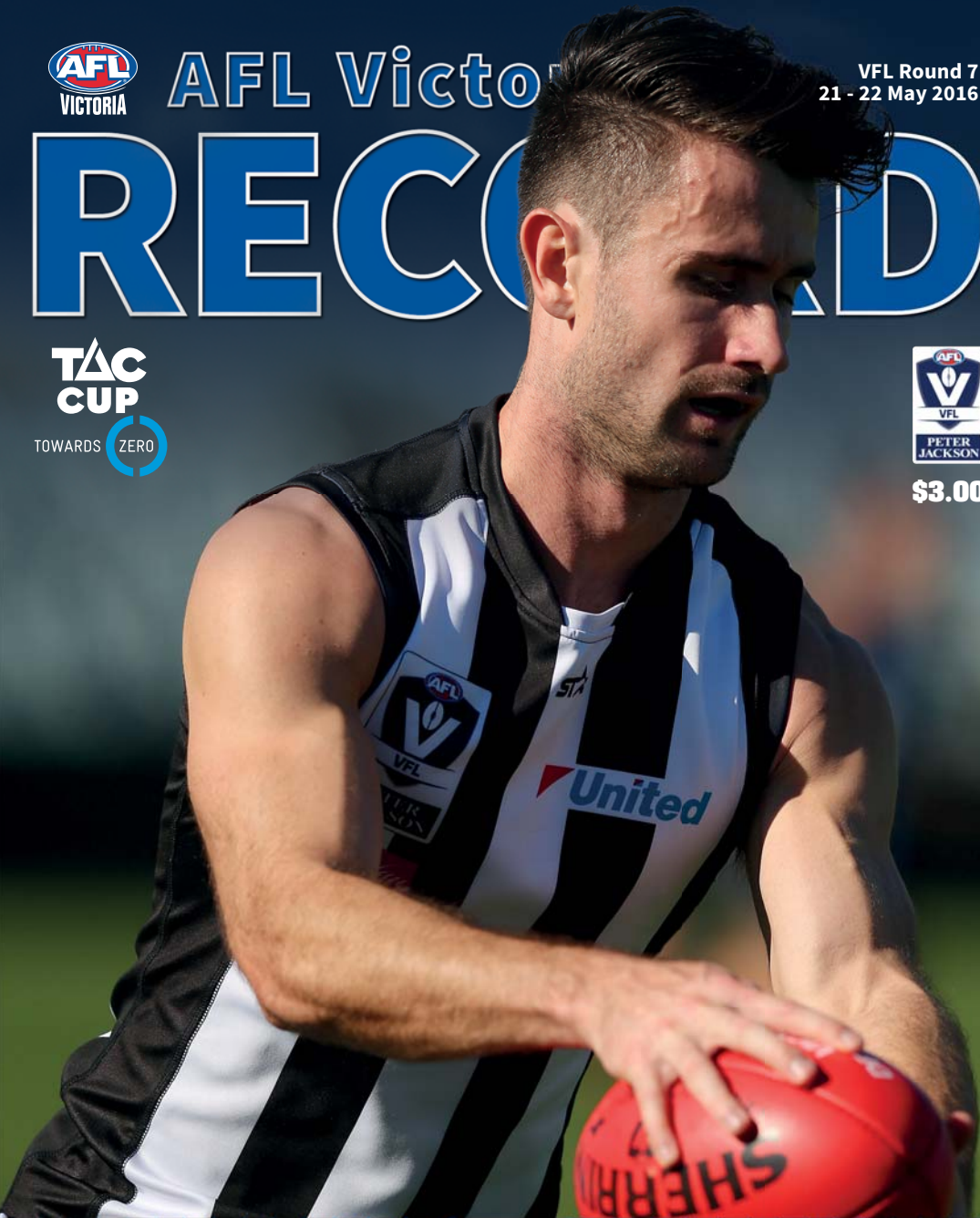

Best talent set to represent Victoria

State football takes centre stage over the next month in the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup.

Last week a squad of 30 players from 11 VFL clubs was named to represent the competition against the SANFL on Sunday May 29 at the Adelaide Oval.

Led by Williamstown premiership coach Andy Collins, the new-look squad – with only six previous state representatives – will cross the border and attempt to record our first win against the Croweaters since 2002.

Congratulations go to each of the players selected in the squad. It is an honour to be recognised to represent the competition at the highest level possible, with the state side over recent years having been a breeding ground for future AFL players.

Players such as Adam Marcon, Kane Lambert, Dean Towers, Kyle Hartigan and Richmond after-the-siren match-winner Sam Lloyd all pulled on the Big V and benefited from the exposure of competing against the best from other state-league competitions. We look forward to seeing the next crop of future AFL players make the most of their opportunities next Sunday in a win for the VFL.

At U18 level, Vic Metro and Vic Country will start their NAB AFL U18 Championships campaigns, supported by Dairy Australia, in early June. Last year Country completed a clean sweep of its opposition to win the title and showcased the abilities of players such as Jacob Weitering, Josh Schache, Darcy Parish and Rhys Mathieson, while an inexperienced Metro team provided opportunities to the likes of Jade Gresham, Ryan Clarke, David Cuningham and Blake Hardwick.

The final squads of 50 will be named in the next week, and we look forward to Vic Country opening its Championships against WA on June 5 and Vic Metro facing traditional rival Vic Country on the Queen's Birthday Monday, June 13, after a bye in Round 1.

Leaders hit 100



Two inspirational leaders of the Peter Jackson VFL will play their 100th senior games this weekend: Box Hill Hawks captain David Mirra and former Northern Blues skipper Brent Bransgrove.

The AFL Victoria Record talked to each of them about their journeys to a relatively rare milestone in the VFL and what the future might now hold.



David Mirra, 25, is a 2013 premiership defender, four-time VFL Team of the Year selection, two-time Victorian state representative and has led the Hawks to Grand Finals in his first two seasons as captain.

Brent Bransgrove, 27, is in his 10th season with the Northern Blues and led the club for four years from 2012-15 (the first two as joint-captain).

What were you hoping to accomplish when you started out in the VFL? Was playing 100 games even a consideration?

DM: "When you first start, you just want to play one game. Then you want to play the next one. For me, it was about establishing myself in the senior side given I played Development League footy all my first year. My ultimate goal was to get drafted but that didn't eventuate, so I just wanted to stick at the best level of footy I could for as long as I could. That's led to me playing 100 games."

BB: "I honestly wouldn't have thought I'd get this far. I didn't really know what to expect coming out of the TAC Cup. I just thought I'd embrace what Northern had there and see where it took me. Each year there were new people and people stuck around as well, and you just keep building relationships."

Which personal traits and skills do you think have allowed you to play 100 VFL games?

DM: "The biggest thing was probably just being honest with myself. In my first few years, I suppose I learned some pretty harsh lessons from the leadership group in terms of how to prepare and how to get the best out of myself in pre-season. It was about changing my focus as well – when you come in, you just worry about kicks, handballs and marks, but as you get older you worry more about the team and how different guys are going, and you start to think outside the box a bit."

BB: "It's been a long journey and my body hasn't held up too well. Persistence is probably the key. I've never been the most athletic or skilled player, but I guess my hard work and hours behind the scenes and on the track has equated to lasting the 10 years and 100 games."

How did you come to be a captain of your club?

DM: "It was something I always wanted to do, and particularly when I started playing seniors I wanted to develop my leadership. It was something (former Box Hill player) Beau Muston got me involved in – in the leadership group in 2012 – and that gave me confidence I could be a leader amongst the group. Then as I developed, the captaincy came about. I was lucky enough to captain the side as an acting captain

to Daniel Pratt for about seven games in 2013 which ultimately led to me gaining full captaincy in 2014. I've got a passion for the jumper and I take privilege and honour in being the captain of the side."

BB: "It really came out of nowhere (in 2012), because I missed out on 2010 due to hip surgery and then the next year I came back and played half in the seniors and half in the Development League. The following year I guess we had a fair turnover of players, losing our captain Adam Iacobucci and also the change to the Northern Blues (and associated alignment with Carlton) brought an influx of players. Me and Andre Gianfagna shared the captaincy, which was a massive honour. I'd been in a leadership group but never thought it would come my way that early in my career."

What have been the biggest changes for you personally over the journey?

DM: "You definitely mature. I think the biggest thing for me was the influence of (then senior coach) Brendon Bolton in my first year (2010), in just setting standards and then driving those standards yourself. I think I've changed my mentality from my first few years, for sure. Brendon sets a strong culture and makes sure everyone abides by it, and there's definitely a lot of lessons I learned from him that I take with me now as captain and try to enforce to the younger guys."

BB: "What you take from footy, you also take into your lifestyle. You have to be organised, dedicated and committed to the cause, so whatever you do outside of football, that relates back to your football. I guess I've taken a lot of life lessons out of football – as much as learning about football itself."

What has been your most memorable on-field moment?

DM: "You can't go past the 2013 flag, but also playing with a lot of quality guys and quality AFL players. We're lucky to have guys come down to Box Hill who have played in AFL premierships."

BB: "The 2009 Grand Final. It was surreal running out on a Friday night at Etihad Stadium. We didn't get the win (the Bullants lost to North Ballarat), but that whole finals campaign was a really good experience and to get to the Grand Final was a pretty good achievement from where we had come from."

Is there a particularly embarrassing or funny moment that sticks out in your mind?

DM: "Probably my first senior win in Round 2, 2011. On the final bell I got pretty excited – fist pumping and jumping up and down. It was like I'd won a Grand Final. I remember (then senior coach) Damian Carroll played the footage during the week in the review and the boys brought me back down to earth."

BB: "Going into that 2009 Grand Final, I already had my head wrapped up before I'd run out onto the ground. I'd split my eye open the previous Sunday and we had to back up on the Friday night. I had six or seven stitches in there."

What do you still hope to achieve in the VFL and what might the future hold?

DM: "I want to win a premiership again. Individual milestones are great, but you don't get the same satisfaction playing 100 games as you do playing a premiership. We've been on the losing end the last two years, so that stings and you want to rectify that in a way by winning another one. Hopefully I'm still working in business (post-footy), but I've always thought about coaching. That's something I'm passionate about, particularly with the younger group we have at the club. I enjoy teaching the tactical side of the game and transferring knowledge I've learned to those guys."

BB: "I think maybe my best footy's past me, so you just try to develop the younger players and also the club culture. You try to instil it into these players coming through and hope they carry that through the following years past my time. That's my main focus, and trying to get people to stay for a period of time – not just a year and then getting out of the Northern Blues and the VFL. There's still a high turnover of players because it's a highly demanding system, and I just hope people actually stick at it because you make a lot of mates and develop yourself as a person. I'm also doing structural engineering and I've been trying to balance that with footy for the last three years, so I'll be focusing a lot more on that."

Telling facts: The Magpies set up their third win of the season with a fast start at Simonds Stadium, booting the first four goals of the game. A scrappy contest ensued after quarter time with only three majors kicked in the second and third terms, before Collingwood weathered a run of four straight Cats goals in the final stanza to prevail.

VFL state squad announced

A new-look Peter Jackson VFL state squad has been announced to face the South Australian National Football League (SANFL) on Sunday May 29 at Adelaide Oval.

State coach Andy Collins has named an initial 30-man squad with just six players – David Mirra, Khan Haretuku, Scott Sherlock, Peter Faulks, Willie Wheeler and Nick Meese – having previous state game experience.

Eleven of the 15 VFL clubs are represented in the squad, with reigning premiers Williamstown boasting the most selections (nine players).

Clubs nominated players who were in form to the VFL state game match committee, with all names reviewed and discussed in their preferred playing positions before the squad was narrowed down to 30. It will be reviewed after Round 6 when a final training squad of 25 will be announced.

Williamstown premiership coach Collins said some tough decisions needed to be made to reduce the squad to 30.

“You need to be athletic to play on Adelaide Oval,” Collins said. “We wanted to make sure we had a really athletic team, a versatile team that can be flipped around to keep ahead of the game and be able to react to a situation too.”

Collins’ coaching panel consists of Ash Hansen (Footscray), Robbie Campbell (Williamstown), Marc Greig (North Ballarat) and Kieran McGuinness (Northern Blues).

The VFL and SANFL have met on five occasions since 1999 with the SANFL enjoying a 4-1 win-loss record.

Zeroes disappear from ladder

There’s a good reason to contend that the 2016 Peter Jackson VFL season will be one of the most even in recent memory.

The competition’s last remaining winless team finally got on the board in Round 6 when Coburg conjured a comeback victory over Essendon, while the last undefeated team was toppled when Werribee defeated the Box Hill Hawks in a thriller.

Those results mean just four games separate ladder leaders the Casey Scorpions and Williamstown (five wins each) from the bottom three of Coburg, the Northern Blues and North Ballarat (one win apiece).

Five teams are sitting on three victories in a logjam between fifth and ninth positions, promising a tight battle for finals positions as the season progresses.

A dominant second half has guided Darebin to a sixth straight victory, defeating the Eastern Devils to reinforce its place atop the VFL Women's ladder after Round 6.

As part of a VFL/VFL Women's double-header at Piranha Park, the Falcons kicked 12 goals to three in the second half to remain undefeated, winning 18.9 (117) to 8.5 (53), as Callum O'Connor reports.

In the first half, Eastern's relentless pressure flustered the Falcons and early in the third term the top-four Devils jumped into the lead.

But over the following 15 minutes, Darebin mainstays Katie Brennan, Jessica Dal-Pos and Sarah Hammond took control of the midfield, and forwards Meghan McDonald, Georgia Hammond and coach Jane Lange kept the scoreboard operator working overtime. The Falcons slammed on seven goals to end the term and showed no mercy in the last quarter to blow out the final margin to 64 points.

Lange, who made a successful return from an ankle injury to finish with three goals for the Falcons, was delighted her players could stand up so impressively when confronted.

"Our play in the third quarter was just incredible," said Lange after the match. "The key is the depth of players who can change in and out of different roles – it's the best headache I can have."

In other results:

- Seaford caused the upset of the round, completing the first win by a former VWFL Division 1 team against a former Premier Division side in Diamond Creek. Despite going goalless in the first term, the Tigers kicked nine goals to three after quarter time to record a 14-point win.

- Geelong recorded its first win of the season with a 147-point win over Knox, with Maddie Boyd dominant in the ruck and Cheryl De Groot dangerous up forward with four goals.

- The VU Western Spurs finished strongest against Cranbourne with a powerful seven-goal final term to claim their third win of the season by 49 points.

- St Kilda moved to third spot, inflicting Melbourne Uni's first defeat of the season. Mo Hope was a class above up forward with five goals, while captain and new Melbourne recruit Penny Cula-Reid was in the best.

VFL Women's will have a bye round this week for the Melbourne v Brisbane exhibition game at the MCG on Sunday.

Bushies sneak home against Stingrays

The Murray Bushrangers prevailed in one of the most thrilling finishes of the TAC Cup season so far last weekend, inflicting the Dandenong Stingrays' first defeat of 2016 by four points.

The result could also prove to be one of the most important of the season, as Murray's win has opened up a six-premiership-point gap between the top four teams and the chasing pack.

Dandenong retained top spot on percentage from the Geelong Falcons despite the loss, while the Sandringham Dragons and Bushrangers are half a game behind. The North Ballarat Rebels, Eastern Ranges and Oakleigh Chargers are now a game and a half adrift of the competition pacesetters as the TAC Cup takes a weekend off.

Performances through these first seven rounds could prove crucial later, as many teams will soon lose their top-end talent to Vic Metro and Vic Country for June's NAB AFL U18 Championships, which commence on the same weekend as Round 9.

Murray's victory was secured when Billy Cooper booted the final goal of the game against the wind at Wangaratta Showgrounds. The Stingrays had taken the lead with the first two majors of the last quarter but couldn't hold off a brave Bushrangers outfit missing several talented players to NSW/ACT's Division 2 U18 Championships team.

Geelong drew level with Dandenong on six wins following a commanding 86-point triumph over the in-form **Calder Cannons** under lights at Simonds Stadium.

The Falcons killed the match off early with seven goals to one in the first quarter, and were 56 points in front by half time. The Cannons had rebounded from a winless start to the season with victories over Murray and the Gippsland Power in recent weeks, but this loss leaves them two wins behind seventh position on the ladder.

Just outside the top eight behind Calder are the **Bendigo Pioneers** and **Western Jets** on two wins apiece. The Jets claimed their first win since Round 1 against the Pioneers at Burbank Oval on the

weekend, but it wasn't without a major late scare.

Western blew an even game wide open with a dominant seven-goal-to-one third quarter, but could only watch as Bendigo piled on 5.5 to just two behinds in the final stanza to briefly put hearts in mouths. However, the Jets ultimately held on by 14 points.

In Round 7's other matches:

- **North Ballarat** won a fourth straight game by keeping the **Northern Knights** scoreless in the first quarter at Preston City Oval, going on to prevail by 60 points; and
- **Eastern** continued **Gippsland's** winless start to the season, recovering from conceding the first four goals of the game to defeat the Power by 50 points at Box Hill City Oval.

The **Dragons** and **Chargers** played their Round 7 match in April, with Oakleigh inflicting Sandringham's only defeat of 2016 to date, to the tune of 32 points.

Rams Marshall another win

Murray Bushrangers forward Todd Marshall ended an interesting week by kicking two goals in NSW/ACT's 101-point defeat of Tasmania at the NAB AFL U18 Championships on Saturday.

The 197cm 17-year-old was last week ruled ineligible to be considered for inclusion in the GWS Academy by the AFL, despite living in the club's academy zone.

The goalkicker responded with a handy performance in front of goal against the Mariners at Blundstone Arena in Hobart, having booted nine majors in three TAC Cup games for the Bushrangers prior to the U18 Championships.

Zach Sproule, Marshall's key-position teammate at Murray, was also influential with a goal in the victory, as was Bushrangers ruckman Max Lynch with 13 disposals and 24 hitouts. Bendigo Pioneers midfielder Kobe Mutch was prolific for the Rams for the second straight week with 26 disposals, seven clearances and a goal.

NSW/ACT is undefeated heading into Sunday's final Division 2 match against the Northern Territory at Metricon Stadium on the Gold Coast following a 47-point triumph over Queensland in Round 1.

Rays' run ends

The last remaining undefeated TAC Cup team was finally knocked off in Round 7 when the Dandenong Stingrays lost a heart-breaker by four points to the Murray Bushrangers.

The Stingrays are still on top of the ladder and boast the strongest percentage in the competition though. Their potency up forward has been on show in 2016, with three players in the top six of the TAC Cup goalkicking count (Sam Fowler – 25 goals, Tom De Koning – 15, Dan Allsop – 14).

Dandenong's loss sets up a massive clash with the second-placed Geelong Falcons for top spot next week at Shepley Oval. The Falcons have won five straight matches and are the competition's top-scoring team.

Witherden, 17, suffered a broken fibula and tibia when an opponent fell across his lower leg while laying a tackle.

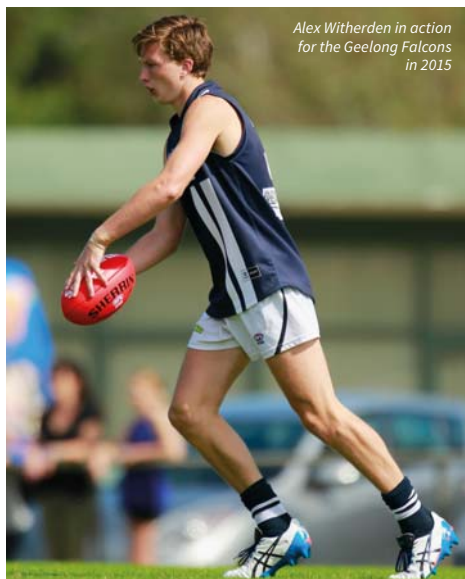

Earlier this year, Turner praised Witherden's character.

"He's a real leader of the club and very professional in everything he does," Turner said. "At this stage of the season, you'd say he's a very strong prospect of getting drafted and probably pretty early."

Young Burgers break through

Coburg finally notched a deserved first win of 2016 in Round 6, following four losses by a margin of 10 points or less in the first five rounds.

The Lions rode an eight-goal-to-two final quarter to victory over the Bombers by 31 points, bringing some joy to those in attendance at Piranha Park after they witnessed heart-breaking losses to North Ballarat by six points in Round 1 and the Box Hill Hawks by eight points in Round 3.

Coburg has also fallen short of Port Melbourne – a top-eight side like the Hawks – by 10 points, while the Bombers were in the top four before Sunday's game, further demonstrating the young and developing Lions are capable of mixing it with the best teams in the competition.

Their stats over the year don't paint a stunning picture, but one area they have been strong in is the tough stuff. Coburg ranked first in the competition for hitouts to advantage per game and equal-second for clearances per game before Round 6, on the back of ruckman Tom Goodwin's prowess at stoppages. Goodwin (20 hitouts) limited the influence of Essendon ruckman Mark Jamar (34 hitouts) and helped the Lions win the clearance count by two.

Emerging 23-year-old Lachlan Johns had eight clearances against the Bombers, 20-year-old Liam Hunt had six and 24-year-old Goodwin had five himself. That's not to mention 2015 VFL Team of the Year midfielder Ozgur Uysal, 23, who had 23 disposals and is second behind Johns for total disposals at Coburg in 2016.

The young bucks in the middle helped pump the ball inside 50 on 58 occasions – 12 more than Essendon – where a similarly developing forward line went to work.

Peter McEvoy, 24, booted four goals (and has 11 for the season) as he relishes the chance to play regular senior football after crossing from Box Hill, while 20-year-old small forward Josh Cauchi chimed in with three. Daniel Younan, 23, kicked two majors to take his yearly total to 10, while injured pair Robbie Fox, 22, and Dylan Tarczon, 18, have had their moments in front of goal in 2016.

Coburg's developing core is now showing it has the ability to match it with the VFL's pacesetters.

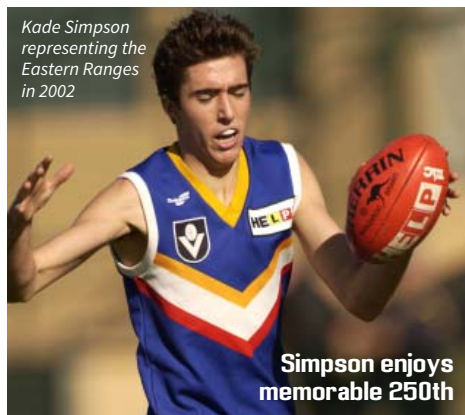

Simpson enjoys memorable 250th

Former Eastern Ranges player and now Carlton stalwart Kade Simpson played his 250th AFL match for the Blues in their thrilling two-point victory over Port Adelaide in Round 8 last week.

Simpson, 32, had 25 disposals, 10 marks and five rebound-50s against the Power in his now customary role running out of defence.

The Emerald junior was taken with pick no.45 in the 2002 AFL Draft after being selected in that year's TAC Cup Team of the Year. Once established in Carlton's senior team, he became known for his remarkable durability and claimed the club's 2013 best and fairest award.

Simpson's **Ranges** teammate in 2002, **Nick Malceski**, also brought up a milestone in Round 8, playing his 200th game in Gold Coast's 91-point loss to GWS. Malceski, 31, had 16 disposals against the Giants.

Ex-**North Ballarat Rebels** and **North Ballarat VFL** key defender **Michael Jamison** played his 150th match alongside Simpson in Carlton's win. Jamison, 29, had seven disposals, six marks and seven one-percenters against the Power.

The Newlyn product was taken with pick no.17 in the 2006 Rookie Draft and has been a Blues vice-captain since 2015.

Former **Sandringham Dragons** and **Williamstown VFL** key defender **Jack Frost** also brought up a milestone last week, playing his 50th game for Collingwood in the club's 78-point win against Brisbane. Frost, 24, had nine disposals, four marks and nine one-percenters in the victory.

The Ormond junior was selected by the Magpies with pick no.41 in the 2012 Rookie Draft.

Jacob hops to Rising Star nom

Ex-North Ballarat Rebels midfielder Jacob Hopper claimed the Round 8 NAB AFL Rising Star nomination for his stunning debut game for GWS in the club's 91-point victory over Gold Coast last week.

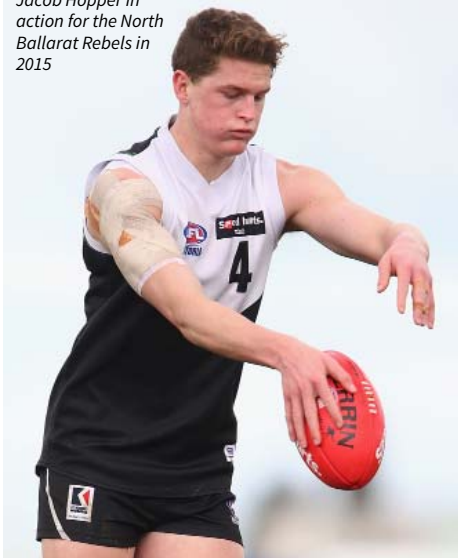
Hopper, 19, had 32 disposals, 17 contested possessions, five marks, nine clearances and seven inside-50s in a brilliant first showing at the elite level.
