

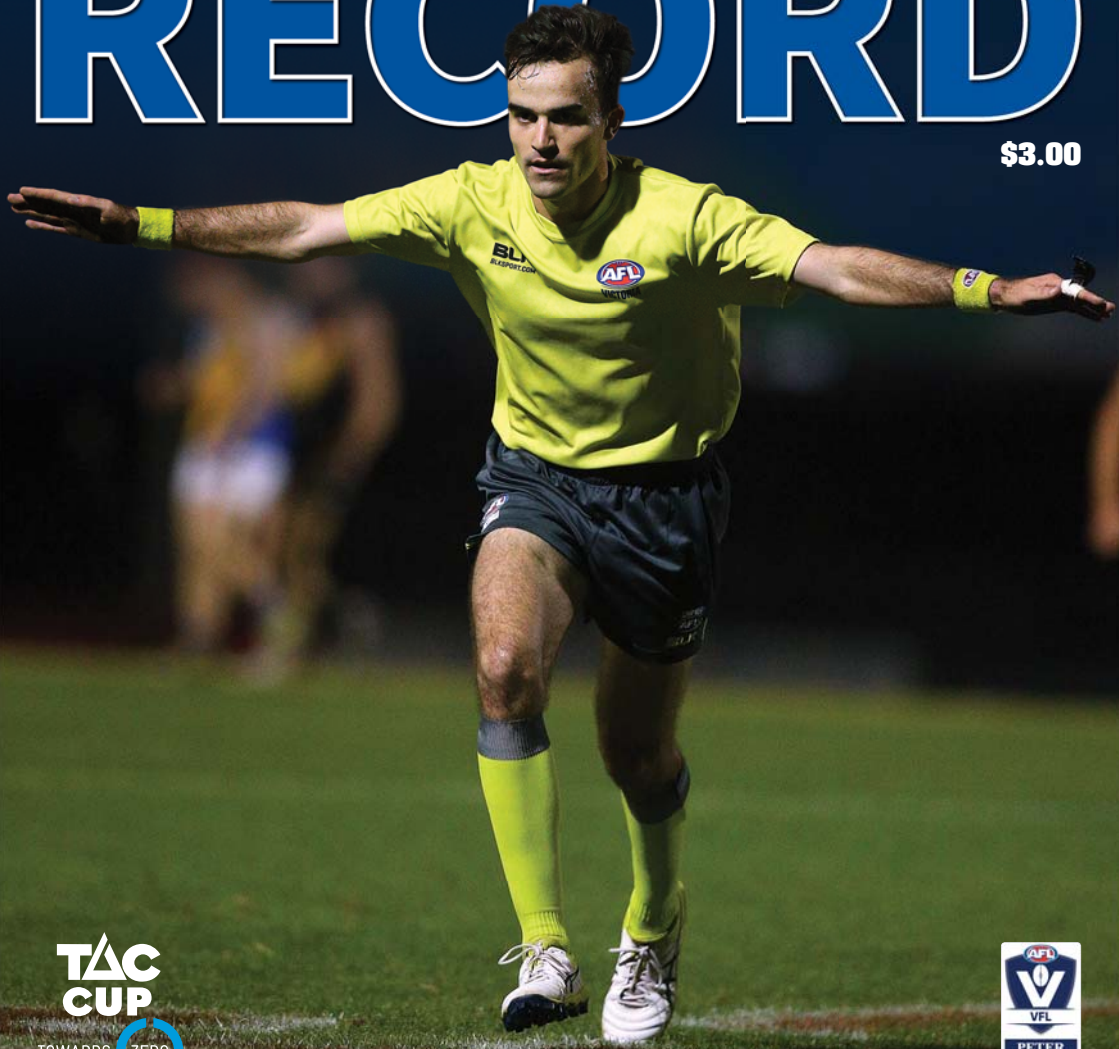

Umpire recognition as important as ever

Football leagues around Victoria will celebrate Community Umpiring Round this weekend.

Respect and appreciation for umpires should not just be recognised one round per season, but should be done every week. They do a great job controlling a game where the skill and speed continually increases, as do the demands on umpires.

Just like footballers, umpires are dedicated athletes whose preparation and passion for the game is unwavering.

And, just like footballers, AFL Victoria strives to provide a clearly defined pathway for umpires to progress their participation to the highest level.

Since 2013 there has been 15 umpires promoted to the AFL – five field, six boundary and four goal umpires.

That means that of the 32 AFL field umpires, 19 are Victorian (60 per cent), while close to 50 per cent of the 101 umpires on the 2016 AFL lists are also from our state. This is a great reflection of the hard work of our umpiring department, led by State league Umpiring Head Coach Cameron Nash.

As Cameron speaks about in this edition of the Record, a key focus over the last 18 months has been bridging the gap between community and state league umpiring.

The introduction of rookie squads has enabled promising local umpires to experience what it takes to reach the next level, exposed to the training standards and preparation needed to take the next step in their umpiring career.

Another positive aspect is the increase in our female umpiring numbers, with seven female umpires (three field, one boundary, three goal) now part of our squad.

It was pleasing last Sunday to watch the Channel 7 Peter Jackson VFL game and see Eleni Glouftsis officiating in the field along with Kate Griffiths in goals – a sight that will hopefully become more familiar not only in the VFL but in the AFL in the future.

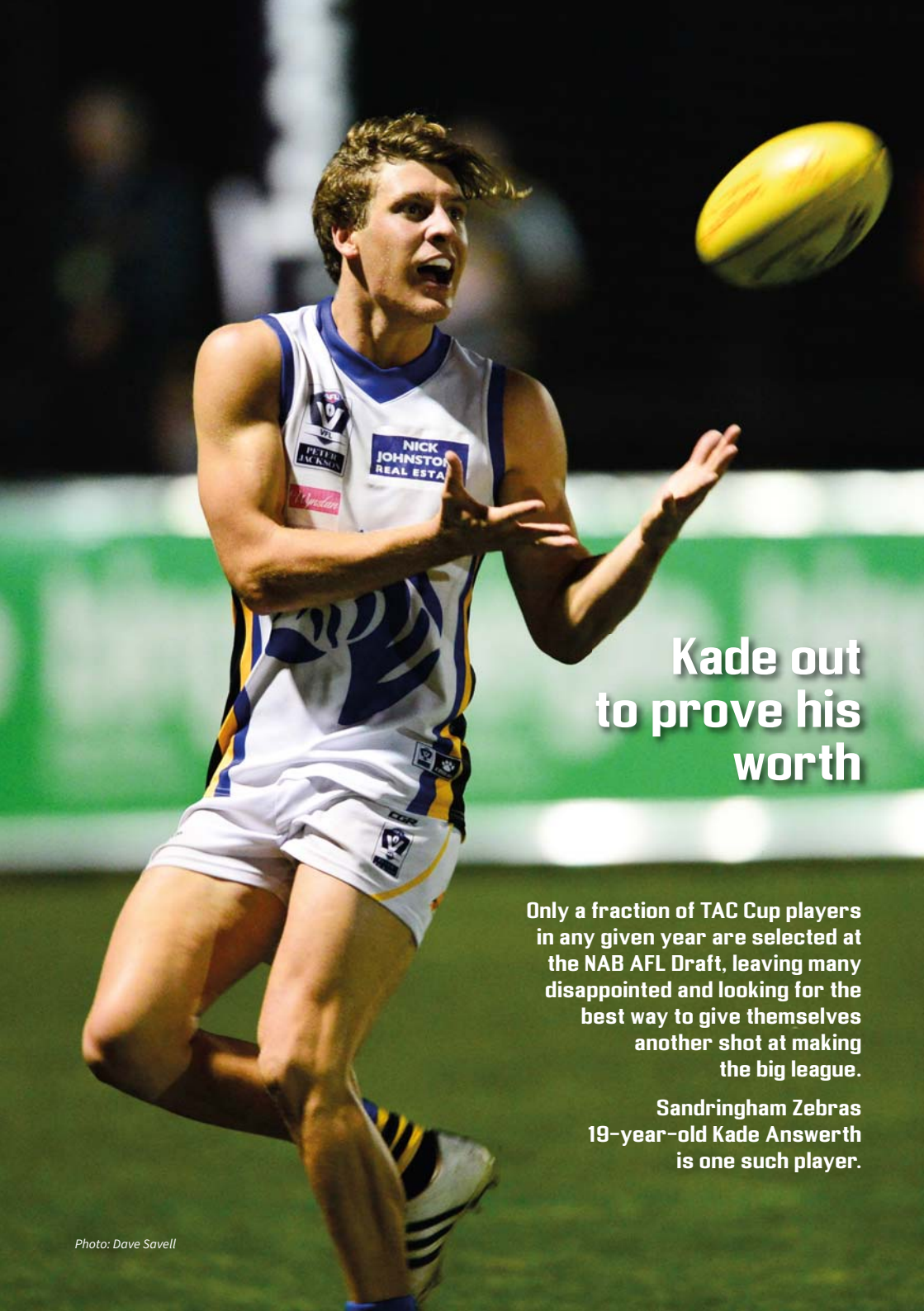

Kade out to prove his worth

Only a fraction of TAC Cup players in any given year are selected at the NAB AFL Draft, leaving many disappointed and looking for the best way to give themselves another shot at making the big league.

Sandringham Zebras
19-year-old Kade Answerth
is one such player.

Some unsuccessful draft aspirants are invited back to their TAC Cup clubs as over-age players; some progress to the Peter Jackson VFL to develop themselves against senior opposition.

After disappointment on draft night the last two years, Answerth has now experienced both scenarios.

In 2014, his top-age season in the TAC Cup, Answerth was the joint-winner of the Oakleigh Chargers' best and fairest award in a premiership year. He hoped for draft success but didn't expect too much. There were question marks on his size (he's now 183cm), his speed and his disposal, and he wasn't selected.

Last year in his over-age season at Oakleigh, Answerth won the club's best and fairest award outright, again in a premiership year. He also won the medal for best-on-ground in the Grand Final victory. Further, he experienced senior VFL football by playing three games for Port Melbourne. Still, it wasn't enough for AFL recruiters.

"Last year I had more hope than the year before," Answerth said. "I didn't leave any stone unturned (in 2015); I did everything in my power.

"Missing out was obviously disappointing but I did everything I could, so not getting picked up didn't

quite hurt as much as it did in 2014. I would've been disappointed if I could've done something differently or more consistently throughout the year."

Answerth averaged 24 disposals and almost six tackles per game across 14 TAC Cup matches in 2015, including 30 disposals, 10 clearances and seven tackles in Oakleigh's premiership victory. He also impressed by averaging 14 disposals per game in his three VFL matches with the Borough.

Despite doing everything in his power and not being rewarded with selection on an AFL list last year, Answerth is still holding out hope of graduating to the elite level.

The reason is that he believes the environment at Sandringham has the potential to develop his football even further. Answerth played the first three matches of 2016 as the senior team's 23rd player – averaging 19 disposals per game and kicking four goals – and then starred in a big victory over Collingwood last weekend with 29 disposals, 10 marks, 11 tackles, five clearances and a goal as part of the starting 22.

His decision to settle at Trevor Barker Beach Oval now looks a good one.

“It was pretty difficult to make up my mind because a lot of Oakleigh boys went to Port Melbourne and I was good mates with them,” Answerth said. “But in the end, I found Sandy was a better fit for me to better my footy.”

“I sat down and had coffee with (senior coach) Paul Hudson, and he was really welcoming and had a clear direction for the club.”

“I probably went more towards the alignment with St Kilda. There’s a bit more of a challenge to get into the seniors, and a lot of people look at that as a negative, but you’re training with and potentially playing with guys on an AFL list. That’s going to better your footy.”

“It seemed like a good fit at the time and it’s turned out to be a decision I’ve really looked back on as a good one.”

Answerth has connections with two AFL-listed Saints through Oakleigh’s 2014 premiership team in good mates Daniel McKenzie and Jack Sinclair.

He said the pair “have definitely come a long way” since entering a professional AFL environment, and took heart from seeing how they’ve developed in defined on-field roles as opposed to gaining experience in various positions at TAC Cup level.

Answerth hopes he too can establish himself in Sandringham’s senior team in a role as a high half forward moving through the midfield. His goal tally shows he’s already addressing one of the aspects

of his game that recruiters may have seen as a deficiency.

“I think hitting the scoreboard a bit more, being more dangerous as a smaller forward and showing I can play that role is something I could improve on,” Answerth said.

“Getting to more contests and getting to the feet of big guys would really help, and so far I’ve done that this year.”

In addition to addressing his ability to hit the scoreboard, Answerth is particularly focused on turning around opinions on his kicking ability, and third-year Zebras teammate Elliot Le Grice has been instrumental in helping him along that path.

“We’ve been kicking a lot together,” Answerth said. “Elliot prides himself on his disposal from the back line and my kicking needs a bit of work, so getting to training early and having a kick with him has been really good.”

“I’ve just been focusing on my ball drop and taking on board some little tips he’s used over the past couple of years that have been working for him.”

He may have just about done it all at TAC Cup level and still not achieved what he ultimately wanted, but it hasn’t stopped Answerth embracing new challenges in a new environment.

Community to state-level umpiring pathway never clearer

There's never been a better time than now for community-level umpires aspiring to reach the heights of officiating state-level football in the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup.

That's the opinion of AFL Victoria State League Umpiring Manager Cameron Nash, who has overseen the introduction and development of community umpire 'rookie squads' since May 2014.

Nash, a former umpire himself, thinks the rookie squads have been a big factor in reducing the gap between umpiring at community level and state level.

The rookie squads comprise community-league umpires – field, boundary and goal – recommended to AFL Victoria by their local coaches as being on the path to graduating to state-level umpiring.

The field umpire rookie squad trains with the AFL Victoria Senior and Development Squads once a fortnight, while the boundary and goal umpire rookie squads train with their state-level counterparts once a month.

Nash and his colleagues also go out and observe the rookie-squad field umpires once or twice a year as they officiate in their own community leagues.

“The rookie squads have probably been the biggest success over the last few years in terms of narrowing the pathway between umpiring in community leagues and state leagues,” Nash said. “Before that, it was quite a big jump.

“The rookie squads give the umpires an understanding of what’s required at this level by training with us, and secondly, it gives us an idea of what talent is coming through and for us to be able to monitor that from a state-league perspective.”

Several umpires have given the caper a publicity boost in recent times and demonstrated that umpiring can become a legitimate career for those who are passionate about it.

The cause of female umpires has been furthered by the likes of Eleni Glouftsis and Kate Griffiths. Glouftsis made history earlier this year when she became the first female field umpire to officiate in an AFL match in the NAB Challenge clash between Carlton and Essendon. Griffiths, meanwhile, has become a regular goal umpire at VFL level.

Brent Wallace – the son of former AFL player and coach Terry Wallace – broke through for his first AFL match as a field umpire last year, while former AFL players Leigh Fisher and Jordan Bannister have also officiated at the elite level.

Former players are also putting their knowledge of the game to use as umpires at state level, benefitting from another recent AFL Victoria initiative.

“We developed our own player-to-umpire program last year,” Nash said.

“We had two participants who have both moved on to our Development Squad this year: Cameron Dore, who played in a premiership at Vermont, and Paul Rebeschini, who came through the Dandenong Stingrays, played at Frankston and then at Bonbeach before taking up umpiring.

“Their feel for the game and their discipline and drive to succeed certainly came across when they took up umpiring. They’re not just in it to give it a go – they’re in it to really be successful.”

Nash said the rookie squads and player-to-umpire program had made it easier than ever for aspiring state-level umpires to make the jump from community level – while the quality of those umpires coming through the pathway has also increased greatly.

“This is my third year in my role and I think the group of new umpires we’ve taken this year is probably the best I’ve seen come through,” Nash said.

“That’s probably due to things such as the coaching umpires are getting at local level now, but a lot of the umpires we took into our squads this year were involved in our rookie program last year.

“That just shows the program works.”

Telling facts: The Bulldogs snapped a three-game losing run by leading throughout in soggy conditions at VU Whitten Oval. Footscray piled on nine unanswered goals either side of quarter time to set up a 68-point lead at the main break and put the match to bed. The loss was North Ballarat's third in a row after a close victory in Round 1.

Casey's fourth win of the season sent it to the top of the ladder on percentage.

Williamstown's Sam Dunell booted five goals against Werribee last weekend

Reigning premier Williamstown produced one of the most devastating bursts of scoring seen in the Peter Jackson VFL in recent times last Saturday night.

The Seagulls notched their fourth win of 2016 against Werribee at Avalon Airport Oval on the back of a show-stopping 10-goal first quarter.

The Tigers had impressed many during their undefeated start to the season but were made to look like witches' hats in a 20-minute period to end the opening stanza.

After Werribee booted the first goal of the match, Williamstown kicked six consecutive behinds before launching into a run of 10 unanswered goals that opened up a match-defining 60-point lead at the first break.

That run extended to 14 goals without reply before the Tigers put their second on the board. Sam Dunell starred with five majors for the Seagulls in the first half, while 2015 Norm Goss Medallist Michael Gibbons (31 disposals) regularly started things in the middle.

The performance was even more impressive given captain Ben Jolley was a late withdrawal with back spasms. Cameron Lockwood stepped into the role and his troops showed they won't be dealing with any challengers to their throne lightly this year.

Men's/Women's double-headers

Simonds Stadium will host Geelong's first-ever Peter Jackson VFL/VFL Women's double-header in one of three such events this weekend.

The Geelong VFL men's team faces Collingwood on Saturday at 1pm before the Geelong VFL Women's team meets Knox from 3.45pm in a game that will be live streamed on vfl.com.au.

In the weekend's other double-headers, St Kilda will come up against Melbourne Uni at 11am before Port Melbourne takes on Footscray from 2pm at North Port Oval on Saturday, while Darebin and the Eastern Devils will clash at 11am ahead of the Coburg vs Essendon game from 2pm at Piranha Park on Sunday.

Contenders clash on 7

Werribee and the Box Hill Hawks will meet in a clash of potential top-four teams in Channel 7's Peter Jackson VFL match of the Round on Sunday.

The Tigers were in scintillating touch before suffering their first defeat of 2016 at the hands of Williamstown last week and will be looking to bounce back against the undefeated Hawks at Avalon Airport Oval.

The Channel 7 broadcast will commence at 11.30am and in addition to live and exclusive match coverage this year, fans will be able to watch the VFL match of the round streamed live on mobile, tablet and PC via PLUS7 Live.

If you miss any games live, the VFL match of the round will be replayed on 7mate on Tuesday morning at 1am or you can watch a replay on 7 Catchup hours after the completion of the game.

A ruthless St Kilda Sharks outfit left Diamond Creek ruing missed opportunities at CT Barling Reserve in Round 5 of the VFL Women's league, running out 50-point winners off the back of a dominant Moana Hope performance, as Michael Di Petta reports.

Hope set the tone early in the first term with back-to-back majors and remained a constant presence up forward throughout the game, eventually finishing with four goals in the Sharks' 11.5 (71) to 2.9 (21) victory.

Diamond Creek enjoyed patches of strong play throughout the contest, often taking control of the game but failing to make an impact on the scoreboard.

Conversely, St Kilda seemed lethal whenever attacking and Hope was ably supported by Tamara Hyett who bagged three goals to share the scoring load.

Hope's four goals took her season tally to 23, cementing her position as the VFL Women's leading goalkicker and earning the praise of coach Shaun Smith who labelled her "the best in the land".

Smith was quick to highlight the importance of a strong siren-to-siren performance, describing game-long consistency as the key to the Sharks' success.

"The games we have lost we have been in the mix to win; to lose those two games was hard. But to play four quarters today, that was the difference. Last week we only played three, so we were really happy with the four-quarter effort."

In other Round 5 games:

- Darebin saw off yet another challenger with a 50-point win over the VU Western Spurs, with Katie Brennan kicking five first-half goals;

- Melbourne Uni submitted another clinical performance to continue its unbeaten start to the season, defeating Geelong by 70 points with Laura Stevens among the best for the winners;

- Seaford trailed by a point at the start of the third quarter before the Eastern Devils kicked seven of the last eight goals of the game to run out 41-point winners - Jaimee Lambert and Sarah Perkins kicking three each for the Devils; and

- Cranbourne recorded its first win of the season against Knox, with Kirsten McLeod kicking four goals in a 76-point victory.

This weekend Round 6 will feature three VFL/VFL Women's double-header clashes, with Geelong vs Knox live video streamed via vfl.com.au from 3.45pm Saturday.

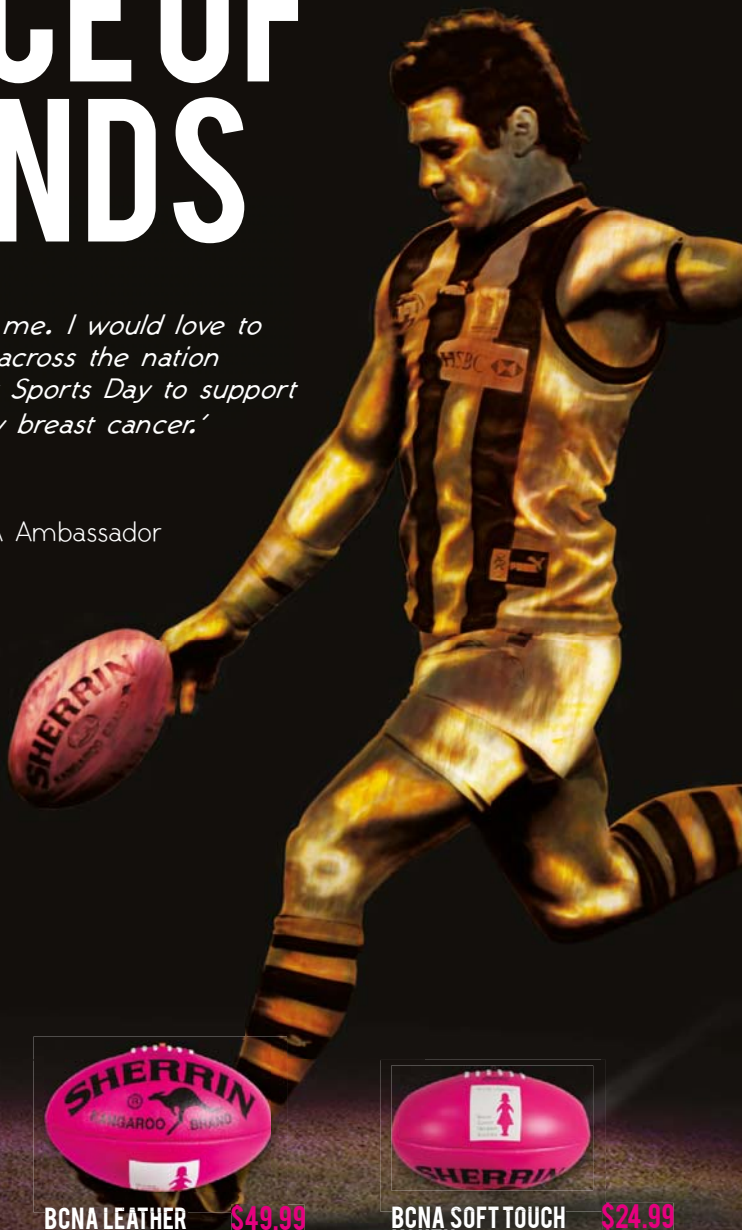

Bendigo finds gold in the Ranges

In a week of comprehensive victories, the smallest winning margin provided the biggest surprise of TAC Cup Round 6 when the Bendigo Pioneers upstaged the Eastern Ranges by 21 points.

A low-scoring opening quarter (three goals total) at Kyabram Recreational Reserve gave no indication of the goal-scoring feast to come, as the Pioneers piled on 14 majors in the second and third stanzas to set up their second triumph of 2016.

The Ranges went toe-to-toe with their opponents in front of goal before half time and held a six-point lead at the main break. For the second week in succession though, a particularly young Eastern outfit couldn't keep up after that point as Bendigo kicked away with nine goals to one in the third quarter. The Geelong Falcons did similar damage to the Ranges last week in the second half.

The 9th-placed Pioneers now have a chance to notch their third win of the season against the 10th-placed Western Jets this weekend, while Eastern (6th, 3-3) will look to rebound against the winless Gippsland Power.

The **Power** was no match for the second-placed **Sandringham Dragons** (5-1-1) on the weekend, recording only four fewer scoring shots but losing by 49 points at Morwell Recreation Reserve.

Without suspended captain Ben Ainsworth, Gippsland was jumped by Sandringham and had conceded a match-defining 37-point lead by half time. The Dragons now have a two-week break after playing their Round 7 match against the Oakleigh Chargers in April and with a Development Weekend following the rest of Round 7 next week.

The **Chargers**, meanwhile, struggled to combat the wind at Eureka Stadium in a 39-point loss to the in-form **North Ballarat Rebels**.

After three losses to start Gerard FitzGerald's first year as head coach, the Rebels have recorded three straight victories over the Calder Cannons, Bendigo and now last year's premiers, and have squared their ledger at 3-3 in seventh position. Oakleigh goes into its two-week break in fifth with a record of 4-3.

Karl Brown booted six goals in the Calder Cannons' win against the Murray Bushrangers in Round 6



The **Cannons** are one of the competition's other in-form teams after inflicting the **Murray Bushrangers'** first defeat of 2016 to the tune of 54 points at Rams Arena.

Calder started the season winless through four games but have hit back with big victories over Gippsland and now the Bushrangers to be sitting in eighth spot. 13 goals to five across the first and third quarters set the Cannons up in this one.

Fourth-placed Murray (4-1-1) now has to back up in a huge clash with the top-of-the-table **Dandenong Stingrays**. The Stingrays are the only team still undefeated following a 99-point win against the **Northern Knights** at Shepley Oval.

Meanwhile, Calder will also face a test against the third-placed **Geelong Falcons** (5-1) this week after the Falcons notched a fourth straight victory in accounting for **Western** by 40 points at Avalon Airport Oval.

The task is certainly ahead of the Knights and Jets – boasting just one win apiece – to break into the top eight.

Mutch to like in U18 Champs

Bendigo Pioneers midfielder Kobe Mutch was the star of NSW/ACT's first game in Division 2 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships last weekend.

The Rams defeated Queensland 18.6 (114) to 9.13 (67) in Blacktown, with Mutch one of the most impressive of the current TAC Cup players representing their native state. A member of the AFL and GWS Academies, the Gol Gol product had a game-high 31 disposals and six inside-50s in the victory.

Mutch was one of 10 TAC Cup players to make the NSW/ACT squad, which includes seven Murray Bushrangers – of whom ruckman Max Lynch and forwards Todd Marshall (four goals) and Charlie Spargo (three) performed well on Sunday.

The Rams now meet Tasmania at Blundstone Arena, Hobart on Saturday at 12.15pm.

Murray's marquee match-up

The Murray Bushrangers will have to rebound from their first loss of 2016 against a rampaging Dandenong Stingrays outfit this weekend.

The two teams likely to be in top-four contention come finals time will face off in what could prove to be a proverbial 'eight-point game' at Wangaratta Showgrounds on Saturday.

A potent forward line – featuring three players in the competition's top seven goalkickers – has helped the Stingrays to an unbeaten start to 2016, while the Bushrangers were flying before a handful of their players were called up to play for the NSW/ACT Rams at the NAB AFL U18 Championships last week.

Lok steps up to senior level

Sandringham Dragons over-ager Goy Lok became the first TAC Cup player to step up to VFL level in 2016 last weekend, representing the Sandringham Zebras as their 23rd player.

Lok averaged 22 disposals, six marks and a goal per game in four matches for the Dragons before having [insert stats when known] in the Zebras' 67-point win against Collingwood on Saturday.

Dragons Talent Manager Ryan O'Connor said Lok was invited back to the club after being in draft contention last year.

"I think clubs wanted him to keep working on expanding his game," O'Connor said earlier in 2016. "They saw he was probably a bit too much of an inside midfielder; he needed to get outside and run and carry a bit.

"He's a ripper kid and he's working really hard."

Rebels turn things around

The North Ballarat Rebels are one of the form teams of the TAC Cup after recording their third consecutive victory in Round 6 following three straight losses to start the season.

Their early draw didn't do new head coach Gerard FitzGerald any favours, with his troops having to face current top-four teams the Geelong Falcons, Dandenong Stingrays and Murray Bushrangers in the first three rounds respectively.

North Ballarat's subsequent games haven't been much easier though, with wins coming against the Calder Cannons, Bendigo Pioneers and Oakleigh Chargers – all teams with good performances on the board in 2016.

Regardless of the opposition, it's the improvement in key statistical measures from Rounds 1-3 to Rounds 4-6 that will please FitzGerald the most – an indication the Rebels are warming to his game plan.

They averaged 50 fewer disposals per game than their opponents in Rounds 1-3, but 56 more in Round 4-6. For contested possessions per game, it was 27 fewer in Rounds 1-3 but 11 more in Rounds 4-6. Clearances per game have improved from two fewer to nine more, and inside-50s per game have skyrocketed from six fewer to 22 more.

North Ballarat has been harder at the contest, winning the ball more and using it to generate a heap of scoring opportunities inside 50 – a recipe for success that will stack up against any team in the competition.

Sandy storms home again

For the second straight game, the Sandringham Zebras kicked six goals and kept their opponents goalless in the final quarter to power to a percentage-boosting win in Round 5 of the Peter Jackson VFL season.

Two weeks ago in Round 4, the Zebras killed off any chance Richmond had of snatching victory by holding the Tigers to just six behinds in the last term while booting 6.6 themselves in a 57-point triumph.

Sandringham did the same to Collingwood on Saturday, piling on 6.8 while holding the Magpies scoreless in the concluding stanza. The result was a 67-point win that boosted its percentage to a healthy 137.3.

25 Nick Graham was in a bruising mood for the Northern Blues in their big loss to the Casey Scorpions. The AFL-listed youngster laid an enormous 25 tackles, six more than the AFL single-game record held by Jude Bolton and Jack Ziebell. While the Scorpions had a lot more of the ball than the Blues, Graham's performance certainly wasn't one-dimensional – he had 35 disposals as well.

9 198cm Dandenong Stingrays bottom-ager Tom De Koning rocketed to equal-fourth on the TAC Cup goalkicking table after booting nine goals straight in his team's big win against the Northern Knights. The Mt Martha product also assisted in another two majors and relegated poor Sam Fowler (five goals) to second billing on the score sheet.

40 Mark Jamar was as good as retired late last year, but his signing as an Essendon top-up player has proven lucky for the club's VFL side. The ruckman had 40 hitouts last week, 30 more than the best hitout-winner for opponent Geelong (Nathan Vardy). Jamar's dominance meant the Bombers were able to win the clearance count by 10, contested possession count by 24 and the match by 21 points.

The Zebras became known as specialists at the death in 2015, winning six matches by 15 points or less – many of which were come-from-behind victories – en route to a top-two finish at the end of the home-and-away season.

Opponents that can't run out a full four quarters against them have been warned.

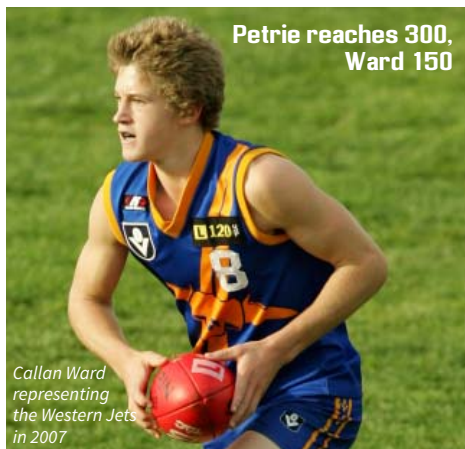

The AFL Victoria Record follows former TAC Cup and VFL players on their AFL journeys



**Petrie reaches 300,
Ward 150**

Callan Ward representing the Western Jets in 2007

Former North Ballarat Rebels forward Drew Petrie played his 300th AFL match for North Melbourne in the club's seven-point triumph over St Kilda in Round 7.

Petrie, 33, had 11 disposals, four marks and booted two goals against the Saints.

The Ballarat product has been one of the game's most consistent goalkickers over his 16-year career, leading North Melbourne's goalkicking count in 2009, 2011-12 and 2014-15 and booting 411 total goals. The 2011 All Australian was selected by the Kangaroos with pick no.23 in the 2000 AFL Draft after being named in that year's TAC Cup Team of the Year.

Ex-**Western Jets** midfielder **Callan Ward** was another TAC Cup graduate to celebrate a milestone last weekend, playing his 150th match in GWS' 18-point victory over Fremantle. Ward, 26, had 31 disposals, 19 contested possessions, 10 clearances and seven tackles in a typically hard-nosed performance.

The Spotswood junior was originally selected by the Western Bulldogs at pick no.19 in the 2007 AFL Draft after being named in that year's TAC Cup Team of the Year. He played 60 games for the Dogs from 2008-11 before signing with the Giants as an uncontracted player for their inaugural AFL season. Ward has been a co-captain of the club since he arrived and also claimed its 2012 best and fairest award.

A more recent **North Ballarat Rebels** graduate, **Jake Lloyd**, also brought up a milestone, playing his 50th match in Sydney's 81-point win against Essendon. Lloyd, 22, had 24 disposals and six marks against the Bombers.

In 2012, the Horsham native won the TAC Cup Coaches Award and was named in the TAC Cup Team of the Year before being taken by the Swans at pick no.16 in the 2012 Rookie Draft. He was upgraded to the senior list early in 2014 and played in the club's losing Grand Final team later that year.

Harmes stars, Ben and Darcy debut

Former Dandenong Stingrays mid-forward James Harmes was named the NAB AFL Rising Star nominee for Round 7 after impressing with 26 disposals, five tackles, four inside-50s and three goals in Melbourne's 73-point victory over Gold Coast.

The Devon Meadows junior has played all seven games for the Demons in 2016 after playing only eight (all in 2015) in his first two years at the club. Harmes, 20, was selected with pick no.2 in the 2013 Rookie Draft and was elevated to Melbourne's senior list at the end of last season.

Meanwhile, 2015 **Oakleigh Chargers** premiership captain **Ben Crocker** made his AFL debut in Collingwood's 15-point loss to Carlton in Round 7. Crocker, 19, had eight disposals and three tackles in limited game time against the Blues.

The Kew Comets junior kicked 23 goals in 14 TAC Cup games last year and was named on the interchange in the TAC Cup Team of the Year before being selected by the Magpies with pick no.65 in the 2015 NAB AFL Draft.

Ex-**Northern Knights** small forward **Darcy MacPherson** also made his AFL debut last weekend, having 10 disposals, nine tackles and kicking 1.1 in Gold Coast's loss to Melbourne.

MacPherson, 18, a Diamond Creek product, was selected by the Suns at pick no.21 in the 2015 Rookie Draft after averaging 21 disposals per game across eight matches for the Knights last year.

WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships

The argument over which Victorian community football league is the best in the state may finally be settled in the inaugural WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships.

For the first time, metropolitan and country leagues will battle it out for the ultimate bragging rights to be crowned the premier community football league in Victoria.

A total of 36 leagues will compete in a one-off head-to-head match, which will be held on May 21 at 18 venues across Victoria, with a further two leagues competing in their own local challenge match across the same weekend.

“It is exciting to be able to take this next step towards the establishment of a Victoria-wide senior community football championships involving a host of leagues from across the state, providing hundreds of players the opportunity to represent their league,” he said.

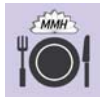
