# Exciting time in women's football

**The future is bright in women's football and full of opportunities.**

Over the last week the next generation of female footballers have taken to the field in the annual Youth Girls National Championships. The Grand Final was played Friday night as a curtain-raiser to the Richmond vs Hawthorn AFL game at the MCG, and fingers crossed we saw a Victorian team holding aloft the Championship trophy at the end of the game.

Whatever the result though, in a few years' time names like Katherine Smith, Izzy Huntington, Georgina Walker and Lily Mithen are likely to be names we hear called on a regular basis at venues like the MCG in the national women's league.

Anticipation has been at fever pitch over recent weeks with AFL clubs confirming their intentions to apply for a licence, with an AFL women's competition set to kick off in early 2017. Submissions closed at the end of April and it was pleasing to see the coverage given to the host of applications in the lead-up to the deadline.

Victoria will field the most teams of any state, which will be just reward for those local players that have been on show, with players like Maddy Boyd and Ellie Blackburn – who only a few years ago were themselves representing Victoria at the Youth Girls Championships – perfect examples of the new talent pathway.

# Senior Lion Saad steps up

Ahmed Saad certainly isn't old – he's only 26 – but his experiences in football and his young new teammates at Coburg are making him feel like an elder statesman of the Peter Jackson VFL.



The former St Kilda goalsneak arrived at the Lions this season after a rollercoaster last four years. He played 33 games for the Saints in 2012-13 and 2015, missing the 2014 season after being suspended for consuming a banned substance contained in an energy drink.

To Saad, it seems like only yesterday when he was starring for the Northern Blues (then Bullants) in 2011, kicking 50 goals and winning the Fothergill-Round Medal for the VFL's best player under 23.

"Thinking about it now, it's all happened pretty quickly from when I first got drafted to being banned to being delisted last year," Saad said earlier.

"I've learned a lot about myself.

"I didn't have any worries (playing at Northern). I was still living at home, working, studying and still young. There wasn't a lot of responsibility other than playing footy for the sake of playing footy and trying to get drafted.

"Now there's a lot more pressure. You grow up and there's a lot more responsibility. It's a totally different ball game now than when I started."

Saad always knew he had the competitiveness and resilience he required to make a return to the AFL after serving his ban, achieved when the Saints rookie-listed him at the end of 2014.

But his experiences at St Kilda taught him a new skill – how to be a leader. It's a responsibility the veteran of 65 VFL games now relishes and one he'll be able to put to use in the wider community after this week being announced as a VFL Multicultural Ambassador, reprising a similar position he held in his time as an AFL player.

Meanwhile, Saad is already fulfilling an unofficial leadership role for his teammates at Coburg.

"I heard it was a young list and that I could play a role as one of the leaders and try to help out as much as I can by passing on some of my experience," Saad said. "It just fit what I wanted. I care about helping; I want to help people improve.

"This is a great opportunity to help my leadership skills and maybe even help me progress to become a coach later on. If I can help those younger guys or the good players that are close to getting drafted

just one or two or three per cent and they can get drafted from that, then I'd get a lot of satisfaction.

"That's probably the first time I'm speaking this way in terms of being at a footy club.

"I'm only 26 but I think we've got 40 or 50 players on the list that are first or second-year players in the VFL system. I'm pretty much going in as one of the older guys and that's been very rare for me."

Saad has certainly needed to step up, with sizeable holes left at Piranha Park by the off-season departures of seven-year captain Nick Carnell, three-time best and fairest winner Daniel Venditti and midfield stalwart Ben Clifton.

He's fielding plenty of questions from the young Lion cubs, working closely with 2015 VFL Team of the Year midfielder Ozgur Uysal, last year's club leading goalkicker Dan Younan and small forward Josh Cauchi.

"They ask a lot of questions," Saad said. "Every time they need help, they ask.

"I speak to them about how to be a bit more professional and they ask: 'What steps can we take playing VFL footy to improve so we can take that next step and play AFL?'

"That's something I can relate to because I got drafted playing in the VFL."

Despite midfield time seemingly up for grabs following the departures of Carnell, Venditti and Clifton, Saad said senior coach Peter German saw him pri-

marily as an answer to Coburg's scoring woes, with the Lions ranked ahead of only Frankston for points scored in 2015.

Saad has certainly held up his end of the bargain so far, topping the league goalkicking table with 14 majors from four games despite the Lions remaining winless.

"They recruited me as a forward because they needed an extra two or three goals a game to be able to match the top eight and make finals," Saad said.

"I'll be playing in the forward line, going on the wing a little bit and going inside (the midfield contests) as well... But my strength is definitely as a forward line player."

Saad holds out hope of returning to the elite level and said he misses being in a professional AFL environment. But for the time being, he's happy to channel the feeling of those early years at Northern where it all began in 2009.

"Footy can get taken away pretty quickly and I realised that twice," Saad said. "It got taken away from me with the ban and got taken away by me getting delisted.

"I just mainly want to go out this year and enjoy my footy again. It's been a long couple of years; I just want to have fun."

# Peters' pain now in the past

Calder Cannons mid-forward James Peters last year suffered a lower leg injury that sent him into shock right then and there on the football field.



Peters, now 18, jumped up in a marking contest against the Eastern Ranges in Round 3 of the 2015 TAC Cup season and came down awkwardly – very awkwardly.

“I’m a bit blurry on what actually happened, but I went up in the marking contest then fell down and looked at my leg, and it was a bit sideways,” Peters said.

I dislocated my ankle and separated two leg bones. I had a fracture in my fibula and tore a couple of ligaments as well.

Peters was invited back to Calder as an over-age player in 2016 and the fact he has now played in four games this season is remarkable given the state he was in only 12 months ago.

“At first I thought I might have pulled a muscle in my lower leg like my Achilles or something, and then saw my ankle and sort of went into shock straight away,” Peters said.

“It just felt fake. It was a very weird feeling – almost as if it was a dream. You look down and you don’t know what to do, but luckily all the trainers were there and they really helped me out a lot.”

The Aberfeldie junior had never suffered a serious injury before and while dealing with the initial shock was difficult, coming to terms with the longer-term consequences was something else altogether.

“At first I was quite down to be honest,” Peters said. You just think the worst – that the dream’s over.

“I just didn’t really know where to go from there but Mum and Dad were really helpful, as well as my sisters. They kept me in a positive mindset for the first few weeks and then I was all good.”

Peters said staying involved with his club was

crucial in keeping him positive about the situation. He would attend Calder training sessions as often as possible and relished seeing some of his mates playing well as the Cannons made it to an elimination final.

A guarantee from Talent Manager Ian Kyte also put Peters’ mind at ease.

“Kyte said early last year: ‘Just get your ankle right and you can play again next year’, so I knew pretty early on I was going to play (in 2016),” Peters said.

“That was really good for me; I could focus on just getting the ankle right.

“It doesn’t hurt any more so it’s time to move on I guess.”

On exposed form this year, Peters has certainly left his injury in the past. After returning to the Calder team in Round 2, the 180cm dynamo has used his agility, pace and nous around goal to great effect.

Playing in a forward role and rotating through the midfield, Peters kicked six goals in three matches and averaged 18 disposals, five marks, four clearances and four tackles per game before suffering a broken jaw in the first quarter of the Cannons’ win against the Gippsland Power last week.

He’ll sit out at least the next month of football with the injury, but said the simple enjoyment of physically being able to run out onto the field again had contributed to his good form to start the year.

“You almost don’t appreciate it enough when you’re playing until you have a long-term injury and you realise how much fun you’re having with your mates,” Peters said.

“There’s nothing much better I think.”





# Country to city, Pios to Pies



Marty Hore is as country as Victorian football players come – he grew up on his family's dairy farm in Cohuna, a town close to the NSW border north of Bendigo with a population of around 2000.

But after impressing as a 19-year-old with the Bendigo Pioneers last year, Hore has moved to Melbourne to take up an offer to play with Collingwood – the nation's biggest football club – in its Peter Jackson VFL team.

The attacking half back/wingman has played all four matches for the VFL Magpies as their 23rd player in 2016, averaging 15 disposals and five marks per game.

The 20-year-old is justifying the efforts of his new senior coach Dale Tapping, who took it upon himself to convince Hore to make the move south.

"Dale Tapping was pretty keen to get me there – he was ringing me a bit," Hore said.

"They only select a certain few players they want to bring in each year. They don't bring in a heap of kids straight out of the TAC Cup and I was one of the select few he wanted.

"He didn't say he had a spot for me in the side, he just thought it'd be good for me and my development – being under their eyes a bit."

Hore has likely opened plenty of eyes already this season. He was one of Collingwood's best players in the club's ANZAC Day eve loss to Essendon for his 18 disposals (17 kicks), seven marks and four inside-50s.

Those stats give an indication about how wiry 189cm Hore likes to play. He says his precise, raking boot is one of his biggest footballing strengths.

"I've played on the wing a little bit and back flank (with the Magpies), trying to use my leg to hit targets in the forward 50," Hore said.

"I like to attack as a defender but I think I'm pretty good at defending too, so I try to keep the balance right – defend when I have to and run off when I can.

"My intercept marking is probably coming along a bit now too. I'm getting heaps better at reading the ball."

In those veins, Hore takes inspiration from the likes of relentlessly attacking Port Adelaide backman Jasper Pittard and Essendon's defensive intercept specialist Cale Hooker.

He's still working on his speed and endurance though, perhaps legacies of his humble football beginnings as a junior at Leitchville-Gunbower back home.

Hore said his first taste of TAC Cup football in 2014 with the Bendigo Pioneers was "a big step up" from where he'd been playing.

"At Bendigo I learnt about how hard you've got to work to make it," Hore said.

"I got invited to try out and training was pretty hard, but I chipped away at it and ended up making the list. I played in my top-age year and probably wasn't as developed as I am now so I struggled a bit.

"When I got invited back (last year) as a 19-year-old, I got to be a bit of a leader and stand up. I was one of the main backmen in the group and it was really good."

Hore averaged 19 disposals across 15 games in 2015, kicking the ball almost five times as much as he handballed it. He finished second in Bendigo's best and fairest award behind Collingwood teammate Lachie Tardrew, whose presence has helped Hore settle into Melbourne, where he's working as a cabinet maker.

Hore says he'll probably move back to the family farm once his footy career in Melbourne is over – but the way it's progressing, that may not be any time soon.

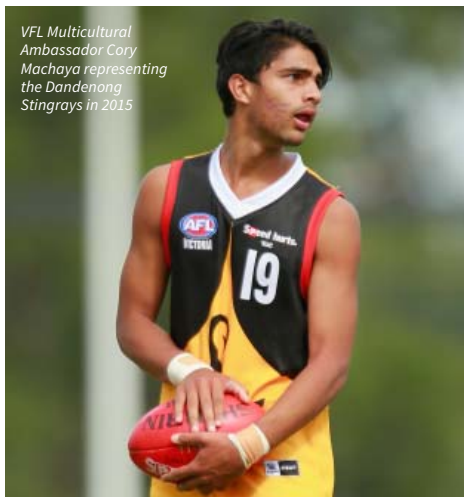

Faced with a 10-point three-quarter-time deficit, Uni kicked four goals to nil in the final term to win by 18 points and cement their pace atop the VFL Women's ladder.

Melbourne Uni coach Andrew Jago paid credit to one group in particular after the final term comeback.

"Obviously our fitness staff are doing their job," Jago quipped.

"We didn't handle the wind well at all, but it was good to see our lesser lights stand out, as well as Catherine O'Bryan. (She was) best on for mine; she's the ultimate team player."

In other Round 4 games:

- Seaford recorded its first VFL Women's win for the season with a 20-point victory over Geelong. In a close tussle all game, three goals to Emma Hall proved the difference.

- Darebin started strongly against St Kilda, establishing a 34-point quarter-time lead with a five-goal-to-nil first term. While the Sharks kept the Falcons to just one goal after quarter time, they were unable to peg back the sizable deficit at the first break, losing by 17 points in Moana Hope's 200th game.

- Cranbourne put a scare through the Diamond Creek camp in Round 4, leading by 18 points at half time. But in captain Steph Chiocci's 150th game, the Creekers fought back in the second half by kicking nine goals to nil to run out 46-point winners.

## Round 5 Highlights

### Cannons and Knights break the duck

**After four losses each to start the season, the Calder Cannons and Northern Knights notched their first victories in Round 5.**

**Calder** faced the **Gippsland Power** at Morwell Recreation Reserve in a battle between two winless clubs with plenty of pride on the line.

‘The Cannons were the only ones to fire early though, with five goals in the first quarter from Karl Brown setting up a 25-point advantage that extended to 43 at half time. Gippsland fought back with four goals to one in the third term, but Calder steadied powerfully after three-quarter time to win by 52 points and leave the Power in last position on the ladder.

**Northern** also got on the board against **Tasmania** at Preston City Oval. Like the Cannons, the Knights did the damage early, keeping the Mariners scoreless in the opening stanza.

Northern established a 41-point lead at quarter time in sunny conditions before rain hit and Tasmania – fielding its youngest team on record – started working its way back into the contest. The visitors kicked six goals to two in the second half and got to within 12 points of the Knights in the last term, but faded to lose by 18 points and bow out of the TAC Cup for 2016 without a win.

The **Northern Territory** also left the competition for this year on the weekend, but instead claimed an impressive victory by five points over the **Oakleigh Chargers** at Warrawee Park.

The Territorians looked home holding a 24-point lead over the reigning premiers at three-quarter time, but a four-goal burst remarkably put the Chargers in front before NT steadied with the match-winning major. The loss was Oakleigh’s second of the season.

The **Murray Bushrangers** and **Sandringham Dragons** played out 2016’s first draw at Norm Minns Oval, with the Dragons paying for their inaccuracy in front of goal.

Sandringham had five more scoring shots than Murray, and in fact kicked four goals straight in the last quarter to come back from a six-point three-quarter-time deficit, but could only split the points. The tie means the Bushrangers are still undefeated in second spot just ahead of the Dragons.

The only team above them on the ladder is the **Dandenong Stingrays**, who claimed their fifth win of the season against the **Western Jets** at an extremely windy Burbank Oval on Sunday.

Both sides failed to score while kicking against the wind in the first half, but Dandenong used the conditions in the first term to establish a 21-point lead that Western never got near. The Jets eventually lost by 54 points and fell to a 1-4 record.

In Round 5’s other matches, the **Geelong Falcons** moved ahead of the **Eastern Ranges** into the top four with a 22-point win over last year’s runners-up at Avalon Airport Oval, while the **North Ballarat Rebels** claimed a 70-point victory over the **Bendigo Pioneers** at Eureka Stadium on the back of a huge 10-goal third quarter.

## Big bag for Brown

**Calder Cannons forward Karl Brown has repaid the club's faith in him with a match-winning nine-goal haul against the Gippsland Power in Round 5.**

Brown was invited back to Calder as an over-age player this year following an enigmatic 2015 season, and was a key factor in the Cannons notching their first victory of 2016 on Saturday. The 193cm Essendon Dousta Stars junior booted five majors in the first term at Morwell Recreation Reserve to help his team open up a match-defining lead.

Brown demonstrated his goalkicking ability last year with 36 goals in 11 TAC Cup games, including bags of eight and six. Talent Manager Ian Kyte said Brown had turned things around ahead of his second year in Calder's program.

"He's lost about 15kg over the two years and is now looking like he might fulfil that potential he showed in previous years but probably wasn't working as hard as he could," Kyte said earlier in 2016.

"I think Karl will be one who'll be talked about by people as the year goes on."

### 10 TAC Cup players in NSW/ACT U18 squad

**Division 2 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships kicks off this weekend and several TAC Cup players will represent the NSW/ACT Rams over the next three weeks.**

10 members of the Rams squad of 28 are playing in the TAC Cup in 2015, including seven Murray Bushrangers, two Bendigo Pioneers and one Sandringham Dragon.

The Bushrangers will lose a significant amount of talent for Rounds 6 and 7 as NSW/ACT battles with Queensland, the Northern Territory and Tasmania for Division 2 honours.

Murray will be without Fletcher Carroll, Ryan Garthwaite, Max Lynch, Todd Marshall, Alex Paech, Charlie Spargo and Zachary Sproule, Bendigo will lose Jarrod Brander and Kobe Mutch, and Sandringham will miss the presence of Will Setterfield.

The Rams start their Championships campaign against Queensland at Blacktown on Sunday, before games against Tasmania at Blundstone Arena, Hobart (Saturday May 14) and NT at Metricon Stadium, Gold Coast (Sunday May 22).

### Country vs Metro round

**It'll be a battle between the bush and the 'burbs this weekend, as the six Country TAC Cup teams face off against their Metro rivals in Round 6.**

After Vic Country dominated the 2015 NAB AFL U18 Championships and Metro teams played off in last year's TAC Cup Grand Final, the 2016 ladder is well balanced between Country and Metro interests.

Three of the top four are Country teams (Dandenong Stingrays, Murray Bushrangers and Geelong Falcons), but the top eight is evenly divided between Country and Metro. This round might be the one to establish a pecking order.

## The Tigers' new stripes

**Werribee is undefeated to start the Peter Jackson VFL season and a lot of it has to do with how the Tigers are using the ball.**

Like AFL counterpart North Melbourne, Werribee is moving the ball quickly and with fluency, and has the forward-line firepower to capitalise on the scoreboard once it enters the attacking arc.

The Tigers are the top-ranked team in the competition for disposals and goals per game in 2016, which is in stark contrast to last year when they ranked second-last for disposals and eighth for goals per game. Werribee's 2015 campaign ended with defeat at the hands of Collingwood in an elimination final.

With the club embarking on a full alignment with the Kangaroos this season, senior coach John Lamont has taken one of the most exciting elements of the also-undefeated AFL team's game plan and applied it to his own squad – his troops are now utilising the handball with devastating effect.

There was something particularly static in the way Werribee moved the ball last year, ranking a clear last for handballs per game. However, the Tigers rank equal-second in that category through their three games so far this year and their kick-to-handball ratio has decreased markedly from 1.75-to-1 in 2015 to 1.28-to-1 in 2016.

Despite only sending the ball inside 50 the eighth-most times per game of any team this season, this slick ball movement means Werribee ranks a clear first for goals scored per inside 50 entry.

Versatile AFL-listed tall Mason Wood (seven goals) and Aaron Black (six), as well as small forward Robin Nahas (seven) have been the main beneficiaries of work up-field by the likes of Matt Hanson, Isaac Conway and Scott Sherlock (the club's top three for total handballs in 2016).

The Tigers illustrated the effectiveness of their game plan perfectly against Footscray at VU Whitten Oval last Saturday. While the Bulldogs generated 59 inside-50s, they could only manage 12 goals (an efficiency of 20 per cent). Werribee, though, scored 19 goals from 53 inside-50s at a rate of almost 36 per cent.

AFL fans would note the striking similarities to the manner of North Melbourne's impressive victory over the Western Bulldogs the previous night.



**42** Harrison Burt did everything he could to try to get the Sandringham Dragons over the line against the Murray Bushrangers, racking up 42 disposals – 15 more than the next highest disposal-winner on the ground. The Ormond product also had game highs in contested possessions (18) and clearances (11), but his Dragons could only manage to split the points with the Bushrangers.

**71** The wild conditions at Burbank Oval on Sunday meant plenty of stoppages in the Williamstown vs Port Melbourne match, and a bonanza for the stat lines of the teams' ruckmen. Seagulls big man Nick Meese recorded an incredible 71 hitouts, while the Borough's Khan Haretuku had 40. However, unfortunately for Meese, Port Melbourne still generated three more clearances than the home team.

**105** The key to the Geelong Falcons' victory over the Eastern Ranges was in their slick ball movement. Eastern had one more mark than Geelong for the match but the Falcons had 118 more disposals. That was on the back of the winners clearly being more willing to move the ball on quickly, recording similar kick numbers but 105 more handballs than the Ranges.

## Hanners heads Rd 6 milestones

**One of the brightest stars in football, former Oakleigh Chargers midfielder Dan Hannebery, celebrated his 150th AFL match for Sydney in Round 6.**

Hannebery, 25, had 33 disposals, 13 tackles, six clearances and six inside-50s in a commanding performance in the club's three-point win against Brisbane.

The Kew Rovers junior was selected by the Swans with pick no.30 in the 2008 NAB AFL Draft and won the NAB AFL Rising Star award shortly after in 2010. He went on to star in Sydney's 2012 Grand Final triumph over Hawthorn before earning All Australian selection in 2013 and 2015.

Hannebery has developed into one of the toughest and most prolific midfielders in the competition, leading the AFL for total disposals during the 2015 home-and-away season.

Another ex-**Oakleigh Chargers** midfielder, Adelaide's **David Mackay**, also played his 150th game in Round 6. Mackay, 27, had 22 disposals and five tackles in the club's 33-point victory over Fremantle.

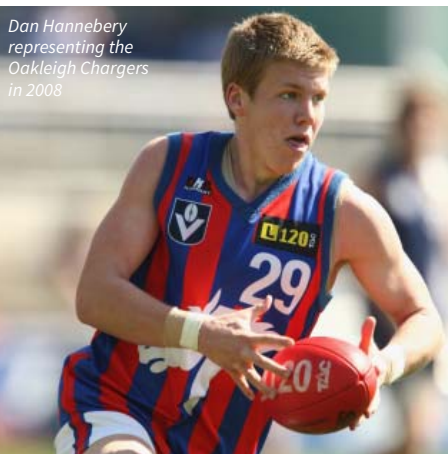
The Trinity Grammar junior was taken by the Crows at pick no.48 in the 2006 AFL Draft and has struggled to cement his place in Adelaide's senior team at times during his career. However, Mackay is excelling under new coach Don Pyke in 2016, having added a harder element to his ability outside the contest.

Former **Sandringham Dragons** ruckman **Stefan Martin**, 29, brought up his 100-game milestone in Brisbane's loss to Sydney with 13 disposals, five marks and 28 hitouts.

The junior basketballer was originally selected by Melbourne with pick no.3 in the 2007 Pre-Season Draft and played 57 games with the Demons before being traded to the Lions ahead of the 2013 season. Martin has become one of the game's premier mobile ruckmen and was a joint-winner of Brisbane's 2015 best and fairest award.

Ex-**Geelong Falcons** mid-forward **Luke Dahlhaus**, 23, was another to notch 100 AFL games in Round 6, recording 28 disposals, six clearances, six tackles and a goal in the Western Bulldogs' 16-point loss to North Melbourne.

The Leopold junior arrived at Whitten Oval via pick no.22 in the 2010 Rookie Draft after being selected in that year's TAC Cup Team of the Year. He was soon upgraded to the Bulldogs' senior list and has become one of the competition's most dynamic smalls, capable of winning the ball in the middle and doing damage in front of goal.

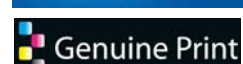
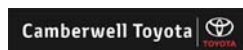
