined total project value of almost \$65 million.

"Some of these projects include premier facility developments completed at Morwell, Bendigo, Ballarat, Shepparton, Horsham, Swan Hill, Colac and Wangaratta, but perhaps even more importantly it has delivered many simple, smaller change room, court, field and lighting projects

that support both Australian Football and Netball volunteers," Mr. Reaper said.

"We recognises that our regional facilities produce some of the best netballers in Victoria. With seven of our twelve Melbourne Vixens athletes hailing from the country, the pathway we have for these players, and the safe and compliant community and regional facilities, is therefore crucial in the development of elite athletes" Mrs Reaper said.

Better sport and recreation facilities go a long way to encouraging future football and netball players, coaches, officials and supporters of all abilities to participate in local sport and make it easier for the rest of the community to get involved.

Netball Victoria's regional staff and the AFL Region Commissions' knowledge of their communities and relationships with local Councils, along with the AFL Victoria state wide facilities plan 'Growing the Heartland', regional facilities plans and Netball Victoria's Statewide Facilities Strategy will ensure the best possible investments can be made.

"With our 2015 Census data showing club participation levels exceeding Victoria's population growth last season, we need to continue to work collaboratively to ensure there are quality facilities across the state to cater for this growth," Mr Reaper said.

The CFNP plays such a significant role in enhancing relationships between clubs, councils and peak sporting organisation. We are excited to have the support of the Victorian Government and look forward to working with program partners on the continuation of the CFNP and other key stakeholders on major and minor projects which are significant to our sports.

The CFNP is a proven model that drives and increases participation in both netball and football within Victoria and we are thankful to the State Governments ongoing commitment to the facility development of football and netball throughout the state.

Romsey v Diggers Rest (6pm)

The Redbacks started the game with confidence against the Bombers but that quickly faded away as they went down by 112-points. The Burras didn't have it easy in their match with Lancefield, prevailing by 49-points on the road.

Romsey desperately missed the influence of Ayden and Nathan Tessari in the backline last week as Jason Allen and Brian Ruffell controlled Riddell's forward line. They had a strong start before conceding six goals in seven minutes to go from from trailing by four points to 40 points in the blink of an eye.

Brayden Feltham was solid all day while Chris and Matt Burkett worked well through the midfield. Wally Saad and Dean Borg took the game on in patches. They lost Marc Young to a foot injury at a time where he was having an impact.

Taylor Hine and Cale Morton had stand-out games for Diggers Rest in its win over Lancefield. Brandon 'BJ' Kilty was unstoppable with two goals and plenty of ball use. He helped pioneer a strong final term finish as the Burras kicked away to a confident win.

Pat Jackson had the break out game that fans knew he was capable of and Col Laurie used the ball well across halfback to set up many forward thrusts. Lancefield's Jon Kent was restricted to just one goal.

The Grand Final rematch under lights is a blockbuster that fans have been itching to see. While Romsey may be on the wrong side of confidence and form, it's these sort of games where players walk taller and generate something special.

Diggers Rest has shown that it has put the ghosts of the 2015 Grand Final loss behind them with two big wins against solid opposition. Morton and Hine have been handy additions in the absence of Jason Williams.

The Burras will thrive on the challenge of playing under lights and aim to take revenge against the Redbacks at the same venue it has faced off for the last two premiership bouts.

Wallan v Woodend/Hesket

The Pies took on the best that Melton Centrals could throw at them before winning by 15-points at home. The Hawks stormed away in the second half to defeat Rockbank by 129-points at Ian Cowie Reserve.

Dan Nolan was the go to man up forward for the Pies last week. He starred with five goals. The Pies had nine players share 16 goals and kicked with great accuracy against the Centrals.

Wallan book-ended the game with 13 goals in the first and last terms. Despite the six goal avalanche

in the final term, their backline leaked five goals. Damien Korp showed great pace and ability that fans at Greenhill Reserve know he can serve up.

The Hawks welcomed the return of one of their favourites, Luke Macklin. He gathered plenty of the ball. Jordan Filakis and Josh Smerdon kicked 13 of 16 second half goals to be a force up forward.

Woodend/Hesket started slowly against a determined Rockbank outfit before kicking away in the second half, their best in quite some time.

The two club's changed fixtures to cater for Greenhill's poor conditions later in the year. Expect both clubs to come out firing. This is an important win for either side who will be working towards fighting for a place in the finals.

Woodend/Hesket must win this game to have any chance in the finals as Macedon, Sunbury Kangaroos, Riddell and Diggers Rest await them in the next month. Wallan have winnable games against Rockbank and Lancefield in that time.

Lancefield v Rockbank

The Tigers went down swinging against Diggers Rest, going down by 49-points. Rockbank is eager to fight back after a heavy loss to Woodend/Hesket at home by 129-points.

Lancefield battled strongly last week against Diggers Rest who kicked away early. They didn't let the margin grow and kept up with their highly fancied opponents in the second half.

Matt Bowden was at his best while Myles Dorman and Nathan Malone kicked two goals each. Cam Wight was the best big man on the ground, controlling the ruck with great confidence.

Alan Greenwood was a stand-out for the Rams in the loss to the Hawks. He was a brilliant user of the ball and showed great inspiration. Jai Teal and John Donker tried hard.

Rockbank held the Hawks to five goals in the first half, something that coach Gavin Sporle can be proud of and draw confidence from.

Lancefield will be eager to bounce back from its loss to the Burras. Kent kicked six goals in the opening round, the same number he kicked against the Rams in this fixture back in round three last year.

This is Lancefield's opportunity to secure a big percentage boosting win, although it won't be easy as Rockbank will showcase areat flaht.

Broadford v Riddell

going down by 43-points. Riddell stepped up against the Redbacks and won in style by 112-points.

Broadford's recruits Cam Dawson (Romsey) and Tevita Fonua (Lancefield) showed potential in the loss to Sunbury. Grant Wearne was a stand-out while Josh Pound was at his brilliant best.

Broadford's start to the season under the coaching reigns of Helmers/Bray hasn't been what it has been expected. An 11-goal loss to the Cats and seven goal loss to Sunbury has left the team in unchartered waters after many had the injury hit Roos as their favourite to win the premiership.

The Bombers flexed their muscles with confidence against reigning premiers Romsey. Jason Allen covered the absence of James Nolan at centre half forward and was a key to many goals as a great play maker.

Ruffell kicked 10 goals and set up a number of others. Ben Said proved handy up forward with four goals while Michael and Paul Sahlberg rotated well out of the midfield and up forward.

Fans would have pencilled this game as one of the best matches in the first half of the season. The Roos sent the Bombers crashing out of the finals race last year and looked to have improve their list.

Fast-forward to round three, Broadford has suffered two big losses and the Bombers have played seven quarters of brilliant football with no sign of slowing down.

It is scary that the Bombers kicked 24 goals last week without Nolan in the team. Broadford did well to contain James Barnes (two goals) but can they contain two key forwards.

Expect this game to be physical from the opening bounce and a hungry Broadford team eager to register its first win of the season.

Melton Centrals v Macedon

The Centrals threw the kitchen sink at Wallan but just fell short by 15-points on the road at Greenhil Reserve. The Cats kicked the last six goals of the game to defeat Rupertswood in an Anzac Day classic.

James Aquilina was the hero for the Centrals last week with 7.1. The silky small forward was hard to stop in his best game. Matt Gilmore had high hopes of replicating his round one success but was held goalless.

Centrals fans saw vintage Craig Harvey at his brilliant best in the midfield as he teamed up wel with Jared Scott and Rex Hickman. There was a lot to like about their endeavour to stay in the contest. Macedon showed great grit and admiration in its win over Rupertswood. After trailing by 28-points late in the third quarter, they stormed home to win by eight-points.

Matt Knox was well held by Nash Egan but James 'Nipper' Wright stepped up in his place in the final term with three goals.

Teghan Henderson was unbeatable in the backline and the key to many forward thrusts. Tom Waters dominated in the ruck after half-time while Josh Clough showed some silky smooth skills through the midfield.

The Cats head to Arnold's Creek with a great advantage. The ground is a touch bigger than Tony Clarke and the Cats use the open spaces of that ground to advantage.

Macedon's form is great and the Centrals will be determined to take the game up to them. The battle between Gilmore and Henderson will be a classic. Whoever wins here can go a long way to setting themselves up for the rest of the season.

Rupertswood v Sunbury Kangaroos

The Sharks led Macedon for the majority of the game before slipping in the final few minutes to go down by eight-points. The Sunbury Kangaroos took on the best that Broadford could offer before winning by seven goals.

Brent Swallows was nothing short of inspiring in his effort on Anzac Day, taking out the award for most courageous player. Nash Egan held in-form forward Matt Knox goalless and Nathan Caldone was incredible across half-back, proving to be a great play maker and user of the ball.

Dylan and Todd Podolczak showed flair up forward while Kaufmann was a handy presence. The big problem with the Sharks is injuries with a number of players going down late in the game.

Sunbury Kangaroos were polished in its win over Broadford. Ryan Pretty kicked four goals and brother, Jared kicked three goals. James Barnes kicked two while Zane Williams was a stand-out through the midfield.

This could be the best match of the round. This is a great rivalry between two strong sides. The Roos are rebuilding nicely under returning coach Dixon while Fitzgerald is more than handy in the coaches box for the Sharks.

The key to this contest is fitness and player availability. Both teams are evenly matched with their talent and this will definitely go down to the wire.



RDFNL JUNIOR COMPETITION UPDATE

Junior Coach & Umpire Forum

On Wednesday April 20th, we held a follow up session of the Junior Coach and Umpire Forum, as a result of low participation levels at the initial forum on March 23rd. It was pleasing to see a significant increase in the number of our Junior Coaches who attend the follow up.

Joining us from the Umpires Panel were our Junior Umpire Coaches, Billy Mitchell and Harley Darmanin, who ran through a series of rule changes impacting the junior competition, and in some cases specific to the modified rules in the Under 10 age division. There were a number of questions for Billy and Harley, and feedback received in subsequent days was that it was most beneficial in having them come along and speak.

One of the key aspects of Junior Coaching, is the ability to send the right message to the young individuals throughout the team, and this was a theme that was regularly presented during the evening. We stress that coaches at junior level are very respectful of umpires,

and lead by example at all times. If we have junior coaches yelling abuse at an umpire from the sidelines, then it's highly likely this will rub off onto some of the players. By comparison, coaches who don't condone this type of behaviour, either from the junior players themselves, or other parents/officials on the sidelines, will be sending the right message to their playing group.

The remainder of the meeting looked at Junior coaching philosophies. At junior level, the emphasis needs to be on player development, over and above what happens on the score board. Tactics used at senior level such as tagging, flooding and zoning, are discouraged, with more emphasis placed upon the rotation of players into different parts of the ground, and attempting to make sure the same few players do not dominate every quarter of every match.

The forum closed with a look at our upcoming Interleague program, and more information will follow on that topic in the coming weeks.

AFL GOLDFIELDS CYBERSAFETY POLICY



Rationale

AFL Goldfields has an obligation to maintain a safe physical and emotional environment for our affiliated leagues, their league officials, staff, registered players, umpires, coaches, club members, parents, spectators and sponsors.

This responsibility is increasingly being linked to the use of the Internet and Information & Communication Technologies (ICT), and has seen the emergence of a number of related Cybersafety issues. The Internet and ICT devices/equipment bring great benefits to all users and to the effective operation of the AFL Victoria, individual leagues and clubs.

AFL Goldfields places a high priority on the acceptable use of ICT devices/equipment which will benefit members however; it recognises that the presence in the sporting arena of these technologies can also facilitate anti-social, inappropriate, and even illegal behaviour and activities. AFL Goldfields aims, therefore, to maximise the benefits of these technologies, while at the same time to minimise the dangers and manage the risks.

Policy

The AFL Goldfields Cyber Safety Policy applies across the Ballarat FNL, Central Highlands FL, Riddell District FNL, Maryborough Castlemaine District FNL, and their affiliated Clubs.

This policy does include all Club, League and AFL Goldfields staff, along with all registered players, umpires, coaches, club members, parents, spectators and sponsors.

AFL Goldfields, its affiliated Leagues and their member clubs will develop and maintain rigorous and effective Cybersafety practices which aim to maximise the benefits of the Internet and ICT and allow for the effective operation of the Leagues and Clubs across the AFL Goldfields Region, whilst minimising and managing any risks.

These Cybersafety practices will aim to not only maintain a cyber safe sporting environment but also to address the needs of the league officials and club members to receive education about the safe and responsible use of present and developing information and communication technologies.

Associated issues that AFL Goldfields will address include the need for relevant education about Cybersafety for the Leagues and their members clubs, the need for ongoing funding for Cybersafety practices through inclusion in the annual budget, implications for the design and delivery of the cybersafety program, the professional development and training, disciplinary responses to breaches of the cybersafety policy and the availability of appropriate professional support.

AFL Goldfields takes seriously its responsibility in providing robust policy, guidelines and education for its members in relation to what is deemed acceptable and appropriate online behaviours. AFL Goldfields, its affiliated Leagues, clubs (and their motto, crest, logo and/or uniform) must not be used in any way which would result in a negative impact for the league or club and its members. Affiliated Leagues and Clubs of AFL Goldfields have a responsibility to ensure that all online communications are in keeping with the leagues expectations in relation to appropriate and respectful interactions with officials, coaches, umpires, players, parents, spectators and sponsors. Players will not post inappropriate comments about individual AFL Goldfields or League officials. umpires, players, club or club members; which if said in person during the playing of a game would result in disciplinary action being taken.

"Cyber bullying is a way of delivering covert psychological bullying. It uses information and communication technologies to support deliberate, repeated and hostile behaviour, by an individual or group that is intended to harm others." (Belsey 2007)

Cyber bullying includes, but is not limited to, the following misuses of technology:

harassing, teasing, intimidating, racially vilifying or threatening another person by sending or posting inappropriate and hurtful e-mail messages, instant messages, text messages, phone messages, digital pictures or images, or Web site postings (including social network sites eg facebook or blogs) and the sending, receiving and/or possession of naked or sexually explicit images of a person. Club members must also be aware that postings from their individual accounts, whether done by themselves or another person will remain the responsibility of the account owner.





AFL GOLDFIELDS CYBERSAFETY POLICY

AFL Goldfields, its affiliated Leagues and individual clubs must be aware that in certain circumstances where a crime has been committed, they may also be subjected to a criminal investigation by Police over which the league and/or club will have no control. This particularly applies to 'sexting' where the image is of a person under the age of 18 years whereby Police will be informed immediately a club becomes aware of the situation.

This policy applied to all the AFL Goldfields affiliated Leagues, along with their Netball competitions – excluding the Central Highlands Netball Association.

Procedure

AFL Goldfields or league officials, staff, registered players, umpires, coaches, club members, parents, spectators and sponsors who feel that they have been the victims of such misuses of technology should save and store the offending material on their computer, mobile phone or other device. They should then print a copy of the material and immediately report the incident to the relevant club/league representative.

All reports of cyber bullying and other technology misuses will be reported to the AFL Goldfields Regional General Manager or applicable League Operations Manager.

AFL Goldfields or its affiliated League will investigate the matter, and where it believes a breach of the Cyber Safety Policy may have occurred AFL Goldfields or the applicable League may, after considering the evidence and following discussion with both Clubs and with League officials, offer a sanction to the offender/s. Should this sanction be accepted by the offender/s the sanction will be applied immediately and the sanction entered into the players Tribunal history. Where it considers it to be required, AFL Goldfields or the applicable League may notify the Police of the incident.

Should the sanction not be accepted, AFL Goldfields or the applicable League will investigate the matter in accordance with the Investigation Procedure as set out in the AFL Victoria Country By Laws and the allegations will be forwarded to the AFL Goldfields Investigation Officer. Where considered appropriate, AFL Goldfields may also refer the matter to the Police where AFL Goldfields, the League or club is legally obliged to do so, or considers it appropriate.

If AFL Victoria or the AFL Commission or its staff receives a complaint about an online issue, the allegations will be forwarded to the Regional General Manager or League Operations Manager for assessment and further action. If the matter is referred to the Investigations Officer and if he considers there is evidence to support claims of a breach of this policy, charges will be laid and the complaint will proceed to the AFL Goldfields Independent Tribunal, exactly the same as if the investigation relates to physical violence or other reportable offences.

Penalties

Any proven charges will automatically lead to a minimum of a two (2) match suspension for a registered player. In deciding the final penalty, consideration will be given to the seriousness of the act, the impact on the victim, the impact on the club/league/AFL Victoria and the prior good history or otherwise of the player.

Players charged with these types of offences for a second or subsequent time and where a suspension has been previously imposed will face deregistration.

Any player presented before the tribunal for the first or subsequent time on a cyber bullying offence must be aware that the penalties available to the tribunal members will cover the complete range including deregistration.

In the case of a non-playing club member being proved to have engaged in harassment or bullying, the club employing, engaging or otherwise associated with the person at the time of the conduct shall be deemed to be vicariously liable for the conduct of the person and shall pay to the League a penalty to be determined by the league.

Important terms used in this document:

- (a) The abbreviation `ICT' in this document refers to the term `Information, Communication and Technologies.
- (b) 'Cybersafety' refers to the safe and responsible use of the Internet and ICT equipment/devices, including mobile phones
- (c) The term 'ICT equipment/devices' used in this document, includes but is not limited to, computers (such as desktops, laptops, PDAs), storage devices (such as USB and flash memory devices, CDs, DVDs, floppy disks, IPods, MP3 players), cameras (such as video, digital, webcams), all types of mobile phones, video and audio players/receivers (such as portable CD and DVD players), Gaming Consoles, and any other, similar, technologies as they come into use.
