SOCCER ROYALTY ALIVE IN OUR UNDER 13'S

Little did Hill Top Soccer Club know about the bloodlines of new Under 13's player Rachel Behan when she signed-up for her first season of soccer earlier this year. Not only did HTSC sign up an excellent young player, the club also now has in its playing ranks the descendent of a Manchester United football legend from the 1930's. The Squawk has learned that Rachel's great grandfather, William "Billy" Behan, was a world class goalkeeper throughout Europe in




the 1930's, plying his trade for Shelbourne and Shamrock Rovers in his native Ireland, before moving to Manchester United in 1934. After Billy retired he became a respected referee and was in charge of the 1943 FA Cup Final, before finishing up as Manchester United's Irish talent scout in the late 1950's. Billy passed away at the age of 80 in Nov 1991. Whilst not specialising in goals like her great grandfather, Rachel has made an excellent start to her career for the Kookaburra's, displaying a tough, no-nonsense approach on the football field, and impressing her coach Michael Gilkes with her dogged determination and willingness to stick to her opponent in all situations. Irish soccer's starmaker

IRISH Soccer last night lost one of its favourite sons when Billy Behan, player, referee, and famed Manchester United scout, died in a Dublin hospital.

He had celebrated his 80th birthday last August and his passing will be mourned by all who knew him.

Billy, a native of his beloved Ringsend, lived for football. His genial smile and gentle manner were a welcome sight at football matches in Dublin for decades.

A goalkeeper of imposing bulk and good reflexes, he joined Manchester United from Shamrock Rovers in the early Thirties. Although he played for United's first team on a number of occasions, he rejoined the Hoops in time to an FAI Senior Cup medal in 1936. He later tool: on reformance achiefs to

He later took up refereeing, which he personally regarded as his forte, despite hig success as a player and later as a scout.

success as a player and later as a scout. His first signing for United was the great Johnny Carey in 1937. From then on Behan, Matt Busby, and Manchester United were a formidable unit. Liam Whelan, Johnny Giles, Tony Dunne, Eamon Dunphy, Don Givens, Mick Martin, Gerry Daly, Ashley Grines, Kevin Moran, and Paul McGrath were all signed by Behan and went on to play for the Republic of Ireland.

Sir Matt Busby, the creator of the post-War Manchester United legend, led the tributes to his friend of more than 55 years.

"I am very sad to hear that Billy is gone. He was a great friend of mine and we shared many happy days together.

"Billy was a great judge of footballers

John Giles said: "It's sad news, I know John Giles said: "It's sad news. I knew Billy when I was a boy, as he was very friendly with my father. When he came to our house to sign me for Manchester United, he didn't have to ask twice. "Billy loved football, loved watching all those games he attended all over Dublin in the search for new talent. He had a marvellous instinct for what makes a good player and he was a lovely person." From Istanbul, Paul McGrath and Kevin Moran remembered with affection the ing kindly man who offered them the key to an undreamt of career in top class Soccer.

Said McGrath: "I'm shocked and saddened to hear about Billy's death. I owe everything to him."

Kevin Moran's horizons spanned no further than playing for Dublin's GAA team when Behan swooped to sign him alter seeing him play for Pegasus against Dundalk in the FAI Cup in 1978.

"He gave me an opportunity that I could not resist. I would have kicked myself if I had turned it down. I owe Billy so much, and he and his late wife Vera, were very good friends to me," said Moran.

Both players sent their condolences to Billy's family. On behalf of the sports staff of Independent Newspapers, we echo those sentimetric sentiments




