Appendix A: Red Card Report – Quick Guide

When a referee is required to issue a red card and send a player from the field, it is very important that the referee completes the necessary post-match documentation. Players who are sent from the field are required to attend a judiciary hearing on the Monday night following the match, but without the necessary documentation this process cannot proceed. If the judiciary hearing does not go ahead, the offending player cannot be punished for their infringements.

The QRR Referee Report Red Card form that must be completed after sending a player from the field can be found in the Resource Library of the QRRRA website at the following link:

If the player is sent from the field on the report of an assistant referee, that assistant referee must complete a Touch Judge Report Red Card form which can also be found in the Resource Library. In these circumstances the match referee must still complete the Referee Report Red Card form, but should enter 'See assistant referee report' in the 'Report' section of the form.

Some elements of the report form are relevant to the exact time of the send-off, and may be difficult to recall after the game. To assist referees in recalling this information, a Red Card Report Quick Guide has been included at Appendix A, and can be kept in the referee's red/yellow card holder, to be completed at the time of the send-off.

For all competitions, Referee Report Red Card forms must be completed and emailed to admin@qrra.com.au by 0900 on the first business day (usually Monday) following the match. This ensures the judiciary has adequate time to prepare for the hearing. Send-off forms for senior competitions (Brisbane Premier, Premiership and Suburban) should also be emailed to michael.backstrom@redsrugby.com.au, and for Brisbane Junior Rugby Union competitions, to kim.schuck@redsrugby.com.au.

It is imperative that referees are familiar with the post-match process for player send offs, and complete the necessary documentation in accordance with these instructions.
