Congratulations Danny and Thank You

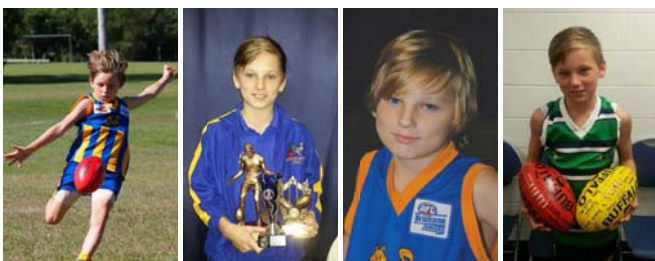

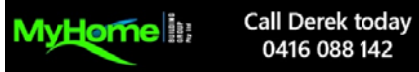
