

To whom it may concern,

This (MOU) Memorandum of Understanding is to advise the Northern Football League of an alliance formed between the (BJFC) Bundoora Junior Football Club inc. and the (BFC) Bundoora Football Club.

During the summer, at meetings between both committees, we came to an agreement that this alliance would provide a pathway for the BJFC to help direct its U17 players into senior football.

This, both committees agreed, would keep players continuing playing football.

It was acknowledge that both clubs cannot direct players to the BFC but show them a pathway to senior football with a Division 1 Club.

This alliance would also allow BJFC players the opportunity to play U19 football for the BFC when required as with other clubs with junior teams.

The BFC in exchange for such an alliance shall commit to aid the BJFC in the development of junior players so they are better prepared for senior football. This support shall take the form of providing at least 5 of the following per season:

- U17 to U15 players attend BFC U19 training on 1 or more occasions per season.
- Senior BFC Players to attend and contribute to training of all junior teams.
- BFC Coaches to attend junior coaches meeting for education purposes.
- BFC Committee or Players attend BJFC Social night to talk to members.
- BFC Senior Players attend BJFC Registration day (Typically early Feb).
- BFC Senior Players attend BJFC Presentation day (Typically mid Sept).


This MOU becomes effective for the 2016 season and beyond as agreed to by both committees. This agreement will become void if either party informs the other and the Northern Football League in writing.

Note: It was also acknowledged that both clubs will have further talks during the 2016 season to explore the opportunity of relocating the BJFC Auskick to the Yulong Reserve on a Friday evening.
