Matt Dunn Report

Kangaroos v Terang Mortlake

While it had been rather windy during the reserves, it turned into a perfect autumn evening for the second night fixture under lights at Melville Oval as we hosted Terang Mortlake, setting the scene for skills to be on display. In front of another huge crowd, our aim was to



carry the Anzac Day momentum we displayed in the last guarter at Portland into this game. Getting off to a great start controlling the play with good ball use, although in the first five minutes we unable to put our initial shots through the 'big sticks' Then Jack Sutherland received a gift for his 18th birthday, as he intercept a Terang pass fifteen metres out, which he slotted for full points giving us the start we were after. Later in the term our silky skilled new recruit Alroy Gilligan, 'laced' big Jack unmarked, again only twenty metres from goal. Our four goals to one in the opening term, gave us a handy 19 point lead. Our work rate through the midfield was matched by the back six who were right on top and the forwards, working as a unit and looking dangerous. The second quarter was the Paul Cox show, showing why he is so popular with the crowd; and more importantly with his teammates who love playing alongside him. Paul took a couple of 'ripping' marks; and when he wasn't kicking goals himself, 'Coxy was 'setting team mates up' Our forward line continued to perform, rewarding the efforts from further afield to post another six majors, giving us a 49 point lead at the main break. During the interval we highlighted the things that were working well for us, but mindful that Terang Mortlake would come back hard at some point. That's just what happened in the quarter as they threw everything at us, kicking the first six goals. Suddenly we were second to the ball and our work rate and other key indicators dropped off, until a late goal from Captain Hamish Waldron steadied us at the third term siren. Holding a 21 point lead, we used the three guarter time break; we discussed our falling away in intensity, all players we very aware of where we needed to improve. Two goals in the opening minutes got our momentum back; and halfway through the final term we took the opportunity to rest some of our experienced players. We came off with a rewarding thirty three point win; and some belief in what were are capable of if we have enough players wanting to take the game on, pressure the opposition and work hard for each other. Paul Cox and Sean Barnes were fantastic, along with a long list of names that played important roles, giving us victory over Terang Mortlake for the first time.

The strong support that the Hamilton Kangaroos have received from the community during the two night fixtures, will hopefully encourage other clubs to travel to Hamilton, for the experience of playing under the superb lights and in front of the huge crowds that create such a great atmosphere. After coming off two good wins, we headed to Cobden, who although they were sitting on the bottom of the ladder, had been more than competitive against strong opposition, so we knew it be a challenging trip for us. The Bombers were quick 'out of the blocks' Their pressure creating turnovers, which enabled them to gain clean entry into their forward line, making life difficult for our 'backs' At the first break Cobden led Six goals to five. The second guarter was a relatively even affair. We worked hard, but our opponents pressure was intense; and made us pay heavily for turnovers. To our boy's credit, we were really competitive and remained 'in the game', down by only four goals at half-time. The third team was again an even contest, we continued to run and 'take the game on' but we were unable to give ourselves enough forward fifty entries to put a score on the board. Similar to the first three quarters there was not much difference in general play during the final term, but luck was not on our side. Chiefly because of their strong start to the game, bigger bodies and cleaner entry into their forward line, Cobden ran out winners by 34 points. While we are disappointed in the result, we take confidence from the fact, that were we able to compete for the full four guarters. Now we look forward to hosting Warrnambool today at our home ground.
