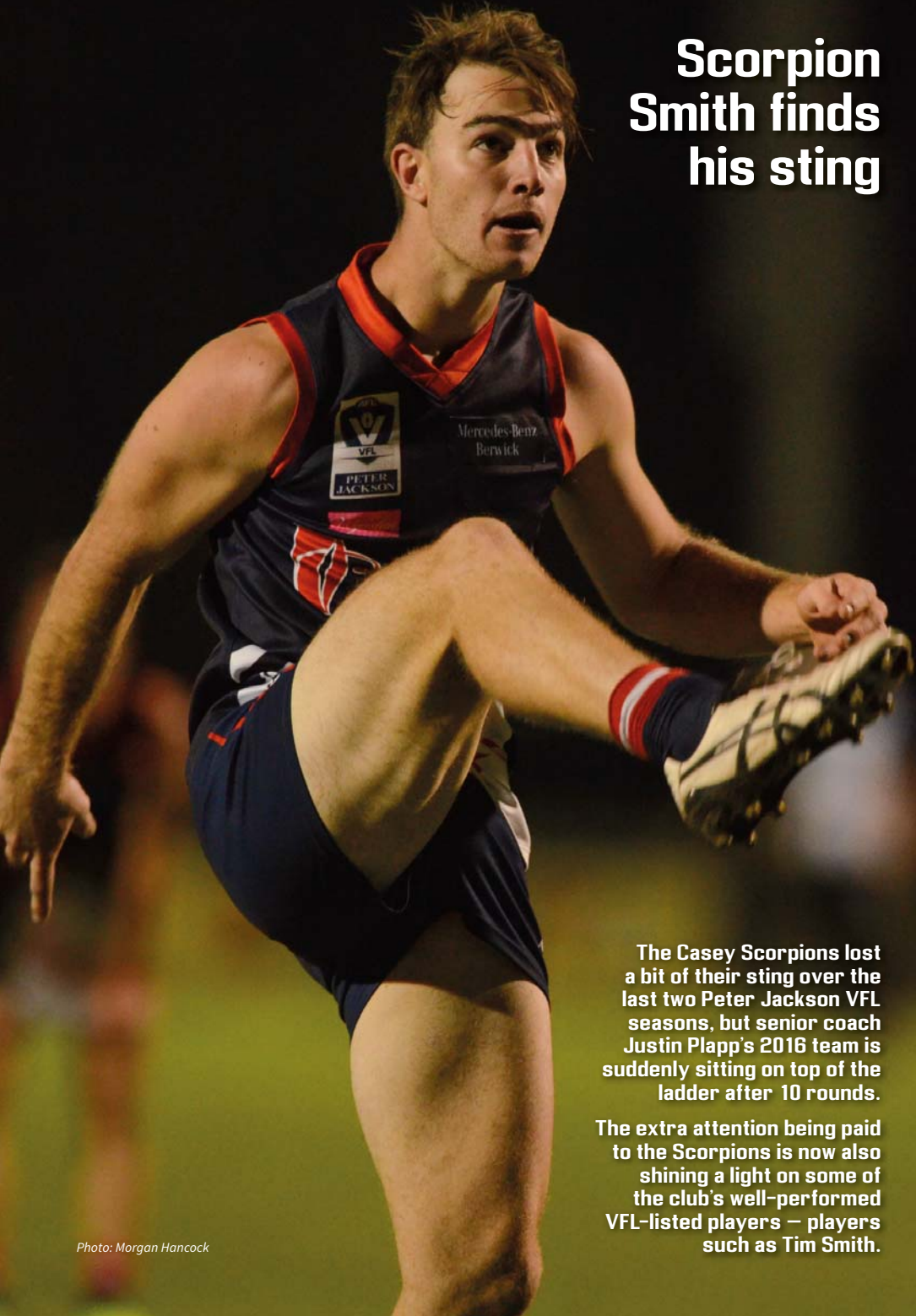

Scorpion Smith finds his sting



The Casey Scorpions lost a bit of their sting over the last two Peter Jackson VFL seasons, but senior coach Justin Plapp's 2016 team is suddenly sitting on top of the ladder after 10 rounds.

The extra attention being paid to the Scorpions is now also shining a light on some of the club's well-performed VFL-listed players – players such as Tim Smith.

At just 25 years of age, Smith is Casey's oldest VFL-listed player and the club's only current 50-gamer following the departures of veterans such as former captain Evan Panozza, Mitch Gent and Will Petropoulos over the off-season.

He joined the Scorpions in 2012 from Upper Ferntree Gully in the Eastern Football League – where he was part of a senior premiership team as a 19-year-old – and promptly played 16 senior games in a year when Casey won the minor premiership.

Smith has been with the club from the relative highs of 2012 through some leaner years more recently and says its AFL alignment with Melbourne has never been stronger.

"That alignment is really a key to our success I reckon," Smith said. "The systems put in place to have a real 'one club' mentality between Casey and Melbourne have advanced tenfold since 2012.

"The guys at Melbourne are obviously invested and they want to succeed, and the guys at Casey are well experienced and want to win. Everyone wants to get to the same goal.

"It's also about just taking a general interest in what everyone's doing around the club. So if guys get senior selection in the AFL, the Casey guys might send them a message or get in contact with them and congratulate them. We're just trying to reach each other on a more personal level.

"It's definitely something Justin Plapp's really worked hard on and all credit to him – he's done a bloody good job because it's working really well."

The success of the 'one club' mentality is now shining a light on the good form of players such as James Munro, Angus Scott and Smith, who said his football was benefiting from the emergence of several Demons key forwards around him.

192cm Smith spent much of his previous four seasons at Casey as a tall forward target – kicking 56 goals in 52 games – but with Melbourne key-position draftees Sam Weideman and Liam Hulett as well as a fit-again Chris Dawes drawing the ball, his on-field role has changed.

He's now playing smaller than previously, as part of the VFL's top-ranked forward line for goals and score

assists per game, and the third-ranked team for goals scored per entry inside 50. With 11 goals from seven games, Smith might just be playing the best football of his career.

"I'd say I am, yeah," he said.

"The biggest thing with VFL football is if you're not consistent, there's always pressure from guys playing in the Development League – especially at an aligned club. In past years my consistency has probably been up and down, whereas this year I'm able to play consistent footy week in week out.

"Our forward line is quite tall and you can't have five blokes jumping at the footy every game, so I've got a spot in there somewhere and maybe staying on the ground and putting on some tackle pressure is more my go.

"I'd like to think I'm playing my role in the team and that's contributing to us winning."

Off-field, Smith's personal development over his time with the Scorpions has translated into a role as vice-captain under club skipper Jack Hutchins.

"Being able to help the younger guys out as much as I can is something I pride myself on," Smith said.

"The leaders do a bit of mentoring around the club. We've got values that we instil and we try to drive to make the club as professional as can be.

"It's all about a team mentality and trying to work side by side with each other on and off the ground. That definitely makes it easier come game day to be able to perform to a high level."

Smith's high-level performances saw him selected in the VFL team that lost to the SANFL by 19 points in the state game two weeks ago. He thinks he "didn't do too bad" testing himself against the best, which is testament to how he's flourished over his VFL journey.

"I was always just thereabouts in junior footy; I wasn't a stand-out," Smith said.

"I tried out for the TAC Cup but I'd just started my plumbing apprenticeship and working full-time. I just wasn't committed to training or playing three nights a week at 17/18 years old so I went and played local footy at Upper Ferntree Gully.

"(After winning the senior premiership,) my decision to go to Casey was all about: 'How good could I actually be?' I wanted to test myself against the best and I want to be the best that I can be – I didn't want to regret not testing out how good I could've been."

While he may not have taken the usual path to high-level football, Tim Smith is now showing he can certainly mix it with the best the state has to offer.

Eagles flies south

Matthew Eagles has experienced a whirlwind migration to Victoria's cooler climate to play at North Ballarat in the Peter Jackson VFL this year.

The 26-year-old forward/ruckman enjoyed a 61-goal season for Yeronga South Brisbane in the Queensland Football Association in 2015, winning the QFA South competition's best and fairest award.

In February, the Adelaide native moved from Queensland down to Melbourne to feature in Foxtel's 'The Recruit', a 10-part reality television series that follows a group of local football players competing against each other for a guaranteed spot on an AFL club list.

With the 10 weeks of filming completed in May and a wait of several months before the winner is announced live on air, Eagles has joined the Roosters to continue his progression towards a potential AFL career.

"It's good to be playing at a higher level than I was back home," Eagles said.

"There's a bit more structure with game plans and just a bit more professionalism. I was only playing amateurs back in Queensland and having a muck-around, so it's good to be in a professional environment and focusing on footy a bit more.

"Getting used to the Ballarat weather will be a bit tricky though. It's a big change coming from Brisbane, so I've pretty much bought a new wardrobe."

Eagles signed with North Ballarat shortly before making his VFL debut three weeks ago when the Roosters lost to Port Melbourne by nine points at Eureka Stadium.

The 200cm, 99kg big man slotted in as ruck support for Orren Stephenson and Rowan Marshall, recording 11 disposals, 15 hitouts and a goal.

He said triple-premiership-winning ruckman Stephenson had helped him make an easy transition to the club and was helping him fine-tune his ruck craft.

That much was evident last week in Round 9 when Eagles had 13 disposals and kicked a remarkable goal out of mid-air in a ruck contest during a 27-point loss to the Box Hill Hawks.

"I felt comfortable with the team; I felt like I'd been playing there for a while," Eagles said after his debut game.

"The coaching staff were good and didn't put any pressure on me – they just said to have fun. It was a good standard of footy. There was a bit more space and the skills were a lot better (than in the QFA).

"I just need to get my head around the different game style. Back in Brisbane I was just sitting in the goal square and waiting for it to come to me pretty much."

While Eagles enjoyed an "unreal" experience as part of 'The Recruit' – receiving tutelage from legendary former AFL coach Mick Malthouse and ex-Hawthorn sharpshooter Ben Dixon – he said the biggest asset he could offer the Roosters and any interested AFL clubs was something that probably can't be taught.

"I learnt a lot from Ben Dixon in terms of skills and a little bit on my goalkicking... but he was really impressed with my aggression," Eagles said. "You can't really teach that.

"Obviously my height and ability is handy, but determination and aggression is something recruiters look for."

Zebras pip Cats in thriller

Sandringham again proved to be one of the Peter Jackson VFL's best last-quarter teams in Round 9, running over Geelong by two points in a thriller at Simonds Stadium.

The Zebras won a string of games coming from behind in final terms last year and their latest Houdini act could prove to be particularly important in their run towards finals. The win was Sandringham's fifth for 2016 and pushed it into the top four, while Geelong's fourth loss sees it stranded outside the top eight in 10th position.

The Zebras trailed the Cats by seven points at three-quarter time and hit the lead for the second time through a Nathan Wright goal at the 24-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Two more quick majors to captain Trent Dennis-Lane – who finished with a match-winning six-goal haul – and Tom Curren saw the lead grow to 14 points at the 27-minute mark, before late Geelong goals to Cory Gregson and Jake Edwards momentarily put Sandringham hearts in mouths.

21-year-old Timm House experienced a bitter-sweet VFL debut as the Cats' 23rd player, kicking five goals in the heart-breaking loss.

Hellier breaks Pies games record

Collingwood captain Jack Hellier broke Kris Pendlebury's club games record in his 70th Peter Jackson VFL match against Werribee last week.

Pendlebury – the brother of Collingwood's AFL captain Scott – played 69 games for the Magpies from 2008-12 including three seasons as captain from 2010-12. He also won the club's best and fairest award and was named in the VFL Team of the Year in 2012.

Hellier, 27, was named Pendlebury's successor as skipper in 2013, his second season at the club after crossing from St Bedes-Mentone Tigers in the VAFA.

The 178cm hard-nut had 14 disposals and four clearances in Collingwood's 29-point victory over Werribee at Avalon Airport Oval and is enjoying an impressive season for the fifth-placed Magpies.

Channel 7 broadcast bonanza

Pies running hot

Collingwood's Peter Jackson VFL team has turned its season around with three straight wins against good opposition and now sits just outside the top four with five wins on the board.

The Magpies were 2-3 with a percentage of 67.1 after a 67-point loss to Sandringham in Round 5, but have since defeated Geelong, Williamstown and Werribee and lifted their percentage to 83.1.

Saturday's 29-point victory over the Tigers at Avalon Airport Oval was the perfect example of how senior coach Dale Tapping seems to have transformed his team's mindset.

Prior to Round 9, Collingwood ranked in the bottom six teams in the competition for hitouts, contested possessions and clearances per game, indicating an inability to win crucial contests. Werribee, meanwhile, ranked in the top six teams for all three measures.

Last week however, the Magpies got down and dirty in scrappy conditions, winning the hitout count by three, contested possessions by eight and clearances by 12. They also laid 90 tackles, 27 more than their previous average.

The Tigers ran headlong into a harder, tougher Collingwood outfit than has been seen this year and simply couldn't put a winning score on the board. Werribee was the second-ranked team for goals per inside-50 (28.5 per cent), but could only manage a major 20 per cent of the time they entered the attacking arc against the hot Pies.

Knights charge forward

A week after having their run-and-gun game style shut down in a loss to the Gippsland Power, the Northern Knights re-discovered their attacking mojo against the Western Jets in Round 9.

Against the Power, the Knights dominated the disposal count by moving the ball forward quickly by hand, recording more handballs than kicks and very high handball-receive numbers. However, their inability to convert on the scoreboard once inside 50 hurt them in the 28-point loss.

Things clicked in their 33-point win against the Jets at Burbank Oval though, despite Melbourne's wet weather potentially standing in the way of effective quick ball movement.

Coburg's Peter McEvoy was a major factor in the club's 33-point victory over Richmond at a soggy Piranha Park. On a day that certainly didn't favour 195cm marking forwards, the former Box Hill Hawk took 10 grabs – including a crucial four contested marks. McEvoy then capitalised on his aerial dominance with two straight goals.

169cm **Will Stephenson** had a monster game in **Gippsland Power's** 37-point loss to the North Ballarat Rebels, recording 37 disposals – eight more than any other player on the ground. The 17-year-old also had clear game-highs in kicks (31), contested possessions (20) and tackles (17), as well as an equal-game-high nine inside-50s.

The **Northern Blues** had 41 fewer disposals in their 40-point win against Frankston, but came out on top in the clearances and, as a result, inside-50s. No one was more important in the contests than Blues hard-nut **Mark Whiley**, who had clear game-highs in clearances (11) and contested possessions (20).

Western seemed to relish the conditions in the contests, winning 17 more contested possessions and 12 more clearances. But Northern took over outside congestion, recording 53 more uncontested possessions and 26 more handball-receives.

The Knights stayed true to their style, backing themselves to first win the ball back from the Jets and then fire it forward at speed, with Bobby Lamanna (11 handball receives) and Patrick Lipinski (10) the chief runners.

The Western Bulldogs made it two from two AFL Women's Exhibition Match wins in 2016, with a hard-fought 13-point victory over WA at Etihad Stadium on Sunday.

The Bulldogs overcame an inaccurate start and used the ball more effectively entering their 50m arc after quarter time to record an 8.5 (53) to 5.10 (40) win.

WA dominated the inside-50 count 47-28, but it was the work of Bri Davey (St Kilda), Karen Paxman (Darebin) and Nicola Stevens (Melbourne Uni) in defence that helped rebound the ball for the Bulldogs, along with Seaford's Kim Ebb playing a stopping role on the dangerous Chelsea Randall.

After a goalless first quarter, St Kilda's Mo Hope and Cranbourne's Bianca Jakobsson did the damage in the second term for the Bulldogs with two each, as they took the lead by 11 points at half time.

While the Western Bulldogs were down in the clearances, the work of Lauren Arnell (27 disposals, Darebin), Jaimee Lambert (19, Eastern Devils) and captain Steph Chiocci (18, Diamond Creek) around the ground helped push the ball forward.

Richelle Cranston (Geelong) kicked the only goal of the third term for the Bulldogs, as WA closed the gap to seven points at the final change.

However, the Bulldogs steadied in the final term, with Cranston kicking her second goal, Hope her third and Emma Kearney her first for a 13-point win.

The leading stats-winner on the day, Darebin Falcon Lauren Arnell, said it was pleasing to record back-to-back wins this year for the Bulldogs – and the first for the team at Etihad Stadium.

"It was very exciting and satisfying, but full credit to WA for some outstanding football and pushing us all the way," Arnell said.

"The centre bounce stats were huge in WA's favour and they had a lot of opportunities going inside 50, but our back line really stood up led by Bri Davey, Nic Stevens and Hannah Scott, plus Darcy Vescio in the second half after Meg Hutchins left the field through injury.

"They were just incredible and fought it out all day."

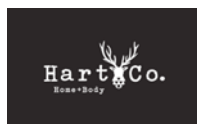

Round 9 Highlights

Cannon fires to down Oakleigh

A big goal haul from Calder Cannons forward Muhammad Saad helped his team jump into the TAC Cup top eight with a thrilling nine-point triumph over the Oakleigh Chargers at Rams Arena in Round 9.

The brother of Gold Coast's Adam Saad booted seven of Calder's nine goals for the match, playing an integral role in the Cannons recovering from a 35-point deficit during the second quarter.

A two-goal burst from Saad put Calder in front for the first time just before three-quarter time, while another two sealed the game after the Chargers had regained the lead early in the final term with their only major of the second half.

The Cannons jumped over the Bendigo Pioneers and Western Jets – who both lost last week – into eighth position with their third win of 2016, while seventh-placed Oakleigh dropped to a record of 4-5.

At the top end of the ladder, the **Geelong Falcons** came through a second consecutive battle for first position, grinding down the **Murray Bushrangers** to prevail by 14 points at Rams Arena.

Geelong has met all challenges put in front of it during a seven-game winning streak, including comprehensively knocking off the Dandenong Stingrays by 45 points away from home two weeks ago.

With players on both sides missing to Vic Country's squad for Round 1 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships, Murray – the only team to have beaten the Falcons this season – opened up a 17-point advantage early in the third quarter. However, the fighting qualities of Geelong soon emerged, drawing to within one point at the last change and continuing on with three goals to one in the final term to secure a 14-point victory.

The Bushrangers (6-2-1) dropped to fourth after the loss, now behind second-placed Dandenong (7-2) and the third-placed Sandringham Dragons (6-2-1), who both enjoyed victories in Round 9.

The **Stingrays** – missing the most players of any country-based TAC Cup team to Vic Country's U18 Championships squad – was inaccurate but did enough to defeat the **Pioneers** by 32 points in Echuca.

Dandenong could only manage 3.13 in the second half but retained enough control of the contest to consign Bendigo to ninth position with a record of 3-6.

The **Dragons**, meanwhile, dominated the **Eastern Ranges** throughout their clash at Box Hill City Oval to win by 43 points.

A seven-goal-to-two second quarter set up Sandringham's victory, with Eastern's loss opening up a two-game and percentage gap between the Ranges (4-5) in sixth and the North Ballarat Rebels (6-3) in fifth.

The **Rebels** had no problem accounting for the **Gippsland Power** by 37 points at North Port Oval, increasing their lead at every change to send the Power (1-8) back to the bottom of the ladder after notching their first win the previous week.

In Round 9's other match, the **Northern Knights** climbed out of the wooden-spoon position following their loss to Gippsland in Round 8 with a 33-point victory over the **Western Jets** (10th position, 3-6) at Burbank Oval.

Atkins promoted to VFL

Dandenong Stingrays ruckman Dylan Atkins was promoted to play for Frankston in the VFL last week.

The 198cm over-age player had five disposals in the Dolphins' 40-point loss to the Northern Blues at Ikon Park. He also played for the club's Development League team in a loss to Port Melbourne two weeks previously.

Atkins has averaged nine disposals and 21 hitouts per game across seven matches for the second-placed Stingrays in 2016 and was named Dandenong's best player in the Round 8 loss to the Geelong Falcons.

Country falls to WA at U18 Champs

Vic Country faded late in suffering a 61-point loss to Western Australia in Round 1 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships on Sunday.

Country – proudly supported by Dairy Australia – stuck with WA for the best part of three quarters at Domain Stadium in Perth, but three goals in the last two minutes of the third term and then seven goals to one in the final stanza saw the Sandgroppers run away with the 19.11 (125) to 10.4 (64) victory.

192cm **Dandenong Stingrays** forward **Josh Battle** kept Country in the game early, booting three goals in the last three minutes of the first quarter and another just after the resumption of play to give his team the lead.

WA hit back to lead by nine points at half time and responded emphatically when Country drew to within four points at the 20-minute mark of the third term.

North Ballarat Rebels midfielder **Hugh McCluggage** was a stand-out in defeat for Country with 27 disposals and six marks, while **Bendigo Pioneers** captain **Joseph Atley** did well in close with 22 disposals and five clearances.

Country's next-best ball-winners were **Dandenong** over-ager **Thomas Jok** (20 disposals, 11 contested possessions, six inside-50s and one goal), **Murray Bushrangers** hard-nut **Will Brodie** (16 disposals and one goal) and **Stingrays** on-baller **Myles Pohlke** (15 disposals, 10 contested possessions and two goals).

Country pipped its opponent in the disposal count but the game was lost at the coalface, with WA dominating contested possessions (+24), hitouts (+23) and clearances (+19). That dominance at the contests led to a lop-sided inside-50 count of 52-29, providing WA's forwards plenty of chances to hit the scoreboard.

The Big League

The AFL Victoria Record follows former TAC Cup and VFL players on their AFL journeys



Hawthorn triple premiership defender Josh Gibson – a former Oakleigh Chargers and Port Melbourne player – celebrated his 200th AFL game in Round 11.

Gibson, 32, was one of the Hawks' best players in their 16-point victory over Melbourne with 18 disposals, six marks, five rebound-50s and 10 one-percenters.

The East Burwood product was originally selected by North Melbourne with pick no. 7 in the 2005 Rookie Draft from the Borough and played 65 games for the Kangaroos before being traded to Hawthorn ahead of the 2010 season. Gibson has since played key defensive roles in the Hawks' 2013-15 premierships, won the club's best and fairest award in 2013 and 2015, and was named an All Australian in 2015.

Ex-Sandringham Dragons ruckman **Max Gawn** brought up a milestone in the same game, playing his 50th match in Melbourne's defeat. Gawn, 24, had eight disposals, 50 hitouts and four clearances against Hawthorn.

The 208cm big man was taken by the Demons at pick no. 34 in the 2009 AFL Draft and played only 26 games in his first five seasons due to form and injury issues. However, from midway through the 2015 season, Gawn has emerged as one of the league's dominant ruckmen.

Former **Dandenong Stingrays** defender **Nick Haynes** also played his 50th game for GWS last week. Haynes, 24, had 17 disposals, seven one-percenters and 14 rebound-50s in the Giants' 10-point loss to Geelong.

The Frankston Bombers junior won Dandenong's best and fairest award in 2011 before being selected by the Giants with pick no. 7 in that year's AFL Draft. While he has struggled for consistent game time, Haynes' ability to read the play has always stood out.

Josh and Jacob meet again

2015's top two NAB AFL Draft picks faced off at the elite level last week in Round 11, a year after also tussling in the TAC Cup.

Carlton's no. 1 pick Jacob Weirter – the former Dandenong Stingrays key defender – and Brisbane's no. 2 pick Josh Schache – the ex-Murray Bushrangers key forward – had long been touted as the top two picks before their teams met at Shepley Oval in July last year.

The Round 13 encounter occurred shortly after both players had helped Vic Country go through the NAB AFL U18 Championships undefeated, Weirter captaining Country and Schache winning the Larke Medal as Division 1's best player for his goalkicking exploits.

Weirter had the best of the match-up that day, recording 21 disposals, 12 marks and helping teammate Kieran Collins (now at the Western Bulldogs) keep Schache to 10 disposals and a goal.

Last week, the two star juniors met again in the big league when Carlton defeated Brisbane by 38 points at Etihad Stadium. Lined up on each other at times, Weirter arguably had the best of Schache once more, proving to be a wall in defence for the Blues with 24 disposals at 79 per cent efficiency and 14 marks. Schache, meanwhile, had nine disposals, took two marks and kicked 1.2.
