From Thursday to Sunday, the Queensland U12 State Carnival was held. The Wolves had 4 representatives in the carnival – three in the Met North team - Ryan Doolan, Rhys Syrett and Ethan Marsden and one in the Presidents Invitational team – Duncan Mc Cabe

The carnival was held in Hervey Bay and featured 12 teams across Queensland including another invitational team from the Islands north of the state.

The Met North team played eight games across the four days, winning 5 and coming 4th overall. The games included a tough opening game against the South Coast team that went through the carnival undefeated, good wins against the Met West, Peninsula and the Presidents team and a narrow loss to the runner up in Met East.

Ethan played around the mid field showing his usual tenacity for the ball, taking some good marks and feeding the forwards. Rhys played mostly in the backline, tackling well with some of his trademark running on show. Ryan also played a lot down back, with a good mark and kicked a few goals on the occasional move up forward. 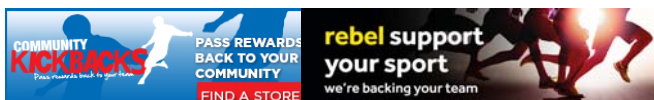
