The Dragons surprised the Wolves by moving the ball very quickly. They won a couple of centre taps in a row and had a few goals up on the board. Alex completed a couple of goal saving tackles on the line and the Wolves awoke for the second half of the opening quarter. The rest of the first quarter was a tight tussle with strong tackles being applied by both sides.

The second quarter was the standout quarter of any game this team has played this season. Chris started with a great tap directly to Alex who promptly sent it sailing over the goal line. Less than half a minute and a goal in the bag. The centres had some more strong centre breaks with-in-roads into the forward zone. Matt had to show great strength to gather the ball, burst through the pack and score his maiden goal.

In the Third quarter the Wolves realised that they would have to be at their defensive best.
