

UMPIRE ACADEMY

2014 marks the fourth year of the SNSW Umpire Academy. Since its inception, the Umpire Academy has continued to build on very strong foundations to evolve and enhance umpire development opportunities for candidate hopefuls and eager to learn umpires alike.

The foundation principle of the Umpire Academy is to provide a medium-long term delivery of training to umpires who are committed to consolidate and build on the SNSWUA Clinics. By delivering up to 6 sessions over a 9-12 week period – woven in with real game scenarios, umpires can learn, practice, check progress, receive feedback, re-learn and practice again. This looping learning process is based on strong training design principles and the results are showing we are on the right track.

Each session is based on progress from previous sessions with consideration for the level of progress and understanding demonstrated by the umpires. The umpires also have a strong ability to influence the agenda by having free and open discussions with the Trainers about the topics or elements of the games that are causing challenge. This collaborative approach proved to be incredibly valuable and the SNSWUA's ability to be flexible with the agenda and training activities helped make the program a success and specifically relevant to the group.

This year in November we saw the end of the 2014 SNSWUA Basic Umpire Academy. This year's Academy was disrupted at times due to inclement weather, but this never tempered the enthusiasm of the 12 participants. Scott Rindfleish, Lead Facilitator of the Umpire Academy, spoke positively of the work ethic of both participants and trainers.

"This year's Academy was one of the best I've been part of and that's in no small way thanks to the fantastic commitment of the umpire participants and my co-trainers. We have worked hard to be dynamic and flexible, embracing a new 'practical' focus spending 100% of our time on the diamond. Well done to you all and I especially appreciate the teamwork and the genuine care for each other that was shown for Association colleagues and for umpires from other areas of NSW."

"Together, we all grew as umpires and helped each other to perform better on the diamond. As students of the game, we are all challenged to step out of our comfort zones and learn new things and that's exactly what this Academy achieved for those involved."

"I congratulate each of the umpires who gave up their time to be involved, and commend the work and commitment of the trainers who were constant supporters of these umpires," Rindfleish concluded.

The SNSWUA is committed to the continued success of the Umpire Academy and we have strong plans in place to ensure that we can support all umpires to prepare and achieve higher accreditation and personal success. We look forward to 2015 and wish all umpires success at the assessment venues.

UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT

For many years the Softball NSW Umpires Association has set the benchmark for umpire development and has had a proud history of introducing innovative approaches and new tactics to our already sound and proactive development programs. With our core focus to improve on diamond skill, this year we specifically focused on reviewing the strategies that will achieve the best results across all levels of umpiring from the introductory umpiring clinics right through to the senior umpire development needs.

During this year the Umpire Development Sub Committee was recalibrated into two distinct teams, a Strategy Team and an Implementation Team. The concept of umpire development was reviewed by the Strategy Team against standards for best practice education and corporate training models.

Our new approach to Umpire Development was piloted at the Basic Clinic and continued in its philosophy and application at the Basic Academy. Major enhancements included a flexible agenda driven by the participating umpires, allowing the umpires to help determine the duration, speed and review topics of the training sessions. Additionally by adjusting the time spend ratio to allow maximum time on the diamond rather than in the classroom led to enhanced learning and practical application and consolidation. The 2014 Basic Academy was completed 100% on diamond; just like during a game.

We are committed to this new philosophy of training and we appreciate the positive feedback from the participating

Looking ahead, we have some new initiatives and new audio/visual equipment that will greatly enhance the umpire experience and learning opportunities – 2015 will be a great year.

Special thanks to all the Presenters and Trainers across our Clinics, Academy and Rules Sessions, your energy and contribution is greatly appreciated. Your continued focus to give time and help other umpires is outstanding. Our ability to better support the sport of softball at all levels is a direct reflection of our training programs and the ability to inspire umpires to learn and grow.

RINDFLEISH INDUCTED INTO HALL OF FAME



After more than 35 years promoting the sport, and equally as long serving it as an umpire, Andrew Rindfleish's distinguished contribution was recognised by the softball community at the SNSW State Teams Dinner.

The Level 8 ISF umpiring stalwart was officially inducted into the Softball Australia Hall of Fame at the Softball NSW State Team's Dinner at Rooty Hill RSL Club.

Presenting Rindfleish with his award was the International Softball Federation's Vice-President, and fellow SAL Life Member, Darryl Clout.

A modest Rindfleish was both surprised and humbled to join softball's class of elite.

"It's a great but unexpected honour that not just recognises my efforts but the efforts of so many others, particularly my family."

"I first became involved in softball back in 1976 because my wife, Sue, was coaching a school team. I started as a scorer and then progressed to umpiring and 38 years later, as they say, the rest is history."

"I've been fortunate enough to share this ride with Sue and, from the 1980s, my two sons, Adam and Scott. For us, it's a family sport; it always has been and always will be."

From humble origins at Sutherland Shire Softball Association in Sydney's south-east, it didn't take Rindfleish long to progress through the umpiring ranks.

"I remember umpiring my first state championship at International Peace Park in 1978 and six years later I was at Waverley in Melbourne umpiring my first National Championship."

" Looking back, I guess some real highlights for me would have to be achieving my ISF Accreditation following our umpires tour of The US and Canada in 1991 and then umpiring my four World Championships."

"I was fortunate to call two Open Men's World Championships in the USA and South Africa, respectively, as well as a Junior Men's and Women's here in Australia."

"In more recent times it's been a privilege to watch my son, Scott, umpire at the international level. Watching him umpire the 2013 ISF Men's World Championship in Auckland, NZ, was just as much a highlight of my career as it was of his," he said.

Rindfleish's contribution to the sport has not only been played out on the diamond but just as importantly off the diamond. As a former NSW Umpire-in-Chief, Softball NSW Board Member, Softball Australia National Staff Member, National Umpire-in-Chief and Softball Australia Representation at two ISF Congresses, Rindfleish has been a mentor and advocate for umpires across NSW, Australia and the Oceania Region.

"With the support of my family, I've been able to give of my time to help make meaningful and lasting administrative changes to our sport and umpiring program in a bid to make it more viable and well-known into the future," Rindfleish said.

"It's also been a pleasure helping so many umpires develop their skills over the years. Umpire development is a real passion of mine and I've met some great friends over the years as I've helped them to mature on the diamond."

Former NSW State Director of Umpiring and Life Member of Softball NSW, Darrell Shephard, who led the state umpiring program for 18 years, praised Rindfleish's work on and off the diamond.

"I've known Andy for many, many years and consider him a real asset and contributor to our sport," Shephard said.

"His umpiring CV is probably unmatched by any other NSW umpire and he is a very worthy Hall of Fame inductee. Andy's past Life Memberships and Service Awards are testament to his extensive contribution over the years."

"He has umpired countless international test series, well over fifty National Championships here in Australia, the majority at the Open Men's level, as well as innumerable State Championships, in a career that has spanned over 35 years, so he is to be congratulated for this latest recognition," Shephard concluded.

Fellow New South Welshmen Barry Blanchard and Harvey Milson (Pictured) were also recognised on Wednesday night. Blanchard was inducted into the Softball Australia Hall of Fame whilst Milson was Awarded Life Membership.

It is an acclamation of outstanding service to umpiring that has only been granted to 14 umpires since the Softball NSW Umpires' Association was founded in 1965. Rindfleish joins his father, Andrew, on the distinguished list of Life Members and together they constitute the first father and son duo to recognised alongside each other.

Scott Rindfleish's admission as a Life Member of the SNSWUA reflects his active and continued involvement with the Softball NSW Umpires' Association Executive Committee for over 13 years, firstly as the SNSWUA Information Co-ordinator in 2002, then from 2003 – 2009 as the SNSWUA Training Co-ordinator, before succeeding Darrell Shephard in 2010 as State Director of Umpiring. Scott has held the position of State Director of Umpiring since 2010.

As Director of Umpiring, Scott was instrumental in the creation and implementing the SNSWUA 'Our House' philosophy; the strategic plan that identifies the association's objectives and focus areas. The five key areas have been systematically developed with strong programs and initiatives over time and have enjoyed immense success under his leadership. These initiatives have shaped the way the current umpires perform, learn, communicate and help attract other umpires to our sport. The ongoing positive growth in numbers along side state, national and international success is a direct result of the initiatives currently in place in NSW.
