Representing Vic Metro is nothing new for Lachlan, Brock, Daniel and Oscar who have all represented Vic Metro in the U/16 National Championships previously. For Brodie and Wilson however this will be their first time in the big V.

Wilson Berry, Jets co-captain has earnt selection on the back of a fantastic bottom age year at the Jets where he was able to finish third in the Club's Barry Round Medal for the Best and Fairest player.

Lachlan Fogarty is one of only a handful of bottom aged players in the squad, Lachlan adds this to his already very impressive football resume.

Last but not least is Jets Co Captain Oscar Junker, Oscar had an interrupted pre season after injuring his shoulder but since his return in Round 3 has shown some fantastic signs playing in all three zones on the ground.

Good luck to all of the boys in their matches vs Vic Country on June 13th at Simmonds Stadium, on June 19th against South Australia at AAMI Stadium, against the Allies at Etihad Stadium on June 24th and against Western Australia on June 29th at Simonds Stadium.
