Kangaroos v Warrnambool

In round six we hosted Warrnambool on another perfect day for football. Both the under 18.5s and reserves started the day off well for us with good wins to go into the Interleague break 3-3. The senior game unfortunately did not bring the same result as Warrnambool demonstrated why they have been such a strong team over a long period of time. We fumbled the footy and let ourselves down with our ball use, Warrnambool making us pay on the scoreboard for every mistake. At half-time we were eight goals down and in need of a 'spark'. A goal in the first 20 seconds after the main break looked like the perfect start, but then the Blues took control again; and despite our backline working overtime and fighting it out to the end, Warrnambool had too many options, and all the momentum, their 'forward entries' being much more regular and cleaner than ours; generally playing a great brand of football, to eventually take the game by fifteen goals. It was a game that we can take a number of lessons from, in particular focussing on stronger tackling, cleaner in our 'ball handling' and being more prepared to provide protection for our team mates. Hopefully we can tidy up these areas, to play the high pressure, hard running football that we have already shown we are capable of.

Kangaroos v Pt. Fairy

We headed into the game with two big 'outs' Kane Uebergang with work commitments for three weeks and Josh Pepper who has moved to Mildura also due to work related issues. Josh has been cleared to South Mildura but we hope to gain Josh's services for one or two games before the end of the season. Pt. Fairy had control of the game in the opening ten minutes, kicking the first three goals through hard running and our lack of accountability; and to make matters worse Luke Uebergang injured his knee early in the game. We steadied in the middle part of the quarter with Brady Hicks working hard through the mid-field; and sixteen year old Tom Scott presenting well across half-forward, however Pt. Fairy finished the term strongly to hold a five goal lead. The second quarter was better for us, a bit of an 'arm wrestle' for the first few minutes before we started to control play for a 10-12 minute patch where we had some good passages of play before Port kicked away again late in the quarter to hold a forty point half-time lead. The third term was arguably our worst for the season. We turned the ball over far too easily, our defensive pressure dropped off and it was hard to find any positives after Pt. Fairy had 14 scoring shots to our 1. At three quarter time the message was simple - go back to basics and

double our efforts. The final term did bring some better signs, a dramatic increase in effort that we were looking for, led by Jarrod O'Brien's attack on the ball and fierce tackling. Hopefully we can find that sort of energy from the opening bounce today. Eighteen year old Jack Sutherland played his best game on Saturday kicking three goals, presenting well and using the ball to advantage. Angus Noske also performed well, with plenty of run off half-back and attacking the ball with purpose. On top of Luke Uebergang's injury Nathan Curtis found out on Monday that he had a fracture in his back. This injury occurred in the practice match against Ararat, meaning that he has been playing in some discomfort for the seven rounds. Nathan is likely to be out of action for about a month. We wish them both well and hope to see them back soon. Sadly we say farewell to Paul Cox, who has headed home after some pretty impressive performances in the opening part off the season. Everyone will be looking forward to having Paul and Kamus Gordon back later in the year.
