Division 1 U18 Championships kick off

This weekend is the first step for many U18 footballers towards draft day in late November with the start of the Division 1 NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Congratulations goes to each player selected to represent the state at U18 level, with the two AFL Victoria Academy teams – reigning champions Vic Country and Vic Metro – having named their final squads.

We once again thank Dairy Australia for its support of our Academy program courtesy of their Legendairy campaign.

Over recent years we have seen a number of players highlight why they are touted as high draft selections with dominant performances at the Championships, like Larke Medal winners Christian Petracca (Eastern Ranges) and Josh Schache (Murray Bushrangers).

The Championships have also been the making of a number of players who have performed strongly on the national stage to help raise their names into draft conversations.

For those players not selected in the final squads, you only need to look at the likes of Morrish Medal winner Clayton Oliver, who did not play at the Championships but was drafted at pick four from the Murray Bushrangers, as well as Gippsland Power player Tom Papley, who was rookie-listed by the Sydney Swans. Both have been NAB AFL Rising Star nominees this season, proving there are a number of pathways to the elite level.

The time and dedication displayed by every member of the team on and off the field should be recognised, as you represented your club and competition with distinction.

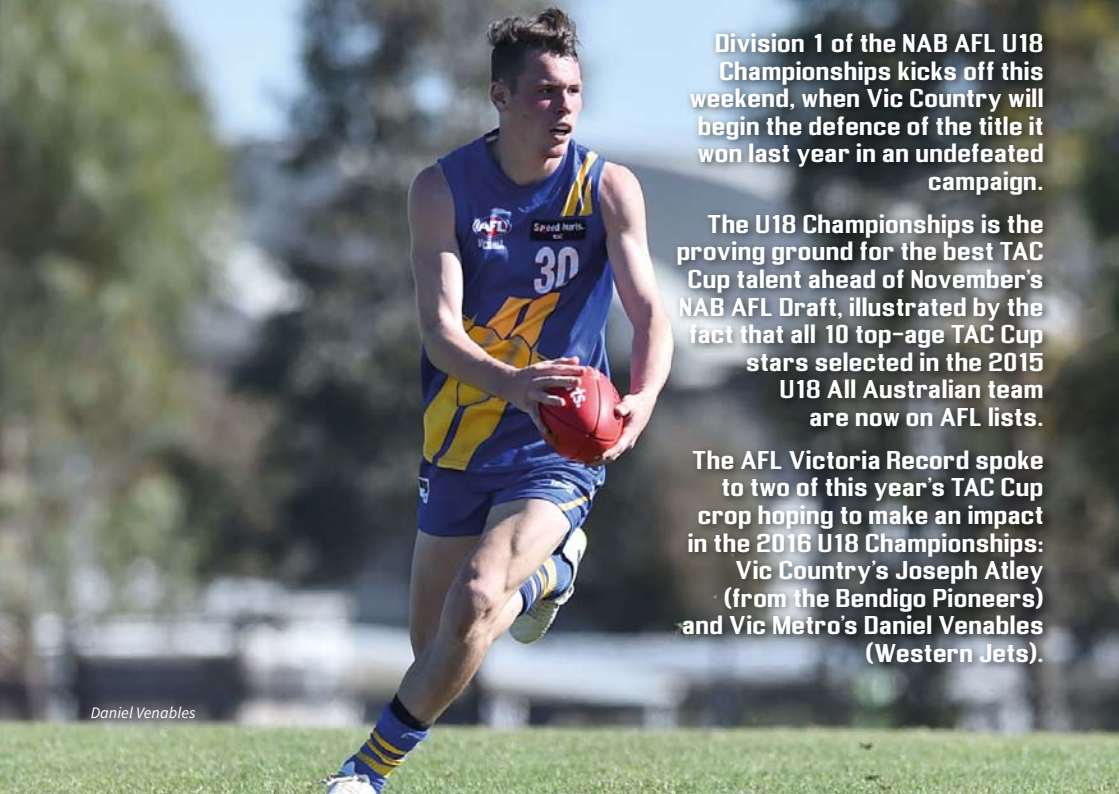

Next generation on show

Division 1 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships kicks off this weekend, when Vic Country will begin the defence of the title it won last year in an undefeated campaign.

The U18 Championships is the proving ground for the best TAC Cup talent ahead of November's NAB AFL Draft, illustrated by the fact that all 10 top-age TAC Cup stars selected in the 2015 U18 All Australian team are now on AFL lists.

The AFL Victoria Record spoke to two of this year's TAC Cup crop hoping to make an impact in the 2016 U18 Championships: Vic Country's Joseph Atley (from the Bendigo Pioneers) and Vic Metro's Daniel Venables (Western Jets).

Joseph Atley is one of four TAC Cup club captains selected in the Vic Country squad, but the Bendigo Pioneers midfielder will be happy to simply lead by his actions at the U18 Championships.

Fellow TAC Cup skippers Jarrod Berry of the North Ballarat Rebels and Ben Ainsworth from the Gippsland Power have commanded the attention of many following stellar performances in the 2015 Championships that saw them named U18 All Australians.

Dandenong Stingrays co-captain Liam McKay has performed well under the radar this year, while Atley himself is only now emerging as the footballer he wants to be. He spent last year playing multiple positions for the Pioneers but has settled into his preferred role as a hard-nosed inside midfielder in 2016.

Without as many runs on the board as some of his contemporaries, the 17-year-old from Rochester plans to let his football do the talking over the next month.

“Last year the Pioneers started me on a half-back flank and then I played a bit of midfield later on,” Atley said. “This year I’ve been pretty much just a midfielder and pushed forward a little bit more and kicked a few goals (five in seven games), which is something I’ve tried to work on.

“(Vic Country coach) Paul Henriksen said he’ll use me pretty much as an inside midfielder. Get the ball and give it to the blokes on the outside of the contest – that’s pretty much my job.

“I just like to play hard, tough football and hopefully others follow.”

Atley’s ability as an inside midfielder makes him

a different player to his brother Shaun, who’s established himself as a skilful running defender at North Melbourne.

Joe Atley is thankful it’s difficult to directly compare him to his brother and would rather model his game on Shaun’s Kangaroos teammate Ben Cunnington, one of the AFL’s clearance kings.

Despite Shaun having experience in elite-level finals, the seemingly unflappable Joe said he wouldn’t need much advice from his brother on handling the big stages of the U18 Championships.

“Because I’ve played in the U16 Championships (in 2014), I probably know what to expect (in the U18 Championships),” Atley said. “I know it’s hard to say because it’s another step up, but you’ve kind of got an idea of what it’s going to be like.

“I don’t usually ask Shaun for much advice. He usually gets home and we like driving around in the paddock on the farm and just getting away from footy.

“He pretty much just says to enjoy your footy. You don’t play it forever, so if you’re not enjoying it, what’s the point?”

Atley should certainly enjoy getting hands dirty alongside the likes of Berry, Ainsworth and Murray Bushrangers midfielder Will Brodie, as he did at the U16 Championships in 2014.

Back then, a core group of Country players who now find themselves reunited for the U18 Championships defeated Vic Metro and lost by eight points or less to South Australia and Western Australia.

That form indicates an improved Joe Atley and his mates won’t be far off the pace again.

Daniel Venables, meanwhile, comes into Vic Metro's U18 Championships campaign feeling much healthier than he has at times over the last year.

The Western Jets mid-forward is finally logging consistent game time after a 2015 season cut short by a broken leg and then hip surgery. The 17-year-old is using the chance to show the football world how dangerous he can be, booting six goals in two games for Western as a midfielder and also impacting the scoreboard playing school football for Penleigh and Essendon Grammar (PEGS).

Venables was playing for Vic Metro as an over-ager at the AFL U16 Championships last July when he broke his leg in the last minute and a half of the team's first game of the carnival.

"It was pretty devastating," Venables said. "It was hard to get my head around it at the start, but I had some good people around me. I guess I just came to the realisation there's a lot worse that could've happened in life.

"That ended my season right then, and I had hip surgery (for a previous condition) straight after I got out of the cast. I was out for about six and a half months and by January I was back in full training.

"I got myself a running coach and I was doing running sessions while everyone was on a break through Christmas to build up the strength in my hip. I think I'm a bit quicker now because of it.

"As I was out for so long, I feel I'm refreshed now. I'm feeling good enough to hopefully peak for the U18 Championships."

Venables thinks Vic Metro coach David Flood will

use him more in the forward line during the U18 Championships, where the hard-nosed but skilful ball user can impact the scoreboard.

He hopes to emulate fellow Keilor junior, Vic Metro representative and 2014 Western Jets graduate Jayden Laverde (now at Essendon) in terms of his on-field versatility.

"I love watching Jayden play," Venables said. "I first played in the TAC Cup when I was 16 so I played a couple of games with him (in 2014), and he went to PEGS as well.

"He's a little bit taller than me (Laverde is 190cm, Venables 186cm), but we play in the forward line and we can both go into the midfield as well and use our speed.

"I don't really feel like I have a main position yet, so I'm happy to swap around and I like playing both positions. I'm a hybrid, so I can be flexible."

Venables' flexibility extends not just across the football field, but across sports too – he was a star junior cricketer who represented Victoria at U15 level.

Like many multi-talented youngsters, Venables eventually had to make a decision about which sport to pursue. But with Australian Football Hall of Fame member Johnny Lewis as his great-grandfather and 1960s North Melbourne player Fred Robinson as his grandfather, he said the decision to choose football was "kind of natural".

Venables will now be hoping his performances at the U18 Championships demonstrate he made a wise decision.

Pair of Gulls hit the ton

2015 Williamstown premiership teammates Nick Meese and Ed Carr will celebrate their 100th Peter Jackson VFL games when the Seagulls face Footscray at Whitten Oval on Sunday.

The AFL Victoria Record talked to each of them about their journeys to the milestone and what may still lie ahead.

Meese, 27, emerged from the Northern Knights and started his VFL journey at the Northern Blues. He crossed to Williamstown ahead of the 2014 season where he has twice been selected as the VFL Team of the Year ruckman.

Carr, 25, was a Gippsland Power junior who moved to Melbourne and has made his living in football as a hard-nosed midfielder.

Firstly, what are your thoughts on your fellow milestone man as a footballer and a person?

Nick Meese: “Ed’s very old school, tough as nails. I probably am too – that’s why we get along! A very proud Maffra boy, as he keeps telling everyone. He’s just a knockabout bloke, very professional about his footy but definitely pretty old school – ‘see ball, get ball’ and attack it pretty hard.”

Ed Carr: “Nick’s always upbeat and loves a joke. He loves a beer after the game as well, so I got along

with him no problems at all. Once you get on the track, he’s as serious as they come and always striving to make us better as a midfield group. He spends about five minutes doing his hair in the mirror before the game and at half time though – he might seem like a big tough guy, but he loves looking at himself in the mirror.”

What were you hoping to accomplish when you started out in the VFL? Was playing 100 games even a consideration?

NM: “My dad is a life member at the Northern Bullants and my grandfather played there briefly as well, so the second I finished in the TAC Cup I said: ‘Oh well, I’m off to the Bullants. Let’s see how we go.’ I still remember a few years into my VFL playing days, I was looking at the older blokes saying: ‘Geez, they’ve played 100 games and are still playing seniors every week.’ I didn’t think I’d ever get there.”

EC: “It not once crossed my mind that I’d stay so long at Williamstown. I suppose as an 18-year-old I was a bit upset I didn’t get drafted – footy was the world to me – so I was more worried about which would be the best club to go to for getting on an AFL list. As I got older I became more aware of where I really stood as a footballer and by the time I got to age 21 or 22, I really started enjoying my footy and realised playing at the top level wasn’t everything. That’s what Williamstown taught me – striving to play the best footy I could play at a great club was really what I wanted to do.”

Which personal traits and skills do you think have allowed you to play 100 VFL games?

NM: "I'm pretty stubborn and very competitive. With me, enough's probably never enough. 50 games was the first aim, then I got there and said: 'What do I do now? I'll just get to 100.'"

EC: "Probably just resilience and grinding away at it. I'm not the flashiest player and I think my coach would tell you the same thing. If he gives me a job, I'll do the job. I'm just there for the team – I'm not going to win you the game every week, but I'll do what has to be done so someone else can do the flashy stuff."

What have been the biggest changes for you personally over the journey?

NM: "People would probably argue differently, but I think I've gotten more professional the older I get. I don't think about footy too much – well I do, but I go out and my role's pretty simple. I go to the stoppages, tap it, tackle some people and move on. That was my nickname at the Northern Blues – 'tap and wrap'. They don't exactly call me 'tap and wrap' at Williamstown but they've pretty well cottoned on that that's all I do."

EC: "I think I've matured a lot and footy's not

everything for me anymore. It's not something that's do-or-die for me and it doesn't set my mood. If I have a bad game, I don't worry about it anymore – I've got other things going on in life."

What has been your most memorable on-field moment?

NM: "Hands down, the flag last year. That was just the greatest thing and everything I wanted. Also in 2011 at Northern – after coming back from a year in local footy at West Preston – cracking into the senior team and playing a full year was a great experience. It was the same at Williamstown – by that stage I'd played 50 VFL games, but when I first got there I was the new bloke who had to earn respect from teammates and supporters, so playing some decent footy and getting people to really acknowledge you and like you for the effort you put in was quite a good feeling."

EC: "Obviously last year's premiership stands out as one of the best things that's happened to me in my footy career. It was an incredible year, an incredible day. But also in 2013 when we were aligned with the Western Bulldogs, from midway through the season we had to win every game to make the finals and we won nine or ten in a row to get there. In the end, Geelong beat us in the preliminary final."

Is there a particularly embarrassing or funny moment that sticks out in your mind?

NM: "I did a pretty shocking kick in my first season at Williamstown (2014) in the preliminary final. The game was in the balance against Box Hill, it dribbled into the middle of the ground and they ran in and kicked a goal. In the end we lost the game (by seven points). That gets brought up a bit."

EC: "Footy trips are always the highlight of the year. We have a mantra – the mantra is: 'Play hard and don't miss a footy trip night', and that's what I like to stick to."

What do you still hope to achieve in the VFL and what might the future hold?

NM: "The older I get, the more it's just about team success. I want to be in a top-four side for as long

as I play because that gives you a good chance to have a crack at a flag. I'm also a plumber, and I'm not very smart so I don't see that changing any time soon! I'm working with the old man and hopefully later in life I have my own business once the VFL commitments die down."

EC: "We had this conversation with (coach) Andrew Collins not long ago and we spoke about how 'good' VFL teams might win a premiership – and the undefeated Port Melbourne team of 2011 was a good team, but they only won one premiership. We want to be known as a team that's won two or three premierships and makes people look back and think: 'Gee, that was an incredible team.' Outside of footy, I'm hoping to finish my honours in electrical engineering at the end of the year and then move into engineering professionally."

VFL unable to overcome SANFL

Victoria's run of outs against the Croweaters has continued, with the Peter Jackson VFL going down to the SANFL by 19 points at Adelaide Oval on Sunday.

The VFL was unable to stop runs of goals from the SANFL in the second and third terms, as the home team made the visitors pay for regular turnovers across half forward in its 16.10 (106) to 13.9 (87) win.

The VFL's drought against the SANFL stretches back to 2002, having now lost the last four encounters staged between the traditional rivals.

Williamstown premiership midfielder Michael Gibbons was named the Frank Johnson Medal winner as the VFL's best player for his 34-disposal performance.

Werribee captain Michael Sodomaco (24 disposals, one goal) and North Ballarat's 2015 J. J. Liston Trophy winner Nick Rippon (23 disposals, three goals) were also prominent, while Footscray duo Will Hayes (21 disposals, two goals) and Jordan Russell (18 disposals, 10 marks) performed well.

In a tight first quarter, Williamstown's Sam Dunell set the tone early with a goal on the run, but the SANFL was quick to answer with two consecutive majors from set shots. The smalls took over up forward for the remainder of the term, with Willie Wheeler (Williamstown), Hayes and Ben Cavarra (Frankston) nailing goals on the run as the Victorians went into the first change 13 points down.

The VFL started strongly in the second quarter but was unable to convert in front of goal. Missed opportunities opened the door for the SANFL, who booted four goals for the term to jump out to a 25-point lead at half time.

The third quarter again started positively for the VFL with Gibbons adding an early goal to his 18 first-half disposals.

But the SANFL again found loose players up forward to spark a four-goal run and jump out to a match-high 43-point lead. However, Khan Haretuku (Port Melbourne) and Rippon kicked goals early in time-on to reduce the deficit to 30 at three-quarter time.

An early surge was needed in the final term and was duly provided through goals to Werribee duo Sodomaco and Matt Hanson, and suddenly the margin was down to 19 points at the 15-minute mark. But that was as close as the VFL got, the SANFL finding a reply to each further goal to seal a 19-point win.

Darebin has continued its unbeaten run in 2016 by defeating old rivals Diamond Creek at CT Barling Reserve, but had to pull out all stops to overcome the gritty Creekers by 17 points.

The Falcons were wrong-footed by Diamond Creek's ferocious attack on the ball and bold style of play early and were slow to acclimatise to the unexpectedly tight contest. Accurate disposal however proved the key for the Falcons, enabling them to find avenues to goal and eventually outlast their opponents, running out winners 8.10 (58) to 6.5 (41), as Callum O'Connor reports.

Champion Falcons full forward Katie Brennan stood up when her side needed her, finishing with five goals (including all four of Darebin's second-half majors) to continue her white-hot 2016 form.

Elise O'Dea was best-on-ground in her 50th match while the Falcons could always rely on the inside grunt of Sarah Hammond and the dynamic Lauren Arnell.

Led by a sterling ruck performance from Al Downie against her much-vaunted opponent Norieul Kinross, Diamond Creek's midfield fought all day to win the clearance contest. The hard-nosed Shae Audley and Millie Barden were excellent extractors.

Although Darebin playing coach Jane Lange conceded her side had struggled without the on-field leadership of Daisy Pearce (who was rested), she was quick to point out that the win was the fourth time this season the Falcons have overcome challenges to steady.

"In that last quarter, our girls took it upon themselves to stand up," said Lange. "And Katie Brennan, she gets everything, defenders just batter her and she comes through. I can't fault her."

In other results:

- St Kilda's Moana Hope closed in on 50 goals for the season (44) with her second double-digit haul in 2016, kicking 16 goals against Knox in a big 176-point win.
- Melbourne Uni ran away from VU Western Spurs in the second half, kicking six goals to two to record a 33-point victory. Emma Kearney and debutant Deanna Berry kicked three each, with the game available to replay on vfl.com.au.



- An eight-goal-to-nil first term helped set up the Eastern Devils' 138-point win over Cranbourne, Jaimee Lambert leading the way with four goals. The win creates a two-game gap between the Devils in fourth and Diamond Creek in fifth.

One game completes Round 7 with Geelong v Seaford, while a number of VFL Women's players will line up for the Western Bulldogs against WA – both games being played on Sunday.

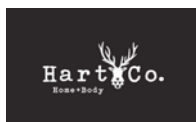

Round 8 Highlights

Falcons take top spot

Round 8 was the last chance for clubs to chalk up a win before their top-end talent is called on to represent Vic Country or Vic Metro at the NAB AFL U18 Championships throughout June.

It was particularly important for the **Dandenong Stingrays** and **Geelong Falcons**, who clashed at Shepley Oval for top spot on the ladder. Dandenong was the TAC Cup's top-ranked defensive team in terms of points conceded before Sunday's match, but gave up 130 of them in a comprehensive 44-point loss to Geelong – the competition's no.1 team for points scored.

The Falcons shocked the Stingrays from the outset, piling on five goals to none in the first quarter and never relenting. It was their sixth consecutive win following a loss to the Murray Bushrangers in Round 2, while Dandenong suffered a second straight defeat after a close loss the previous week, also to Murray.

The **Bushrangers**, meanwhile, overtook the Stingrays to claim second spot on the ladder with a 22-point win over the **Oakleigh Chargers** and set up another big clash with Geelong in Round 9.

The opening quarter proved decisive for the Bushrangers at Warrawee Park on Saturday, Murray booting three goals to one to establish a 13-point lead at the first break. That advantage would prove a welcome buffer when a torrential downpour affected play late in the match.

The Chargers are now 4-4 and only one game ahead of the Bendigo Pioneers and Western Jets in eighth and ninth – two teams that prevailed impressively in Round 8.

The **Pioneers** caused a minor boilover at Queen Elizabeth Oval, leading throughout to topple the **Sandringham Dragons** by 35 points – a team that had lost only once before Saturday's game.

The Pioneers stunned the Dragons early, keeping their opponents goalless in the first term en route to opening up a four-goal advantage they wouldn't relinquish.

The **Jets** backed up a win over the Pioneers in Round 7 with a tense two-point triumph over the **Calder Cannons** in tough conditions at Burbank Oval last week.

Western headed into the final term with a 22-point lead but saw it eroded within 11 minutes as the Cannons – who had booted only three goals before that point – slammed on four unanswered majors. Brandon Lester put the Jets back in front with a late set-shot goal and his team hung on desperately until the final siren.

The loss saw Calder fall out of the top eight and slip below Western into 10th position with a record of 2-6.

The **North Ballarat Rebels** continued their winning ways against the **Eastern Ranges** at Box Hill City Oval, claiming a fifth consecutive win by eight points, having started the season 0-3.

The Rebels are now knocking on the door of the top four after holding off a gallant Ranges outfit that fought back from a 37-point deficit during the second quarter to close to within two points late in the final term. Eastern is now 4-4, but boasts a superior percentage to any of the teams below it on the ladder.

In Round 8's final game, the **Gippsland Power** finally got on the board in 2016, defeating fellow one-win team the **Northern Knights** by 28 points at Morwell Recreation Reserve.

U18 Champs Vic Country squad

The 36-player 2016 Vic Country squad that will attempt to defend last year's NAB AFL U18 Championships title has been announced. (See the squad below.)

Geelong vs Murray for top spot

The Murray Bushrangers are the only team to defeat the Falcons this season and will look to do so again at Rams Arena. Consecutive victories over Dandenong and the Oakleigh Chargers has set Murray up for a crack at first position.

Potent Power on the board

The Gippsland Power chalked up their first win of 2016 against the Northern Knights last week on the back of some real potency inside 50.

Gippsland led from start to finish to prevail by 28 points in Morwell, despite being beaten by the Knights at the contests (-5 in the clearance and contested possession counts), with the ball in hand (-81 in the disposal count) and without the ball (-4 in the tackle count).

But when the Power did gain possession, they were powerful indeed.

The home team put a score on the board 62 per cent of the time they went inside 50 (30 scoring shots from 48 entries), clearly better than Northern's strike rate of 40 per cent (17 scoring shots from 42 entries).

A big factor in that potency was Gippsland's method of moving the ball, recording a kick-to-handball ratio of 2:1. The Knights did things in stark contrast, however, playing on from a mark whenever possible and recording a kick-to-handball ratio of 0.94:1.

That higher-risk game style didn't come off on Sunday though, with the Power – and leading goalkickers Anthony Young and Nathan Voss (three majors each) – better rewarded for their long, direct ball movement.

Casey dismantles the Box

The Casey Scorpions must surely be seen as worthy ladder leaders after statistically dominating the Box Hill Hawks in their seven-point victory two weeks ago.

Box Hill was the top-ranked team in the VFL for uncontested possessions and uncontested marks before the Round 7 clash, but the stingy Scorpions kept the Hawks to 86 fewer uncontested possessions and 59 fewer uncontested marks than their previous averages.

Casey has made its living this season on being in the competition's top two for contested possessions, hard-ball gets and clearances per game. However, it's also attacking the opposition on the rare occasions it hasn't won the ball in close, ranking no.1 for tackles per game.

That manic pressure took away the time and space Box Hill uses to carve through defences with precision passing by foot, and duly rewarded the Scorpions with a win as well as plenty of respect.

The key to the **Geelong Falcons'** comprehensive defeat of the Dandenong Stingrays in a battle for top spot was how they denied their opponents the ball. The Falcons limited the Stingrays to just 235 disposals – 87 less than their own count. No Dandenong player had more than 21 touches, while Geelong's **James Worpel** had a field day with 30 – and that's not to mention his 11 inside-50s, nine clearances and a goal.

The VFL Dreamtime game between **Essendon** and Richmond was a low-scoring slog, and with many statistical indicators relatively even, it was the Bombers' willingness to tackle that helped get them over the line. Essendon had 28 more tackles than the Tigers in difficult conditions at Punt Road Oval, with second-gamer **Chris Peart** leading the way with 14 – six more than anyone else on the ground.

In the same week he was named in the Vic Country squad for the AFL U18 Championships, **Kayle Kirby** had a massive influence inside 50 in the **Bendigo Pioneers'** victory over the Sandringham Dragons. Kirby booted six of his team's 13 goals, and to illustrate exactly how dangerous he was, he only had 12 disposals for the match – that's a major every two touches.

Lewis laps up 250th

Jordan Lewis representing Vic Country in 2004

Former Geelong Falcons midfielder Jordan Lewis celebrated his 250th AFL match in style in Hawthorn's 48-point defeat of Brisbane in Round 10.

Lewis, 30, had a game-high 42 disposals, as well as six marks, nine clearances, six inside-50s and a goal as the stand-in captain for injured skipper Luke Hodge. The respected Hawks leader is one of the club's most decorated players, winning four premierships in 2008 and 2013-15. He was also named in the 2014 All Australian team and won Hawthorn's best and fairest the same year.

The Warrnambool junior was taken by the Hawks at pick no.7 in the 2004 AFL Draft following a stellar season at the Falcons that saw him selected in the TAC Cup Team of the Year.

Ex-**Dandenong Stingrays** defender **Shane Savage** played his 100th AFL game last week, having 22 disposals and five marks in St Kilda's 34-point victory over Fremantle.

Savage, 25, was originally selected by Hawthorn at pick no.75 in the 2008 AFL Draft and played 56 games for the Hawks before being traded to the Saints ahead of the 2014 season.

Former **Murray Bushrangers** midfielder **Jack Crisp** also brought up a milestone in Round 10, playing his 50th match in Collingwood's 21-point loss to the Western Bulldogs. Crisp, 22, had 23 disposals, seven marks and seven tackles on the day.

The Myrtleford junior won Murray's best and fairest award and was named in the TAC Cup Team of the Year before being taken by Brisbane at pick no.40 in the 2011 Rookie Draft. He played 18 games for the Lions before being traded to the Magpies, where he finished third in the best and fairest award in his first season at the club last year.

Byrne-Jones bags Rising Star nom

Former Oakleigh Chargers small defender Darcy Byrne-Jones was named the Round 10 nominee for the NAB AFL Rising Star award.

Byrne-Jones, 20, impressed with 23 disposals at 78 per cent efficiency, eight marks and a goal in Port Adelaide's 45-point defeat of Melbourne. He made his AFL debut in Round 3 and has played all eight games since, averaging almost 18 disposals per game and regularly showing toughness in spite of his 181cm/75kg frame.

The Camberwell junior was selected by Port Adelaide with pick no.52 in the 2013 NAB AFL Draft and had to bide his time before breaking into the Power's senior side.

Meanwhile, former **Box Hill Hawks** and **Oakleigh Chargers** key defender **Sam Collins** broke through for his AFL debut in Fremantle's 34-point loss to St Kilda in Round 10. Collins, 21, had 12 disposals, seven marks and five one-percenters replacing the injured Alex Pearce.

The Donvale junior was taken as a mature-age recruit at pick no.55 in the 2015 AFL Draft after being part of the Box Hill team that made last year's VFL Grand Final.

Ex-**Bendigo Pioneers** midfielder/defender **Tom Cole** also played his first game at the elite level last week, having 14 disposals and four marks in West Coast's 77-point win against Gold Coast.

Cole, 19, was selected by the Eagles with pick no.36 in the 2015 AFL Draft after a stellar season as a ball-winning midfielder that saw him named in the TAC Cup Team of the Year. The Sandhurst product had previously played as a rebounding defender, and took up that role in several impressive performances for Geelong at VFL level last year.

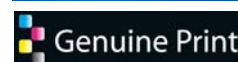
