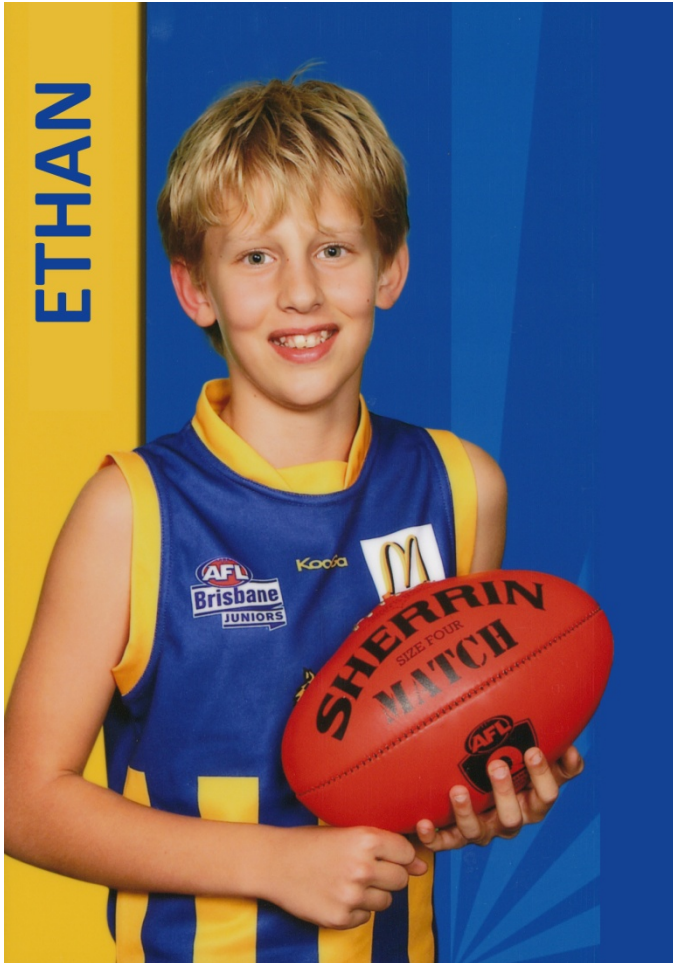
Thanks again to all the parents who helped out on the evening. This week we travel over the river to take on Morningside at 10:30 Sunday morning.

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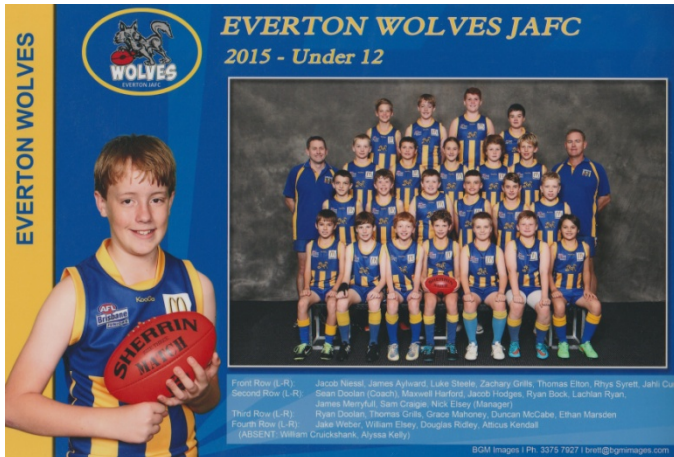
