The season started amid controversy over the application by Melton and Melton South to join the RDFL.

After much discussion and many meetings, the matter was resolved and clubs got down to the business of playing football.

The League had a new president, Cr. Doug. McIntyre of Monegeetta, a new vice-president, Cr. Jim Robson of Wallan, and a new secretary in Mr. John Karman of Sunbury.

After 30 years of service to the Riddell League and Association as a president, vice-president and secretary, Mr. Eric Boardman was defeated in the election for the presidency.

No man had served football in this district longer then Eric Boardman, and the fact that football has

The RDFL Independent Tribunal has met on over 20 occasions this season and the men deserve congratulating on the work carried out.

President Doug, McIntyre has been kept extremely busy all year with the appointment of independent goal and boundary umpires, and our panel must be the envy of many leagues.

The RDFL was surprisingly defeated by Panton Hills in the interleague match, as were the seconds and thirds.

Our record had been very impressive in the past and it would now appear that a squad will have to train together if we are to win next year.

During the season, a weekly highlight was the amazing performances of Wallan's Greg Wood.

He finished the season with 173 goals and established a VCFL record.

Riddell's Alan Retallick became the first player ever to win two consecutive Bowen medals.

His strong marking each week was a delight to watch.

Another star during the year was Melton's Terry Munday.

He won the "Regional" award for the best footballer in the league according to the votes of the goal and boundary umpires.
