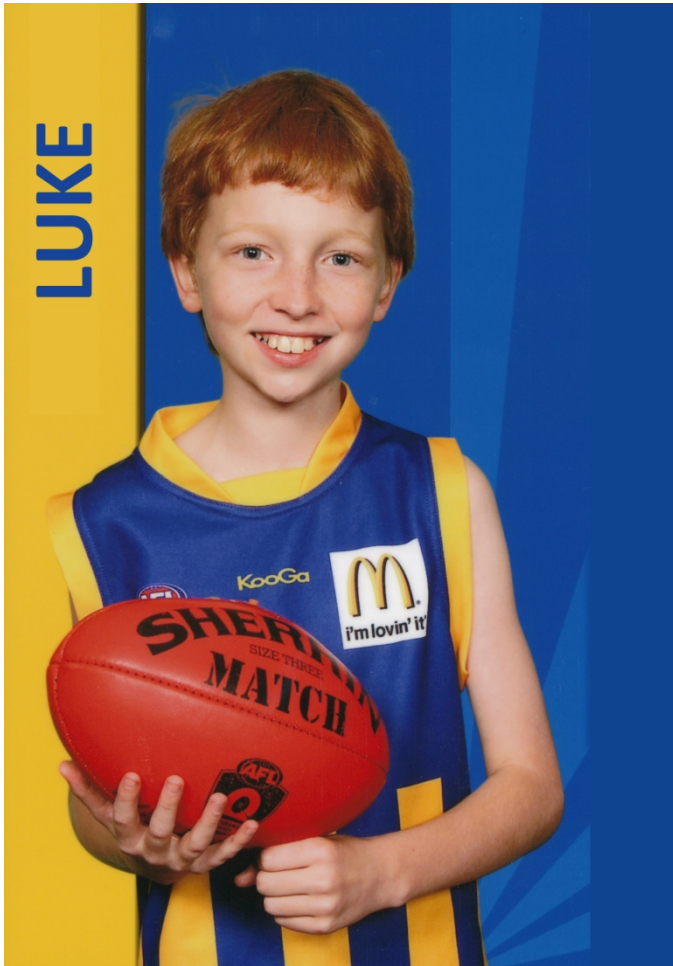




## UMPIRE OF THE WEEK
